Issue: DuBois Area United Way

Michael Clement interviewed Ryan Carr, President of DuBois Area United Way Board; and Neil Hanes, Executive Director of DuBois Area United Way. Issue: Police Appreciation

Both Chief Clark and Chief Krzelak gave their personal history, and why they chose to work in law enforcement. Both spoke of how important it is for police to connect with the communities they serve, and to have officers deeply involved with the community. Both said their biggest concerns include: the safety of their officers, the drug and mental health issues and problems in our community, and the proliferation of skills games in the area. Each also spoke about DuBois/Sandy Township consolidation, and cooperation between their departments.

Issue: Supplying basic needs for school-age children in the DuBois Area

Michael Clement interviewed representatives of the DuBois area's "We Care for Kids" – Susan Hassen (co-founder) and Danielle Knarr. We Care For Kids was founded in 2018 with the mission of giving children of the community basic needs supplies. Information was given on how donations are received, and the local groups who support the mission. We Care For Kids distributes clothing and basic needs supplies to six schools in the DuBois area. Only quality brands and types of clothing are distributed – 75% of the items are new. Hassen and Knarr also explained how they are working to remove the stigma of being "in need."
