Oct 7th: GUEST HOST: DEBORAH PERRY interviews LUCY RIOS, of RI Coalition Against Domestic Violence, program director and trainer, discusses the Community Attitudes Assessment survey on what Rhode Islanders know about domestic violence.

Oct 14th: GUEST HOST: EVA MANCUSO interviews **EILEEN** HAYES of Amos House. In 1976, it started as a soup kitchen, today it has grown into a comprehensive social service agency serving over 15,000 Rhode Islanders.

Oct 21st: GUEST HOST: DEBORAH PERRY interviews LUCY RIOS, of RI Coalition Against Domestic Violence, program director and trainer, discusses the Community Attitudes Assessment survey on what Rhode Islanders know about domestic violence.

Oct 28th: GUEST HOST: EVA MANCUSO interviews KAREN SANTILLI, resident/CEO of Crossroads RI helping homeless or at-risk families and individuals secure stable housing.

Nov 4th: GUEST HOST: MEGHAN GRADY interviews **AMY DAVIDSON**, of YWCA RI to discuss Fantastic Girltastic Code Company and the important of computer science for girls and why more young women need to pursue 'non-traditional' careers.

Nov 11th: Former talk-show host, columnist, social worker, and leading advocate for women's reproductive rights, **MARY ANN SORRENTINO**, discusses the shifting political landscape, the US Supreme Court and the impact women will have on the midterm and 2020 elections.

Nov 18th: Down Syndrome affects over 400,000 people in this country. **TERESA MURRAY** living with DOWN SYNDROME while she writes her poetry, music, and her advice on life: "lean into it and if you need help, ask for it." **SHERLY GOMES**, a social worker and mentor, shares how Teresa's perseverance and friendship is an inspiration to so many.

Nov 25th: For almost 30 years, **VALERIE TUTSON**, has been telling stories! She is part of Rhode Island Black Storytellers. She talks about the songs and stories she learned while traveling South Africa. She's also gaining a reputation for her exciting retelling of age-old Bible stories. So sit back, listen, and get swept away on a journey of words, sounds, and passion.

Dec 2nd: About 8,000 students attend one of the 18 private, independent schools K-12 in Rhode Island. **DIANE RICH**, head of school, is the first woman to lead Rocky Hill School in East Greenwich since Dorothy Marshall founded the school in 1934. She discusses their innovative approach to educating the 300 students.

Dec 9th: **CAPTAIN VICTORIA TOLBERT** has served in the Massachusetts and Indiana National Guard and now is the Aide to the Commanding General in the RI Guard. She spent 18 years as a teacher and administrator including at the Gordon School in East Providence. She is inspirational

Dec 16th: In 1638, Roger Williams was the first minister at the First Baptist Church in Providence. In 2018, it's **REVEREND JAMIE WASHAM**. She discusses Roger Williams' ideas of liberty and freedom of conscience and the historic and religious significance of America's oldest church right here in Providence, Rhode Island.

Dec 23rd: It is expensive to buy clothes for kids today; it's even more difficult for families in need. **EVA MANCUSO** discusses her non-profit *Clothes to Kids Rhode Island* helping Providence County families in need clothing for their kids. Kids in grades

K-12 are eligible or if the family is in crisis due to a natural disaster, homelessness, or displacement.

Dec 30th: Opening up your heart and your home as a foster parent can change a child's life forever. **KIM ZANDY**, a foster mom who adopted her two children, explains how becoming a foster parent has changed her life. **LISA GUILLETTE** of *Foster Forward* shares her foster care story and how you can become a foster parent.
