[Northwest Spectrum] - [6am, Sunday, February 15, 2015]

[ISSUE: Health. Nearly a dozen cases of measles in the northwest suburbs prompts a serious discussion on measles and why the outbreak has occurred and what people could do to protect themselves. Talked to Deb Quakenbush of the McHenry County Dept. of Health.]

[Northwest Spectrum] - [6am, Sunday, February 22, 2015]

[ISSUE: Government. Northwest suburban Congressman Randy Hultgren discusses terrorist at the Lincoln Day Dinner. ISIS has become a major concern in the U.S. and Northwest Spectrum felt the congressman who represents parts of Kane, McHenry, Lake, Kendall, Du Page, DeKalb, and Will Counties needed to explain our nation's response so far.]

[ISSUE: Health. Recent suicides of three young people in recent weeks prompted a community forum to examine what services are offered to help people with depression and suicidal thoughts. Interviews with Voni Coombs, a crisis response worker at McHenry County Crisis Program; Mike Quick, a detective with the McHenry County Sheriff's Dept.; and Scott Campbell, clinical director of Samaritan Counseling Center and co-president of NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness and Rick Kershof, co-president of NAMI, Mcty.)]

[The following summarizes a representative sample of programming that provided the most significant treatment of community issues during the past quarter. Programming frequently deals with more than one issue.]

Coverage Addressing the Following Issues:

1) [Issue]-HEALTH January 18, 2015 6am 10-minutes (Homelessness increasing....must find away to fund to continue operating every year.)

- 2) [Issue]-ECONOMY January 16, 2015 6am 10-minutes. (Newly installed McHenry County Board Chair explains the budget, his proposed projects and the upcoming election of a new chairman.)
- 3) [Issue]-ENVIRONMENTAL February 8, 2015 6am 10-minutes. (Woman demands Crystal Lake Park District be accountable to residents and ask for input before the park district continues clearing trees from a forest preserve.)
- 4) [Issue]-GOVERNMENT March 1, 2015 6am 10-minutes. (Lots of jobs are available in northern Illinois in the manufacturing sector but few people are skilled to take these high paying jobs. What one college is doing to get people to train in their manufacturing lab.)
- 5) [Issue]-COMMUNITY EVENTS March 8, 2015, 6am 10-minutes. (Volunteers keep dozens of service organizations alive in northern Illinois. An event called the Human Race provides dozens of organizations with necessary funding to keep going and encourage volunteers to receive training.)
- 6) [Issue]-HEALTH March 15, 2015 6am 10-minutes (A psychiatrist uses his time to discuss depression and suicide as the area is reeling from the recent deaths of three high school students from suicide.)
- 7) [Issue]-EDUCATION March 29, 2015 6am 10-minutes. (More and more people are in need of tutors for reading. One organization in Elgin is inundated with requests and is doing everything possible to meet the demand and plans on holding an important trivia bee to raise money.

Controlled burns by conservation districts is a very common procedure. You may occasionally see smoke coming from these areas in mchenry and kane counties...and throughout northern Illinois. Also the removal of invasive species is another common procedure. While the importance of these procedures are generally understood, the question is whether people deserve an opportunity to make public their feelings on these processes before the work begins and for the pros and cons to be worth further discussion. GOOD MORNING, I'M STEW COHEN AND THIS IS NORTHWEST SPECTRUM, A PUBLIC AFFAIRS SHOW AIRING EVERY SUNDAY MORNING.

You'll likely witness road construction projects—especially in the summertime—in the northwest suburbs and fox valley and most of the time we won't think anything of it. Road crews move into an area and one of the first things they do is remove a number of trees. My guest this morning....saw that very process for the Walk-Up Road construction in Crystal Lake in the area of Sterne's Woods and Fen...and once again...this is not unusual...mature trees are removed in exchange for widening a road and easing traffic congestion. However, my guest...who signs emails and other correspondence as "Grieving Nature's Loss Even More," took her usual walk through Sterne's Woods and Fen this past Fall and saw more trees being removed....this time, she would not be silent—asking people in the area what they knew of this..and she says it became clear that no one really knew definitively why the trees are disappearing from Sterne's Woods. Now, from what Jean Natoli has learned, it seems to her that the Fen at Sterne's Woods is being expanded and that the Pine Forest is being as she puts it, "systematically dismantled to provide more sunlight for prairie plants."

MY GUEST THIS MORNING IS JEAN NATOLI (nah-toe-lee) OF CRYSTAL LAKE. Natoli is a 2nd through 3rd grade special education teacher in mchenry with a very strong interest in Sterne's woods in crystal lake... You've said to me that it's not WHAT is being done...but how. ...that the prized plant, the Princess of the Prairie—according to naturalists—can only thrive if only the pines didn't limit the hours and intensity of sunlight for the plant. ..You've told me that the stressed trees at the western edge of the pine forest in Veteran Acres were removed...but now rows and rows of pine trees have been destroyed, living and non living. ..and the argument is that the pines are not native to the Veteran Acres site—as mentioned....an invasive species. However, you say the same pine forest has been a refuge for wildlife, for hikers, bikers, families....and that the Park District needs to consider the aesthetics of Sterne's Woods and Fen and Veteran Acres....and most of all spend more time COMMUNICATING.

Jean, what does a walk in the woods mean to you?

Finally.....JeanI want to read something you wrote to me recently....that Sterne's Woods is a place where people can lose their everyday stress amongst the trees, where mountain bikers, runners, cross country skiers and feel accomplishment, where families can walk under a canopy of leafy tree branches. Nature, you say, may recover, but people who love and use Sterne's Woods and Fen and Veteran Acres will be missing out on the inspiration of nature.


