PUBLIC AFFAIRS RELATED PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Northwest Spectrum – Sunday, January 17, 2016, 6am (10-min) COMMUNITY EVENTS.

Warm Your Heart with the Gift of Shelter as the chill of winter seems to hit us right in the face every day. The number of people looking for shelter in northern Illinois has increased. That means McHenry County is facing an ongoing challenge. The root of homelessness is examined in the interview with Barb Swanson, donor relations and community development coordinator for Pioneer Center and Laurie Bivona, director of marketing.

Northwest Spectrum – Sunday, February 7, 2016, 6am (10-min) ECONOMY.

On Feb. 10 President Obama visits the Illinois General Assembly addressing lawmakers in what's billed as a speech on "What We Can Do, Together to Build a Better Politics." Will this help Democrats and Republican toward working out their state budget impasse of eight months? State Senator Pam Althoff, a McHenry Republican is asked to discuss where we've been on the budget, where we are now and where we could be headed.

Northwest Spectrum – Sunday, February 21, 2016, 6am (10-min) EDUCATION

This is the first radio interview with the new head of McHenry County College. Talked to McHenry County College President Clinton Gabbard, the eighth president of the college about his insight into the number one educational institution in McHenry County. Can MCC hold costs down for students, offer new programs, determine what's needed for future educational demands.

Northwest Spectrum – Sunday, March 20, 2016, 6am (10-min) HEALTH

The failure of the State of Illinois to agree on a state budget has affected hundreds of non-profit organizations. Pioneer Center for Human Services is no exception, according to interim President and CEO Sam Tenuto and Marketing Director Laurie Bivona. Pioneer Center for Human Services is working to ensure that its developmental disability program, homeless program, McHenry County PADS and Pioneer Center Group Homes stay open.

[The following summarizes a representative sample of programming that provided the most significant treatment of community issues during the past quarter. Programming frequently deals with more than one issue.]

Coverage Addressing the Following Issues:

- 1) EDUCATION Advice on writing and research by Dennis Lee Hague, author of "The Eyes of the Comet." 10-min.
- 2) YOUTH McHenry County College student Peter Atterberg, graduate of Huntley High School, talks about his decisions as a student to write a book and how his classes have helped him realize his dream. 10-min.
- 3)HEALTH Hundreds of people participate in Sleep Out for Shelter in McHenry County. Barb Swanson and Laurie Bivona of the Pioneer Center for Human Services discuss McHenry County PADS and how this event helps homeless in the area. 10-min.
- 4) VETERANS In the Folded Flag, we see the heavy price of freedom. Folds of Honor chose the American flag to reflect its mission...to honor the sacrifice of America's heroes, while giving hope to the bearers of their legacy. This Northwest Spectrum brings forth the story of one local couple's call to action in the construction and sale of a two story home in the northwest suburbs. The guest is Bill Shey of Barrington, owner of a professional plumbing and insignia kitchen and bath in Barrington and a veteran of the U.S. Marines. 10-min.
- 5) GOVERNMENT State Senator Pam Althoff, a McHenry Republican discusses the need for a state budget but not to the extent we're trying to fund programs we just don't have the money to fund. Althoff reviews what she perceives will be the address by the Governor. 10-min.
- 6) POLITICS Michael Walkup of Crystal Lake is running for McHenry County Board Chairman. He is one of two candidates. This is the first time that voters will decide the outcome of the county board race in McHenry County. 10-min.
- 7) EDUCATION A strong relationship between the community and community college is the cornerstone of what the new president of McHenry County College believes. New MCC President Clinton Gabbard tells us what he envisions for the college in the future.
- 8)POLITICS McHenry County Board Chairman Joe Gottemoller sits down to discuss why he should win the election. He is the last chairman selected by the county board members. He tells why he should win the election and continue with the goals he started. 10-min.
- 9) GOVERNMENT/POLITICS The race for McHenry County State's Attorney between two Republican candidates. This interview brings to the table Dan Regna and Patrick Kenneally. Each gets 6 minutes of air time on Northwest Spectrum. The most controversial part of the two interviews revolves around Regna bringing up Kenneally's encounter with police in a domestic call to his home some years ago. Kenneally has the opportunity to respond and he does so.12-min.

10) **POLITICS** Steven Reick is a candidate for State Representative in the 63rd District which takes in a number of towns including Marengo. His Republican opponent Jeff Lichte refuses to be interviewed for Northwest Spectrum, saying his wife is ill and he won't have the time. The winner will face State Representative Jack Franks, a Marengo Democrat. 10-min.

11) **HEALTH** The Pioneer Center for Human Services behind Interim President Sam Tenuto and Marketing Director Laurie Bivona are trying to save as many programs as possible despite serious troubles with the State of Illinois. The State can't pay back Pioneer Center what is owed so Pioneer Center went to its reserves and kept key programs going. However, Pioneer Center is running out of money and needs help in the form of fundraisers and donations and has a campaign going right now. At stake is the entire behavioral health division.

12) **EDUCATION** The lack of a state budget hits hard with the Literacy Connection in Elgin. Karen Oswald, director of the Literacy Connection in Elgin discusses the upcoming 19th Annual Trivia Bee at the Grand Victoria Casino in Elgin. The event is extremely important to keep the Literacy Connection going. There are quite a few people in need of services and the money helps make it possible for people to have a chance to read and write English.




