## Governor Tasks New Elder Abuse Work Group

12-05-17

Minnesota Governor Dayton is calling for a new elder abuse work group to improve state oversight of Minnesota's senior care facilities. Last year, the Minnesota Department of Health received more than 25,000 allegations of maltreatment in state-licensed senior homes. Otter Tail County Public Health Director Diane Thorson says all elder abuse complaints are initiated at the state level...

Dayton says the group would be led by Minnesota AARP officials and would develop recommendations meant to protect the rights of residents in state-licensed homes for seniors. Recommendations could include changes to state law to reduce the secrecy surrounding state abuse investigations. The deadline for the work group is January 26th, 2018.

## Flu Shot Not Mandatory For Workers at LRH

## Otter Tail Among Counties In Minnesota More Susceptible For Higher Potential Radon

Otter Tail is among the counties in Minnesota that is at a higher risk for Radon exposure. Once radon is produced, it moves up through the ground into the air and can also dissolve into ground and surface water. Otter Tail County Public Health Director Diane Thorson...

OUTCUE: "...and you get the most accurate testing

The only way to determine how much radon is in the area is to test for it. Thorson says that free Radon Test Kits are available at Otter Tail County Public Health at the Government Services Center in Fergus Falls. Thorson recommends that if you get a high reading with their kit, that you should purchase one of the longer duration test kits available at almost any hardware store. Nationwide, nearly one out of every 15 homes has a radon level EPA considers to be elevated. The EPA also states that any radon exposure carries some risk; no level of radon exposure is always safe.
