## **Kidney Disease – 03/21/16 - TFN**

:60 spot There is a progressive and potentially fatal health condition that effects one in seven American adults, and causes more deaths annually than either breast cancer or prostate cancer. One third of Americans are at risk of developing this disease, and yet the symptoms are so difficult to detect that most people don't even know they have it until they become critically ill and require emergency medical intervention. Can you guess what it is? It's chronic kidney disease, a preventable and treatable condition that takes a terrible toll on overall health and quality of life for millions of Americans.

Our kidneys play a vital role in keeping us healthy and ensuring our bodies work properly. Their primary function is to filter wastes and extra water out

### **Children's Eye Health 09/05/18 – TFN**

:60 spot Eye health is important to overall health, especially for children. One in four children have vision problems that, if left untreated, may result in learning issues and hinder development and academic performance in school. All children, even those with no signs of trouble, should have their eyes checked during the first few years of life, before entering kindergarten, and throughout the school years. Signs of vision problems include squinting while reading or watching TV, frequently rubbing the eyes, one eye appearing crossed or looking outwards, or issues reading or writing. Watch for digital eye strain, which is caused by prolonged use of computers or smartphones and can cause dry eyes, blurred vision or headaches. **Bridging the Gap – 28:00 Minutes – Saturday 1:00 p.m. & 7:30 p.m. – 10/03/20**

PSA: Bridging the Gap

Host: Sal Mendez; Guest: Ivory Weatherspoon, Milton Johnson, Natasha Johnson, Dairy Weatherspoon

Sal welcomed the audience and thanked them for tuning in. Sal welcomed his guests and asked them to introduce themselves. Milton shared that as a collective group, they have a non-profit called Led by the Spirit, Lead by Example. They are a Christian hip hop group. They like to offer filming, photography and audio engineering services to Christian entities. They want to provide quality work for their pro bono services. They don't want money to get in the way of ministry, so they don't charge for their services. They are also passionate about producing quality work so it will be noticed by the mainstream folks. They do accept donations, but they don't outright charge for their services.

Ivory shared that Milton started doing hip hop in prisons, and Milton invited Ivory to join him. They started recording and photography in the prisons, which allowed them to help outside people understand what was happening in the prisons. Their wives then joined them in going into the prisons. Dairy shared that it was hard to go into the prisons initially, but then she realized how free she felt while she was there. It is important for people on the outside to see what it's like on the inside of prison.

Dairy shared that people in prison are without pretense and are very transparent. She said that she would rather be in prison than in church, because there are no facades.

Natasha preached for the first time in a prison. She shared that she started doing prison ministry when she was 18. Natasha is a singer, as are others in the group.

A few people in the group sang a few lyrics from some of their songs.

The group focuses on putting Christ first and allows their testimonies to take a back seat. They want God to get the glory for all of their talents and everything they're producing. Sal said that it's important to focus on Christ

and everything else will fall in place. Natasha Johnson just released a single titled "Best Friend". It's available on YouTube, iTunes and any digital platform.

### **Bridging the Gap – 28:00 Minutes – Saturday 7:30 p.m. – 10/10/20**

PSA: Bridging the Gap, 10-10-2020

Host: Sal Mendez; Guests: Heather McCaskill, Jackie Hatcher and Norma Estrada from One by One Ministries

Sal welcomed the audience and thanked them for tuning in. Sal asked his guests to introduce themselves and talk about their ministry. Heather shared that she's the executive director of One By One Ministries, which is a faith-based mentoring ministry to new and expecting moms. The ministry was founded in San Antonio over 20 years ago, but they took a break about 5 years ago. The ministry mentors' moms to parent well, coming alongside moms at a critical time to support and educate them through the first year of their child's life.

Heather mentioned that Norma served with One by One Ministries 10-15 years ago. Norma shared that she went through the One by One program about 10 years ago with her daughter Jennifer, who was a pregnant teenager. Norma became a mentor, and she served at the ministry for several years. Norma's daughter had a baby girl named Genesis. Norma

knew the importance of One by One Ministries, so she began praying and fasting to bring it back to the San Antonio area when it ended, because there is so much need. Sal reiterated that God's timing is perfect... and that although God says be still, He doesn't say stop moving.

One by One Ministries is always looking for mentors to get involved in the lives of new and expecting moms, and they will provide the necessary training for anyone who is interested. One by One Ministries will minister to any mom of any age, any socioeconomic background and any marital status. 40% of births are to single moms. One by One Ministries has three main goals: 1) to provide a young mom support, to help her know she's not alone and she is loved unconditionally and has worth, and that the Lord has a plan for her life and for the life of her child. 2) they want to equip moms to be great parents, so they share educational materials with their moms so they can know how to keep their children safe; they share developmental milestones and provide activities that a mom can do with her child to promote development. 3) they want their moms to know that the Lord loves them and that One by One Ministries is there to support her.

Heather shared that they are now trying to raise awareness of the ministry and the need in the community. Once the mentors are trained, they are then matched with a mom, who they will meet with once a month with weekly contact in between meetings. They will begin meeting while the mom is pregnant and will continue meeting until at least the child's first birthday. If the mom wants to meet more frequently, that is an option too.

Sal shared how important having a mentor has been in his own life. Sal also shared that since children don't come with manuals on what to do, mentorship would be so important to better equip young moms.

They will have a mentor training coming up soon. Anyone who's interested in the training or interested in getting a mentor can learn more on the ministry's website: [www.onebyoneusa.org](http://www.onebyoneusa.org). Mentors will initially meet with their mentees in a neutral location while the two get to know each other.

Sal said that One by One Ministries is a great resource to any new or expecting mom looking for help and guidance. Norma shared her personal experience with One by One Ministries and her pregnant 17-year-old daughter.

Sal asked Jackie to introduce herself and tell what role she has at One By One Ministries. Jackie shared that the best part is, for anyone who wants to become a member, the ministry provides everything that a mentor will need to be a good mentor. Each mentor also has a mentor prayer partner so they can share what they're experiencing with someone who can relate. The mentor has a curriculum that they follow with the mentee. Sal asked what they look for in a mentor. Jackie shared that to be a mentor, someone will need to be 21+, complete an application, have a background check, and agree with their statement of faith. Applications are also available on their website. They can also call their Memphis office at 901-857-1153.

PSA: Bridging the Gap

Host: Sal Mendez; Guests: Rose & Robert Reyes with King's Compassion

Sal welcomed the audience and thanked them for tuning in. By way of introduction, Sal mentioned that his guests today serve the senior citizens of San Antonio. Sal introduced Rose and Robert Reyes and thanked them for being on the program. Sal recently met the Reyes' and asked them for their background.

Rose said that Robert graduated from South San High School in San Antonio in 1978. Rose was born in Monterrey but came to San Antonio when she was 3. Rose also graduated in 1978. Robert and Rose started attending a new church in 1999, when someone mentioned they wanted to start doing work with the poor in San Antonio. She went to a meeting to learn more, and she started volunteering with them, and later Robert joined

her. They went door-to-door and gave out candies, and asked if they could pray with those whose homes they were at. The organization was focused on children and youth, but as they continued going door to door, Robert and Rose's hearts were being tugged toward the elderly since they tend to be neglected and forgotten.

In 2003, Robert was cutting limbs in his yard, and he fell off a ladder from a considerable height and broke his back. Robert was disabled for over a year, and his trucking company Central Freightline couldn't hold his job that long, even though he'd been with them for 23 years. Robert got the help he needed and was restored to health after a long journey.

During a mission trip to Mozambique in 2007, Robert heard the Lord tell him it was time to step out and do something new. He initially didn't tell Rose about it. King's Compassion was borne out of Robert's desire to help senior citizens. At the time, Rose was working in management and was caring for her elderly widowed mom. They got a 501c3 and started King's Compassion, an organization that focuses on providing for a senior citizen's total wellbeing. They serve people aged 70+ who are living at or below the poverty level. That means the people they are serving make less than \$1,064 per month for a single person and \$1,437 for a family. They want to expand their services to other areas of San Antonio.

King's Compassion offers companionship and builds relationships with the elderly clients. Pre-COVID, they would spend time visiting with their clients. During COVID, they are calling them on the phone and see if they have any needs. They also want to make sure they have the things they need, so King's Compassion delivers groceries to their clients. Most of their clients are homebound or shouldn't drive. With COVID, they are at greater risk of contracting the disease. They also do minor home repairs for them. Robert and their volunteers take care of their lawncare. They have also painted the houses of elderly clients, replacing rotted woodwork in the process. They have organizations that donate supplies to them that they then distribute.

The Reyes' are currently operating King's Compassion out of their home, but they are praying for a warehouse this year. They do what they can to restore the dignity of the clients they serve by recognizing their birthdays, Mother's and Father's Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. If there is a need

that King's Compassion can't fulfill, they do their best to find resources in the community who might be able to help out.

Rose shared that unless the Lord chooses otherwise, at some point all of us are going to become an elderly person, so it's good to have a paradigm shift and have compassion on the older generations now. We need to pass on compassion to the younger generations. Compassion isn't about feeling a deep sorrow about someone's situation, it's about taking action. You can give of your time, your talents, your skills and prayers to help King's Compassion.

Host: Jimmy Robles & Sal Mendez; Guest: Teresa Salazar with God Sees Your Tears Ministry

Jimmy welcomed the audience and thanked them for tuning in and thanked Sal for filling in for him. Jimmy asked Teresa to introduce herself and talk about the ministry she's involved in.

Jimmy mentioned that she recently received turkeys, and Teresa shared that she plans to distribute the turkeys to 20 families in need to those families through God Sees Your Tears Ministry.

Jimmy asked about Teresa's background. Jimmy shared that Teresa's son was murdered 2 years ago, and he mentioned that he lost his daughter in a car accident around the same time. Holidays are particularly tough when there's an empty chair at the dinner table.

Teresa shared that her son was 33 when he was murdered. He was Teresa's firstborn and was a Christian rapper. Her son would routinely wake her up in the middle of the night to share new lyrics he'd written. Teresa shared that her son was a former heroin addict, and he went to jail because of it. At the time Teresa was working in Austin and convicted her to move back to San Antonio to put her family back together. In jail, her son encountered God and brought Teresa back to the church.

Teresa's son went to take care of some business. Later that day, the police knocked on Teresa's door and asked if Abel Salazar was her son. She said he was, and they proceeded to tell her that her son was deceased. Teresa started screaming when she was outside, so they took her inside. Teresa found out he'd been murdered. She was in total disbelief and was like a zombie. She thought she knew what pain was, but she'd never experienced pain like this before.

Grief is like a rollercoaster. But God has been so faithful to Teresa. What the devil meant to destroy her, she's turning into a positive. Sometimes something has to die in order for something else to live.

God Sees Your Tears Ministry came into existence in mid-November when she was sitting on her sofa, very angry. She told God she couldn't take the pain anymore. She had a gun in her hand and was contemplating suicide. Death seemed a whole bunch better right then. The Lord came to her and told her that He had a purpose for her life. He told her that He has seen Teresa's tears. He led her to start the ministry. She was resistant at first, but then she came around.

Around this time, a friend returned a bag of clothes that belonged to Teresa's daughter. In the bag was a sealed letter from Abel. Her daughter gathered the family and read the letter out loud to them. The letter contained a personal message to each of them, and Abel's letter

encouraged Teresa to move forward with the work that God has given her to do. She vowed at that point to serve God the rest of her life.

Since then, Teresa has had a celebration on the anniversary of her son's death. Many people have been saved at those events. She is particularly passionate for those who are addicted to drugs.

Her long-term goal is to open a center to provide activities and resources, because the need is there. COVID has really increased the needs in the special needs community, as it has throughout the city. Rosie's Gracious Heart accepts donations of food and money.

They need \$2,000 in order to purchase the 15-passenger van. Pastor Raul from Journey to the Cross Church has the van for sale. So far, they have \$350 to put towards the van.

Pastor Randy welcomed the audience and introduced his guest, actor Brett Varvel. Brett will be the lead actor in a new Christian film called "Play the Flute". Mark expressed his appreciation for KDRY and their impact on the seven mountains of society.

Mark said he met Jacob around 6 months ago, and he asked Jacob when he first came to know Jesus as his Lord and Savior.

Jacob shared that in the good, the bad, and the ugly is a testimony. He knows God's hand has been on his life from a very young age. At the age of 10, the Lord started working in his life, with his grandmother bringing him to the Lord. She told him that he would be a minister for the Lord and that he'd "go to the nations". As a shy, timid, young boy he couldn't imagine how this would be possible. His grandmother emphasized the love of Christ.

One day when he was home alone, he turned on the TV to hear Kenneth Copeland preaching. He was preaching on the love of Christ, just as his grandmother shared with him. Kenneth Copeland pointed at the TV and said, "You need to receive the Lord Jesus Christ inside your heart". It really moved Jacob. Kenneth's show ended, and following his program came Billy Graham. He also started sharing about the love of Jesus. Jacob started weeping. Billy: "At the end of this night, kneel down at your bedside and ask the Lord Jesus Christ into your heart and into your life". That's exactly what Jacob did. That night started everything for Jacob at the age of 10.

Mark shared that he came to faith in Christ at the age of seven, and he strongly believes that when the gospel is presented at an age-appropriate level and they can understand the message, they are able to receive Christ. Children mature at different paces, so there are variables.

Jacob mentioned that he was experiencing some physical and emotional abuses at that time. The love of Christ mended his broken heart. He saw the goodness of the Lord at that time. Days after that, a minister knocked on Jacob's door and welcomed him to come to his church. So he went to the church, and it was a wonderful church that sang the old hymns. However, Jacob knew there was something that was still missing. There was something more to this Christian life.

At the age of 13, his best friend came up to him and invited him to a youth rally. So Jacob went. He felt the same presence as the night he received Jesus. The pastor walked right up to Jacob and gave him a huge hug. The

pastor said that he felt like he just needed to give Jacob a hug. Jacob was amazed as he heard the pastor prophesy about his life. The pastor told him exactly what his grandmother had... that he was going to preach the gospel and go to the nations.

At the youth rally, they had an altar call, and Jacob went forward. The pastor started talking about the love of Christ and the repentance of sins. Jacob was then invited to youth camp, which is where his life was really changed. It was there he encountered the Holy Spirit, which is what changed his life. It was at that camp that he spoke in tongues for the first time.

Mark asked Jacob to expound on the fire of God. Jacob explained that it is the presence of the Lord. There is a strong anointing that comes upon you. As a shy child, when the Holy Spirit empowered him, he wasn't shy anymore.

Mark asked Jacob when he said "yes" to God. Jacob said that he received the call at the youth camp when he was 14. Jacob said that each and every one of us has a call on our life. Everyone has a divine purpose.

Mark mentioned the idea of New Year's resolutions and how we commit to things that fade away. Maybe this is a time to recommit to important things, like making God first in your life, marriage, and family.

Jacob walked people through the principles of salvation using the ABCs. Admit that you're a sinner. Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ. Confess with your mouth that Jesus is your Lord. Jacob led the closing prayer.

Mark started the program by introducing Gene Hildebrand, founder of Engage SA.

Gene expressed his appreciation to be on the program. Gene shared that Engage SA is a call to action to help people find ministry opportunities. They publish a weekly calendar about ministry opportunities in San Antonio. They currently have 20-30 different ministries each week. They feature church events, evangelistic outreaches, concerts, and other activities. The weekly calendar is sent to 750 people who have subscribed to their email list. It is also posted on Engage SA's Facebook page.

Mark mentioned that getting the word out about church events can be a challenge, since publicizing an event often requires a budget. Gene said that his services are absolutely free. Event details can be emailed to Engage SA at [calendar@engagesa.org](mailto:calendar@engagesa.org). Unity in the body of Christ is so important, which is the goal of Engage SA. They want to connect the body of Christ all across San Antonio, regardless of their ethnicity or geographic location.

Mark mentioned we're stronger together. Veronica asked about where to find Engage SA on Facebook. Gene said they can be found by searching Engage SA on Facebook, which also includes information about their podcast, which includes interviews with faith leaders across San Antonio.

Veronica read Engage SA's mission statement "Engage is a call to action, a challenge to make a difference, an imperative to serve and a directive to be the Church, advancing the kingdom and transforming our city".

Mark asked about how listeners can find their podcast. Gene shared all the podcasts are posted on Soundcloud. Search for "Engage with Gene Hildebrand". They have roughly 60 different interviews that range from 10-20 minutes. As Gene has traveled around the area, he's found that people have a desire in their heart for unity of the body of Christ. There are steps that we need to take in order to collaborate well. Without collaboration, we'll never have unity.

Gene talked about sanctified networking, which he defines as "glorious connections by divine appointments that advance the kingdom and transform the city". As Christians, there are ways for us to collaborate that will lead us to unity in the church.

Veronica mentioned the different services that Engage SA offers through their ministry. Gene mentioned that he's been facilitating a workshop on divorce recovery. No group activities are going on right now, but he's doing one-on-one meetings. The divorce recovery classes came out of his own divorce. He sees this as a need he can fill out of his own experience to help break the cycle of divorce. The group discussed the impact of divorce and the views for divorce in their own families.

Veronica mentioned that the one thing that has helped her marriage is that they have put Christ in the center of their marriage. Gene mentioned that Christ isn't there as a helper in a marriage, but He's there to be the source of their marriage. For victorious Christian living to happen, Christ has to be the center of our lives.

Gene said that for anyone experiencing divorce right now, to get help. The help and resources are out there. If pain avoidance is the goal, it's going to lead to a lot of dysfunctional behaviors: drug/alcohol use, intimacy outside of marriage, etc. God will help heal you so you can engage in a healthy relationship in the future.

Mark said that if someone goes through healing, they can look forward to life after divorce. Veronica asked how listeners can reach Gene if they need divorce recovery help. Gene shared his ministry's contact details: [gene@engagesa.org](mailto:gene@engagesa.org); message through Facebook: Engage SA.

Mark brought up the fact that financial struggles are also a common cause of divorce. Engage SA offers counseling and coaching regarding finances. Gene mentioned the biggest takeaway he had from the book, *Rich Dad Poor Dad*: "Everyone in life must choose whether to be a

consumer of wealth or an accumulator of wealth. No one can be both". Dave Ramsey's materials and Financial Peace University is also a great resource.

Gene closed the program in prayer.

She started making cakes just for her family's celebrations, and it eventually morphed into a business after Natalie became pregnant with her daughter.

Natalie's husband bought her the first box of business cards and is very involved in supply purchases. Veronica shared how important it is to have your spouse on board with ideas like this. Veronica also said that being a stay-at-home mom doesn't mean doing nothing... that it's a fulltime job in and of itself.

Mark shared that in raising the next generation, it's important to have a parent at home with the kids. Sometimes it's not financially possible, but when it can be, it's very beneficial. Natalie said that she's seen some real benefits of staying at home with her three kids. Mark and Veronica discussed their family life and the struggles that are out there with raising kids. Electronics have played a major role in kids today.

Mark asked Natalie where she got the idea for the name of her business. Natalie shared that she had two friends that were her first customers, but they told her she needed a name for her business. Her husband told her that sometimes you need to step out in faith and take a chance. Natalie thought about it and incorporated that idea into the name of her business, which is based on Luke 1:33.

Mark asked about what she's making now. Natalie shared she decorates cupcakes and is open to suggestions from customers. Veronica asked

Natalie to share how special it is when she sees the faces of her customers. Natalie said that it is priceless to see the reaction of her customers. Some of her customers will send her pictures of the cupcakes she's made, and she finds that very rewarding.

Natalie has a page on Facebook that you can find by searching Natalie's Faith Cakes. Veronica encouraged the audience to check out her Facebook page and to like and follow her page.

Mark said that everyone needs a pick-me-up sometimes. Mark mentioned the Proverbs 31 woman and expounded upon how contributing to the family is part of the image displayed in this chapter of scripture. Mark said that Natalie is embodying that spirit with her business. Veronica said that Proverbs 31 came to her mind when she thought about Natalie's business too.

Veronica mentioned that Natalie's in-laws are pastors of a church. Natalie said that her entire family is involved with the ministry and plays a role at the church. The church has a food pantry and other ministries.

Mark said that they are noticing as they interview different businesses, if you're looking at only finances in your business, you're not going to really enjoy what you're doing and you won't be fulfilled. If it's only about finances, it's not going to be fulfilling. In faith, sometimes you just need to step out.

Natalie has said that faith has been a big part of her business, She's had to trust that God will bring her the orders she needs to provide for her family. Orders for Natalie's Faith Cakes can be made through her Facebook page. She needs the date you need the cupcakes, and a brief description of the style and flavors you're looking for. She appreciates 2 days' notice for simple orders and 2 weeks' notice for larger quantity or complicated design orders.

Natalie closed the program in prayer.

PSA: Impact Radio

Hosts: Mark & Veronica Lugo; Guest: Angela Williams from Abba Father Christian Store

Mark and Veronica welcomed the audience and introduced their guest, Angela Williams from Abba Father Christian Store. Mark shared that it's an amazing resource for the body of Christ. For anyone interested in learning more about God or exploring their faith, they have a lot of resources available.

Angela gave all glory and honor to God for the opportunity to be on Impact Radio. Mark asked her to share her story and mentioned that a huge storm brought her to San Antonio in the first place. Angela shared that she's originally from New Orleans, LA and was brought to San Antonio because of Hurricane Katrina. She's married with 3 children. Hurricane Katrina wasn't her first hurricane, but as a child, it seemed exciting to stay in hotels for a few days. However, as an adult with a family, it was more unnerving to outrun a storm.

She and her family first wound up in a small Mississippi town, and as a young black woman, it was very scary because of the racial tension. She went into a gas station to ask for help finding a hotel, and the attendant told her she wouldn't find a hotel in their town. Angela went to leave the store and tripped. She immediately started to cry, and the attendant called her back and handed her the keys to her own trailer and told her that Angela and her family could stay at her place. Angela tried to give her money, but the young lady wouldn't accept it. Angela and her family stayed at the lady's trailer until the hurricane was heading toward them. The young lady explained that she and her dad were leaving to flee the storm, but that Angela and her family were welcome to stay.

Angela's family decided to leave since the storm was heading their direction, and it's a very good thing they did. A huge oak tree outside the

trailer was snapped in half and fell straight through the trailer where they'd been sleeping. They saw the hand of God working in their lives through the entire thing.

Angela and her family headed to Texas. God has made ways to provide for her family. She kept trying to head back to New Orleans, but she kept getting blocked.

One time, Angela and her family went camping, and she noticed a pain in her back. She tried to shrug it off but it got worse, so they went home. The next day, Angela was paralyzed from her waist down. For 8 months, she was paralyzed. She had plans to move back to New Orleans around that time, but her condition kept her in San Antonio. Angela eventually had back surgery, and her doctors told her she'd never be able to walk again because of the nerve damage in her back.

She was still under anesthesia but she could hear her mom screaming after hearing the news. Angela was still out but could hear everything, and she wanted to tell her mom that everything was going to be okay, that she'd walk again one day with God's help. Angela started anointing her legs with oil and would thank God for allowing her to walk again one day. This whole experience really built her faith in God. When she ran out of anointing oil, she used cooking oil.

She now has an added compassion when she sees people in wheelchairs. She also saw God work through an injury to her Achilles heel. She kept reading passages in Scripture where Jesus said "by your faith you're healed". Angela shared that God is in the miracle and healing business.

Mark shared that you shouldn't judge someone's situation without really knowing what's going on with them. So many times in scripture, things got worse before it got better.

Abba Father Christian Store was started after Angela lost her job. They just opened a new store on the west side of San Antonio. Right before the store was opening, her youngest daughter was going through a depression period. Her daughter couldn't express what was wrong, but she was sinking into a deep depression. She went to her church and her pastors

prayed for her. She was driving home on the highway, and her car completely shut off for no reason. She called her husband to come get her. And during that experience, the breakthrough came for her daughter.

So many times, hard things are kept secret for other people. Angela shared that you need to surround yourself with believers who can support and encourage each other. We have to do ministry together and help each other. It's a team effort. Veronica said that so often, we don't share our struggles because we don't want to be judged, but we need the prayer support of other believers.

Veronica shared the struggles they had when they went to name their radio program. Veronica shared that so many times, we go through struggles so we can help others.

Angela said that Abba Father Christian Stores isn't just a store... it's a testimony of God's faithfulness. Mark shared there are 3 Abba Father Christian stores, one in the Land of Americas, one in River Center and one on the westside of San Antonio on Castorville Road. Mark said to buy your Christian books there.

Mark reiterated that this show has been about breakthrough, to release the things that have been holding you back. Mark and Angela closed the program in prayer.

He thanked Angela for being on the program and for the audience for tuning in. Program ended abruptly.
