# January 7

#### OCIF:

This week Karyn Bower and Kat Johnson are joined by Dr. Scott Farthing, an accomplished conductor, composer, pianist, and the dean of Fine Arts & Media Technology at Saddleback College. ### On Point:

More than 60,000 people are estimated to be experiencing homelessness in Los Angeles. According to the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA), about 72 percent of displaced people in the county are unsheltered. What housing options — temporary, permanent, or somewhere in-between — are available to help shelter currently-unhoused people in L.A.? From the perspective of people creating (and using?) these housing options, which are working to make a difference in the city's homelessness crisis? Hengameh Abraham is the Iranian Outreach Chair for the Republican party of Orange County, she immigrated to the U.S. at the age of 14 and this week she joins Karyn Bower and Negar Vahabi to talk about her own encounter with the morality police before leaving Iran, how the Iranian Revolution in 1979 is connected to the 2022 protests that began after the death of Mahsa Amini, why this is different from the protests in 2009 and the Green Movement, and more.

#### On Point:

Over the last decade, South Korean Pop music has gone mainstream around the world... especially here in the United States. K-pop groups have millions of album sales and streams in the United States alone. The music and its fans are starting to have an impact on American society. ### OCIF:

On this episode of OC In Focus we're joined by Daniel Kim, co-founder of The Dragon Kim Foundation. Kim shares the origins of the foundation, how grief has transformed into a mission to empower youth, providing them with opportunities to pursue passions and make a difference in their communities. We're joined by Foothill High School students Carson Ly and Robert Padilla, winners of the 2023 Dragon Kim Challenge, who share their experience creating Creative Labs, a STEM camp for underprivileged children. Learn about the foundation's fellowship and music programs, fulfilling Dragon's dream of providing free music education to hundreds of children.

#### On Point:

After another summer of drought and heat waves, Angelenos will once again have to keep a close eye on their water use. The City of Los Angeles has introduced a conservation ordinance limiting residents to watering their lawns only two days a week. LA residents do appear to be following the restrictions, but climate change is likely to have lasting impacts on the water supply in the entire state. Where does L.A. get its water? And how much longer will the city have to live with these restrictions?

#### OCIF:

This week on OC In Focus we're joined by Steve Cederquist, the author of "Get Out

Alive: Inspiring Journey from Streets to Success." The topic discussed relates to the financial crisis that will affect students across California. The change is officially in effect for students attending a Cal State University starting in the fall 2024, spring 2025 academic year. This tuition increase is expected to continually rise within the next five years, a theme that is closely discussed throughout the course of the episode.

### March 10

#### OCIF:

On this episode of OC In Focus, we delve into the complex issue of homelessness in Orange County. Joined by Dr. Pooja Bhalla, CEO of Illumination Foundation, we explore the critical need for a comprehensive system of care. Dr. Bhalla sheds light on shelter clinics providing housing and medical respite for those experiencing homelessness. With more than 5,600 people without

shelter in Orange County alone, our discussion navigates the growing numbers, including hidden demographics like single women and families. Dr. Bhalla shares insights on the challenges of accessing resources, qualifications for family shelters, and the urgent need for more housing, particularly for vulnerable seniors.
