Chest compression is the preferred first treatment by bystanders if an incident occurs. The heel of the hand is used. It is hard work. There are devices all over the airport. Each unit is around \$1,500.00 to\$ 2,000 each. There have been 51 incidents and 40 survived. Chest compression is the first response then the AED.

In 1948 Sky Harbor was the busiest airport in the nation. Terminal 2 was west of Terminal one. It was opened in 1952. The control tower was was of the only air conditioned building in the area. Make of used tubes with a central area for electric lines. Amenities from early airlines included wicker chairs for weight purposes. Later berths were added for sleep.

In 1962 Terminal 2 was thought to be enough for travel to the year 2000. In the 21st Century is the modernization of Terminal 3 with more glass.
