During this quarter, WZSR gave particular attention to the issues listed in the following report. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority of importance.

Issue: CASA of McHenry County
Program Name: Northwest Spectrum

Air Date: 10/02/22 **Duration:** 15 minutes

Description: Becky Morris, Executive Director of CASA of McHenry County, discussed what CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) offers to abused and neglected children that are in the foster care system. She talked about how the volunteers are the advocates for these children in the court system. We also discussed the new Illinois legislation that mandates a CASA representative for all foster children facing a court case.
