### Friday, April 8, 2011

- **THE PROPOSAL:** A man tells fellow diners at a restaurant on Valentine's Day that he's about to propose to his girlfriend who is meeting him there. After she arrives, and he excuses himself from the table, she is heard on her cell phone talking to *another* lover. Will anyone warn the man about her call before he pops the question?
- **OVERWEIGHT DISCRIMINATION:** When a manager at a health food/nutrition store tells an overweight woman applying for a job that she is not a good fit for the position, will any of the customers say anything?
- **WILL CON:** A young woman being very solicitous to her elderly friend is really trying to get him to sign over his house, freezing his own kids out of the will. Will any diners intervene when they witness this elder abuse?

### Friday, April 15, 2011

- **GASTRIC BYPASS:** When a thin mother and her overweight teen daughter discuss gastric bypass surgery for the teen, will any fellow diners say anything? Will it matter who is pushing for the potentially dangerous surgery, the mom or the daughter?
- **ELDERLY WORKER:** With the state of the current economy, a growing number of senior citizens are being forced to re-enter the job market. "WWYD" goes to a busy gourmet food store to observe two senior citizens on their first day on the job behind the register. Due to a computer problem of our making, the seniors can't get the scanner to work. Will customers become impatient and assume the delay is a result of our seniors' age, or will they show compassion and understanding?
- **SOBRIETY:** A woman is celebrating her one year of sobriety at a restaurant/bar with a couple of friends, toasting with non-alcoholic beverages. Once her friends depart, the woman immediately goes to bar and asks for a double vodka, but is denied. Will any bystanders take her money to buy her a drink, helping her fall off the wagon? What if it's a man celebrating his sobriety?
- **RETAIL EMPLOYEE ABUSE:** Is the customer always right, even when they're clearly wrong? A high maintenance female shopper in a women's clothing store is overly demanding and outright rude to the store's hard working employee. Will other customers step in to stop the abusive behavior? What if the store's manager intervenes and sides with the customers, based on her fabricated account of what transpired... even firing the employee? Will witnesses set the manager straight and save the employee's job?

### Friday, April 22, 2011

- **PREGNANT ON THE JOB:** Will patrons say anything when a visibly pregnant waitress, working hard, is being discriminated against by her manager for being pregnant? What if the waitress is goofing off, using pregnancy as an excuse to chat on her cell phone and watch TV?
- **SUPERFICIAL SPOUSE:** A man harshly criticizes his wife publicly, encouraging, even trying to persuade her to change her looks through cosmetic procedures to look more youthful. The wife doesn't see anything wrong with her looks and says so. Will anyone intervene?
- **DISCRIMINATING PARENTS:** Will any diners speak up when they witness an inter-racial couple being demeaned by offensive parents who do not accept their child's choice of future spouse?

- **BEGGING FOR GAS:** With high gasoline prices and a falling economy, how will people react to someone who approaches them begging not for money, but for a few gallons of gasoline? Will the unsuspecting motorists react differently to female and male beggars?

Friday, May 6, 2011

- **Blind, Blind Date:** It's his first date with a supermodel (at least that's what *she* says she is). But he has to take her word for it, because he's blind. Will his fellow patrons at the bar let him know she's lying?
- **The Grazer:** A "grazer" is supermarket industry term for people who eat products before buying them or even eat and then opt not to buy them at all. Will anyone object to someone openly "grazing" in the produce aisle at a supermarket?
- **Job discrimination:** Will anyone come to a job applicant's defense when they overhear the boss engage in religious discrimination during the interview?
- **Baby Be Mine:** An excited couple arrive at a diner waiting for their teenage surrogate mother to join them. But when the very pregnant teenage girl shows up and tells them she has changed her mind and wants to keep the baby, the couple starts to verbally assault her, saying she betrayed their trust and are going to sue her to get their money back. Will anyone intervene?

Friday, May 13, 2011

- **TIGER MOM:** Recently there has been a lot of public debate around Amy Chua and her book, Battle Hymn of the Tiger Mother. The issue of tough Chinese parenting has hit such a raw nerve in the U.S. that the author has even received death threats. Will anyone at a restaurant intervene when they witness a strict Asian "Tiger Mom" – who is being tough on her daughter?
- **PREGNANCY SCAM:** A pregnant teenage girl waits at a diner for the arrival of the adoptive parents for her soon-to-be born child. Two couples arrive, separately, and the pregnant teen tells each of them everything they want to hear, that they will be great parents for her unborn child. She thanks them for the money they gave her, and then asks for more. Before leaving, the each couple complies. Will any on-lookers stop this scam in progress?
- **BUYME CONDOMS / PLAN B:** A teenage boy asks pharmacy customers to buy condoms for him, explaining that the pharmacist behind the counter is a family friend and he's too embarrassed. "WWYD" then changes things up with a teenage girl asking customers to buy Plan B for her, under similar circumstances. Will anyone help the teens out?
- **BLACK TEEN COUPLE FIGHTING:** We return to a park to see how people would react to a teen-dating violence scenario. The young boyfriend will be emotionally abusive to his girlfriend and the fight will escalate to the threat of physical harm. Will anyone intervene? Will appearances play a role?

Friday, May 20, 2011 (Season Finale)

- **Gay Couple:** At a busy diner in a Dallas suburb, a gay couple is verbally harassed when their waitress begins an anti-gay diatribe. Her comments are relentless – culminating in her kicking the couple out of the restaurant. Will any bystanders intervene?
- **Interracial Couple:** A black man and his white girlfriend are minding their own business and enjoying some food at a local diner when another patron comes over and interrupts them to chastise the man for choosing a white partner. Will anyone say anything to the racist instigator?
- **Pageant Mom:** At a salon, a mother is having her little girl's nails done and coaching her about an upcoming beauty pageant. The mother suggests to the reluctant little girl to get her eyebrows

waxed to give her a competitive advantage. The little girl screams in protest but her mother insists. Will other customers say anything? What if it's a dad putting pressure on the daughter?

- **Rude Customer:** A woman getting a manicure/pedicure berates her nail technician. She starts with small insults – and then eventually escalates into her saying discriminatory things like “Do you even speak English?” Will people intervene? What if it's a rude male customer?
- **Teen Pregnancy:** A young teen and her boyfriend sit at a table at a small city café. The anxious teen is heard confessing to her boyfriend that she's newly pregnant. The boyfriend doesn't take the news well and lashes out at her, telling her she's going to have to get an abortion. The teen is distraught, but her boyfriend is undeterred. Will anyone step in?
