Meanwhile in the Middle East, the hour is late to stop Iran's nuclear program. At this point, perhaps, only Israel will prevent Iran's Ayatollahs from acquiring the world's deadliest weapons. Russia, China, North Korea, and Iran. Four governments with serious ideological differences that are nonetheless united by their hostility toward the U.S. and their desire to see America toppled as the world's superpower. How should we respond to these unprecedented challenges? These wars and rumors of wars. Is our leadership up to the task? And how can Christians be a voice of truth and shine a light in the growing darkness? CBN Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: Since the fallout after the Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade abortion decision, pregnancy centers across the country remain on high alert after dozens of incidents of violence, vandalism, and intimidation against them have been reported. Toby DeBause, president of Crisis Pregnancy Center of Tidewater Keim Centers shared an example of that anger at one of his center's five locations. DeBause said his clinics are seeing a record number of patients following the fall of Roe. But fake online reviews criticizing their work are also on the rise as well as abortion advocates posing as patients to harass workers. The centers recently implemented high-tech security measures with better surveillance and more control over access to clinics. DeBause said the improvements will likely total about \$100,000, which represents a significant cost for the ministry. Armed guards also now patrol the area. State officials and local law enforcement are also getting involved in keeping the centers safe. The need is growing nationally as Philadelphia's Pro-Life Union office, which recently had a brick thrown through its front window and was vandalized, tightened its security. Despite the recent attacks, volunteer Phaedra Anderson said more people are giving to the group's mission of rescuing the unborn. In the end, DeBause explained he and his staff plan to continue the work God has entrusted to them as they look to Him as their true source of protection.

CBN Reporter Brody Carter Reports: Major American cities are facing a perfect storm. Violent crime is growing, and law enforcement agencies are struggling to keep officers on the job. Now, some of these cities are bringing faith to the frontlines as police departments fight the increasing crime with fewer officers. In Gresham, Oregon, Sgt. Travis Garrison says a crime spike is forcing his department to choose which calls and crimes they can send officers to. "Triaging" or prioritizing first responders is becoming commonplace. In Philadelphia, police disbanded their abandoned car unit. In Los Angeles, police cut their homeless outreach and animal cruelty teams. As a growing number of police walk away from the job, violent crime still surges in several major U.S. cities. In an unprecedented move, departments are turning to houses of worship, hoping faith can help reduce that trend. More than 25 law enforcement groups joined prominent faith leaders on Capitol Hill, Tuesday – inviting communities to participate in the National Faith and Blue weekend. Dr. Rev. Markel Hutchins, head of MovementForward Inc., started this event five years ago in Atlanta. He knows firsthand that one weekend can spark change. In early October, Faith and Blue will seek to reinvigorate police-community relations through town halls, peace walks, picnics, and other activities nationwide. Chief Patrick Ogden, Associate Chief of Police at the University of Delaware, sees these partnerships as key to building stronger and safer communities.

CBN Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: Despite adding an unprecedented 3.8 million jobs in 2021, workforce participation remains low. This worker shortage is creating a unique opportunity for those with a troubled past. At age 21, Jesse Wiese committed a crime that led to time behind bars. After becoming a Christian and attending Prison Fellowship Academy, Wiese's life dramatically changed. After his release in 2006, Wiese attended Bible college and then completed law school at Regent University. Today he is a practicing attorney. He also works with Prison Fellowship, helping others like himself navigate the often-difficult life on the outside. Devon Kelley of Newport News, VA knows about that stigma. After three years in prison on a drug charge, finding work proved frustrating. Wiese says the ongoing labor shortage created by the COVID-19 pandemic has opened employment opportunities for those who have served time. In 2018, Kelley was re-hired as a shipfitter at Huntington Ingalls Newport News shipyard. He now pays it forward by encouraging the company to hire others like him, something he saw pay off at a recent hiring event. Kelley also runs his own non-profit called "Not My Child," which reaches at-risk youth in his city. Meanwhile, Wiese says the work of removing barriers for those seeking a chance after incarceration is far from over.

> CBN Reporter Dale Hurd Reports: Your body is valuable to you and to your Creator. It also carries a street value in dollars and cents on the human organ market. Depending on your age - and the prime age is 28 - the total can reach as much as half a million dollars or more. Human organs are a hot commodity in today's world where people want to live longer. and transplantation has become easier. Known as the 'Red Market,' this lucrative underground economy is booming. Scott Carney, author of "The Red Market," says, in many nations, the value of a donated organ is embedded into the cost of the medical procedure. Iran is the only nation where it is still legal to buy and sell human organs. Everywhere else, organs must be donated. But the black-market organ harvesting business, especially in kidneys, is widespread in many developing nations where the poor are desperate for money. In America, someone is added to a transplant waiting list every 9 minutes. And 6,000 Americans died last year because of organs not donated in time. The demand in wealthy nations has created "transplant tourism," traveling abroad to undergo a transplant. On the red market, buyers and sellers exist for nearly every part of the human body, although kidneys are by far the most sought-after organ. The World Health Organization estimates that more than one kidney is traded illegally on the black market every hour. Officially, the United States does more legal organ transplants than any other nation in the world, more than 40,000 last year. Unofficially, the world leader by far is China, and experts believe almost none of the organs were donated but were stolen from political prisoners who were either executed or alive when their organs were harvested. Ethan Gutmann, author of "The Slaughter" and one of the world's leading experts on China's organ harvesting program, says China may do as many as 100,000 organ transplants a year from executed and live prisoners, including Uyghurs, Falun Gong followers, and Christians, many of them 28-year-old males. And while an organ transplant in the West might be done hours after the organ is donated, Gutmann says many Chinese transplants are recorded as happening the moment the organ is donated. Dr. Enver Tohti has testified that as a Chinese surgeon he was told to remove the organs from a man who was still alive, and was struggling to escape, but was too weak. Former Chinese prisoners have recounted how they thought they were getting health checkups but were actually getting organ screenings. China's organ transplant industry now attracts wealthy clients from all over the world. Legal organ transplants are still immensely important and offer the gift of life to those who might otherwise die. The illegal organ harvesting industry turns the human body into a parts bazaar. And China is making billions by turning the bodies of political prisoners into cash.

Nearly 50% of adults in the U.S. don't have enough cash to cover a \$400 emergency and most can't pass a financial literacy test. With mounting debt from credit cards and student loans, there is a need for a better understanding of basic financial principles. CBN Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: Before prices at the pump and supermarkets started taking off, economists noticed a growing number of Americans putting money toward credit card debt or building their savings. Now, according to a new survey by Bankrate, 41 percent of Americans need a side income just to help pay for monthly expenses from housing to utilities to food. Halfway through her senior year, 23-year-old Shaina Bourne felt the need to drop out of college due to her tight budget. After becoming a full-time nanny, Shaina soon realized she would need more money to make ends meet. That forced her to turn a hobby into a second job. As the cost of living continued to go up, Shaina then picked up a third job. Shaina is not alone. According to Bankrate, inflation is driving more than a third of Americans to increase working hours due to rising prices. Ted Rossman, senior industry analyst for Bankrate, said that any additional income is often going toward putting food on the table or paying rent. Shaina says that describes many people she knows. Rossman said the problem underscores the financial burden many are carrying. Meanwhile, Shaina is trying to keep her college degree hope alive as she continues to do what she can now just to stay afloat.

CBN Reporter Abigail Robertson Reports: Extreme heat is sweeping the country right now with many areas of the U.S. facing temperatures that could feel like 115 degrees with heat and humidity on Tuesday. As temperatures are heating up from coast to coast, 60 million people are expected to face temperatures in the triple digits in the coming days. For the first time ever, the Houston forecast predicts 10 days straight of 100 degrees or higher temperatures, and Dallas is on track to break heat records. Texans are being asked to conserve electricity and water with looming concerns over the power grid's ability to handle the high demand during the high heat. In Arizona, a UPS driver was seen on a Nest camera collapsing at a customer's front door in 110-degree heat. UPS says he's okay. Overseas, high temperatures are causing dozens of wildfires to spread across western Europe in countries including Spain, Portugal, France, and Greece. Harrowing video circulating on Monday showed train passengers in Zamora, Spain, passing through fire on both sides of the train.

Officials in Spain and Portugal claim more than 1,100 people have died already as a result of the deadly heat. The majority of Europeans do not have air conditioning in their homes. The UK issued its first-ever extreme heat warning as they, too, deal with record high temperatures. The UK recorded a record-breaking temperature of 104 degrees before noon on Tuesday, and the temperature is expected to increase throughout the day. Experts say UK infrastructure is not prepared to handle extreme heat, and on Monday London's Luton airport suspended flights for a few hours when a small section of its tarmac melted in the high temperatures. In the U.S., a lack of grass and water are forcing cattle ranchers to sell their livestock, which could drive up beef prices at the grocery store.

CBN Reporter Dale Hurd Reports: Summertime power blackouts are occurring more frequently in America, and heat is not the only culprit. The North American Electric Reliability Corporation warns that a hotter than usual summer will cause more power failures throughout most of the Western U.S. this year. In the Midwest and parts of the South, the situation is even worse with blackouts expected regardless of how hot it gets. Why does one of the most energy-rich nations in the world have power blackouts? Well, you can't prevent extreme summer heat, but some of the other causes of America's new energy crisis are entirely preventable. The report targets three causes; severe drought that is making it harder to generate hydroelectric power, the unreliability of green energy, and a shortage of power from fossil fuels as more and more traditional power plants are closed down. The head of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association, Jim Matheson, says green energy is not producing enough to cover the loss of fossil fuel power generation. Energy analyst Dr. Mario Lewis of the Competitive Enterprise Institute says the government and the banking industry are strangling the fossil fuel industry by demonizing it and driving capital and talent away from it. The Biden Administration wants America on 100 percent green energy in 13 years. Europe is also moving toward 100 percent green energy, and they're worried about freezing this winter after nations have shut down many of their nuclear plants. They're also concerned that Vladimir Putin won't turn their natural gas supplies back on. Energy expert Larry Behrens at the organization Power the Future warns that trying to fix the U.S. power grid now by going back to more fossil fuels might not be guick and easy. White House Climate Advisor Gina McCarthy has gone on record saying criticism of green energy should be censored. But if the blackouts happen as predicted, by the end of this summer many Americans could be complaining about green energy.

CBN Reporter Heather Sells Reports: More than 100 million Americans in 29 states area facing heat advisories and excessive heat warnings this weekend as the country bakes under high temperatures. Experts warn that extreme heat is the top weather killer. It can lead to dehydration, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke. In Georgia, a lightning strike at Ft. Gordon killed one soldier and injured nine others. A home video from Arizona shows a UPS driver collapsing as he rang a doorbell. In states like Texas, the heat is fueling wildfires. Across Europe, a parallel heat wave is generating wildfires in Spain and France. On Tuesday, Britain shattered its record for the highest temperature ever recorded. In the U.S., the heat is moving east towards major metropolitan areas like Philadelphia, Boston, and New York. The power company Con Edison is telling customers to conserve electricity to avoid outages. Climate change activists blame global warming for driving the historic temperatures right now while experts note that urban sprawl is also accelerating the trend by creating what is known as the urban heat island effect. It's created by pavement and buildings that absorb and retain heat more than natural land. Dr. Sean McKenna at the Desert Research Institute in Las Vegas says the effect is raising temperatures

in urban areas. Americans can expect to pay more in electric bills this year. Along with the need for more electricity to cool homes, prices are expected to spike by 20 percent this summer largely due to soaring natural gas prices. In the Southwest, the worst drought in 12 centuries is wiping out the water supply, most notably at Lake Mead in Nevada, which provides water to 25 million people.

CBN Reporter Dale Hurd Reports: The most efficient system in history of growing food and getting it to consumers, modern farming, is under attack, blamed for causing climate change. The world has watched as Dutch famers fight for their economic survival against demands that they shrink their operations to suit the government's climate change agenda. The Dutch government has told farmers to cut ammonia emissions by 50 percent, and those near protected areas must reduce their operations by as much as 95 percent, or they must sell their land to the government and face a lifetime ban from farming. Dutch farmers have responded by spraying government buildings with manure while Dutch police shot at a 16-year-old boy at a demonstration. Jos Ubels, Vice President of the Farmer's Defense Force in the Netherlands, says negotiations are not going anywhere and a bad situation is continuing to escalate. Ubels also defended Dutch farmers' methods. Farmers from around the world who are also seeing their way of life under attack have demonstrated in solidarity. American farmers, who are already subject to a host of regulations, could also find themselves facing even more restrictions. But the island nation of Sri Lanka serves as a cautionary tale. Sri Lanka's ban of chemical fertilizers in struggling nation's agricultural sector economy https://www.nationalreview.com/corner/sri-lanka-an-organic-catastrophe/) to collapse. It ended with protestors frolicking in the presidential swimming pool after nation's president fled the country. Sri Lanka was supposed to be the poster child for modern organic farming. The World Economic Forum(http://https://www.weforum.org/agenda/2018/08/this-is-howwe-will-make-sir-lanka-rich-by-2025/) even proudly posted an article about Sri Lanka's expected success, written by the prime minister whose house was set on fire by protestors. Parts of the world already face famine because of a shortage of chemical fertilizer due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine - the same kind of fertilizer environmentalists want to reduce. Washington Attorney Gary Baise, who helped start the Environmental Protection Agency in 1970 and now says it should be abolished, owns 11 farms in Illinois. He calls what the Dutch government is trying to do to its farming sector "madness," and sees signs a similar movement is coming to the U.S. Baise believes the era of cheap food at the grocery store is over, not just from inflation but because of growing environmental regulations on farming and says Sri Lanka should be a warning to leaders who want to experiment with food production. Nevertheless, the Biden Administration appears to be coming after farmers. Steve Milloy, editor of the website Junkscience.com(http://junkscience.com/), writes that a new study by the EPA claims that air emissions from farms, basically farm dust, kill 17,000 Americans per year, the same EPA standards that basically killed the coal industry. Former U.S. ambassador to the Netherlands Pete Hoekstra says if the Dutch government wins this battle against its own farmers - who are the second largest exporters of agricultural products in the world behind the United States - it will only make the global food shortage worse. Any politician willing to risk the food supply in order to fight climate change might want to keep Lanka(http:// https://abcnews.go.com/International/sri-lanka-protestors-lounged-presidents-pool-countrysgovernment/story?id=86743582) in mind.

CBN Reporter Heather Sells Reports: A Commerce Department report out today shows the U.S. economy shrank from April to June for a second straight quarter. It contracted at a .9% annual pace, following a 1.6% drop in January through March. The decline in gross domestic product (GDP) is raising concerns that the U.S. may be approaching a recession, even as the Federal Reserve chair Jerome Powell sought Wednesday to counter that, pointing to a robust labor market with 11 million job openings and a low 3.6% unemployment rate. Powell said he's encouraged by such signs. Powell announced that the U.S. is hiking interest rates for the fourth time this year in an effort to combat soaring prices. Inflation is 9.1 percent right now, the highest rate in 40 years. The Federal Reserve said it's raising its key interest rate by ¾ of a point to slow the economy. The rate hike means Americans will pay more for mortgages, car loans, and credit card debt. The Fed hopes that in response, consumers will spend less and tamp down inflation. The Fed is betting it can slow growth just enough to bring down inflation while avoiding triggering a recession. It's a high-stakes risk that the country is hoping it gets right. There are signs the plan may be working. This week Walmart lowered its profit outlook, pointing to high gas and food prices as factors forcing shoppers to spend less on discretionary items like clothing. Economists are concerned

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that consumers are losing confidence, despite the strong labor market. Their fears could also affect the mid-term elections in November, increasing the probability that Democrats will lose control of the House and Senate.

CBN Reporter Brody Carter Reports: With inflation running out of control and higher prices squeezing family budgets, more American are turning to credit cards to bridge the gap. That's led to the biggest leap in credit card balances in 20 years. Household debt is now at its highest level ever, climbing past \$16 trillion - a 13% increase in the past year. Americans are treading water. Roughly, 125 million people are living paycheck to paycheck according to financepond.com. That's 54% of the U.S. adult population. So just how bad is it? The collective U.S. household debt is one indicator totaling 16.15 trillion through the end of June, up \$312 billion from the previous quarter. With food and gas prices surging to 40-year highs, the Fed is working to bring down inflation by raising interest rates. Yet, those higher rates mean higher interest on credit cards as the new data shows that American families are using their plastic to pay the bills. Danny Kofke, author, and motivational mentor with Mentoro says the numbers indicate so many people need financial wellness. Kofke believes that the higher prices are forcing Americans to borrow more money. The problem is that using credit cards only puts consumers deeper in the hole. Per his example; someone who racks up \$5.000 on a credit card could pay 1.25% of the balance, with an 18% interest rate. His example shows how people don't consider the total cost beyond the minimum payment, which explains why credit card balances just surged by the largest amount in 20 years. So what can you do to bring down monthly costs? Some families are stretching their dollars at the Dollar Store. Kofke recommends getting a "side-hustle" – or using your skills to make money on the side. He even says now's a good time to ask your boss for a raise. An expansion in household debt is typically followed by a sharp slowdown in spending and investment, furthering fears that a recession is imminent.

CBN Reporter Brody Carter Reports: Inflation seems to be slowing down after the recent report from the Labor Department, but prices remain incredibly high compared to this time last year. After months and months of record-breaking spikes in the cost of living, better than anticipated numbers sent the stock market soaring. The good news in today's report mainly comes from a drop in gas prices. And while this month's rate is a bit better than economists expected, there's still a long way to go. Not only are gas prices dropping, but this month's inflation report also points to lower costs for new and used cars, travel, and clothing. Still, inflation remains a big concern, up a whopping 8.5% in July compared to a year ago, although the Biden administration is trying to paint a rosy picture. Biden's touting the zero percent number deals with what's known as core inflation, one of several lenses used to view the economy. That figure ignores food and energy prices which can often be more volatile. Mark Hamrick, Sr., an economic analyst with Bankrate, doesn't agree with Biden's take on the inflation numbers. There's still another month's worth of data before the Federal Reserve's next policy meeting, which is around the third week in September. Hamrick says they might look directionally good with hope coming from dropping gas prices which should permeate the food category next month.

CBN Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: As the first day of class approaches, thousands of public schools are scrambling to fill vacant teaching positions. That is because a shortage of teachers is forcing many districts to adjust while offering unique incentives to attract educators. Dr. Brian Austin, Chief Human Resources Officer at Chesapeake Public Schools said his district is short of 60 teachers. The district is looking to fill the void with substitute teachers. The problem of teacher shortages is nationwide, driven by the pandemic, burnout, low pay, ever-increasing demands and growing disrespect from both students and parents. The state of Florida is seeing as many as 9,500 open teaching positions just weeks before the start of school according to the Economic Policy Institute. Those who are leaving the classroom say the decision is hard. The Economic Policy Institute also reports that the problem is only going to get worse. It predicts a nationwide shortfall of 300,000 teachers by 2024. Desperate school districts are turning to extraordinary measures. For example, Des Moines Public Schools is offering a \$50,000 bonus to teachers, nurses and administrators who are nearing retirement to stay with the district through the 2022-2023 school year. Florida's Department of Education now offers a temporary teaching certificate to military veterans who have not yet earned their bachelor's degree. The Dallas Independent School district recently set aside \$51 million for salary increases and \$52 million for retention bonuses for the new school year. Like many districts. Chesapeake is raising teacher pay. The district is also offering teachers the option to work virtually. Meanwhile, the U.S. Department of Education hopes to use money from the American Rescue Plan to help fill vacant teacher positions around the country.

CBN Reporter Caitlin Burke Reports: Nearly a year ago, when Texas enacted the most restrictive abortion law in the country, there was a significant increase in women considering adoption. Sherri Statler, President and CEO of Christian Homes and Family Services in Tyler, TX, says there's been a new spike in interest with the Roe v. Wade decision. The Supreme Court's action also triggered abortion restrictions in nearly half the country. Now, both critics and supporters of the pro-life movement are calling for a renewed focus on life beyond birth. Michelle Douglas, Program Director for The Call in Arkansas, a non-profit that focuses on mobilizing local churches to serve children and youth placed in foster care, says the Bible is clear on the role of the Church. While children will be adopted into loving families, more will likely also be born into households strained by addiction, poverty, and mental illness. Without support, those kids could end up going into an already strained foster care system. Christie Erwin, Founder and Executive Director of Project Zero, a non-profit that helps families adopt children in the foster care system, acknowledges that many in the Church have been working in this space for years and that more is needed now than ever. These leaders point out that taking a child into your home isn't the only way to help. Other options could look like, providing meals to a foster family, helping with diaper drives, or a financial donation. Support comes in many forms and on all levels.

CBN Medical Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: Before the pandemic, the number of Americans struggling with mental health issues including suicide was already high. Now, two years later, the number of people suffering from depression, anxiety, substance abuse, domestic violence and suicide is even greater than it was pre-pandemic. Mental health experts and Christians alike are taking a closer look at how to help people in the church address difficulties they may be experiencing with mental health issues. Dr. Thema Bryant, an ordained minister and clinical psychologist, knows firsthand how Christians can spiral into despair. In her book, Homecoming: Overcome Fear and Trauma to Reclaim Your whole authentic Self, Dr. Bryant describes overcoming her trauma from sexual assault while keeping her faith by using therapeutic approaches which she now shares with her own clients, including one of her favorites, dance therapy, which is similar to praise dance. As President-Elect of the American Psychological Association, Dr. Bryant says the church needs to create a culture where people can admit they're struggling and seek help. The tide is starting to change. While more churches are signaling to their members that it's OK to struggle with mental health issues, some are taking it a step further by developing ministries to help people with these types of problems. One example is at New Life Church in Virginia Beach. Cyrus Williams III, Ph.D., is a member of the church and also serves as a counselor at Rapha Counseling Services, a faith-based Christian Counseling practice. Rapha Counseling entered into a partnership with the church whereby Dr. Williams and his team treat people in the comfort of their own church building. Demand is high, given the growing number of those struggling with depression and anxiety. While the counseling is affordable for many, the goal, Williams said, is to make it available for all who need it. Pastor Tina Davis told CBN News after years of trying to normalize mental health struggles from the pulpit and erasing the shame often associated with these issues, the pastoral team wanted to do even more. New Life also hosts mental health forums and seminars. So while mental health problems within the church can still be considered taboo, more Christian leaders are trying to do away with the stigma so people can get the help they need.

CBN Reporter Brody Carter Reports: President Biden took executive action today to promote access to abortion, sending pro-choice directives to the Departments of Justice and Health and Human Services. The White House's goal is to ensure access to federally approved abortion drugs and to guarantee travel across state lines to access abortion clinics. But Biden said it's ultimately up to Congress to do something about abortion. On Friday, he reiterated what he told Democratic governors last week, saying the main objective will be new nationwide abortion laws. Meanwhile, individual states are taking pro-abortion legal action after the Supreme Court's ruling to overturn Roe v Wade. The high court decision is expected to lead to abortion bans in roughly half the states, 13 of which have already initiated so-called 'trigger laws' banning the procedure. In North Carolina, Gov. Roy Cooper (D) singed an executive order Wednesday to protect both abortion providers as well as women who cross state lines to get an abortion. NC is an outlier state in the South that could see a surge of women from surrounding states who want to have abortions. Colorado's Governor signed a similar executive order to protect women and abortion clinics from being disciplined, saying the state won't cooperate with other states' abortion investigations. Lawyers there are already preparing for intense legal battles. In Mississippi, protestors clashed Thursday outside the Jackson Women's Health Organization, which was the state's only abortion clinic. Mississippi's trigger law has closed the clinic's doors for good, leading to a scuffle outside the facility. The clinic will move to New Mexico, although it is appealing the law to the state's supreme court. Another legal case is taking shape in Kentucky where two abortion clinics are in circuit court trying to block the state's near-total ban on abortion. A Judge issued a temporary restraining order stopping the ban last week. If granted, the injunction would suspend the state law while the case is litigated. In states like Florida, Ohio, and Texas, abortion bans or restrictions have taken effect. For example, Florida has a new restriction against abortion after the unborn person has developed for 15 weeks.

CBN Medical Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: While millions of Americans face the death of a loved one, many are unaware of a service that can greatly help them, as well as assisting the dying person, by helping to manage the challenges unique to the end of life. It's called hospice care, sometimes referred to as comfort care. Far too many people are unaware of the benefits of hospice care or have misconceptions about the service. Hospice care seeks to provide the highest quality of life as possible for a patient who has less than six months to live, when medical treatment is no longer an option, or is no longer desired. Hospice teams go to wherever the patient is. In Garrett's case, both her mother-in-law and her husband Bill were at her home. It was the right decision. Not everyone who is eligible for hospice care accepts the service, possibly because they don't know fully understand its benefits. For example, accepting hospice care doesn't demonstrate a lack of faith. Some mistakenly believe hospice hastens death, when research shows people actually live about a month longer in hospice, compared to people with similar health issues who didn't choose it. Another misconception is that people in hospice are heavily medicated with morphine. Hospice workers teach family members to administer the drug as needed. Jessica Pope, RN, Administrator, Trinity Hospice, says sometimes people are surprised to learn that a little bit of morphine often invigorates the patient, by loosening the muscles that tend to tighten around the lungs of the elderly and critically ill. Hospice workers frequently provide another drug, Lorazepam, to control anxiety and spasms. Many people are unaware of the various resources offered through hospice, that are 100-percent paid for by Medicare. The hospice teams understand everything that's available and can help patients and their families gain access to these goods and services. Chaplains are an important part of the hospice team. They assist people of all faiths and those with no faith at all, according to Al Reynosa, a chaplain with Trinity Hospice, with things like repairing relationships and finding closure at the end of life. Chaplains counsel families and do among other things, speak to the dying patient even when it seems like they can't hear, because that sense is the last one to fail. Most importantly, chaplains discuss issues of eternity with anyone who desires. Many people actually accept Jesus as their savior just before dying, according to Reynosa. Hospice workers observe most of the dying process is spiritual. So while caring for a terminally ill loved one can be overwhelming, especially at home, hospice can ease that burden. Hospice even offers grief counseling for more than a year after the death. While no one likes the idea of needing hospice care, those who use it often say it was so helpful, they wish they'd started it sooner.

Medical Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: Domestic violence is a terrible crime, often leading to a lifetime of emotional and physical scars. That can include traumatic brain injuries, which often go undetected. Now a growing number of domestic abuse advocates are trying to change that. Like many domestic violence victims, Paula Walters has been hit in the head more times than she can count. Unfortunately, that cruel treatment was all too familiar for Paula. It wasn't unusual for Paula to be hit in the head multiple times in one day, something other abuse victims often report. Paula left her abuser decades ago. She's in a safe, healthy relationship now. Through her nonprofit organization, The Courageous Survivor, she tries to educate and empower other abuse victims. However, despite her progress, Paula still suffers from brain-related repercussions from her years of abuse, such as sensitivity to light and sound, dizziness, and more. A doctor's visit and an MRI revealed Paula suffered from extensive brain damage which is likely permanent and could cause her increasing difficulty as she ages. About 15 years ago, doctors discovered football players who were repeatedly hit in the head, often developed the brain disease called CTE, or Chronic Traumatic Encephalitis. Now, researchers are taking a closer look at domestic violence victims who have been repeatedly hit in the head to determine whether they too may have CTE or other types of brain injuries. These diseases can cause personalities to change, steal memories, and lead to early death. Lee Goldstein, M.D., Ph.D., a researcher and clinical team leader at the Boston University CTE Center, emphasizes CTE can occur in people who have never sustained a concussion, but who instead have repeatedly been hit in the head, regardless of whether any of the blows caused a concussion. Researchers are reportedly closed to developing a test to diagnose CTE in people who are alive, but right now, the only way to determine whether a person definitely had CTE is to examine their brain after their death. Scientists at the B.U. CTE Center have confirmed CTE in the donated brains of over a thousand people, mostly deceased football players, who exhibited CTE symptoms while they were still alive. The B.U. CTE Center has also confirmed CTE in a small number of brains from battered women, mainly due to lack of access. Surprisingly, until very recently, it didn't occur to many in the medical community, victim advocates, and abused women themselves, that repeated hits to the head were likely causing traumatic brain injuries. Now that the connection between domestic abuse victims who've been repeatedly hit in the head and traumatic brain injury has been made, Rachel Ramirez, LISW-S, RA, the Founder and Director of The Center on Partner-Inflicted Brain Injury, a project of the Ohio Domestic Violence Network, is trying to raise awareness among people best positioned to help victims. Recognizing the risk of permanent brain injury from domestic abuse could potentially motivate more victims to leave dangerous partners, get medical attention, and stop blaming themselves for the symptoms they're experiencing such as depression, difficulty remembering, and trouble with problem-solving. When women gather the strength to seek help from domestic abuse shelters, more of the people who work at these help centers are beginning to consider the possibility that the women coming to them could be suffering from traumatic brain injury. One of those is Samaritan House, which provides emergency and permanent housing, support services and community outreach to victims of violence in the Hampton Roads, Virginia region. Questions include inquiries about physical health, such as whether the woman has experienced headaches, dizziness, and vision problems, mental

health, concerning problems with memory, concentration, and staying organized. Emotions also play a part, including irritability, nervousness, and depression. Counting the number of domestic abuse victims with brain injuries is difficult. Many choose to suffer in silence. Those who seek medical treatment often minimize their injuries or lie about how they got them. While treatments for brain injuries are limited, some can get better, especially when identified early. Some things that help are lots of rest, a healthy diet, and most importantly, avoiding future head injuries. 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Medical Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: Over two hundred years ago, President Abraham Lincoln famously said, "Most folks are about as happy as they make up their minds to be." Is that even possible today in the midst of a global pandemic? Christian psychiatrist Daniel Amen, M.D. believes each of us can raise the degree of happiness we experience even in the midst of challenging circumstances like the ones we are facing today. The COVID-19 pandemic sent mental health crises through the roof. Over the last two years, adult depression tripled while depression and anxiety disorders among children more than doubled. However, he says it doesn't have to be that way. After studying more than 200,000 brain scans, Dr. Amen discovered neuroscience techniques that can lead to increased happiness. He then tested them on his patients and found an average 32 percent improvement after one month. In his book, "You Happier: The 7 Neuroscience Secrets of Feeling Good Based On Your Brain Type," Dr. Amen prescribes different happiness strategies based on a person's personality type. He says there are 16 different types, which are combinations of five main ones. Dr. Amen says while he recommends a targeted approach to happiness based on a person's brain type, there are certain things everyone can do to raise their happiness level, regardless of their personality. The first step involves boosting your overall brain health. Believe it or not, our diet plays a major role in how well our brain functions. The types of foods and drinks we consume directly contribute to the way we think and feel through a complex system of neurotransmitters, hormones, and more. Dr. Amen says good brain health begins with minimizing the consumption of junk foods like sugary, processed foods and drinks that are loaded with chemical additives and lack fiber and other nutrients. Dr. Amen points out that the very foods that comfort us while we are eating them, actually make our mood worse in the long run. Dr. Amen says much like junk food, some people tend to reach for alcohol to feel better at the moment, but in the long run, boozy beverages are best avoided. Dr. Amen says supplements can also help improve brain health. While making recommendations based on personality type, he adds just about everyone can benefit from heavy-hitters like a multivitamin, probiotic, vitamin D, and fish oil as well as lesser-known supplements that really pack a punch. In addition to improving brain health, another key to boosting happiness levels is learning to control our thoughts. Dr. Amen suggests several techniques to identify thinking patterns that lead to unhappiness and how to reverse them. recommends the Biblical practice of replacing negative thoughts with positive ones. Dr. Amen recommends limiting time online, pointing to research showing social media increases suicide risk in teenage girls, which he believes could be just the tip of the iceberg. Just like with social media, Dr. Amen says many people would likely be happier if they cut back on their consumption of negative news stories. So while genetics and circumstances can play a role in our overall happiness, it appears our choices and habits play even bigger ones.

CBN Reporter Brody Carter Reports: The World Health Organization will soon try to change the way people view gender by updating a 146-page agency manual with an explanation of gender that, "exists on a continuum and that sex is not limited to male or female." The WHO says in light of "new scientific evidence," it's promoting and updating what's called the Gender Mainstreaming Manual that will soon bypass the traditional binary approach and instead, focus on a "nonbinary approach" to gender and sexual diversity. The manual was created to teach health managers worldwide about gender roles in relation to health-related behaviors. It's widely used, cited, and supports new health care policies and laws. The updates could encourage change in the way people talk about sex and gender. As the United Nations' health unit challenges the traditional understanding of gender, critics warn it's a politically-motivated agenda that will cause more confusion. Rebecca Oas, director of research at the Center for Family and Human Rights, said the WHO pioneered making transsexuality mainstream in 2018 when it removed it from its list of mental health disorders. Updates to the Gender Mainstreaming Agenda include changing key concepts around gender to include power dynamics, privilege, and inequality. The WHO said they want to normalize gender identity outside the biological sex of male and female. Most noteworthy, the plan to introduce lessons and team-building exercises to teach health care professionals that male and female genders inherently discriminate against transgender people, is founded on the concept of intersectionality which is derived from Critical Race Theory. Nicole Hunt, a life issues analyst for Focus on the Family, said this is just the beginning of a chain reaction yet to come. Both Oas and Hunt say the Gender Mainstreaming Manual update is based on political winds, noting the WHO's largest donor is the U.S. government, which provided between \$200 million and \$600 million annually over the last decade. That money was suspended during President Donald Trump's administration but was reversed when President Biden took office. The updated manual will be released in the coming months. Critics encourage parents to learn what's in it to better defend against it.

Now the American Heart Association is emphasizing that it's also one of the most important paths to heart health. That's worth our attention because heart disease kills more Americans than any other cause of death. To show the powerful connection of sleep to a healthy heart, the AHA is adding sleep to its overall key measurements. It joins diet, exercise, nicotine exposure, body mass index, blood lipids, blood glucose, and blood pressure. Most health experts and institutions recommend adults get seven to nine hours of sleep each night, preferably with few to no interruptions. Bodies need that time to repair and reset, and doctors say without it, our heart pays the price. Research shows people who regularly sleep less than six hours a night may triple their risk of heart disease. The concern is that's not enough time spent in the deepest stage of sleep, when blood pressure and heart rate drop as much as 20 percent, reducing stress on the heart.

Also during this sleep stage, the brain releases growth hormones that help the heart recover from demands placed on it during the day. Deepak R. Talreja, M.D., a cardiologist with Sentara Healthcare told CBN News sleep is very important to heart health, but unfortunately, today more than half of all U.S. adults don't get enough, and sleep deprivation is more common now than it was in past generations. He sees firsthand how that's taking a toll. Dr. Talreja tells his patients that the path to better sleep begins with the right environment. The bedroom should be dark, cook (but not too cold), and quiet, which can include a white noise machine to cover up environmental or outside noises. Then establish your best bedtime and stick to it. Stay away from electronics well before bedtime and silence them to avoid interruptions during the night. It you do wake up, stay away from the smartphone. Exercise is also very important to getting a good night's sleep. Dr. Talreja points to a star patient who changed his ways. Severino Tiaba now works out daily and goes to bed at nine o'clock. Severino made a lot of other changes after suffering a heart attack six years ago. That near-death experience

convinced the beer-drinking, cigar-loving, junk food junkie to do a 180. Severino started by following Dr. Talreja's advice to switch to a more heart-healthy diet. Dr. Talreja recommends a plant-based eating plan that minimizes saturated fat, sugar, and processed foods. Severino enjoys the Mediterranean diet. He gave up alcohol, except an occasional glass of red wine, and ditched the cigars. Dr. Talreja says some people are better able to improve their heart health by making changes gradually and with the help of others. So while heart disease is currently America's number one killer, that could

change.

CBN Medical Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: America could soon be facing a twin-demic: A harsh flu season coupled with a COVID spike. As the fall and winter months approach, health experts say we're in for a very bad flu season, one that starts earlier than most and hits children especially hard. Our flu season generally follows what happens in the southern hemisphere, which is just now finishing its most severe season in five years. This go-round is characterized by an early onset, which tends to increase severity, and children ages five to nine had the highest rates of infection, followed by children four and under. Michael Cirigliano, M.D. a Penn Medicine physician specializing in internal medicine told CBN News while the pandemic has taken center stage for the last couple of years, we need to also turn our attention to the flu. Last year, the world saw very little flu, and the year before almost none at all, presumably due to people isolating and masking to avoid COVID-19. This year, though, more people are resuming pre-pandemic activities, which come with a warning. Doctors recommend a flu shot for most people, ideally before Halloween, as the best way to avoid the flu or suffering severe complications. The flu vaccine takes full effect after a couple of weeks and lasts about six months. While the new flu shots are rolling out, a new COVID booster is also available that is touted to be more effective against the omicron variants, which are currently the dominant variants in the U.S. - the BA-4 and BA-5 strains. John E. Snellings, M.D. (https://www.evms.edu/directory/profiles/johne-e-snellings,php) Clinician and Assistant Professor of Family and Community Medicine Eastern Virginia Medical School, told CBN News it's likely both shots can be administered at the same time. Despite these measures, the U.S. could see a spike in both viruses. In that case, hospitals could become overwhelmed. Tracey Odachowski, System Director of Infection Prevention and Control at Sentara Healthcare, told CBN News hospitals are preparing for an influx of both COVID and flu patients. U.S. health officials said COVID vaccine boosters will likely be offered every fall, and only in the fall, instead of after a few months as we've seen in the last couple of years, much like the flu vaccine. They add that like the flue, COVID is here to stay.

CBN Medical Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: President Biden twice said the pandemic is over during his first one-on-one interview in more than six months. Putting the pandemic in the rear-view mirror raises questions about continued vaccine mandates for the military, teachers, and other government workers. It could also make it difficult for Biden to pass the more than \$22 billion COVID Relief Bill to pay for more vaccines, tests, and PPE, a plan touted Monday by his Health and Human Services Secretary Xavier Becerra. With U.S. deaths topping 400 daily, doctors warn against developing a false sense of security. Penn Medical Internal Medicine specialist Michael Cirigliano, M.D. said the U.S. will not see the high death tolls from the past because most Americans now have some level of immunity from previous infection, vaccination, or both. Also therapeutics such as the anti-viral medication Paxlovid are keeping many patients out of the hospital. Health experts say if it hasn't already happened, the COVID-19 pandemic will be downgraded to an endemic, like the flu, which kills about 30,000 Americans each year. Doctors see COVID boosters becoming an annual fall recommendation like the flu shot. Craig DeLisi, M.D., a Family Medicine Specialist at Titus Regional Medical Center in Mt. Pleasant, Texas, told CBN News he didn't think the person who declared the pandemic over would be a politician. While health experts may debate whether COVID-19 is now a pandemic or an endemic, one thing is certain: we need to learn to live with it because it's here to stay.

CBN Reporter Caitlin Burke Reports: A growing number of Americans can't remember going through an airport that didn't include enhanced security measures. While mostly effective in keeping people safe, they're also time-consuming and inconvenient. After the terror attacks of 9/11, the security protocol in airports changed, but many of the enhanced measures evolved over time. The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) and its partners are now focused on being proactive, to stay ahead of potential threats. One of the missions of the U.S. Dept. of Energy's Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL) is national security, and its researchers are behind much of the screening technology in airports today. Those scanners use millimeter wave technology. The initial technology was actually marketed to be used in apparel fitting. Then, 9/11 catapulted millimeter wave tech to the forefront of national security. PNNL researchers are constantly working on taking their technologies one step further. Now, a second-generation millimeter-wave system is close to being deployed. Liberty Defense developed Hexwave using technology licensed from PNNL. Bill Frain, CEO of Liberty Defense, a technology company that develops security products, says the key differentiator between it and existing technologies is the ability to detect non-metallic threats. Liberty has also licensed a shoe scanning technology from PNNL that can be used inside the Hexwave or existing body scanners. While this scanning is a few years away, the Hexwave system will soon be deployed to screen aviation workers who access secure areas of the airport. After that, the goal is for it to be used at all security checkpoints, allowing travelers to pass through without breaking stride. Other interesting technology in the pipeline includes the ability to differentiate powders from liquids in baggage, and a way to detect explosives in their vapor form so that bomb-sniffing dogs are no longer needed.

CBN Reporter George Thomas Reports: China's President Xi Jinping has been on a technical quest to build what some call a blueprint for a digital dictatorship ever since. It would not only allow China's communist government to control huge volumes of data on its own citizens but also of those around the world. Dustin Carmack worked as a chief of staff for the Director of National Intelligence. China has more than 415 million surveillance cameras deployed throughout the country, making its population by far the world's most-watched. And now Beijing is using digital currency, social security cards, social credit systems and online interactions to keep an even closer eye on its citizens. Geoffrey Cain, the author of the new book, "The Perfect Police State: An Undercover Odyssey into China's Terrifying Surveillance Dystopia of the Future," says the regime first tested this type of surveillance several years ago to monitor Uighurs, an ethnic Muslim group living in the western part of the country. Cain says his investigation found that those reams of data are fed to a massive police database, and with the help of artificial intelligence, attempts to predict whether someone will commit a crime in the future. China is accused of committing genocide against the Uighurs by holding more than a million of them in what Beijing calls "re-education camps." The Associated Press gained exclusive access to one such detention center this summer that allegedly had room enough to hold more than 10,000 prisoners. Experts say President Xi also wants China to

be the global leader in exporting its authoritarian surveillance tech to other like-minded regimes. New research from Oxford University and Berlin's Humboldt University uncovered some 18-hundred active Chinese surveillance devices across 72 countries, including Venezuela, Kenya, the Philippines, and Oman. China has also deployed censorship devices in 17 other countries, among them, Turkey, Cuba, Egypt, and Pakistan where news and media websites are blocked. China used these and other tactics to suppress protestors in Hong Kong then came to Cuba's aid in July by cutting communications after tens of thousands took to the streets protesting the regime. Meanwhile, new research shows that technology made by seven American companies, including IBM, Microsoft, and Oracle, are facilitating China's surveillance of Uighur Muslims with little or no consequences. It's a deal that's handing China a treasure trove of data in its quest for global information superiority and digital control over its citizens and those around the world.

CBN National Security Correspondent Caitlin Burke Reports: TikTok is the most downloaded app in the world. Known for short viral videos, it has tens of millions of users in the U.S. In order to operate successfully, TikTok collects a lot of data. It tracks account information, search history, and any content created through the platform, along with users' locations and behavioral information. Companies like Facebook and Google collect similar data, but there's one major difference: TikTok is based in China. This means Chinese companies are required to make all data they collect available to the Chinese Communist Party (CCP), with no exceptions. FCC Chairman Brendan Carr tells CBN News that includes all the personal information TikTok's been gathering on millions of Americans. An investigation into the national security implications of TikTok was first launched by the Treasury Department back in 2019. Then in 2020, President Donald Trump threatened to ban the entertainment platform if it didn't sell itself to a U.S. company. Through it all, TikTok maintained it had never shared data with the Chinese government, and insisted the information of American users was secure, being handled only by U.S.-based teams. Then in June, Buzzfeed got access to a collection of leaked tapes from internal meetings at TikTok, and they told a completely different story. TikTok went on damage control, and recently assured concerned Republican lawmakers that new steps are now being taken to further secure American data, including the transition to a U.S.-based cloud services provider, which they say will soon be used to operate the app, as well as store American users' personal information. While it sounds like a step in the right direction, TikTok's CEO also admitted some China-based engineers will still require access to app, which by law grants that same access to Beijing. A key part of the work that will still need to be done in China involves TikTok's algorithm. China expert and author Gordon Chang says that's the biggest security concern of all. In a rare show of bipartisan cooperation, lawmakers are now saying enough is enough. The Senate Intelligence Committee recently sent a letter to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) requesting an investigation be launched into TikTok. Warner is the Chairman of the committee and believes the evidence against TikTok is overwhelming. Meanwhile, the heads of the FBI and the United Kingdom's MI5 recently issued a very clear warning about the threat posed by China. Sen. Mark Warner (D-VA) says one step lawmakers can take immediately involves passing data privacy legislation. He points out this may be the last bipartisan issue that can be addressed ahead of the midterm elections.

CBN Reporter Gary Lane Reports: A recent study by a group of scientists, former defense officials, and intelligence officers determined the COVID-19 virus came from a Wuhan, China lab. This group, known as Team B III went further saying, the Chinese Communist Party intentionally unleashed it on the world. These findings and more appear in the new book, "The CCP is at War with America," from the Center for Security Policy. Former House Intelligence Committee Chairman Peter Hoekstra is one of the authors. It's not from tainted bat meat in a Wuhan wet market, he insisted. Chief Medical Adviser to the President, Dr. Anthony Fauci disagreed. He said when highly rated and competent virologists looked at the virus carefully, they determined that COVID-19 evolved naturally. Also, in late July, the journal "Science"(http://https://www.science.org/doi/10.1126/science.abp8715), published research showing that the virus originated in the

Wuhan wet market, not the lab. Brian Kennedy, chairman of the Committee on the Present Danger: China, doubts the validity of that research. And more Americans are rejecting studies that suggest a natural origin to the virus. A new national poll commissioned by the Committee on the Present Danger: China, shows that 60 percent of adults questioned believe the Chinese Communist Party deliberately unleashed the COVID virus. Open minds have led to altered views about COVID-19. Although the World Health Organization initially supported China's claim that the virus originated from diseased bat meat in a Chinese wet market, today - nearly three years later - the WHO and Jeffrey Sachs of the Lancet Commission believe COVID-19 originated in that Wuhan lab. Also, former CDC Director Robert Redfield has changed this thinking. He now believes the virus may have been manipulated in the lab. Redfield suggests that it became one of the most lethal known to man because it was "educated how to infect human tissue." Hoekstra and members of the Team B group also conclude the virus was engineered. But did China intentionally spread the virus around the world? Kennedy things the timing of the pandemic is more than a coincidence. He said it began shortly after aspects of Donald Trump's phase one trade agreement with China kicked in. The virus wrecked the U.S. economy and killed more than one million Americans. The same Mclaughlin poll commissioned by Kennedy's organization found that 60% of American adults want China held accountable. Hoekstra said he's looking forward to a Republican-controlled House that would take a "deep dive" into what U.S. leaders and health officials actually knew about the virus. But hasn't the pandemic also hurt the Chinese government and its economy, not just the U.S. and parts of the world? Kennedy believes the CCP wanted to demoralize the American people. Hoekstra believes the CCP may unleash another virus on the world in the days ahead. And the former House Intelligence Committee warns Americans to wake up to the imminent danger.

CBN Reporter Brody Carter Reports: Extremist groups are using one of the country's most popular forms of entertainment - video games, as a dangerous recruiting tool. Among the targets are vulnerable teenagers. One research team is exposing this trend to help law enforcement and parents become more aware of the danger. Gaming has become so popular that an estimated 216 million Americans consider themselves gamers. That's more than half the country's population. And today's games are a far cry from Pong and Pac Man, for better – and for worse. Dr. Rachel Kowert is Research Director for Take This, a mental health non-profit decreasing stigma and increasing support for mental health in games. Her cohort, Alex Newhouse, is Deputy Director of the Center on Terrorism, Extremism, and Counter Terrorism at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies at Monterey. Together, they are behind a groundbreaking study on the evolution of gaming and the platform's use to promote extreme ideologies and radicalization. For those who believe they or their kids are safe from extreme propaganda, The Anti-Defamation League has found close to one in four people are exposed to white supremacist ideologies on the internet. That's about 54-million Americans. So shocking, it became the catalyst for Kowert and Newhouse to dive into the research to raise awareness. One aspect behind this trend is the combining of video games with streaming platforms or social networking apps. Given this overlap, players can stream live gaming sessions, or connect with complete strangers through chats and forums. Which can be great, but also dangerous. Discord is known as "your place to talk and hang out." It provides gamers (or anyone with a smart phone), the ability to talk over voice, video, and text. It was specifically identified in the Institute for Strategic Dialogue's 2020 study as a hub and community for right-wing extremism. In Europe, the country's counter-terrorism coordinator doubled down on that warning - saying extremists are increasingly present in digital gaming spaces. Even so, Rachel points out the research finds there are game spaces that provide more good than bad. She adds there is a darkness, however, which is why she and her colleague are working to make games a safer place. Ryan Lo'Ree, shared with CBN about his former life as a prominent Neo-Nazi with the goal of taking online hate groups mainstream. Lo'Ree said his mission began well before Facebook – using Myspace and earlier social media platforms to plant propaganda. Today, he says that propaganda can be found in every platform you go to. In finding ways to finance his mission and move in the ranks, Lo'Ree got into trouble with the law. While his life of crime ultimately led to prison, the time behind bars provided distance from his extremist group. Friends and family helped Lo'Ree de-radicalize and ultimately re-dedicate his life to Jesus Christ. For 10 years, Lo'Ree has helped extremists find a new way to live, through a counter-terrorism effort called Parallel Networks. He says the only way to open those doors is through conversations and compassion. Unfortunately, technology combined with bad actors has torn the social fabric by trying to replace community with an online world. That's why Dr. Kowert wants to remind gamers and others that when things appear bad online or in life, they have the power to make a change.

CBN Senior Washington Correspondent Tara Mergener Reports: Parents are claiming a Virginia school district is indoctrinating their children into transgender ideology, and they're taking their case to court. The school district is also accused of hiding sensitive information on gender identity from parents. Harrisonburg is one of several school systems faced with legal action in recent months. This suit accuses school officials of promoting gender fluidity while hiding it from parents. Middle school teacher Deb Figliola is one of those suing the district. The policy in question requires teachers to ask students which name and pronoun are preferred and teachers must use it. A quidance counselor is to be notified if the student's choice is different from their biological sex although school officials are forbidden to tell parents. Alliance Defending Freedom has filed suit against Harrisonburg city public schools on behalf of six parents and teachers. As practicing Christians, the plaintiffs say this policy forces staff members to go against their faith, that it violates free speech, and usurps parental rights. District officials declined CBN's request for an interview, pointing us instead to a statement that reads in part: "...the focus is always to foster a team approach that includes and supports the unique needs of the student and family on a case-by-case basis..." At least 18 states, along with the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, have recently issued school guidance in some form focused on inclusion and treatment of transgender students. Lanae Erickson, who came out to her own parents years ago, calls the issue complicated. Citing confidentiality and privacy, public schools often don't tell parents when students socially transition. Like Harrison schools, a growing number of districts in other states face complaints over secrecy. Others argue there are good reasons for not notifying parents. They point out examples such as avoiding "outing" kids who could be in harm's way at home or kids not ready to tell parents. Deb, an educator of 25 years, however, maintains moms and dads are being kept in the dark at a time when children need them most. Meanwhile, as the debate plays out, experts say the number of gender-questioning youth is on the rise.

CBN Washington Correspondent Jenna Browder Reports: During the pandemic, millions of children spent months learning online. Studies show that American kids spend a huge chunk of the day there, and not just for school. For some, it's become an addition. That's why Molly DeFrank tells CBN it's time for a digital detox. Her new book, Digital Detox: The Two-Week Tech Reset for Kids was inspired by her own family and their experience. The book begins by taking parents step by step through a two-week cold turkey detox for their children. She says it comes down to brain chemistry. Too much screen time creates excessive levels of dopamine in the brain, the kind that can be addicting. For kids, it's a problem that can follow them well into their adult lives. The second half of her book helps parents develop a long-term strategy using their observations from the detox period. So how often should parents do a digital detox? DeFrank says it's in its right place. Her own children are testament to that. In just two weeks, she says they were free from the grip of technology, moods shifted, creativity exploded, and they learned how to entertain themselves and enjoy life without screens. And it's not just for our kids, DeFrank adds. Adults too can benefit from a digital detox.

CBN Senior National Affairs Correspondent Heather Sells Reports: Gender medical treatment for children has seen a staggering spike in recent years. In the U.S. alone, more than 50 pediatric clinics perform or refer out for procedures, including surgery, that could leave young patients unable to have children of their own. Now, a surprising move by the American Academy of Pediatrics may be putting the brakes on such radical measures. It comes in the wake of criticism from parents and professionals, plus a significant shift in direction overseas. In July, the United Kingdom stunned many when it closed its Tavistock Centre, the country's gender clinic for children. The shutdown came after an independent review found shaky scientific evidence for pushing hormones, puberty blockers, and surgery. U.S. hormone specialists like pediatric endocrinologist Dr. Paul Hruz are paying close attention to the gaps in research. Now, a class action lawsuit against Tavistock is launching with potentially up to a thousand affected families joining. In the U.S., social media protests over pediatric gender clinics have taken off, prompting places like the Boston Children's Hospital to remove videos explaining its surgeries. On Monday, The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) appeared to backpedal, saying that for the vast majority of children, it does not recommend medical treatment or surgery. In 2018, it called the watchful waiting method, which delays medical treatment, an outdated approach. The Society for Evidence-Based Gender Medicine (SEGM), recently formed to promote better research on gender medicine. It noted that the AAP's move realigns it with the UK's new stance as well as that of Sweden and Finland. It also called on the AAP to "update its quidelines accordingly" and spell out alternative treatments like psychotherapy. The recent growth in gender medicine has been dramatic. In the U.K., young patients seeking help(http://(https://gids.nhs.uk/about-us/number-of-referrals/)) have risen from hundreds to thousands yearly in just the last decade. In the U.S., more than 50 pediatric clinics have been opened since Boston first began its center in 2007. Mary Rice Hasson, director of the Person and Identity Project at the Ethics & Public Policy Center, has tracked the field for years, and says the gender medical treatments given to young children are alarming. Medical advocates like Dr. Johanna Olson at Children's Hospital Los Angeles contend that giving puberty blockers at a young age can prevent tragedy. Still, research shows these treatments can cause kids to lose their ability to have children some day and Hasson argues that they can't meaningfully grasp the possible long-term effects. Many parents are rising up by seeking support in parent groups or becoming politically active after witnessing how gender medicine has harmed their children. Doctors are also speaking out in professional groups like SEGM. Hruz said he'd like to see more rigorous research in the field and a slower approach among practitioners.
