

CIVIC AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

1st Quarter 2022 Community Events:

San Antonio Livestock Exposition 1/12-2/27

KCYY supported the annual Let's Rodeo Ball, with promotional mentions. This event kicks off the San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo and raises funds for scholarships.

The Battle of Flowers Parade




