A new program called "Change Their Day" in conjunction with the city is a change kiosk collecting money for the military. There are six kiosks in all three terminals. They are at the TSA checkpoints. The money is used for the airport facility and a number of other programs. The idea came from the Phoenix Mayor, Stanton. They are open every day of the year. In 2014, 23,000 people visited the USO

facility. Other airports are starting to do the same thing with the kiosks. The USO facility is very family friendly from dining to a rest area. It is about 3000 square feet. Volunteers are welcome and can apply at the USO website.
