Clinics will be held at MCRHC office located at 1540 West Park Ave., Suite 1, Tinton Falls, NJ 07724. All school age children, from preschoolers to college students, should be vaccinated. Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (whooping cough), polio, measles, mumps, rubella, hepatitis B, and varicella (chicken pox) are some of the diseases that can be prevented through immunizations.
