This radio station airs a unique niche format which is primarily Christian music, interspersed with numerous short-form programs throughout the week that provide insight on a variety of life issues. The stations audience is made up, primarily, of people of religious faith who desire to hear the type of music played by the station and to learn biblical principles which they can apply to their everyday lives.

There are many broadcast media outlets within the service area of this Station, along with countless online sources of information, which address contemporary issues of all types. This Station, on an ongoing basis, focuses on addressing a short list of those issues which are among the most significant to its listenership.

The station airs 3 minutes per hour, every hour, 24/7, of short-form content addressing a broad range of everyday life issues and presents listeners with two hours per week of long-form programming addressing the specific issues noted above.

The listing of programs on the following pages identifies a small sampling of programs aired during the quarter which gave significant treatment to one or more of those issues.

01/06/24 10:26am 25:00 Focus on the Family Weekend

Dr. Rosaria Champagne Butterfield challenges listeners to share God's love by opening their home to strangers, neighbors, and anyone in need, in a discussion based on her book The Gospel Comes With a House Key: Practicing Radically Ordinary Hospitality in Our Post-Christian World.

01/20/24 10:26am 25:00 Focus on the Family Weekend

Dr. Marcus Warner and Chris Coursey explain the brain science behind joy and offer easy, practical ways you can increase joy in your marriage by playing together, listening for emotion, appreciating your spouse daily, and nurturing a rhythm of rest. Then Laura Wifler and Erin Smalley share about the joys and challenges of raising kids with special needs, reminding us that all children are made in the image of God – and it is this fact that gives a person's life innate worth.

Taylor and Megan Kovar review the five money personalities and explain how to be more content with financial situation and trust God for the future. They share how couples can get on the same page, financially, through a "money dump" — a once per year discussion of money fears and dreams, and through a "money huddle," where couples do a monthly assessment of their financial situation. Then Karen Ehman talks about reaching others through acts of kindness and service, encouraging us to get out of our comfort zones to bless others.

Lucille Williams equips you with ways you can nurture your child's strengths and help them learn to overcome their weaknesses. Then Dave and Ashley Willis help you to avoid developing bad habits in your marriage. They address common problems like score-keeping, and they encourage husbands and wives to share as much as possible, rather than have separate bank accounts, hobbies, and even friends.

Infidelity can rip a marriage apart — and it's hard to imagine a betrayal more painful than finding out your spouse is involved with someone else. Josh and Katie Walters share the story of Katie's affair with the husband of their good friend couple, and how Katie vacillated for quite a while, torn between doing the right thing (ending the affair) and still feeling love for the other man. Meanwhile, Josh was convinced by God that divorce was wrong and he needed to love Katie as Christ loves the Church, which meant pushing through the pain and hoping against hope to rescue his marriage. Josh and Katie have developed an acronym — S.T.A.Y. — for struggling couples. "S" stands for "Start with me," or taking ownership of your own sin and mistakes instead of blaming your spouse. They also address "T" — "Take quitting off of the table," and Katie shares

a story of making a vow to the Lord of "You can have my feet," which meant she still wasn't sure about her love/marriage with Josh, but she wouldn't be going anywhere.
