Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significantly facing our community in this quarter:

- A. Heat-related issues and the extreme Arizona summer temperatures.**
- B. Arizona children and our “at-risk” youth population.**
- C. First Responders and Military population.**
- D. Homeless, underserved, and poverty-level population.**
- E. Physically and mentally challenged.**
- F. Conservation issues and safeguarding our resources.**
- G. Animal neglect, abuse, and overpopulation issues.**

Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below.

A. Heat-related issues and the extreme Arizona summer temperatures.

Valley Focus - Broadcast on July 14th at 6:00 AM, July 28th at 6:07 AM, August 4th at 6:00 AM, and August 18th at 6:11 AM; Duration 9 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Nicole Pena of the Phoenix Rescue Mission. As the heat in our valley increases to triple digits, the homeless population faces even greater risks. Phoenix Rescue Mission ministers to the homeless by sending out Hope Coaches that traverse the valley looking for those homeless in need. They travel to encampments, river beds, alley ways, and highway underpasses. The homeless are offered water and an invitation to come into any Phoenix Rescue Mission facility.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on August 11th at 6:00 AM, August 18th at 6:21 AM, and August 25th at 6:00 AM; Duration 14 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Bill Montgomery, Maricopa County Attorney. The discussion focused on the “Don’t Leave Me Behind” Campaign, a collaboration with the Governor’s Offices of Highway Safety, Phoenix Children’s Hospital, and the Arizona Humane Society to prevent the deaths of children and animals that are left behind in vehicles during the hot Arizona summer months. Also discussed was new “Good Samaritan Law” that protects anyone who helps a child or pet left in a hot car from prosecution.

Valley Focus - Broadcast on July 7th at 6:47 AM, July 14th at 6:19 AM, July 21st at 6:21 AM, and July 28th at 6:16 AM; Duration 12 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Jessica Berg and Emily Radowic of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Composed of 95% volunteers, the society, with donations of things like water, sunscreen, hats, hygiene items and food, assists those in our community in need. They also help the homeless get in transitional homes.

B. Arizona children and our “at-risk” youth population.

Valley Focus - Broadcast on September 8th at 6:00 AM and September 22nd at 6:11 AM; Duration 10 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Nikki Kuntz, Clinical Director for Teen Lifeline. September is “Suicide Awareness and Prevention Month.” The fall months can be difficult for teens as they move into a new school year with many stressful events and often difficult relationships. The upcoming holidays can also offer another level of stress with exams - extra events and responsibilities. Teen Lifeline offers a confidential resource for teens who are depressed/considering suicide. They have teens that are trained to provide peer counseling via phone and all avenues of social media.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on September 1st at 6:00 AM and September 8th at 6:14 AM; Duration 14 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Dr. Kelly Warren of the Florence Crittenton School for Girls. For over 123 years, this organization has provided the empowerment and support of young women, girls, and their children. They strive to offer safety, hope, and opportunity to girls from 10 years old to adult age with various programs and services, as well as a high school and thrift shop.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on July 7th at 6:25 AM, July 28th at 6:28 AM, August 4th at 6:22 AM; Duration 11.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Emily Denis of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Metro Phoenix along with Karen Vangelos of Twin Peaks Restaurants. Boys and Girls Clubs strive to be the premiere out-of-school-time provider of programs for kids focusing on four main goals; 1) Fun with a purpose, 2) Be great/do good, 3) Academic success and 4) Healthy choices. Twin Peaks, along with the Boys and Girls Clubs, are sponsoring a drive to collect all types of new athletic equipment for kids who could not afford these items themselves for summer league play.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on July 21st at 6:49 AM and July 28th at 6:40 AM; Duration 10.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Laurene Austin – Director of Development and Marketing for the Herberger Theater, a non-profit organization that serves the community with programs and outreach opportunities, including the “Childsplay” children’s arts program. Herberger Theater will be supporting many groups that focus on summer sessions for Arizona youth – including a workshop for the upcoming Addams Family production that will reach out to underprivileged and at-risk students.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on July 14th at 6:51 A and July 21st at 6:40 AM; duration 8.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Ronnie Williams, President of the HeroZona Foundation. This is a non-profit group founded by Desert Storm veteran heroes to invest in initiatives for veterans and underserved students. They are sponsoring this year’s “Tools 4 Schools”, Arizona’s largest back-to-school giveaway. This annual event has impacted over 40,000 students and their families, and was voted “Best Annual Charity Event” by a local magazine. There will be college workshops, games, and free breakfast for all who attend. For this upcoming event, listeners are asked to donate school supplies such as book bags, notebooks, writing utensils, markers, crayons, and paper.

C. First Responders and Military population.

Valley Focus — Broadcast on August 11th at 6:15 AM; duration 10.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Chandler Fire Battalion Chief, Jeff West, and Jon Ford, Director of Strategic Initiatives for the Vitalyst Foundation. This group works with communities around the state to create a healthier community and provides grants to try to help people work collaboratively across sectors of the population. One of their latest grants is to support the Chandler Fire Department’s Crisis Support Training program, which is an initiative that provides behavioral health treatment to firefighters across the state. Vitalyst also partnered with Arizona State University to provide curriculum that gives Fire Fighters training in understanding the emotional situations and needs of the people they help, in order to more effectively serve the public.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on July 7th at 6:00 AM, July 14th at 6:31 AM, and July 28th at 6:00 AM; Duration 7 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Jim Hill, Vice-President of Arizona Law Enforcement Outreach and Support (LEO'S). LEO'S is a collaboration of first responders that provides support to injured and fallen first responders and their families. They are gathering school supplies over the summer for at-risk youth in our valley area. Police officers will head out into the community to deliver these supplies. The goal is to foster trust for police officers and other first responders, as well as to open paths of communication.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on September 22nd at 6:35 AM and September 29th at 6:35 AM; Duration 14 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Andrew Christian, Executive Director of the Marine Raider Foundation. Andrew is a former Marine who is organizing programs and events to support Marine Raiders and their families after injury, retirement, or death. The Marine Raider "Valley of the Sun Gala" will take place October 5th. Gala-goers will hear speeches by Derek Herrera (who served and was injured in Afghanistan), and Kirsty Ennis, a Marine veteran who lost her leg and now initiates programs for the handicapped.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on August 25th at 6:49 AM, September 1st at 6:49 AM, and September 8th at 6:50 AM; Duration 9.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Riley Murph, Firefighter and Paramedic for the Salt River Fire Department. His group, along with the National Fallen Firefighters' Foundation and the Firefighters' Relief Fund, is hosting a 9/11 stair climb on Sunday, September 8th. This will commemorate all those who lost their lives helping others during the terrible Twin Towers' tragedy in New York on September 11th, 2001. Participants will climb 2017 steps to represent the 110 stories in the Twin Towers. Climbers will each wear a commemorative name tag of a fallen hero, and will ring a bell when they finish their symbolic climb.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on September 29th at 6:50 AM; Duration 9 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Stephanie Barriero from the Boston Beer Company and Pete Tocco of the Scottsdale Firefighters' Association. Boston Beer will sponsor "Scotttoberfest" to raise money for charity. The supported charity for this event is the Scottsdale Firefighters' Association, which is a group of firefighters that give back to the community by donating time for community service. In the past year, this included serving meals to students who would not have had lunch otherwise during the teachers' strike – and also rescuing a horse from a trampoline pit.

D. Homeless, underserved, and poverty-level population.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on July 28th at 6:51 AM; Duration 8.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Jenny Ho Viczunko, representing Project Joy, an initiative started as a tribute to Jenny's father's lifelong medical missions. Project Joy is implementing a program whereby a hospital in a financially struggling area is "adopted". Jenny and her husband, who are medical professionals, donate equipment and training for the hospital and its staff.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on July 7th at 6:08 AM, July 14th at 6:11 AM, July 14th at 6:11 AM, and July 21st at 6:00 AM; Duration 7.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Mylem Byers, Director of Sports Partnerships. He is coordinating a program in collaboration with Food for the Hungry in an effort to end extreme poverty in Arizona, and around the world. To help this program, Sports Partnerships has founded the "Striking Out Poverty" Baseball Campaign. This program connects fans with those in need, with donations to match funds donated by their favorite players. As an example, Arizona Diamondback Nick Ahmed is donating funds every time he gets a hit, and pitcher Luke Weaver is donating funds every time he strikes out a player.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on July 21st at 6:31 AM; Duration 8.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Joan Serviss and Cameron Stenson of the Arizona Housing Coalition. This is a state-wide organization that is a professional association dedicated to ending homelessness and advocating for “a safe, affordable place to call home” for all Arizonans. The Arizona Housing Coalition accomplishes this through continuing education programs, and also by coordinating heat relief drives in the summer months to help local residents. They also collaborate with other organizations throughout the state to impact local, state, and national laws. And they sponsor events throughout the year such as the “Arizona Veteran Stand Down”, which provides legal and medical assistance to veterans.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on August 18th at 6:35 AM, August 25th at 6:24 AM, and September 8th at 6:28 AM – A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Brent Downs and Katie Thorson of the “St. Joseph the Worker” organization. This is a 31-year old valley non-profit group that provides employment services to the homeless, disadvantaged, and working poor. Throughout their 5 locations, St. Joseph the Worker provides resumes, cover letters, resources, and any help possible to aid in the employment of anyone needing assistance. The Phoenix area currently has over 30,000 homeless children and adults, and 1 in 7 people are experiencing extreme poverty.

E. Physically and mentally challenged.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on September 29th at 6:32 AM; Duration 11 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Christopher William Riley, Compliance Officer for Crossroads. This is a residential substance abuse center which was started in 1960 as a 20-bed facility and has grown to 7 facilities that house 408 male and female clients. Crossroads also has outpatient programs that include relapse prevention, anger management, and life skills. As opioid abuse and addiction has become a major problem, Crossroads has developed new strategic programs to address these issues. They are looking for volunteers from every industry to help address problems across the spectrum of needs, as well as financial support and donations of much-needed supplies.

Valley Focus - Broadcast on August 11th at 6:25 AM and September 15th at 6:00 AM; Duration 14 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Tammy Querry, Director of Excellence for the Abrazo Arizona Heart Hospital, and Warren Peabody, President of the Mended Hearts group. Mended Hearts is one of the nation’s largest peer to peer support groups that provides cardio-vascular heart patients with help in eliminating fear and anxiety. Mended Hearts volunteers are previous heart patients or family members who visit patients before and after surgery.

Valley Focus - Broadcast on August 4th at 6:34 AM and September 15th at 6:24 AM; Duration 14 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Bo Larsen, Director of Marketing and Business Development for the Civitan Foundation, and Patrick Andrew, Music Coordinator. Civitan is an organization that works with children and adults of all ages that have developmental disabilities. This is accomplished by a variety of programs to keep members moving, engaged, and growing. Programs include music, art, theater and culinary activities.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on August 4th at 6:53 AM; Duration 6.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Tera Schaad, owner and founder of the Hunkapi Equine Therapy Farm in Scottsdale. This is a farm that provides therapeutic riding for children with developmental disorders such as autism. They also provide equine-assisted life skills for youth 3-17 who have experienced trauma, often as the result of having been in foster care. The kids are taught life experiences and skills through a farm regimen including responsibility, empathy, relationship building, communication skills, and following through with tasks. Hunkapi also provides equine-assisted psycho-therapy for all forms of trauma and mental issues.

F. Conservation issues and safeguarding our resources.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on September 15th at 6:17 AM; Duration 7 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Nicole Corey, Executive Director and Founder of Natural Restorations, a non-profit group that removes waste, graffiti, and other foreign items from outdoor recreation and wilderness areas. This is accomplished by managing and supporting a dedicated restoration team of contracted military veterans along with the help of youth and community members for cleanup events that are held throughout the state.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on September 29th at 6:13 AM; Duration 7 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Tim Sprague, co-chairman of the “Noche en Blanco” celebration that will be held at Hance Park on October 19th. This is a celebration that got its inspiration from a Paris event called “Diner en Blanc” (“Dinner in White”). Patrons of this event are encouraged to dress in white and bring their own table settings to use on table with all white tablecloths. The event is intended to bring together the different communities that surround and benefit from Hance Park, which is a natural area preserved in downtown Phoenix. Proceeds will also be used to preserve and maintain the park for future generations.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on August 11th at 6:49 AM, August 18th at 6:00 AM, and August 25th at 6:14 AM; Duration 10.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Ann Hutchison, representing the Black Canyon Heritage Park and its upcoming Smithsonian Waterways Exhibit. Black Canyon Heritage Park is a natural area located 10 miles north of Phoenix on the Agua Fria River. The park is open every day, and is free for all ages. The habitat includes a self-guided accessible trail, a butterfly sanctuary, and a birding destination. The goal of the park is to introduce people to the desert habitat. In conjunction with the Arizona Humanities Foundation and ASU, the park is presenting the Smithsonian Waterways Exhibit this fall; as well as several local well seminars that cover all facets of water usage.

G. Animal neglect, abuse, and overpopulation

Valley Focus – Broadcast on August 18th at 6:49 AM, August 25th at 6:38 AM, and September 1st at 6:39 AM; Duration 10 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Melissa Gable, Foothills Animal Rescue in North Scottsdale, a cage-free animal shelter that encourages people to visit who may otherwise be intimidated or put-off by conventional animal shelters. Foothills Animal Rescue sponsors several adoption events each year, and there will be a free, no-cost adoption event on August 31st. The event and the shelter itself are sponsored by the Smith Family, who lost their daughter Brynn unexpectedly several years ago. As she was a pet lover, the shelter and the events are dedicated to her memory.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on September 8th at 6:42 AM, September 15th at 6:43 AM, and September 22nd at 6:26 AM; Duration 11.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Kara LaBree, co-owner of the Bug & Weed Mart. This is a family business dedicated to helping people take care of their yards at a low cost, and with a minimal negative effect on the animal population. Their love for pets has lead them to celebrate their upcoming 40-year anniversary by supporting the 2 Pups Wellness fund. This fund helps local animal shelters with medical and financial assistance. There will be a free pet adoption event at the grand opening of Bug & Weed Mart’s sixth valley location, and a portion of all proceeds from the week leading up to the grand opening will be given to the 2 Pups Wellness fund.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on September 29th at 6:00 AM; Duration 10.5 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Sonja Hernandez, project manager of the “Fix, Adopt, Save” animal welfare organization with 6 local partners throughout Maricopa County. This group helps prevent pet homelessness by supporting adoptions, and also sponsors events and services to help current pet owners retain their pets. Their upcoming annual “Pittie Palooza” on October 19th will feature \$20 pit bull adoptions, with each pit bull fully immunized and spayed/neutered. All 6 partners will be on-site with all pet and feline needs represented, and there will also be free vaccination to all attendees who bring their own pets.

Valley Focus – Broadcast on August 11th at 6:41 AM; Duration 8 minutes. A segment of our locally produced public affairs program featuring a discussion with Sandra Rutan, Marketing and Development Coordinator for the Lost Our Home pet rescue group. This is an animal rescue and pet shelter – with an added special perspective. The Lost Our Home group focuses on preserving the bond between pets and their families, so they offer special programs to try to help keep pets with their families and avoid surrender if possible. This includes pet foster care as well as connections to organization to provide support and emergency shelter.
