Friday, January 9, 2015

A FEW OF OUR FAVORITE THINGS

- With money on her mind, Jaqueline Luongo was charged with murdering – and then impersonating – her roommate. The key witness: Luongo's friend and confidante Maria Calderon. For Luongo that was one witness too many, and police say that from jail she tries to put out a hit on Maria. But when the Broward County Sheriff's office gets wind of the scheme, they give "20/20" rare access to their operation as they go undercover with a fake hitman, a fake lawyer, and even a fake corpse to give Ms. Luongo a special surprise. Matt Gutman reports.
- The California DMV lies in wait along popular hiking routes, looking for able-bodied motorists parking in coveted handicapped spaces. Jim Avila and "20/20" cameras are there as the cops swoop in.
- "20/20" outfits a Brooklyn brownstone with hidden cameras to put exterminators and their heavily-marketed bedbug dogs to the test. Is that beagle really smelling the dreaded pest, or is he just hungry for a snack? Paula Faris reports.
- Federal agents rigged up a Social Security office with hidden cameras to catch Lawrence Popp as he came in to be assessed by a local benefits administrator -- making bold, categorical claims about his inability to drive or read because of blindness, moments before he hit the freeway as he headed home. Rebecca Jarvis reports on one man caught on camera defrauding social security.

Friday, January 16, 2015

MEET THE PARENTS

- Why on earth would two highly educated lawyers and parents plant drugs in the car of a fellow parent who is the president of the PTA and a school volunteer? Chris Connelly's report on the bizarre case out of Irvine, California includes revealing interviews with the victim, prosecutor, and police.
- Nick Watt reports on a family caught between new relaxed marijuana laws and older tighter child protection statutes. "20/20" follows all the twists and turns of a custody case involving parents whose five year old son is taken into state custody because of marijuana use even though it is legal in their state.
- They are a typical American family – a father, mother and two biological children. But in one important respect, they are anything but typical -- the parents are both transgender. Bianca was born a boy and transitioned to live as a woman, while Nick was born a girl and has lived as a man. They met and fell in love, can't afford sex reassignment surgeries, and will remain as they are for now. Nick bore the children and they are raising their children and preparing to face the many questions from their kids and the world. They say they are ready for anything. Elizabeth Vargas has their story.
- Police allege that Diane Staudte woke up one morning and decided she had enough of being a wife and mom. With the help of her daughter and some well-mixed anti-freeze cocktails, police allege she successfully killed her husband, then her son, and very nearly another daughter – who lived to tell the tale to "20/20." Deborah Roberts reports.

Friday, January 23, 2015

CAMPUS CONFIDENTIAL

- Logan, a junior on a scholarship at University of Massachusetts Amherst, was busted for selling drugs on campus, he was offered – and accepted – a deal not to be arrested if he became a confidential informant, helping campus police bust his former roommate for drugs. He ended up dying of his own addiction problem months later. Did the campus police forsake Logan's well-being for its own interests? Elizabeth Vargas reports.
- Nearly one in five women are sexually assaulted on college campuses every year, and many schools are under fire for the way they handle these crimes. But Southern Oregon University's "You Have Options" is a unique program that works to break down the barriers so many victims face -- guaranteeing confidentiality, giving victims the choice to proceed with a criminal or campus investigation, and most importantly partnering closely with local law enforcement to ensure

perpetrators are held accountable. Niki, who was raped by her boyfriend during her junior year, speaks candidly to 20/20.

VANDERBILT ASSAULT TRIAL

It is the scandalous crime that has made headlines across the country -- college football stars at one of the country's most prestigious schools just this week convicted of assaulting a fellow student while she was unconscious after a night of out-of-control drinking. What really happened inside a Vanderbilt dorm room? ABC News Correspondent Ryan Smith reports.

Friday, February 6, 2015

FAMILY SECRETS

- When former White House Counsel J. Michael Farren learned of his wife's plans to divorce him, he beat her nearly to death in their Connecticut mansion. Mary Margaret Farren barely escaped with her life and her two young daughters. Now, in an exclusive "20/20" interview, Mary Margaret reveals to ABC's Amy Robach the harrowing details of her escape from domestic violence and the nearly deadly marriage.
- Catch Him If You Can...The young man's hospital badge said he was a physician's assistant at Osceola Hospital in Florida. He wore scrubs, a stethoscope, and examined patients while dropping medical terminology, even performing CPR on a patient who had overdosed. Months later, he was allegedly cruising South Beach in what looked like a police cruiser, stopping other drivers to tell them to put on their seat belts. Matthew Scheidt was neither a physician nor a cop -- he was a fraud. Matt Gutman reports.

Friday, February 13, 2015

REAL ESTATE ROULETTE

How far would one woman go after losing her dream home in a bidding war to another couple? Kathy Rowe of San Diego turned to pranks on the new home owners, from re-listing the house for sale online and even advertising for a fake New Year's Eve party at the house. Yet, she was sentenced for stalking the young married couple. Rowe speaks exclusively to ABC News' Chris Connelly.

Also: As the spring real estate season kicks into gear, real estate agents are on guard as an uptick in open house criminal activity – everything from robberies to murders – makes showing a home a potentially risky proposition. "20/20" speaks to a survivor of an assault; relives some caught-on-cam moments; get tips from Barbara Corcoran; and attends a self-defense class customized for brokers. Rebecca Jarvis reports.

And: What happens when a very wealthy couple gets divorced but decide to continue co-habiting with their daughters in their multi-million dollar Manhattan apartment? Complicating matters, mom gets married again and has another baby. Such is the situation in the swanky building on the Upper West Side as real estate agent Carol Levy and her husband try to find some way to make it work. Deborah Roberts reports.

Friday, February 20, 2015

SLENDER MAN

What started out as a normal middle school sleepover took a horrifying turn when one 12 year-old girl was stabbed 19 times by her two best friends and left for dead in the Wisconsin woods. The girls' motive and the miraculous recovery of the survivor made headlines around the world since the May attack. The two girls, who are both charged with attempted first-degree intentional homicide, say they attacked their friend because they wanted to prove themselves to a mysterious, fictional internet character called "Slender Man," who they believe to be real. Who is "Slender Man" and why should parents be aware of him? New details have emerged in the trial and, together, "20/20" goes inside the interrogation room and David Muir's reports.

Friday, March 13, 2015

STRANGE AFFLICTION

"20/20" takes viewers into the lives of people with some of the most unusual medical mysteries.

- Cynthia and Brandon Ross of Maine rushed their infant son to the hospital with swollen legs. When doctors examined the baby, they found fractures all over his little body. They charged Brandon with child abuse and their two children were placed in foster care. Brandon and Cynthia believe their son suffers from a rare medical condition called Ehler Danlos Syndrome, which causes bruising and flexible joints. Brandon is awaiting his day in court or for the charges to be dropped. Deborah Robert reports.
- What if you woke up one morning to discover your partner was no longer the person you thought you married? After Heather suffered a potentially life threatening brain trauma and two weeks in a

coma, she awoke with a change in personality. Her brain trauma seemed to make her hypersexual, pursuing men in addition to her husband. Elizabeth Vargas reports.

- Sixteen-year-old "Beckie O" went viral when she disclosed her most closely held secret to thousands of fans on her YouTube channel. She's a "Trichster," suffering from a hair pulling disorder. She shares with us her years of documenting her experience. Elizabeth Vargas reports.
- Jessica Mellen, 29, suffers from Anxiety Disorder. Jessica's most intense fear is the fear of vomiting. Jessica tells her fiancé she does not think she can have kids because she is too fearful of morning sickness. Wanting to marry the man she loves, Jessica decides to put herself through "exposure therapy" and, for five months, our cameras follow her as she confronts her fears. Will she make it to the altar?

Friday, March 20, 2015

TERROR ON THE TRESTLE

- There may be no boss who commands more power than a movie director. But what happens when the safety of the crew is compromised for the sake of getting a great shot? When a dream sequence scene soon turns into a nightmare, tragically, 27-year-old camera assistant Sarah Jones is killed instantly and others are injured. Sarah's death shocks the film community. Director Randall Miller pleads guilty to involuntary manslaughter making it the first time a director in the history of filmmaking is sent to jail for the death of a crewmember. Sarah Jones' parents take a journey up the Altamaha River to see, first hand, the trestle where their daughter tragically lost her life. "20/20" reports.
- Robert Durst, the son of a real estate mogul, is under suicide watch at a Louisiana prison after being arrested in New Orleans earlier this week on a warrant out of Los Angeles, where he was charged in the 2000 murder of his friend, Susan Berman. He was arrested the day before HBO aired the finale of "The Jinx," its documentary series about Durst covering the 1982 disappearance of his first wife in New York, his acquittal for the dismemberment murder of a neighbor in Texas and Berman's slaying. Elizabeth Vargas reports.

OCCUPATIONAL HAZARDS

- Dov Charney, one of the most outrageous and controversial CEOs, discusses his ouster from the iconic retailer American Apparel and his plans to re-take control of the company. Gio Benitez reports.
- **Confessions of a Customer Service Rep:** Does anything make the blood boil more than getting stuck on the line with a horrible customer service rep? "20/20" interviews a customer service rep who says lowly paid and overworked reps sometimes deliberately antagonize their customers.
- **Don't Hit Send:** That super snarky tweet or post could give you 30 seconds of happiness and a lifetime of career-crippling shame. "20/20" chronicles the case of Adam Smith, who uploaded a YouTube video of himself confronting a drive-thru clerk at a Chick-Fil-A that went viral and caused a downward spiral that took him from the CFO's office to unemployment.
- The Quitzilla is a new breed of employee who orchestrates his or her departure into a major media event. Charlo Greene, the former Alaska local news reporter who quit live on the air after doing a segment about a medical marijuana club, tells "20/20" how she came up with her plan and that she has no regrets. Chris Connelly reports.

FROM BEST FRIENDS TO KILLERS

Sixteen-year-old Skylar Neese disappeared from her home one summer night, last seen on surveillance video sneaking out of her window and getting into a sedan. What many thought was a typical case of a teenage runaway turned out to be something much more wicked – Neese was stabbed to death by her two best friends. The police had no leads until a surprising break in the case. Correspondent Ryan Smith interviews Neese's parents, police and high school classmates to unravel the horrific mystery and murder, and ultimately the surprising suspects.

Saturday, January 10, 2015

BURNING BED

Who killed Lucy Johnson, shot in the head twice and left in a house set on fire? With no shortage of suspects including her ex-boyfriend and her fiancé, pregnant after just three weeks together and engaged after three months, "20/20" follows the twists and turns of this explosive whodunit story. Police focused on

four men in her life, believing it was not a stranger since no locks in the house were forced. Even Lucy had an opinion about who might have wanted her dead, as her journal was read in court.

Saturday, January 24, 2015

COLLEGE LOVE TRIANGLE

A beautiful college student loved by two young men. One vanishes. A frantic search uncovers his body in the swamps of Florida. After a two-year investigation, Pedro Bravo was accused of strangling his romantic rival and one-time best friend Christian Aguilar to death, and faced first degree murder. This murder mystery made national headlines and Bravo's trial was watched by millions. Aguilar's family speaks out about the jealous rage that cost a young college student his life. And the woman at the center of the tragic love triangle, Erika Friman, also breaks her silence with Matt Gutman reports.

Saturday, January 31, 2015

DESIGNING WOMEN

- In one of the most sensational cases Houston has ever seen, a Texas jury found Ana Trujillo guilty of stabbing her boyfriend, University of Houston professor Stefan Andersson, to death with a stiletto high heel after a night of drinking. Trujillo, who has claimed all along that she was acting in self-defense, speaks exclusively to ABC News' Ryan Smith. (OAD: 4/11/14)
- Tawny Blazejowski is a one-of-a-kind stalker who set her sights on her ex-boyfriend, Joe Good, and strangely, just about everyone he knew – from his landlord to his current girlfriend's daughter to his neighbor. Blazejowski would physically threaten her victims, plant drugs, make accusations of child molestation, and her specialty -- she distributed lots of porn. Tawny, a detail oriented stalker, documented all her actions and plans in a series of carefully kept spiral notebooks. It was a practice that helped put her behind bars. Matt Gutman reports. (OAD: 10/17/14)
- Jim Avila with the case of a 36-year-old mother accused of plotting and executing the claw-hammer murder of her child's father. Was it self-defense after years of abuse, or was she just after the insurance money. Avila's report includes interviews with the nanny and the victim's sister. (OAD: 4/11/14)

MYSTERY ONJOHNSBURG ROAD

How does a man wind up being convicted of committing a murder at a grocery store when no body, no weapon, and no DNA link him to the scene? That is exactly what happened to Mario Casciaro in 2013 when he was convicted of killing 17-year-old Brian Carrick, and is now serving a 26-year sentence. Prosecutors were successful in getting a conviction on the very rare and controversial charge of murder by intimidation because another stock boy, Shane Lamb—in exchange for an immunity deal—told prosecutors he knocked Carrick out during a fight, and then left Casciaro with the unconscious Carrick. Yet could potentially explosive evidence, including Shane Lamb's recent recanting of his story, help Casciaro prove his innocence? ABC News Correspondent Ryan Smith reports.

Saturday, March 14, 2015

ROAD TO RUIN

- The Hunt for the Kansas City shooter: This spring, motorists in the Kansas City area had to cope with much more than rush hour traffic – a lone gunman was firing at vehicles on the highway, nine times in all. Once police determined they had a serial shooter on their hands, they deployed a series of sophisticated and controversial investigative techniques to move from a series of random data points to the arrest of suspect Mohammed Whitaker and his green Dodge Neon. Jim Avila reports.
- Hazardous Guardrails?: Brian Ross investigates a major manufacturer of highway guardrails accused of making a design change that has caused these accident cushions to become lethal lances in some gruesome accidents.
- Truckers: In the wake of the Tracy Morgan fatal crash, more questions than ever are popping up about fatigued truckers and the safety of those massive rigs on the road. Matt Gutman talks to a trucker who reveals the pressures companies put on drivers to stay on the road, and he shares video of his own dispatchers telling him to keep driving even though he is complaining that he is falling asleep at the wheel. Additionally, "20/20" reports.
