They were asked about ethics reform, and cleaning up corruption in the New York State Legislature. Also, the two candidates running for Mayor in Plattsburgh met for a forum at SUNY Plattsburgh, hosted by Vision2Action. Democrat Colin Read and Independent incumbent Jim Calnon talked about their visions for the city's waterfront. NEW OVERTIME RULE: Sweeping new federal rules will allow tens of thousands of salaried workers across Northern New York to begin collecting overtime pay. We are hosting another in our on-going series of forums on Mountain Lake PBS, and this week we're focusing on the Department of Labor's new overtime rule that goes into effect in less than two weeks on December 1, 2016. It is a big deal because more than 4-million salaried workers, including thousands in Northern New York, are now going to qualify for overtime pay. Currently, any employee making less than \$455 a week, or 23,660 in salary a year, has been eligible for overtime if they work more than 40 hours a week. That's about to change. Under the new rules that salary is going to jump to \$913 a week, or \$47,476 a year. Any worker now making less than \$47,476 will be eligible for overtime pay. But could President-Elect Trump or the new Congress look to make major changes to the new rule? Our panel includes: Jacqueline Kelleher, an attorney who specializes in labor & employment with the Stafford Owens Law Firm in Plattsburgh; Sue Matton, Vice-President for Economic Development with the North Country Chamber of Commerce; Colin Read, a professor of economics and finance at SUNY Plattsburgh; and Betsy Vicencio, Vice-President and Chief Financial Officer at the Northeast Group in Plattsburgh.
