ISLAM IN AMERICA

The recent controversy over the building of an Islamic community center near Ground Zero has sparked a nationwide conversation about Islam. MURDER MYSTERY

"20/20" goes inside a police investigation as they help unlock a murder mystery haunting a community for ten years. In the summer of 2000, 15-year-old Leah Freeman went missing in Coquille, Oregon. For weeks the police chief treated it as a missing person case, until Leah's decomposed body was found a few miles out of town. Speculation swirled over who the killer could be. Now, ten years later, the new Police Chief Mark Dannels has made it his personal goal to find Leah's killer.

SCAMMED

An ABC News investigation, Brian Ross tracks down the American fugitives accused of being part of a scam that has affected thousands of senior citizens. SCORCHING FEUD

The number of addicts in America has nearly doubled since 2007, according to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration. ABC News Anchor Chris Cuomo reports that heroin addiction is not to be dismissed as an inner-city scourge -- kids from suburban families are falling victim like never before.

WRONGFULLY ACCUSED

What could be worse than facing life in prison for something you insist you did not do, and knowing that your own children put you there? Tonight on "20/20," a father -- a decorated police officer -- accused of a heinous crime... But did he do it? And if not, why would his children lie? What did his two ex-wives have to do with his charges? Was the prosecution hiding evidence? Elizabeth Vargas reports.

Friday, November 12, 2010

BBB

20/20 and ABC stations across the country investigate the Better Business Bureau, whose A+ grade is considered the gold standard for businesses. As Brian Ross reports, the BBB is under fire, accused of using bad ratings and the promise of improved ratings to sell memberships.

Friday, November 19, 2010

MEAN GIRLS

What started as a classic teenage rivalry - two girls locked in a tug of war over the same boy - quickly escalated into internet insults, and finally a deadly street side showdown. The girls learned of each other through Myspace and then used the web as a place to taunt and bait each other. It would all come to a head on a fateful night in April 2009, when words would turn into blows and lives would be forever changed. Ashleigh Banfield reports.

Friday, November 26, 2010

OBAMA INTERVIEW

President and Mrs. Obama will sit together for a Thanksgiving visit in a joint interview with Barbara Walters, the day after the holiday. In addition to focusing on some of the major challenges facing the President today, part of the conversation will be a discussion of how the whole family reacted to the President's political reversal. This interview will be Mrs. Obama's first since the mid-term elections.

Friday, December 3, 2010

CREDIBLE WITNESS?

Whom to believe -- mother or son? Just hours after the drowning death of seven-year-old Adrianna Hutto, her six-year-old brother, AJ, had a horrific story to tell police about their mother, Amanda Lewis. He accused his mother of drowning Adrianna in their Florida pool. "20/20" explores family secrets, the challenges of child testimony, and AJ's heart-wrenching testimony.

POWERHOUSE VOICE

Rhema Marvanne was an unknown seven-year-old when her inspirational songs, first posted on YouTube, turned her into a viral sensation. Now, more than 17 million online views later and counting, the surprisingly poised prodigy is moving beyond the internet. Juju Chang reports on the tragedy that inspired Rhema to sing and her plans for the future.

SEVEN WONDERS

20/20 reports on the modern version of the seven wonders -- real people with superpowers they've developed by dedicating their lives to the basic human urge to overcome limitations... to soar by unlocking abilities hidden deep within.

PRIME TIME: WHAT WOULD YOU DO? (Premiere)

Friday, October 29, 2010

Using hidden cameras, "What Would You Do?" establishes everyday scenarios and then captures people's reactions. Whether people are compelled to act or mind their own business, **John Quiñones** reports on their split-second and often surprising decision-making process.

Friday, November 5, 2010

- **ANTI-SEMITISM:** When a clerk is rude to a young Jewish couple -- insulting them with commonly used anti-Jewish slurs -- will fellow patrons intervene? And will there be a difference in how Jewish or non Jewish bystanders react to the bigoted clerk?
- **DRUNK PARENTS:** What happens when a mom brings her child to a bar, drinking a few too many? Will patrons react any differently if the parent drinking is a dad instead of a mom?
- **FAKE PANHANDLER:** Imagine sitting down in a local outside café/park when you see a woman get out of her car and, before your eyes, transform from dressed up to dressed down. She pulls out a cup/sign and sets up shop to ask for spare change. What would you do? Would it make a difference if it was a man?

- **MUSLIM -- "American" Girl:** Last year "WWYD?" saw how diners reacted when they saw a young, would-be bride trying to escape from her Polygamist family; this season we see how witnesses react to a girl who is unwilling to obey the strict customs of her fundamentalist Muslim family.

Friday, November 12, 2010

- **TEEN DATING VIOLENCE:** One of the first "WWYD?" scenarios involved a man berating his girlfriend, on the verge of physical violence. This time the young boyfriend will be emotionally abusive to his girlfriend and the fight will escalate to the threat of physical harm. One twist will involve changing the couple's attire from conservative/preppy clothes to something edgier.
- **FAKE SLIP & FALL:** It is a multi-billion dollar scam -- a customer in a store slips and falls, then threatens to sue the store for damages. What happens when our perpetrator tries to pull this scam in front of eyewitnesses who know that no such accident occurred? How will people react differently if the person appears to be struggling in a tough economy?
- **THE JUNK FOOD POLICE:** While at a grocery store, an overweight mother and her daughter push a shopping cart filled with groceries with no nutritional value. What will bystanders do when they witness another shopper approach the mom and daughter and criticize them for their choice of food?

Friday, November 19, 2010

- **DRUNK DOCTORS:** Two doctors are at a bar doing some drinking in their scrubs. But instead of being an innocent after work get-together, these doctors make it known to the other patrons that they're an hour or two from beginning their shifts at the local hospital. What will bystanders do knowing that these doctors are not sober enough to pick up a scalpel.
- **BIKINI FAT:** A husband berates his wife for wearing a bikini too soon after she has given birth to their new baby -- telling her she looks fat and needs to lose the extra baby weight before he is willing to be seen with her while she's wearing *that*. How will bystanders react? And what if it's the man out of shape?
- **KIDS ON A LEASH:** A mother parades her young children around on leashes, even ties them to a pole when she goes inside a store. Will anyone say anything to the children or to the mom?

Friday, December 3, 2010

- **TEEN DRUNK DRIVING:** A tipsy teenager stumbles toward his car in full view of shoppers and diners in a popular shopping area. Will anyone stop him from climbing behind the wheel and driving away? How will people respond when the intoxicated teen is a girl? And what happens if it's a couple on a date -- will anyone dare to step in when the boyfriend is drunk and the girlfriend can't stop him?
- **HOMOPHOBIC PARENT:** A teenage boy tells his father he is gay in the middle of a busy café. The father is initially in a state of disbelief and tells his son it's a fad that he will outgrow. The son protests as the father gets angrier and angrier -- finally erupting, "No son of mine is gay." The teen dissolves into tears as the father storms out of the café. How will bystanders respond? And how will people respond when a teen comes out to an intolerant mother instead?
- **MOM'S TIRADE:** A mom stands rink-side at her daughter's skating practice and yells insults at her across the ice... "That is pathetic!" "You're not a champion! Try harder! Skate faster!" When the daughter comes off the ice, the mom continues her tirade -- "This is embarrassing." Bystanders watch as the daughter (actually a real-life skating champ) glides and spins perfectly -- will they confront the mother or walk away? Will people respond differently if it's a coach who berates the skater?

Friday, December 10, 2010

- **DATE RAPE DRUG:** A past "WWYD?" scenario showed how people jumped to the rescue of a woman they suspected was being drugged by a man. But what would happen if a man were being drugged by an innocent looking young woman?
- **DRAG QUEENS:** At clubs across the country, audiences cheer as drag queens strut their stuff on stage. But not everyone is so enthusiastic about men dressed as women. When two drag queens enter a coffee shop they're greeted with a mean-spirited waiter. Will customers jump to the drag queens' defense?
- **PREGNANT DRINKER:** A pregnant woman who looks like she might give birth at any moment sits at a bar ordering drink after drink. What would you do – toast with her, or try to take her drink away?
- **BIKE THEFT:** What happens when a thief snatches a bike in broad daylight in a crowded park? What happens each time when the culprits are white, black and then, a female?

Friday, December 17, 2010

- **MEAN GIRLS:** We all know adolescence can be tough and that teens can be cruel. But while "bullying" may be associated with boys, girls can be bullies too. "What Would You Do?" creates a scenario where three girls verbally attack another in a park, what will witnesses do?
- **GAY PARENTS:** A lesbian couple are eating dinner with their two young children when a nosy waiter complains that having two mommies is "unnatural" and asks the family to leave the restaurant. This scenario is based on real incidents across the country. In fact, gay and lesbian couples can be thrown out of restaurants legally in several states. Will other restaurant patrons intervene, or will they look the other way?
- **ALONE IN A CAR:** Almost 40 children die every year after being left behind in a hot car. Did these kids go unnoticed or did strangers just walk on by? Using a lifelike doll, "What Would You Do?" examines how people passing by would react if they did indeed noticed – would they come to the baby's rescue?
- **SHOPPING WHILE BLACK:** How will people react when they witness overt racial profiling in a retail setting? When a store clerk in a chic Manhattan clothing boutique starts trailing a well-dressed black woman solely because of her race, will customers step in or will they turn their heads and just keep shopping? And what will happen if the shoppers being followed are a group of teenagers – will reactions be different?
- **CALLER FROM HELL:** Almost everyone has experienced it -- the obnoxious person in a restaurant talking so loudly on his cell phone that there is no escape; everyone must hear every word. How will the frustrated diners react? And when an attractive woman plays the part, does it change everything?
