Program description: Mayor Julian Castro was confirmed overwhelmingly by the Senate this week and will be Secretary of Housing and Urban Development. San Antonio could have an interim mayor to serve until next May within two weeks. We will have one of the two leading candidates tonight and the other next week.

Program description: By this time next week, San Antonio should have a new Mayor. Julian Castro intends to resign on Tuesday before taking over as the new Housing and Urban Development Secretary for President Obama. Once that happens, the remaining council members will vote for one of their own to serve as interim Mayor until the May 2015 City elections. Technically, while all ten council members are eligible, we have identified two front runners for the office. Last week, we spoke with District 6 Councilman Ray Lopez and this week, we focus on District 2 City Councilmember, Ivy Taylor.

County Judge Nelson Wolff, one of the project's most vocal cheerleaders, said county-appointed members of the VIA board would also be asked to cancel the project. What led to the decision, and what are the ramifications -- both for VIA and for the broader political lay of the land?
