Here are the 13 Northwest Spectrum programs for the quarterly period July through Sept. 2014.

July 6....The mission is clear...a dedication to conquering all blood cancers by funding research into the causes and cures of leukemia....and my guest is Andy Hanson, president of Andy's Chapter of Hope of the Leukemia Research Foundation.

July 13....Woodstock Children's Summer Theatre brings to the Woodstock Opera House Orson Welles Stage, The Wizard of Oz...and the children starring in the production are my guests. This is a special yearly program where we focus on young people and summer theatre.

July 20.....The president of McHenry County College explains her job, a very significant prize, and other things she does to a class of kids in the Kids and College Summer Program class called Be a Broadcaster taught over the summer by News Director Stew Cohen. Stew invited MCC President Vicky Smith into his classroom at MCC for a news conference where the kids would ask questions and write a story based on her information.

July 27....Opening up the McHenry County Fair to our Northwest Spectrum listeners by interviewing McHenry County Fair President Ken Bowman. He talks about introducing agriculture and food to young people at the fair.

August 3....The need for power plants in Illinois is rarely disputed, however the location of these plants is up for serious debate....and in one such case, developers are asking the Village of Oakwood Hills to approve a site in their village for a 450-million dollar power plant. Residents are strongly opposed...and all the sides came together for a public zoning meeting where Stew Cohen taped the public comments and put together a Northwest Spectrum on the concerns of the residents and comments from the developers experts.

August 10....It runs in the family, never more true than for the new commander of the Salvation Army of McHenry County. Interviewed is Captain Carol Lewis, pastor and commander of the Salvation Army of McHenry County on what people can expect from her leadership.

August 17....Take a Stand for Turning Point.....aired 36 hours of programming on our radio station WZSR-FM Friday into Saturday....bringing needed attention to the long and hard battle against t his type of physical and mental abuse. Interviewed is Turning Point Executive Director Jane Farmer on what's expected for the radiothon.

August 24....From personal experience, a young woman from the northwest suburbs is empowered to help teenagers with her Girl Scout Gold Service Award Project. Anne Marie Elsinger, a graduate of Marian Central Catholic High School in Woodstock addresses tough teen issues...such as risk taking, sexual abuse, and peer pressure.

August 31....The YMCA has been a staple in serving many needs of people in the northwest suburbs. The SAGE YMCA is expanded and renovated in Crystal Lake and my guest is Robyn Ostrem, executive director of SAGE YMCA. She takes Northwest Spectrum on tour of the new facility about to open for thousands of people using its facilities.

Sept. 7....The United Way touches many lives and in the northwest suburbs, one such organization's executive director discusses the positive community impact for us to remember just how important your dollars are to programs and agencies funded through the United Way of McHenry County. My guest is Steve Otten, executive director of the United Way of Greater McHenry County.

Sept. 14...Just over a week away from the start of fall though the weather sure seems to have left the summer behind...but this past summer wasn't one for vacations or relaxation in one specific area of northern Illinois. Thousands of people got actively involved in what was happening in Oakwood Hills, and many of them participated in public hearings for a 430-megawatt natural gas power plant. My guests are Suzanne and Joe Ricciardi. We talk about how they learned about the proposal, what they did once they knew, and how the potential for a power plant is affecting their lives.

Sept. 21.....The Alzheimer's Association Memory Walk to End Alzheimer's is the world's largest event to fight Alzheimer's disease. In the northwest suburbs, hundreds of people gather at Sunset Park in Lake-in-the-Hills to help raise thousands of dollars for research into the sixth leading cause of death in the U.S. My guest is Jennifer Ratkovic, manager of special events for the Alzheimer's Association of Greater Illinois Chapter.

Sept. 28.....Domestic abuse has become very top of mind lately across America because of cases such as that of former pro football running back Ray Rice. The Rice video is very stark in that it shows Rice punching his then fiancé in an elevator. While the person I'm talking to for Northwest Spectrum works in the forefront of the issue on a daily basis, the call for increased awareness of domestic violence comes as we observe October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month. I speak to Jane Farmer, executive director of Turning Point.







Books of all types have been challenged throughout the centuries, which is why the American Library Association instituted Banned Book Week in 1982, and why CLPL is hosting its 2nd Annual Crystal Lake Read Out. This year's event will be moderated by Stew Cohen, news anchor for WZSR-FM 105.5 and WFXF-FM 103.9 The Fox. Seven individuals including Ray Exum, Susan Gavle, Bill Weller, Deborah Wright, Leslie Schermerhorn and Kurt Begalka will read from challenged materials.

# 2014 Community Survey

The Library Board recently initiated a Community Survey to verify data gathered in previous surveys in 2005 and 2011, and to gauge the community's current thinking relative to the Library's facilities and use.

### Who was surveyed

517 residents completed the survey

- 417 (81%) were users and
- 100 (19%) were nonusers

### Investment in the Community

Nearly 100% of all of the respondents agree that the Library is a "good investment in the community," with 92% stating that they "Strongly Agree" and 7% stating that they "Somewhat Agree."

# Site Comparison Study

The Library Trustees recently completed a two-year Site Comparison Study, comparing 24 potential sites for a new Library facility. The Library Board hired architectural firm Engberg Anderson to conduct the study and answer questions from the Crystal Lake City Council. Sites were evaluated based on 10 criteria including:

- Location/Context
- Site Size
- Building Layouts
- Building Height
- Adaptability
- Access/Parking
- Control of Site
- Constructability
- Amenities
- Other Attributes including highest and best use; Net Tax Revenue

As part of the Site Comparison Study, the Board developed a Vision Statement for a new building, which is to "provide a cost effective, 21st century technology based, adaptable public library facility that fulfills the Mission of the City of Crystal Lake and will serve the needs of our residents today and for many generations to come." 
