### 1. Spring Fire Season and 4 p.m. Burn Law

4/1, 4/15, 4/29 (news updates at 6:50,7:50,8:50 and 11:50am)

News stories with Karen Stanley with the Virginia Department of Forestry who focused on the continuation of Spring Fire Season and Virginia's 4 p.m. Burn Law which ran through April 30. Rockbridge County officials also discussed their county burn ban, which was in effect for a few weeks.

### 2. Buena Vista's New Property Regulations

### 3. Fiscal 2017 Budget Work

Lexington Council-member Frank Friedman, Buena Vista council-member Steve Baldrige and Rockbridge County Supervisor Ronnie Campbell were among the government officials who provided updates on the Fiscal 2017 budget work, detailing final tax rates and water and sewer rates.
