Sun, 7/13/14

Issue: Criminal Justice System/Education
Guests: Brooklyn District Attorney Ken Thompson; NYC Comptroller Scott Stringer
Description: Brooklyn DA Ken Thompson discusses his controversial policy not to prosecute low level marijuana arrests. Will it undermine police efforts to enforce the law? He also talks about his conviction review unit. His office is reviewing 90 cases. At least half a dozen convictions have already been overturned. And, City Comptroller Scott Stringer points fingers at the Department of Education for failing to effectively address the problem of overcrowded schools.

Sun, 7/20/14

Issue: Brooklyn Renaissance/15 year anniversary of JFK Jr's death
Guests: Brooklyn Borough President Eric Adams; Rosemarie Terenzio, JFK Jr's former assistant; political analysts Jeanne Zaino and Morgan Pehme
Description: Brooklyn Borough President Eric Adams talks about his borough's renaissance, and efforts to get the Democratic National Convention there. Was JFK Jr. destined for a political future...perhaps to follow in his father's footsteps into the White House? It's a question that's been asked over and over since that fateful day, the 38-year-old was killed in a plane crash 15 years ago. Guests discuss what might have been had he lived.

Sun, 7/27/14

Issue: Fallout from death of unarmed Staten Island man/The New Bronx
Guests: Richard Aborn, Citizens Crime Commission President; Bronx Borough President Ruben Diaz Jr.
Description: Richard Aborn weighs in on the death of Eric Garner who died after being put in an apparent chokehold by police. Bronx Borough President Ruben Diaz Jr. talks about the new Bronx...and development along the Harlem River waterfront.

Sun, 8/3/14

Issue: Politics/Mideast FAA

Guests: Morgan Pehme, Editor-in-Chief of City and State; Jeanne Zaine, Professor of Political Science at Iona College; Jeffrey Gardere, clinical psychologist and professor behavioral medicine at Touro College; PIX11 reporter Mario Diaz.

Description: Political analysts weigh in on ethics questions surrounding Governor Cuomo on his alleged interference with the Moreland Commission, which he himself created to investigate state government corruption. Though Israel maintains its current offensive is in defense of attacks on Israel by Hamas, whose goal is to destroy the Jewish state, the images of Palestinian casualties—many of them civilians—are creating outrage around the world. Guest Jeff Gardere talks about how images can shape public opinion. PIX 11 reporter Mario Diaz gives update on his investigation into air disasters in which air controllers were involved—controllers who are now back on the job.

Issue: Policing and Eric Garner Case

Guests: PBA President Pat Lynch; Harlem Assemblyman Keith Wright

Description: President of the Police Benevolent Association defends his officers in the apparent chokehold death of Eric Garner. He says the medical examiners ruling that it was a homicide was politically motivated. Manhattan Democratic Leader—Harlem Assemblyman Keith Wright—talks about how this case is impacting race relations in the city.

Sun, 8/17/14

Issue: Politics/Middle East/Police Brutality

Guests: Rep. Charles Rangel (D) New York

Description: One on one with Congressman Rangel fresh from his primary victory to serve his 23rd term in Congress. Does he support President Obama's foreign policy? And where does he stand on the escalating violence in Iraq, the Middle East and the streets of our nation?

Sun, 8/24/14

Issue: Alzheimers Disease/Bullying

Guests: Alzheimers researchers Dr. Jean-Pierre Roussarie and Dr. Thomas Wisniewski; Bullying expert Karl Romaine, and Vice President of the NYC Parents Unions, Sam Pirozzolo.

Description: Almost five and a half million Americans have Alzheimers, and it's the sixth leading cause of death in the U.S. The discussion focuses on the latest medical advances made in the efforts to find a cure. Bullying: the

silent epidemic. Guests talk about how to identify a bully, and how should the one being bullied respond to the taunting and harassment.

Issue: Police brutality/Homelessness/Politics

Guests: Darrin Porcher, a retired NYPD lieutenant, and professor of criminal justice; Queens Councilman Jimmy Van Bramer, who was homeless during a period of his childhood, and, Gabriela Sandoval Requena, policy analyst for the Coalition for the Homeless; Morgan Pehme, Editor-in-Chief of City & State.

Description: The police killing of Michael Brown, an unarmed teen in Ferguson, Missouri, chokehold death of Eric Garner in Staten Island, have placed police all across the nation under the microscope. Is the backlash justified? Many claim the homeless crisis worsened under the Bloomberg administration because of his affordable housing policies. The de Blasio administration has pledged to tackle the homelessness crisis. The discussion focuses on ways to reduce the growing numbers of homeless New Yorkers. Political analysis of the New York gubernatorial primary.

Sun, 9/7/14 (additional airing on Sat, 9/6/14 @ 10:30pm)

Issue: Politics

Guests: Professor Zephyr Teachout, Governor Cuomo's chief opponent in Tuesday's primary, and Westchester County Executive Rob Astorino – the Republican nominee in November's election; those joining moderator Marvin Scott in questioning the candidates are Jonathan Lentz, Albany Bureau Chief, City & State, and Fordham University Professor Christina Greer.

Description: Gubernatorial Debate Special

Issue: Politics

Guests: Rep. Carolyn Maloney, (D) New York; Morgan Pehme, Editor-in-Chief, City & State Magazine, and Iona College Professor Jeanne Zaino.

Description: Congresswoman Carolyn Maloney weighs in on President Obama's strategy against Islamic extremists, and discusses her efforts to extend the Zadroga Act to help those still suffering the ill effects of 9/11. Plus, analysis of this week's primary.

Issue: Terrorism/NFL and Abusive Behavior

Guests: Robert Strang, formerly with the FBI, and President of Investigative Management Group, an international security consulting firm; Sports anchor Scott Stanford, and Kimerlina Kavern, Director of Safe Horizon's Bronx Family Court Program.

Description: Since the attacks of September 11th, the NYPD has thwarted no less than 16 attempted terrorist attacks on the city. ISIS is seen as an even greater threat than Al Qaeda. Guest assesses how great a threat they pose, and are we really prepared
