PUBLIC AFFAIRS SHOWS 4Q 2021

10/3/21 JEAN SINZDAK, ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR OF THE RUTGERS CENTER FOR AMERICAN WOMEN AND POLITICS AT THE EAGLETON INSTITUTE OF POLITICS, discussed challenges faced by potential female candidates seeking or considering public office, how New Jersey ranks on a national level for the number of women holding public office, and ways of increasing female representation.

10/10/21 CHRISTINE GIORDANO HANLON, MONMOUTH COUNTY CLERK, discussed a new law in New Jersey in effect for the 2021 November General Election mandating the option of early, in-person voting, how it will work, designated polling locations, dates and times, security measures, and new monetary incentives for polls workers.

10/17/21 MAJOR STEVE DITMER FROM THE SALVATION ARMY'S TOMS RIVER CORPS, discussed the non-profit's annual Red Kettle campaign, new efforts to highlight the Jersey Shore, the increase in need since the COVID-19 pandemic, how many families the local Corps helps each year, additional services and programs the Salvation Army offers, ways to donate and volunteer.

10/24/21 DEBORAH HERR, CO-LEADER OF LUNCH BREAK'S SPECIAL EVENTS TEAM, discussed the Red Bank non-profit's 2021 Holiday Meal Drive, how the community can sponsor a family, the increase in need since before the COVID-19 pandemic, other services and program's the agency offers, and how people can donate or volunteer.

10/31/21 MITCH LITTLE, TOMS RIVER POLICE CHIEF, discussed Halloween safety tips for parents, children and motorists, as well as the local Police Foundation's upcoming annual 5k race in December to raise money for student scholarships and local charities.

11/7/21 PATRICK MURRAY, DIRECTOR OF THE MONMOUTH UNIVERSITY POLLING INSTITUTE, discussed the pending outcome of the closer-than-expected Governor's race between incumbent Democrat Phil Murphy and Republican challenger Jack Ciattarelli, Murray's public apology for the Institute's inaccurate poll margin projecting Murphy as the easy winner, whether political polls should be banned, and the shocking defeat of long-time state Senate President Steve Sweeney to a little-known Republican.

11/14/21 BRIAN BECKER, FOUNDER AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE GARDEN STATE ANIMAL SHELTER, discussed the non-profit's opening of its first adoption shelter at Freehold Raceway Mall in Freehold, its goal of increasing community support, educational seminars and pet supply donations, the screening process to adopt an animal, and volunteer training.

11/21/21 JIM KROEZE, CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER OF FULFILL, discussed the Foodbank's annual holiday drive, how much food insecurity has gone up, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic, other program's the non-profit offers to help people in need and ways the public can help.

11/28/21 JIM BURNS, ANTI-BULLYING EXPERT AND AUTHOR WHO LIVES IN OCEAN COUNTY, in the wake recent hazing allegations among the Wall Township High School football team, discussed the definition of a bully, characteristics, signs or behavior teachers, coaches and parents should look for, how to report instances of bullying and how listeners can get help.

12/5/21 STEVE BRIGHAM, PASTOR AND FOUNDER OF DESTINY'S BRIDGE, provided an update on the homeless situation in Ocean and Monmouth Counties as the COVID-19 pandemic continues, as well as the latest in attempts to get a permanent shelter, outreach efforts, items people can donate, and his proposed idea for how the state can help the homeless.

12/12/21 DR. MICHAEL ANESTIS, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE NEW JERSEY GUN VIOLENCE RESEARCH CENTER AND ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF URBAN-GLOBAL PUBLIC HEALTH AT RUTGERS UNIVERSITY, discussed motivations for gun-related violence, reason for a surge in gun purchases during the COVID-19 pandemic as well as two recent studies by the research center, how New Jersey's already tough gun laws can be strengthened, and his thoughts on the Oxford, Michigan school shooting in which accused gunman 15-year-old Ethan Crumbley's parents also were charged with involuntary manslaughter.

12/19/21 PAUL HULSE, CEO/JUST BELIEVE INC., provided an update on efforts by the non-profit to get a permanent transitional home for the homeless on donated land, amount needed to build the structure, the recent opening of its thrift store boutique in Toms River and ways the public can get involved in helping area homeless.

12/26/21 KERRI MARTIN, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF SECOND LIFE BIKES IN MONMOUTH COUNTY, discussed how the Asbury Park non-profit offers a bike-earning program for children, as well as affordable bike sales and repairs, how donated bicycles and parts are vital in sustaining the agency, and a yearly program in which bikes are refurbished and then provided for free to families of young children every December.
