FOUL PLAY?

Did Michele MacNeill, a former beauty queen and mother of eight, really die of natural causes after falling unconscious in the bathtub, as her husband, Martin, suspected and police concluded? The medical examiner originally ruled death by natural causes, but is there more to this tragedy than meets the eye? Could Martin, a well-established local doctor, have been responsible, as his daughters Alexis and Rachel allege? Elizabeth Vargas' reports.

BEATING THE ODDS

One man's murderous rampage 20 years ago destroyed his own family and devastated a Northern California wine country community. Now Schadler updates what has happened since, including making it to the second round of "American Idol," an epic triumph for Carmina, who survived having her throat slashed from ear to ear. Friday, March 25, 2011

FIERY DEATH

Jennifer Schipsi seemed like the girl who had it all, until her life came to a tragic end. Police believe she was strangled by her boyfriend, local business owner Bulos "Paul" Zumot, who then allegedly staged a fire in the home they shared to cover up the murder. The two had a tumultuous past with a history of domestic violence... but would evidence show that Paul murdered Jennifer? Jim Avila reports.

PRIMETIME: WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

Friday, January 7, 2011

- **EMTs on Break, not Willing to Help:** Will any bystanders intervene when two emergency medical technicians, clearly on break, stand by and do nothing to help a woman who collapses right in front of them?
- **You Break it, You Buy it:** A "WWYD?" "shopper" accidentally breaks something at a high end interior design showroom chock full of expensive home furnishings. What will happen when she asks the surrounding shoppers to remain quiet and not tell the manager what happened or who was at fault? At what point will tempers flare?
- **Dine and Dash:** Three loud teenage boys, out for a meal at an established family restaurant, dare each other to exit without paying for their food. When the check arrives, one by one they slyly make their way out of the diner - having just pulled off a "dine and dash." How will fellow diners respond?
- **Yelling at the Elderly:** What will people do if they saw an elderly man being taunted by a group of teenage boys -- will anyone confront the kids and step in to save the senior? What will happen if, instead of an elderly man, the boys decide to harass an elderly woman? Finally, what if the bullies are teenage girls?

Friday, January 14, 2011

- **UNDERAGE DRINKING:** The Center for Disease Control reports that 11% of all alcohol consumed in the United States is by people under 21 years old. So what will happen when bystanders are confronted with seemingly underage teens pretending to get wasted in public?
- **HARASSMENT:** What would you do if you saw three construction workers harassing an attractive young woman who asks them to stop flirting?
- **SHOPLIFTING:** Some statistics say senior citizen non-violent crime is up five-fold. So "WWYD" wondered how people would respond if they were eyewitnesses to elderly shoplifters helping themselves to food from the stocked shelves. Even law enforcement were surprised.
- **GOLD DIGGER:** A young, attractive woman sits at the bar with her fiancé -- a much older man. When he goes to the restroom, the woman confides in the bartender, telling him she can't wait for her fiancé to die so she can get his money and finally marry someone her own age. What happens if the couple is an older woman and a younger man?

Friday, January 21, 2011

- **OVERWEIGHT CUSTOMER:** What will happen when an overweight customer orders fattening, unhealthy items and her waiter, instead, suggests low calorie alternatives? Will other customers support the waiter, or will they empathize with the overweight customer?
- **INTERRACIAL COUPLE:** Will anyone take a stand when an interracial couple is harassed by fellow bar patrons?
- **FOOD STAMPS:** When a woman using food stamps is informed she does not have enough left in her monthly allowance to cover the cost of her groceries, will someone step in to help her?
- **GENDER APPROPRIATE TOYS:** The decision recently made public by two mothers to allow their five-year-old boys to wear dresses has stirred up debate over gender stereotypes and public perceptions. What will happen at a toy store when parents tell their children not to play with toys some consider inappropriate for their gender?

Friday, January 28, 2011

- **RUDE RESTAURANT CUSTOMER:** What will happen when a rude and demanding customer not only serves up insults to his waitress, but starts to interfere with other diners' eating experiences? Will anyone stand up to his obnoxious behavior?
- **MIXED-RACE FAMILY:** What would you do if an African American father and his white daughter are sharply questioned by a coffee shop manager? What happens when it's a white father and a black daughter?
- **FAKE PANHANDLER:** Imagine sitting down in a local outside café/park when you see a woman get out of her car and, before your eyes, transform from dressed up to dressed down. She pulls out a cup/sign and sets up shop to ask for spare change. What would you do? What happens when the panhandler is a man?
- **FAKE SLIP AND FALL:** It's a multi-billion dollar scam -- a customer in a store slips and falls, then threatens to sue the store for damages. What happens when our perpetrator tries to pull this scam in front of eyewitnesses who know that no such accident occurred in the first place?

Friday, February 4, 2011

- **ARIZONA IMMIGRATION LAW:** What will bystanders do when they observe people being racially profiled right in front of them? "WWYD" travels to Arizona, which has recently enacted a controversial illegal immigration law that would permit law enforcement to seek identification from people suspected of being illegal aliens, even having committed no crime. Will anyone speak up when they observe an off-duty security guard confront a Latino family at a restaurant and demand identification for no apparent reason other than their appearance? In a twist, John Quinones himself steps into the role of the one being questioned.
- **STEALING TIPS:** It's a ritual of restaurant dining, tipping your waiter. But when someone steals the waiter's tip, will anyone in the restaurant say anything? The different ways people respond might be surprising.
- **DEAF DISCRIMINATION:** Will anyone intervene when a coffee shop manager blatantly discriminates against two deaf women applying for a job?
- **WANTED:** Customers sit at diner when a man who says he's a bounty hunter hands out a poster of someone wanted for passing counterfeit bills. What will the diners do when the wanted man comes into the restaurant? Will they say anything or mind their own business?

Friday, February 18, 2011

- **LOOKING FOR ALCOHOL:** Will any patrons of a liquor store buy alcohol for three underage teenage boys? What happens when the teens are girls?
- **DRESSING SEXY:** Will anyone in a clothing store say anything when a controlling boyfriend pressures his innocent looking girlfriend into buying and wearing sexy clothes? What happens when it's an overbearing mom -- concerned that her daughter doesn't look sexy enough to be popular in school -- who insists on buying her daughter provocative clothes?
- **AIDS DISCRIMINATION:** To explore the many myths about the AIDS disease, "What Would You Do" cameras capture the reactions of patrons at a restaurant to a fellow "diner" who says he has AIDS.

Tuesday, February 22, 2011

- **TEENAGE ABORTION:** While eating at a restaurant, a teenaged girl tells her teen boyfriend that she's pregnant and wants to keep the baby. The boyfriend, visually upset, says for all to hear that he wants no part in the rearing of the child and suggests she end the pregnancy. Will anyone in the restaurant speak up? Submitted by: Grand Prize Winner Jared Smith from Chippewa Falls, WI
- **DISCRIMINATION:** A little person is hassled and mocked for his size by fellow customers while shopping. Will anyone intervene? Submitted by: Grand Prize Winner Casey Hubelbank from Meriden, CT
- **HOMOPHOBIC CHILD:** Child: What would you do if, while at a restaurant, you witnessed a father telling his child that he is gay, and the child loudly showing disgust and intolerance over the situation? Submitted by: Damen Sterling from Taylor, MI
- **WHEELCHAIR ABUSE:** A capable young woman in a wheelchair is shopping at her local grocery store when a well intentioned customer tries to help. When she politely declines the offer, the help quickly turns into harassment. How will other shoppers react when they see our highly independent disabled actress being patronized as if she's a child? Contest winner Amy Saffell says it's a situation she frequently faces. Submitted by: Grand Prize Winner Amy Saffell from Franklin, TN
- **INSULTED:** A boy is insulted and abused by a group of boys at a diner. Will other patrons step in? Will anyone join in with the "ginger abuse" – when red heads are verbally attacked by others because of the color of their hair? Submitted by: Jonathan Gilsdorf from Rocklin, California (please note: Jonathan did not meet the contest age requirement and was not an official contestant)
- **"WWYD" CLASSROOM ASSIGNMENT:** John Quiñones and the "WWYD?" cameras visit students from a Buffalo, New York middle school class who submitted scenario ideas for a teacher's assignment (these submissions were not official contest entries as they were sent in by minors).

Friday, February 25, 2011

- **GAY MILITARY SERVICEMEN:** It has only been two months since the military's "don't ask, don't tell" policy was repealed. While polls show a majority of Americans support the end of the 17-year-old policy, others have openly opposed the decision. The repeal remains a hot topic, so "WWYD?" decided to set up its hidden cameras in a NJ diner to see how some fellow diners felt about openly gay servicemen showing affection in public.
- **INTERRACIAL ADOPTION:** Two friends having lunch together to meet the newly adopted daughter of one of the women turns into an uncomfortable situation when the other woman disapproves - since the new daughter is black and the mother is white. Will anyone at a restaurant interrupt their lunch and stand up for the new mom?
- **ONLINE SCAMS:** At an internet cafe, an older woman is having trouble with her computer and asks another patron to help her wire money to a man halfway around the world for what she believes is a fantastic opportunity. It is pretty clear that she is being scammed. Will bystanders come to her aid?

Friday, March 4, 2011

- **GAY MILITARY SERVICEMENT:** It has only been two months since the military's "don't ask, don't tell" policy was repealed, with the final implementation awaiting review by the President, the Secretary of Defense and the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. While polls show a majority of Americans support the end of the 17-year-old policy, others have openly opposed the decision. The repeal remains a hot topic, so "WWYD?" decided to set up its hidden cameras in a NJ diner to see how some fellow diners felt about openly gay servicemen showing affection in public.
- **MISBEHAVING KIDS:** Will anyone in a diner approach a parent whose two out-of-control kids are wreaking havoc, disturbing some of the customers? What if an overwhelmed waiter asks the children to please quiet down and the hi-jinks continue, or if the "manager" throws them out of the restaurant.... will patrons cheer the manager or stand by the family?
- **BOTOX MOM-ZILLA:** What will patrons do at a beauty salon intervene when a mother tries to convince her reluctant teenage daughter to get botox?

Friday, March 11, 2011

- **WORK-OUT FROM HELL:** Health clubs and fitness centers around the country are more popular than ever, but they're also a hotbed for some bad behavior and lack of respect for others. "WWYD's" hidden cameras looks at etiquette at the gym - will anyone speak up when a man monopolizes the equipment, or refuses to clean up his weights, or chats on his cell phone while others wait their turn? And what will happen when the "WWYD" "gym member" enters a gym class late, talks and laughs and even take on the instructor during the routine?
- **FLIRTING WITH DANGER:** A couple sit at a bar having dinner together. The wife is very into the husband, but the husband is paying very little attention to her. When she excuses herself to go to the bathroom, the husband aggressively hits on a single woman seating nearby, asking if she would like to go out sometime. Will bystanders blow the husband's cover when his wife comes back from the bathroom?
- **ONLINE BULLYING:** The anonymity of the internet allows individuals to bully and tease relentlessly and often with little consequence. So "WWYD" set up a scenario to see if any patrons of a coffee shop will intervene when they overhear "mean girls" harassing a fellow classmate over the internet with degrading comments and unflattering pictures.

Friday, March 18, 2011

- **FAVORITISM:** Will fellow shoppers say anything when a mother clearly favors one daughter, making rude comments to her other daughter, while shopping at a clothing store?
- **TEEN BIKINI FAT:** When a mother berates her daughter at the beach for wearing a bikini that makes her look fat, throwing insult after insult, will anyone stand up for the daughter?
- **SERVICE DOG DISCRIMINATION:** A woman who relies on her service dog is harassed by fellow diners at a restaurant. The disabled person assures the manager that, not only is the dog specially trained and well behaved, but it is legal for her to have him with her at a restaurant. But the maitre d' / manager sides with the other diners. How will other patrons react?
- **LAUNDROMAT THEFT:** What will happen when someone starts to steal clothes from someone else's dryer at a laundromat? Will anyone confront the potential thief?

Friday, March 25, 2011

- **RACE APPROPRIATE TOYS:** A landmark study conducted in the 1940s, and cited to support desegregation in *Brown v Board of Education*, showed that a majority of black children showed an inherent preference for playing with white dolls over black dolls, identifying with the white dolls and displaying a poignant disconnect from dolls of their own skin color. Fast forward to 2011 – what happens when a white child opts for a black doll and vice versa? What if the caretakers for the children begin admonishing the children for their choice of dolls? Will anyone intervene?
- **WAITER SERVING DIRTY FOOD:** When a waiter drops food on the floor and serves it to an unsuspecting couple sitting in a booth, will anyone warn the couple or say anything to the waiter? Twist: Will anyone say anything after they hear how rude and obnoxious the couple is to the waiter?
- **CHEATING HUSBAND:** When a travelling businessman makes his daily Skype call to check in with his wife, he says all the right things – telling her he misses her and that he hates the marathon meetings he's been stuck in. Unfortunately, the other customers at this internet café are seeing a much different picture. What they know and the wife doesn't, is that he has a woman with him just off camera... and the only business they're up to is funny business. Will customers step in to say something to the man?
- **TOO THIN MODEL:** An already thin teen model type is berated by her agent to eat less. When the young woman tries to order something other than a salad, the agent scolds her. Will anyone intervene?

A BARBARA WALTERS SPECIAL: A MATTER OF LIFE & DEATH

What do Barbara Walters, President Bill Clinton, David Letterman, Regis Philbin, Robin Williams and Charlie Rose all have in common? They all went from being in the spotlight to being in the operating room for life-and-death open heart surgery. Now in a groundbreaking report, the "brotherhood of the cracked chest club" (as Robin Williams describes them) all open their hearts to Walters and reveal their emotional stories of how they triumphed over heart disease.
