Description: The numbers of homeless in the city are staggering. This past September, an all-time record was set in the city, with 58,000 homeless sleeping in shelters. Many of the homeless are from hard working families with limited income who simply cannot find affordable housing. Jay Dow talks about one such family he profiled. Affordable housing in the city is limited. Many live in NYCHA housing developments where rents are stabilized. But life in the developments isn't always stable. Jay Dow discusses the problems at NYCHA.

Just two weeks before the hurricane totally destroyed their home, Kotula and his wife welcomed their first child. Now, their second child will arrive in — hopefully — to a far less stressful scenario. The Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation made it all possible thanks to its network of thousands of volunteers. It was created in memory of the firefighter, the group's namesake, who died responding to the World Trade Center on Sept. 11. So far, the foundation has completely rebuilt and restored 150 homes with an additional 40 homes expected to be complete by early next year. It's restored thousands of other homes damaged by the storm.

Description: PIX11 Cares: A Breast Cancer Awareness Month news special helped the community take on the disease that kills one in eight women. We shared stories of struggle and survival, explained the BRCA gene mutation and its strong connection to breast and ovarian cancers, and showed our viewers how they can lower their risk at developing the disease. But we wanted to do more than just talk, we wanted to help. Breast cancer is the leading cause of cancer deaths for women in Brooklyn so we went there to help those who are uninsured get screened. We partnered with Project Renewal's ScanVan and Susan G. Komen to offer free mammograms outside of the Kings County Courthouse. We were also joined by Brooklyn Borough President Eric Adams, Miss USA Nia Sanchez, and many incredible volunteers. PIX11 was also in New Jersey, helping women there get checked. We partnered with St. Michael's Medical Center's 'In the Pink' program to provide free breast screenings and follow-up mammograms to uninsured women. Dr. Rachel Wellner from Hackensack University Medical Center was also there giving health talks, teaching self-breast exams and answering questions. Susan G. Komen and other community organizations set up tables as resources for women. New York Giants punter Steve Weatherford was also there to talk about why this cause is important to him. PIX11 Cares was also online. We had a dedicated page for this special that included a video diary of Star Lopez's journey leading up to her preventative double mastectomy, we provided resources for women looking for a way to get screened, and more. Immediately following the special, Dr. Wellner held a very successful live webchat through Facebook to answer any breast health-related questions.
