### 1.Medicaid Expansion and State Budget

7/1, 7/3 (news updates at 6-7-8 a.m., 12-5 p.m.)

News stories featuring Delegate Ben Cline discussing the debate in the General Assembly in Richmond on the Medicaid Expansion issue. Cline also discussed the recently adopted biennial budget for Virginia and highlighted the local effects.
