KRON 4 News @ 8, a daily prime time news/informational program aired from 8 pm to 9 pm, includes reports and features, typically 30 seconds to 2 minutes long, dealing with community issues, and the day's major news stories.

KRON 4 News @ 10, a daily prime time news/informational program aired from 10 pm to 11 pm, includes reports and features, typically 30 seconds to 2 minutes long, dealing with community issues and the day's major news stories.

KRON 4 News @ 11, a daily news/informational program aired 11 pm to 11:15 pm, providing a summary of the day's headlines, featuring both community issues and major news stories.

KRON 4 Morning News Weekend, a weekend news/informational program aired Saturdays and Sundays 7 am to 10 am, includes reports and in-depth features, dealing with community issues and major news stories.

4/8/16 KRON 4 News at 8pm East Bay community sees spike in burglaries

THERE ARE SOME RATTLED NERVES IN THE COMMUNITY OF DUBLIN TONIGHT AFTER A RASH OF RECENTBURGLARIES THERE. KRON 4'S MAUREEN KELLY SPOKE TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE ABOUT WHAT HIS DEPARTMENT IS DOING ABOUT IT:

THE AREA OF EAST DUBLIN HAS SEEN AN ALARMING RISE IN THE NUMBER OF BURGLARIES LATELY. THERE WERE NINE IN THE MONTH OF MARCH ALONE. HERE'S A MAP THAT SHOWS WHERE THEY ARE CLUSTERED.

IN ADDITION TO THE SAME AREA BEING HIT, THE CHIEF SAYS THEY HAVE NOTICED A DISTINCT PATTERN REGARDING THESE BREAK-INS.

Dublin police chief: "Most of them occur in the evenings. The suspects are looking for people who aren't at home, so they knock at the front door. When they don't get an answer, they move to the back and what they've been doing is breaking the rear sliding glass doors."

THE RESIDENTS WHO HAVE BEEN HIT TELL POLICE THEY ARE LOSING JEWERLY AND OTHER EASILY PORTABLE VALUABLES. THE CHIEF SAYS HE HAS INVESTIGATORS DEDICATED TO THIS CRIME WAVE AND INCREASED PATROLS TO THIS PART OF THE COMMUNITY.

AND THIS RASH OF BREAK-INS HAS NEIGHBORS IN THE AREA RETHINKING THEIR OWN HOME SECURITY SYSTEMS.

Resident: "Alarms don't seem to be a major deterrent, although cameras, high definition cameras, would be a great idea. If you can't stop them, at least maybe you can catch them."

THE CHIEF RECOMMENDS ALARMS WITH MOTION SENSORS AND GLASS BREAKAGE DETECTORS AND ALSO SAYS IF ANYONE HEARS A KNOCK AT THEIR FRONT DOOR, KEEP IT CLOSED BUT MAKE SURE THE PERSON ON THE OTHER SIDE OF IT KNOWS SOMEONE IS HOME. THEN CALL POLICE. THAT'S HOW THEY WERE ABLE TO ARREST FOUR SUSPECTS AT THE END OF MARCH, HERE ON BASSETS WAY.

THOSE ARRESTED INCLUDE ONE ADULT, 18 YEAR OLD ISRAEL JOHNSON, AND THREE JUVENILES, ALL FROM RICHMOND. ONE OF THE JUVENILES WAS ALLEGEDLY IN POSSESSION OF A LOADED FIREARM.

THERE HAS BEEN AT LEAST ONE OTHER BREAK IN AFTER THOSE ARRESTS, SO THE POLICE BELIEVE THERE ARE MORE THIEVES CONNECTED WITH THE CREW BEHIND THESE BURGLARIES.

Resident: "It's good to know the police are backing us up but we also need to have the neighborhood band together and increase our own vigilance to act as a deterrent."

I PERSONALLY HAVE SEEN NEIGHBORS PATROLLING THIS AREA. OVER THE COURSE OF APPROXIMENTLY ONE HOUR I HAVE BEEN PARKED HERE, WORKING IN MY CAR, I WAS APPROACHED BY THREE SEPARATE GROUPS OF NEIGHBORS ASKING WHAT I WAS DOING HERE – WHICH IS EXACTLY WHAT THE CHIEF SAYS HE IS ASKING THESE NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH GROUPS <u>NOT</u> TO DO. HE SAYS HE HAS REPEATEDLY ASKED RESIDENTS NOT TO APPROACH SUSPICIOUS INDIVIDUALS AND THEY SHOULD DEFINITELY NOT BE TRYING TO ARREST SUSPECTS ON THEIR OWN. HE SAYS HE IS STRESSING THAT CONCERNED RESIDENTS ONLY OBSERVE AND REPORT TO POLICE DESCRIPTIONS OF SUSPICIOUS PEOPLE, THEIR CARS AND LICENSE PLATE NUMBERS SO NO ONE GETS HURT.

4/15/16 KRON 4 News at 8pm East Bay thieves targeting work trucks

IN THE EAST BAY, THIEVES ARE TARGETING WORK-RELATED TRUCKS IN LIVERMORE. POLICE THERE SAY IN THE PAST SIX MONTHS AT LEAST TWO DOZEN COMMERCIAL TRUCKS HAVE BEEN STOLEN -- MANY NOT RECOVERED. TONIGHT, KRON 4'S PHILIPPE DJEGAL TELLS US WHAT THIEVES ARE LOOKING FOR AND HOW TO AVOID BECOMING A VICTIM:

OUTSIDE HOMES... IN PARKING LOTS... AND ALONG MAJOR THOROUGHFARES...

Lt. John Hurd, Livermore Police Department: "It's across the board. If we could target one area, we would. But it's really all over the place."

WORK TRUCKS IN LIVERMORE ARE SITTING DUCKS FOR THIEVES WHO DON'T CARE WHO THEY'RE RIPPING OFF.

Lt. Hurd: "I mean, the numbers are kind of bad right now. In the last six months, we've had 24 work-type vehicles stolen."

LIVERMORE POLICE LIEUTENANT JOHN HURD SAYS THE MAJORITY OF THE TARGETED VEHICLES ARE FORD VANS OR TRUCKS, TYPICALLY WHITE F-250'S, F-350'S AND OTHER MODELS MADE BETWEEN 2002 AND 2006. HURD SAYS 90 PERCENT OF THE STOLEN VEHICLES WERE LOCKED AT THE TIME AND HAVE SIGNAGE OR LOGOS ON THE DOORS AND TOOLBOXES IN THE BACK.

Lt. Hurd: "Can you imagine being a construction guy? All of your livelihood is in the back of your truck or your van. You come out one morning and it's all gone. I mean, that's gotta be heartbreaking."

POLICE SAY PURCHASING A STEERING WHEEL LOCK, KNOWN AS THE CLUB, MAY BE A STRONG INVESTMENT. YOU CAN FIND THESE AT MOST AUTO SHOPS IN YOUR AREA.

Josue Parjarito, assistant manager: "They actually make them pretty bright red. They make them very visual and obvious."

JOSUE PARJARITO AT O'REILLY AUTO PARTS IN LIVERMORE SAYS BREAK PEDAL LOCKS AND THE CLUB ARE BIG SELLERS.

Parharito: "It keeps the vehicle from being stolen, and turning it. So, if you can't turn it, you can't steal it."

IN ABOUT HALF OF THE CASES, LT. HURD SAYS THE TRUCKS ARE BEING STRIPPED OF THEIR TOOLS, BEFORE BEING DUMPED ON THE SIDE OF THE ROAD SOMEWHERE.

Lt. Hurd: "But other cases, we're not even finding the trucks or recovering them."

SO, IT'S BEST TO TAKE MATTERS INTO YOUR OWN HANDS, AND USE EVERY AVAILABLE DETERANT TO SECURE YOUR TRUCK OR VAN.

Lt. Hurd: "If it has an alarm, turn it on. If it has GPS tracking, turn it on so we can find it later on, if it is stolen. But, really, just be aware."

WE HAVE A WARNING FOR YOU. A TEXTING SCAM IS GAINING TRACTION AND TRICKING PEOPLE INTO GIVING OUT THEIR PERSONAL INFORMATION TO CYBER CRIMINALS. OUR TECH TRENDS REPORTER GABE SLATE SHOWS US HOW IT WORKS AND HOW TO AVOID FALLING VICTIM:

PEOPLE ARE GETTING A MESSAGE THAT POPS UP ON THEIR PHONE SAYING THAT THEIR APPLE ID IS EXPIRING AND THEY WILL BE LOCKED OUT OF THEIR ACCOUNT UNLESS THEY TAKE ACTION. DON'T FALL FOR THIS. HERE'S A CLOSER LOOK.

THE MESSAGE LOOKS SOMETHING LIKE THIS, SAYING YOU NEED TO SIGN IN AND CONFIRM YOUR DETAILS OR YOUR APPLE ID WILL BE DEACTIVATED.

IT LOOKS REAL AND THE LINK URL IN THE MESSAGE LOOKS REAL, WITH THE WORDS SIGN IN ICLOUD. IF YOU CLICK ON THAT LINK IT TAKES YOU TO THIS PHONY WEBSITE SET UP TO PHISH OUT YOUR INFORMATION.

TO ME THIS IS THE SCARY PART. THIS IS A VERY CONVINCING FAKE APPLE WEBSITE. IT LOOKS REAL.

NOW, REGARDLESS OF WHAT YOU ENTER ON THE USERNAME/PASSWORD SCREEN YOU WILL BE TOLD THAT YOUR APPLE ID HAS BEEN "LOCKED FOR SECURITY REASONS". TO UNLOCK YOUR APPLE ID, THE PHISHING SITE THEN ASKS YOU TO ENTER FURTHER PERSONAL DETAILS INCLUDING YOUR DATE OF BIRTH, TELEPHONE NUMBER, ADDRESS, AND CREDIT CARD DETAILS.

THERE IS ANOTHER SCAM SIMILAR TO THIS GOING AROUND, AGAIN THROUGH TEXT MESSAGE. BUT THIS ONE SAYS THAT YOUR ICLOUD ACCOUNT WAS LOGGED INTO ON SOMEONE ELSE'S IPHONE. IN THIS EXAMPLE THEY SAY IT WAS "ALEXANDER'S IPHONE."

THE MESSAGE POINTS OUT THE OBVIOUS THAT THIS IS SUSPICIOUS AND YOU SHOULD LOG INTO YOUR ACCOUNT TO VERIFY EVERYTHING IS SAFE, AGAIN SAME THING. IT'S A TRAP.

DON'T EVER CLICK ON LINKS IN A TEXT MESSAGE. IF YOU THINK ANYTHING SUSPICIOUS IS GOING ON, VISIT THE REAL ICLOUD APPLE WEBSITE AND CHECK IT OUT.

4/26/16 KRON 4 Evening My KRON4 Story illustrates disturbing trend in vehicle theft

A PLUMBER'S TRUCK THAT WAS RECENTLY STOLEN HAS BEEN FOUND. HOWEVER, THAT IS NOT GOOD NEWS IN THIS CASE BECAUSE OF THE CONDITION THE VEHICLE.. THE OWNER OF THE TRUCK IS DEEPLY TROUBLED BY THE SITUATION AS HE TELLS KRON4'S HAAZIQ MADYUN IN THIS MY KRON4 STORY:

Rick Howell, R.B.Travis Plumbing Contractor: "Okay, this is the truck when we went out there yesterday. The cab is completely burned up and everything's taken out of the bins."

THE OWNER OF R.B. TRAVIS PLUMBING CONTRACTOR, RICK HOWELL, IS SHOWING ME PHOTOS OF WHAT SOMEBODY DID TO ONE OF HIS TRUCKS THAT WAS RECENTLY STOLEN FROM AN EMPLOYEE'S HOME IN PLEASANT HILL. HE SAYS THE TRUCK LOOKED EXACTLY LIKE THIS ONE WHEN IT WAS STOLEN LAST MONDAY. FIVE DAYS LATER THE CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL FOUND IT ON FRANKLIN CANYON ROAD IN MARTINEZ – FULLY ENGULFED IN FLAMES. Howell: "It was burned completely. So I was going out there hoping that it would look a little bit better and at least we could pull our parts of the truck, because they have never stolen our parts before, just always our tools."

BUT IN THIS CASE?

Howell: "They took everything. They took the tools, the parts, cleaned out every bin."

NOW MR. HOWELL SAYS HE DECIDED TO TELL KRON4 HIS STORY BECAUSE, AS HE TOLD ME, THIS ISN'T HIS FIRST PICK UP THAT HAS BEEN STOLEN FROM HIS BUSINESS. HOWEVER, HE SAYS IT IS THE FIRST THAT HAS BEEN SET ON FIRE AND HE SAYS HE FINDS THAT VERY DISTURBING.

Howell: "You know it's kind of a sick feeling when you see one of your trucks burned that bad, just because somebody wanted to steal your tools."

Cpl. Christopher Blakely, Concord Police Department: "Unfortunately when a car is torched like that or is burned, there is a lot of evidence that goes up with it."

CONCORD BORDERS PLEASANT HILL. POLICE THERE SAY THEIVES AE BURNING STOLEN VEHICLES MORE OFTEN THESE DAYS.

Blakely: "The reason why they do it is because there is evidence in those vehicles even after the suspect is gone."

Howell: "These guys are serious. The ones who took this truck, they weren't playing around, I would like to see them caught so other people don't have to go through anything like this."

POLICE ARE HOPING SOMEONE REMEMBERS SEEING THIS TRUCK AND ARE ASKING ANYONE WITH ANY INFORMATION REGARDING THIS CASE TO GIVE THEM A CALL.

5/9/16 KRON 4 News at 8pm Online Safe Zone idea catching on ANOTHER BAY AREA CITY IS POISED TO CREATE A 'SAFE ZONE' FOR ONLINE SALES TRANSACTIONS. DALY CITY'S CITY COUNCIL IS VOTING TONIGHT ON LEGISLATION TO MAKE A SAFE EXCHANGE. THE ZONE WOULD HAVE H-D CAMERAS AND PROVIDE 24- HOUR SURVEILLANCE. IF APPROVED, THE PROGRAM WILL NOT COST TAXPAYERS ANY MONEY. PITTSBURG HAS ALSO ADOPTED A SIMILAR IDEA FOR ONLINE SALES TRANSACTIONS.

5/17/16 KRON 4 Evening News Thieves targeting women in East Bay

IN THE EAST BAY, A WARNING GOING OUT TO WOMEN, AFTER SEVERAL HAVE BEEN TARGETED BY THIEVES WHILE OUT WALKING IN THEIR NEIGHBORHOODS. THE CROOKS ARE STEALING GOLD CHAINS, AND IN ONE CASE THEY EVEN TRIED TO RIP A PAIR OF EARRINGS OUT OF A WOMAN'S EARS. KRON 4'S TERISA ESTACIO SHOWS US WHERE THESE CRIMES ARE HAPPENING AND TELLS US WHY POLICE BELIEVE A CERTAIN GROUP OF WOMEN IS AT GREAT RISK:

Manaswini Vonteru: "It's too dangerous."

MANASWINI VONTERU SAYS SHE IS TAKING NO CHANCES. SHE'S NOW LEAVING HER EXPENSIVE JEWELRY AT HOME BEFORE GOING OUT.

Vonteru: "It puts you at risk. It's really scary. It leaves marks here [pointing to neck area] sometimes when they snatch the chains."

Geneva Bosques, Fremont Police Department: "These suspects really don't care who they hurt."

GENEVA BOSQUES, SPOKESPERSON WITH THE FREMONT POLICE DEPARTMENT, SAYS IN THE LAST FEW DAYS THEY'VE HAD AT LEAST THREE CASES WHERE THIEVES HAVE COME UP TO VICTIMS AND VIOLENTLY SNATCHED GOLD CHAINS. IN ONE CASE THE VICTIM WAS NEARLY SERIOUSLY INJURED.

Bosques: "We had one suspect stand behind the female. And this is a female that is with her father and baby. So once suspect stands behind her while another suspect grabs the chain. It sounds as though something fell to the ground and so he went back for more and starts to tug at her earrings. He was not successful, thank goodness."

IN THIS EAST BAY CITY THIS IS THE AREA ON THE MAP WHERE THE LATEST CRIMES ARE TAKING PLACE, IN WHAT'S KNOWN AS THE ARDENWOOD NEIGHBORHOOD.

POLICE SAY THESE THEIVES ARE TARGETING A PATICULAR GROUP OF WOMEN IN THESE CHAIN-SNATCHING CASES.

Bosques: "It has been South Asian and Indian females."

MANSWINI SAYS SHE FEARS FOR SOME OF THE OLDER WOMEN OUT WALKING. JEWELRY IS A CULTURAL MATTER AND CHAINS ARE LIKE WEDDING RINGS FOR SOME PEOPLE.

Vonteru: "They cannot fight them. They cannot go against because they are not enough strong."

POLICE BELIEVE MOST OF THE ITEMS ARE BEING SOLD QUICKLY TO PAWN SHOPS. THE NECKLACES CAN RANGE IN PRICE ANYWHERE FROM A COUPLE HUNDRED DOLLARS TO SEVERAL THOUSAND.

Bosques: "The way that we normally solve these crimes is from vigilant citizens who take a photo or call us immediately."

POLICE ARE ALREADY INCREASING PATROLS AND GETTING FLYERS OUT TO TRY AND CATCH THE THIEVES. LAST SUMMER THEY HAD A SIMILAR RASH OF CRIMES AND DID MAKE A COUPLE OF ARRESTS.

5/19/16 KRON 4 News at 8pm Police say rash of freeway shootings is gang-related

IN THE EAST BAY WE ARE FOLLOWING THE RECENT SPIKE IN FREEWAY SHOOTINGS. INVESTIGATORS ARE DESCRIBING IT AS HIGH-SPEED GANG WARFARE AND SAY THEY ARE DOING EVERYTHING THEY CAN TO TRY AND STOP THE VIOLENCE.

THERE HAVE BEEN MORE THAN 20 SHOOTINGS ON BAY AREA FREEWAY'S SINCE NOVEMBER OF 2015. ONLY ONE SUSPECT HAS BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION TO ONE SHOOTING CASE. KRON 4'S HAAZIQ MADYUN RODE ALONG WITH OFFICERS -- IN A STORY YOU'LL ONLY SEE ON KRON4:

TWNETY-FOUR SHOOTINGS ON BAY AREA FREEWAYS SINCE NOVEMBER OF 2015, NO SUSPECTS IDENTIFIED, SO FAR ONE PERSON ARRESTED IN CONNECTION TO ONLY ONE OF THESE SHOOTINGS

Lt. Felix Tan, Richmond Police Department: "A lot of times we know who is doing what. We have a pretty good pulse as to what has been occurring. We just need confirmation."

BUT RICHMOND POLICE OFFICER FELIX TAN SAYS GETTING CONFIRMATION HAS BEEN DIFFICULT BECAUSE OF THE CONNECTION TO GANG ACTIVITY.

Lt. Tan: "Well unfortunately with gang investigations, it is really challenging for detectives to crack the case. That's due to the fact that the gang members don't want to talk. They don't want to cooperate and witnesses are very, very hesitant to talk about what they know."

SO, LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES ACROSS THE BAY AREA ARE TURNING UP THE HEAT ON THEM.

Lt. Tan: "So then we have to go into our plan, our strategy. Sometimes it can involve surveillance and sometimes enforcement."

AND SOMETIMES IT INVOLVES TECHNOLOGY.

Lt. Tan: "All the officers have shot spotter in their cars, so it's pretty much immediate notification."

IN ADDITION TO THAT CRIME FIGHTING TOOL, THE CITY ALSO HAS SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS ON THE STREET ALL OVER TOWN. BUT THERE MIGHT BE AN UNINTENDED SIDE EFFECT TO THAT.

Lt. Tan: "A lot of the gang members, the criminals, they know about this. So, did we push them outside of our city? Perhaps, but there is no one clear answer to why they are going on the freeway."

MEANWHILE, TO HELP DETER THE FREEWAY VIOLENCE, CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS IN PITTSBURG HAVE APPROVED THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF CAMERAS ALONG HIGHWAY 4.

INVESTIGATORS SAY SINCE THE FORMING OF A SPECIAL JOINT LAW ENFORCEMENT TASK FORCE, 29 FIREARMS HAVE BEEN CONFISCATED AND 77 INDIVIDUALS WITH GANG TIES HAVE BEEN ARRESTED FOR FELONY CRIMES ASSOCIATED WITH GANG ACTIVITY.

5/23/16 KRN 4 News at 8pm Warning on new ATM malware

A WARNING FOR ATM USERS. MALWARE COULD BE STEALING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION. THIEVES ARE INSTALLING MALWARE PROGRAMS ON CASH MACHINES AND THERE MAY BE VERY LITTLE YOU CAN DO TO STOP THEM. KRON 4'S CHARLES CLIFFORD IS LIVE TONIGHT IN THE NEWSROOM TO EXPLAIN THE PROBLEM. THIS AFTERNOON HE ALSO SPOKE WITH A SECURITY EXPERT WHO SAYS THAT THIS IS JUST ONE OF MANY THREATS FACING ATM USERS. CHARLES:

IN AN ONGOING INVESTIGATION, THE CYBERSECURITY COMPANY KASPERSKY LAB SAYS THEY'VE FOUND A NEW VERSION OF AN OLD MALWARE PROGRAM CALLED SKIMMER THAT'S DESIGNED TO CORRUPT AN ATM'S SOFTWARE.

BY INSTALLING SKIMMER INTO THE MACHINE, THIEVES CAN STEAL PERSONAL INFORMATION, CREIDT CARD NUMBERS AND PIN NUMBERS. UNLIKE PREVIOUS VERSIONS OF THE MALWARE, THE NEW SKIMMER CAN HIDE UNDETECTED FOR MONTHS, QUIETLY GATHERING DATA UNTIL SOMEONE ENTERS AN ACTIVATION CODE. IF THE THIEF IS ONLY LOOKING FOR SOME QUICK CASH, SKIMMER CAN ALSO DISPENSE THE ATM'S FUNDS ON CUE.

Tony Anscombe, cyber-security expert: "And some lucky cyber-criminal is going to stand there with a bag and collect the cash."

TONY ANSCOMBE IS A CYBER-SECURITY EXPERT WITH AVG TECHNOLOGIES. HE SAYS THAT BECAUSE SKIMMER IS SOFTWARE INSIDE THE ATM, THERE'S ALMOST NOTHING THAT THE AVERAGE PERSON CAN DO TO AVOID IT. IT FALLS TO THE OWNER OF THE ATM TO PROTECT THEIR MACHINE.

Anscombe: "You have to think of them as a PC. Make sure they are patched. Make sure they have the latest version of the operating system. Make sure you're protecting the ATM network with good antivirus software so the malware is detected if someone inserts it."

THAT BEING SAID, ANSCOMBE ALSO SAYS THAT ATM USERS SHOULD NOT LET THEIR GUARD DOWN. THERE ARE PLENTY OF OTHER SECURITY THREATS THAT CAN BE AVOIDED SIMPLY BY BEING OBSERVANT.

Anscombe: "When we go to an ATM, make sure no one is looking over your shoulder. If the machine doesn't look in good order, or if it's been tampered with, walk to the next one."

FINALLY, EXPERTS ALSO SAY THAT THIEVES CAN ACTUALLY INSTRUCT THIS MALWARE TO SELF-DESTRUCT, LEAVING NO TRACE THAT THERE WAS EVER A THREAT.

REPORTER AMANDA SMITH SHOWS US WHAT'S HAPPENING:

HOME SECURITY SYSTEMS HAVE COME A LONG WAY. YOU CAN GET A SIMPLE WI-FI SYSTEM FOR LESS THAN A TANK OF GAS. BUT, IF YOU DON'T SET IT UP PROPERLY THE VERY THINGS YOU ARE TRYING TO PROTECT – YOUR LOVED ONES, YOUR PROPERTY, EVEN YOUR PRIVACY -COULD BE BROADCASTING MORE THAN YOU KNOW. IT'S LIKE PUTTING WHAT'S INSIDE YOUR HOUSE AND PUTTING IT UP ON THE OUTSIDE FOR EVERYONE TO SEE.

WHEN YOU BUY A HOME CAMERA SYSTEM, YOU'RE SUPPOSED TO PROTECT IT WITH A PASSWORD. IF YOU DON'T, YOUR HOME COULD WIND UP ON THIS WEBSITE OUT OF RUSSIA. IT COLLECTS THE FEEDS AND THEN ORGANIZES THEM BY CITY. I LOOKED IN ON SOME GUY'S LIVING ROOM, THIS FAMILY'S BACKYARD, THIS DAYCARE, AND EVEN THIS BAR.

I SHOWED THE WEBSITE TO DR. ADAM EARNHARDT AT YSU.

Dr. Earnhardt: "Creepy."

HE TEACHES CLASSES ON PRIVACY AND ONLINE SAFETY.

Dr. Earnhardt: One that I researched this morning was actually looking right into someone's living room. There was no one in the room, thank God, but just imagine there is somebody out there at five o'clock having dinner."

POLICE SAY THESE CAMERAS CAN CREATE A HUGE DANGER. BURGLERS CAN USE THE GPS INFORMATION THEY CONTAIN AND THEN USE YOUR OWN SECURITY SYTSTEM AGAINST YOU.

Police officer: "Without securing your camera system, anyone can view it and they can pick up hour habits, see what's in your house, see what security you have in the house besides sthe camera and they can use that against you."

NOW THESE CAMERAS CAN CATCH BURGLERS AND HELP SOLVE CRIMES, BUT ONLY IF YOU SET THEM UP THE RIGHT WAY.

BestBuy spokesperson: "The security of your system is very important, so if you're allowing just anybody to get on there, you are potentially setting yourself up for some problems."

IF YOU DON'T KNOW HOW TO SET UP YOUR NEW SYSTEM, IT'S GOOD IDEA TO GET HELP.

BestBuy spokesperson: "We can send a tech out to your house to set the network up for you, secure it properly and make sure it's encrypted so you don't have any unwanted guests on your system."

BOTTOM LINE, IF YOU ARE IN ANYWAY UNSURE ABOUT SETTING UP YOUR HOME SECURITY SYSTEM IT'S BEST TO REACH OUT FOR HELP, OTHERWISE WHO KNOWS WHO'S WATCHING.

FIVE BAY AREA MAYORS HEADED TO SACRAMENTO TO MEET WITH STATE OFFICIALS ABOUT THE SURGE IN VIOLENCE ALONG EAST BAY HIGHWAYS. SINCE LAST FALL, THERE HAVE BEEN MORE THAN 20 SHOOTINGS ALONG THOSE ROADWAYS AND NOW OFFICIALS ARE STEPPING UP EFFORTS TO CONFRONT THE PROBLEM. KRON 4'S CHARLES CLIFFORD HAS MORE:

WHEN VIOLENCE ERUPTS ALONG A BAY AREA INTERSTATE OF HIGHWAY, THE CITY WHERE IT HAPPENS UNVILLINGLY BECOMES PART OF HE STORY. DAN ROMERO IS THE MAYOR OF HERCULES, WHICH INCLUDES SECTIONS OF HIGHWAY 4 AND INTERSTATE 80, BOTH OF WHICH HAVE BEEN PLAGUES BY PROBLEMS IN RECENT MONTHS.

Mayor Romero: "The city of Hercules gets tagged with this. We are an innocent law-abiding community. When the shooting happens on the freeway, the town of Hercules gets mentioned into it."

HE ALSO FEELS THAT'S IT'S NOTE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF LOCAL MUNICIPALITIES TO MONITOR STATE ROADWAYS FOR PROBLEMS.

Mayor Romero: "That's not our duty as a locality. That's CalTrans and CHP's duty to make sure that residents are travelling in a safe environment."

AND HE'S NOT ALONE. ON MONDAY, ROMERO ALONG WITH THE MAYORS OF EL CERRITO, PINOLE, SAN PABLO AND PITTSBURG MET WITH STATON TRANSPORTATION OFFICIALS, THE HIGHWAY PATROL AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE. THE GOAL WAS TO SEE WHAT THE STATE WAS DOING TO DEAL WITH THE PROBLEM.

Mayor Romero: "The purpose of today's meeting was to let the five mayors have a say with the state, which we did."

A TASK FORCE MADE UP OF THE CONTRAC COSTA COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE, CALTRANS, LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AND THE HIGHWAY PATROL IS CONSIDERING INSTALLING HIGH-DEFINITION CAMERAS, SHOTSPOTTER TECHNOLOGY AND LICENSE PLATE READERS ALONG INTERSTATE 80 AND HIGHWAY 4. CALTRANS ALSO APPEARS WILLING TO PAY RO THE EQUIPMENT IF THE STATE APPROVES THE NECESSARY FUNDING.

ROMERO BELIEVES THAT IS THE RIGHT APPROACH.

Mayor Romero: "That's what's important right now. Finding a solution, finding out what it costs so we can get it back to the state so they can fit it into their budget."

THE ALARMING NUMBER OF FREEWAY SHOOTINGS – CLOSE TO 30 IN RECENT MONTHS – HAS EAST BAY CITIES STRUGGLING TO COME UP WITH ANSWERS ON HOW TO CATCH THOSE RESPONSIBLE. HOWEVER, ONE TOWN HAS AGREED ON A SECURITY PLAN, AND AS KRON4'S HAAZIQ MADYUN REPORTS, THAT PLAN IS NOW BEING PUT INTO ACTION.

AFTER TWO FATAL FREEWAY SHOOTINGS IN THE CITY OF PITTSBURG, ONE IN APRIL AND ANOTHER IN MAY. CITY LEADERS HAVE TAKEN SWIFT ACTION IN RESPONSE. THE MONEY HAS BEEN APPROVED. THE PLAN IS NOW IN PLACE. SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS ARE COMING TO HIGHWAY 4.

Captain Ron Raman, Pittsburg Police Department: "My time line is right away! We are hoping to have that done within the next few weeks. We are going to have at least 10 cameras."

THOSE CAMERAS WILL BE STRATEGICALLY PLACED ALONG THIS STRETCH OF THE EAST BAY FREEWAY, SAYS PITTSBURG POLICE CAPTAIN RON RAMAN.

Captain Raman: "We have identified several locations, nothing set in concrete yet but, the goal is, if a crime does occur to have an investigative tool to let people know that if they come into the city limits of Pittsburg, they are going to be on camera if they commit a violent crime."

Marcus McFarland, Pittsburg resident: "I don't know if it will be enough, but 10 is a good start."

THIS PITTSBURG RESIDENT SAYS HE KNOWS WHERE THE CAMERAS SHOULD BE PLACED.

McFarland: "Put one on Bailey. Put one on Lonetree, You got to go through that area at some point to get out of Contra Costa County."

KNOWING THAT SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS ARE GOING UP SOON MAKES THIS WOMAN FEEL BETTER ABOUT DRIVING ON HIGHWAY 4. THESE CAMERAS ARE GOING TO MAKE YOU FEEL A LITTLE SAFER?

Resident: "The cameras? It will make me feel safe knowing that the people who are out here doing the shootings will eventually be caught and off the street."

SINCE LAST NOVEMBER THERE HAVE BEEN NEARLY 30 SHOOTINGS ON BAY AREA FREEWAYS. WHILE OTHER CITIES IMPACTED BY THIS VIOLENCE ARE TRYING TO FIND THE MONEY TO PAY FOR CAMERAS, THIS TOWN FOUND \$100,000 DOLLARS IN THE GENERAL FUND TO GET THE JOB DONE.

THESE CONVENIENT CABLE-FREE DEVICES THAT CONNECT TO YOUR COMPUTER OR LAPTOP USE THESE LITTLE DONGLES WHICH, EXPERTS SAY, LEAVE AN OPEN DOOR TO HACKERS. KRON 4'S TECH REPORTER GABE SLATE SHARES THE DETAILS ON THIS FRIGHTFUL DISCOVERY:

WATCH WHAT IS ABOUT TO HAPPEN. THIS SMART PHONE IS ABOUT TO TAKE CONTROL OF THIS LAPTOP REMOTELY THROUGH A NEW SECURITY THREAT CALLED MOUSEJACK.

THE HACKER WITH THE PHONE SENDS TEXT TO THE COMPUTER AND THAT IS FREAKY. THE PHONE IS NOW CONTROLLING THE COMPUTER. IT'S A TRAP THAT ANYONE USING THESE WIRELESS DONGLE DEVICES COULD FALL INTO. HERE'S HOW IT WORKS:

THE HACK SOFTWARE IS RUNNING ON A SMARTPHONE. THE ANTENNA ATTACHED SNIFFS OUT THE WIRELESS BRIDGE BETWEEN THE DONGLE AND THE WIRELESS MOUSE. THE HACKER FINDS AN ELECTRONIC FLAW, A HOLE, AND A WAY TO TAKE OVER THE DONGLE AND FROM THERE TAKE OVER THE COMPUTER.

THA MEANS SOMEONE ELSE CAN PRETEND TO BE YOU THROUGH YOUR COMPUTER. SEND OUT EMAILS. POST TO SOCIAL MEDIA. ANYTHING YOU CAN DO ON YOUR COMPUTER. A MOUSEJACK CAN ALSO BE DONE THROUGH A LAPTOP. IT KIND OF MAKES YOU THINK TWICE ABOUT THAT PERSON SITTING INNOCENTLY BEHIND YOU IN THE CAFÉ.

BAD GUYS COUL DDELETE FILES ON YOUR MACHINE, INSTALL MALWARE THAT COULD STEAL YOUR PICTURES DOCUMENTS AND PERSONAL INFORMATION – EVERYTHING THEY NEED TO STEAL YOUR IDENTITY.

SECURITY RESEARCHERS WITH BASTILLE WHO DISCOVERED THIS FLAW FOUND THAT WITH THIS LARGER ANTTENNA, A HACKER WOULD NOT NEED TO BE IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO THE VICTIM TO PULL OFF A MOUSEJACK.

Bastille spokesperson: "They could do the attack from 500 feet away, from across the street, through a wall. We tested 13 different dongles from 5 major manufacturers Dell, Microsoft, Lenova, Logitech, and found they were al vulnerable to one variation or another of this attack."

I TALKED TO SERVERAL OF THE MANUFACTURERS OF THESE WIRELESS MICE AND KEYBOARDS LIKE LOGITECH WHO SAY THEY ARE AWARE OF BASTILLE'S FINDINGS AND HAVE RELEASED FIRMWARE UPDATES THAT PEOPLE CAN DOWNLOAD TO PATCH THE SECURITY HOLE CREATED BY THE DONGLES.

Paula Hawthorn, Brady Campaign: "You listen to anyone who was there and they say it was bang bang bang bang bang. Of course it was! He had an automatic weapon which should not have been in his hands!"

THE BAY AREA CHAPTER OF THE BRADY CAMPAIGN AND THE GROUP OF LOCAL LAWMAKERS SAY THE NEARLY 50 BODIES LEFT BEHIND AND MORE THAN 50 WOUNDED IN ORLANDO ARE A CALL TO ACTION.

Marc Levine, California Assemblyman: "It is time to get assault rifles off our streets once and for all."

CALIFORNIA ASSEMBLYMAN MARC LEVINE OF MARIN COUNTY IS ONE OF SEVERAL BAY AREA LAWMAKERS PUSHING A PACKAGE OF GUN SAFETY BILLS THROUGH SACRAMENTO. ONE, INSPIRED BY THE SAN BERNARDINO TERROR ATTACK, WOULD CLOSE THE SO CALLED BULLET BUTTON LOOPHOLE IN THE STATE'S ASSAULT WEAPON BAN THAT CURRENTLY ALLOWS FOR QUICK RELOADING OF AMMUNITION.

Levine: "I was able to reload in seconds and I have no training at all."

LAWMAKERS SAY THEY WANT CALIFORNIA TO CONTINUE TO BE A LEADER IN GUN SAFETY AND POINT TO A GUN LAW THAT IS CURRENTLY ON OUR BOOKS THAT MIGHT HAVE PREVENTED WHAT HAPPENED IN ORLANDO.

Phil Ting, California Assemblyman: "What we've heard is that law enforcement had concerns. This person's ex-wife was concerned. Family members were concerned. Any of them in California today could have gone to court and asked for a restraining order to get that individual's guns taken away for a year."

ASSEMBLYMAN PHIL TING WANTS TO STRENGTHEN THAT LAW TO ALLOW COWORKERS AND FELLOW STUDENTS TO ASK FOR A SIMILAR RESTRAINING ORDER, POINTING OUT THAT MIGHT HAVE PREVENTED THE SHOOTER RESPONSIBLE FOR THE 2014 ISLA VISTA MASSACRE.

MEMBERS OF THE MUSLIM AMERICAN AND THE LGBT COMMUNITIES STOOD ALONGSIDE THE LAWMAKERS.

Chiu: "What happened Sunday in Orlando could have happened in the Castro."

BUT NOT EVERYONE IN THE LGBT COMMUNITY FEELS THE SAME WAY.

Nicki Stallard, Pink Pistols: "It's dancing on the bodies of dead people to promote an agenda and it's disgusting."

I SPOKE TO NICKI STALLARD WITH THE PINK PISTOLS BY PHONE, A TRANS WOMAN WHO CALLS THIS CIVIL DISARMMENT.

Stallard: "All it's going to do is make it harder for law abiding citizens to defend themselves."

THE LAWMAKERS HOPE THAT WHAT HAPPENED IN ORLANDO WILL FORCE THEIR COLLEAGUES IN THE STATE CAPITOL WHO ARE THINKG OF VOITING AGAINST THESE BILLS TO THINK AGAIN.

WHAT'S YOUR CREDIT SCORE? TO SOME, THAT THREE DIGIT NUMBER CAN BE MORE LIKE A DIRTY WORD. THERE ARE WAYS TO IMPROVE YOUR SCORE, BUT YOU NEED TO BE CAREFUL. AS CNN'S MARY MOLONEY EXPLAINS, SCAMMERS CAN NOT ONLY STEAL YOUR INFORMATION, THEY CAN ALSO TURN YOU INTO A CROOK:

WHEN TRYING TO MAKE A FINANCIAL DECISION FOR THE FUTURE, IT'S OFTEN FINANCIAL DECISIONS FROM THE PAST THAT CAN TRIP YOU UP. FROM BUYING A CAR TO BUYING A HOME, LENDERS CAN SEE YOUR DECISIONS IN A CREDIT REPORT. AND SOME SCAMMERS SEE AN OPPORTUNITY.

ACCORDING TO THE FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION, THERE ARE A FEW EASY WAYS TO SPOT A CREDIT REPAIR SCAM. FIRST, IF THE COMPANY ASKS FOR PAYMENT BEFORE THEY RENDER ANY SERVICES. ALSO, IF THEY ASK THAT YOU DO NOT CONTACT THE CREDIT REPORTING AGENCIES DIRECTLY. AND IF THEY SUGGEST GIVING FALSE INFORMATION WHEN APPLYING FOR A MORTGAGE OR A LOAN.

ANOTHER TROUBLING TREND AMONG CREDIT REPAIR SCAMMERS, THE PROMISE OF AN ENTIRELY NEW CREDIT IDENTITY WHICH CAN UNWITTINGLY LAND A CONSUMER IN TROUBLE WITH THE LAW.

YOU CAN SPOT THESE SCAMS WHEN A SERVICE SUGGESTS ABANDONING A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER AS A PRIMARY SOURCE OF IDENTIFICATION. AND INSTEAD USING A NEW NUMBER THEY ASSIGN AND CALL A CPN -- FOR CREDIT PRIVACY NUMBER OR CREDIT PROFILE NUMBER. IN MANY CASES, THESE NUMBERS ARE STOLEN SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS -- OFTEN FROM CHILDREN -- WHICH IS WHY THEY HAVE A CLEAN CREDIT SLATE.

AND THAT CAN TURN A CONSUMER INTO AN UNKNOWING IDENTITY THIEF -- DESPITE THEIR GOOD FINANCIAL INTENTIONS.

FOR CONSUMER WATCH -- I'M MARY MOLONEY.

THE FBI IS WARNING ABOUT THE RISE IN "DIGITAL EXTORTION" – ONLINE RANSOMWARE ATTACKS BY CYBER CRIMINALS. RANSOMWARE IS A FORM OF MALWARE. IT WORKS BY EITHER HOLDING YOUR ENTIRE COMPUTER HOSTAGE OR BY BLOCKING ACCESS TO YOUR FILES. OUR TECH REPORTER GABE SLATE TALKED WITH A CYBER SECURITY EXPERT TO FIND OUT WHAT YOU CAN DO TO PROTECT YOURSELF. Jerome, cyber security expert: "The assumption used to be that if you don't browse dodgy sites you won't get infected, but that isn't true anymore. You browse visit perfectly legitimate sites, popular sites like Huffington Post, and still get infected."

JEROME IS A CYBER SECURITY EXPERT WITH MALWARE FIGHTS. HE SAYS EVERYONE NEEDS TO BE AWARE OF THIS NEW THREAT ONLINE – RANSOMWARE – AND HOW EASY IT IS TO GET INFECTED FROM NORMAL WEB-BROWSING BEHAVIOR. NO ONE IS 100% SAFE FROM IT IF THEY'RE ONLINE.

Jerome: "Getting the malware cleaned up is fairly easy. Getting the files restored is practically impossible without actually paying."

IT'S A NIGHTMARE TO THINK ABOUT AND HERE'S HOW IT HAPPENS. YOU'RE BROWSING THE INTERNET AND YOU PICK UP SOME MALWARE. AND THEN SUDDENLY YOU'RE COMPUTER FREEZES AND THERE'S A POP UP WINDOW SAYING ALL THE FILES ON YOUR COMPUTER ARE LOCKED UNLESS YOU PAY A RANSOM. TYPICALLY THE HIJACKERS WILL INSTRUCT THE VICTIM TO BUY A PREPAID CREDIT CARD OR DEBIT CARD FROM A CONVENIENCE STORE AND GIVE THEM THE CODE OFF THE CARD FOR USE. OR, THEY WILL HAVE THE VICTIM USE BITCOIN. THEY MAKE PEOPLE USE ANONYMOUS TYPES OF PAYMENT SERVICES.

HERE'S THE BIG TAKEAWAY. AVOIDING DIGITAL EXTORTION IS ALL ABOUT PREVENTION.

Jerome: "You've got to keep your computer up to date. Keep you antivirus up to date. Your anti-malware solution."

AND BACK UP YOUR FILES. ANYTHING IMPORTANT ON YOUR COMPUTER, YOUR DOCUMENTS, VIDEOS, PICTURES – BACK IT UP TO AN EXTERNAL HARD DRIVE.

THIS IS THE BAD NEWS. IF YOU GET HIT WITH ONE OF THESE TYPES OF ATTACKS YOU LIKELY WILL NEVER SEE YOUR PERSONAL FILES AGAIN UNLESS YOU PAY. YES, YOU CAN REFUSE TO PAY THE RANSOM AND HIRE A CYBER SECURITY EXPERT TO REMOVE THE MALWARE FROM YOUR COMPUTER. YOU CAN GAIN BACK ACCESS TO YOUR MACHINE. BUT THE FILES ON THE COMPUTER ARE STILL ENCRYPTED AND YOU WON'T HAVE ACCESS TO THEM.

Jerome: "The damage is done. There is no solution at the moment on the market to recover the files. The encryption they use is legitimate. It's a very strong encryption. It would take years and years by a powerful computer to decrypt your files."

A NEW REPORT ON CAR BURGLARIES IN SAN FRANCISCO IS OUT, AND A CIVIL GRAND JURY SAYS THE CITY IS FACING AN EPIDEMIC WITH ALMOST 25 THOUSAND CAR BREAK-INS JUST LAST YEAR. THE GRAND JURY ISSUED ITS REPORT AFTER A NINE MONTH REVIEW. KRON 4'S SPENCER BLAKE HAS MORE: THOSE BURGLARIES FROM 2015 ALONE AMOUNTED TO 19 MILLION DOLLARS WORTH OF DAMAGE TO CARS IN SAN FRANCISCO. BUT THE CIVIL GRAND JURY DOES HAVE CERTAIN STEPS THAT IT HOPES WILL HELP LOWER THOSE NUMBERS.

IF IT'S EVER HAPPENED TO YOU, YOUR STOMACH PROBABLY DROPPED WHEN YOU DISCOVERED YOUR CAR WINDOW SMASHED TO BITS.

Julio Lara, Auto Glass Now manager: "We see it all the time."

THAT MEANS PLACES LIKE AUTO GLASS NOW HAVE PLENTY OF BUSINESS. BUT IT'S BUSINESS THAT REPRESENTS A CHRONIC PROBLEM IN SAN FRANCISCO.

Lara: "Today we've touched 15 cars that have just been door glasses. And broken back glasses, vent glasses, etcetera. No windshields. And we specialize in windshields!"

THE CIVIL GRAND JURY IDENTIFED A PROBLEM THAT THEY SAY IMPACTS THE QUALITY OF LIFE IN THE CITY.

Mike Skahill, civil grand juror: "It's really gotten out of hand, and something needed to be done, so we took it on and took a hard look at the problem."

WITH POLICE IDENTIFYING SERIAL CRIMINALS AS THE DRIVING FORCE BEHIND CAR BURGLARIES, JURORS NOTE THAT THE PROBLEM IS NOT ISOLATED TO ANY ONE DISTRICT, SO THEY RECOMMEND DEALING THE CRIMINAL GANGS CITYWIDE. THEY ALSO SUGGEST USING DATA ANALYSIS TO HELP POLICE IDENTIFY PATTERNS AND HELP PREDICT FUTURE CRIME TRENDS AND USING SOCIAL MEDIA AND TECHNOLOGY TO DO A BETTER JOB OF INFORMING THE PUBLIC.

JURORS POINTED OUT THAT SAN FRANCISCANS AREN'T THE ONLY VICTIMS.

Skahill: "We found that a lot of tourists and visitors to the city are targeted."

THIS PARENT AND ABOUT A DOZEN OTHERS SHOWED UP AT THE SAN RAMON VALLEY UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, CONCERNED ABOUT THIS VIDEO. IT'S ONE OF SEVERAL VIDEOS THAT IS SCHEDULED TO BE PLAYED DURING "ACCEPTANCE WEEK" AT WINDEMERE MIDDLE SCHOOL IN

SAN RAMON, STARTING APRIL 11TH. A DISTRICT SPOKESPERSON SAYS THE STUDENTS CAME UP WITH THE IDEA TO DEDICATE A WEEK TO LGBTQ ISSUES IN CONNECTION WITH THE NATIONAL DAY OF SILENCE ON THE TOPIC ON APRIL 15. HOWEVER, NOT ALL PARENTS ARE ON BOARD.

Debbie Rocha, parent: "We viewed the videos. They're not acceptable for children 12 or 13 years old."

THE MEETING WAS HELD BEHIND CLOSED DOORS AT THE DISTRICT. PARENTS DO HAVE THE OPTION TO HAVE THEIR KIDS OPT OUT OF THE PROGRAM. YET...

Sharlee Stemmons, parent: "The issue with opting out is it forces kids to have to walk away and show that they're not participating. Children the ages of 11 to 14, their maturity level is just not there to handle why they are not going to participate."

FOR SHARLEE STEMMONS, OPTING OUT JUST MEANS THEY WILL BE A TARGET AND COME ACROSS AS NOT TOLERANT.

Teacher; "I am tolerant of all. Teaching tolerance is good."

SAN JOSE'S WILLOW GLEN NEIGHBORHOOD, MORE SPECIFICALLY THE AREA SURROUNDING EVANS LANE AND CANOAS GARDEN, IS THE LATEST HOT SPOT IN THE ONGOING EFFORT TO FIND SHELTER FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE HOMELESS IN SAN JOSE. RESIDENTS OF A NEARBY MOBILE HOME PARK ARE SPEAKING OUT AGAINST

THE PROPOSAL TO LOCATE A HOMELESS SHELTER IN THEIR NEIGHBORHOOD. KRON 4'S ROB FLADEBOE SHOWS YOU THE SITE AND EXPLAINS WHY NEIGHBORS AREN'T HAPPY:

Joshua Howerton, against the shelter: "I walk to work every morning about 5am and there's trash all over the sidewalk. They leave whatever, bags of trash out there. They just don't care."

Angel Cortinas, against the shelter: "Certainly I don't think a homeless shelter would be great next to a rehabilitation center or a place where there's a lot of kids. It just doesn't seem like it would make any sense at all."

Mike Williams mobile home park manager: "You don't know if these people are violent or if they're under the influence of alcohol or drugs."

MIKE WILLIAMS IS THE MANAGER OF THE WILLOW GLEN MOBILE HOME PARK HERE ON EVANS LANE. AS WE CRUISED AROUND THE PARK IN HIS GOLF CART, HE EXPLAINED WHY VIRTUALLY ALL OF THE 150 RESIDENTS HERE ARE AGAINST THE CITY'S PLAN TO BUILD A HOMELESS SHELTER ON A VACANT, 6-ACRE SITE RIGHT NEXT DOOR.

Williams: "You have families and kids throughout this park and their lives will be put into a situation where they won't be able to go outside and enjoy life around the neighborhood anymore."

THE PLAN, THOUGH FAR FROM COMPLETE, COULD ENTAIL HOUSING AS MANY AS 100 HOMELESS PEOPLE, IN A CAMPGROUND-LIKE SETTING, IN TEMPORARY UNITS. IT'S NEXT DOOR TO A REHABILITATION CENTER. BUT DESPITE CONCERNS A NEW SHELTER COULD MAKING AN EXISTING CRIME PROBLEM WORSE, THE CITY IS DETERMINED TO FIND MORE HOUSING FOR THE HOMELESS.

Ray Bramseon, San Jose homeless outreach manager: "We firmly believe that well-manager, well-run, welloperated affordable housing developments and programs like the one we're proposing at Evans Lane will revitalize the community, will provide add attention and help us address some of the neighborhood issues that are going on right now."

MEANWHILE MIKE WILLIAMS IS LOBBYING PARK RESIDENTS TO SPEAK OUT AGAINST THE SHELTER PLAN. FORMERLY HOMELESS HIMSELF, WILLIAMS AGREES THE HOMELESS NEED A NEW SHELTER BUT HE INSISTS THIS IS NOT THE RIGHT PLACE FOR IT.

Williams: "Put this place somewhere else where people won't intertwine with the families, then I think you'll be better off."

IT IS POSSIBLE THE SHELTER WOULD BE LIMITED TO HOMELESS FAMILES, SINGLE MOTHERS WITH CHILDREN AND VETERANS, BUT THE PLAN IS STILL A LONG WAYS FROM BEING APPROVED. THERE'S AN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT TO BE COMPLETED AND NEIGHBORS HAVE A COUPLE MORE WEEKS TO WEIGH IN BEFORE THE PLANNING COMMISSION MAKES ITS RECOMMENDATION TO THE CITY COUNCIL.

AS KRON 4'S ROB FLADEBOE SHOWS YOU, SOMETHING AS SIMPLE AS A SAFE PLACE TO PARK IS A BLESSING: Sheila H: "I never thought, never thought, I would be in this situation."

HOMELESS AND LIVING AND SLEEPING IN HER VAN FOR THE PAST YEAR AND A HALF, SHEILA H. HAS FOUND AN OVERNIGHT REFUGE HERE IN THE PARKING LOT OF SANTA TERESA CATHOLIC CHURCH AND IN HER WORLD THAT IS HUGE.

Sheila H: "They give us meals. They bring us hot meals every night. It's so wonderful. These people are just wonderful. They help us out with blankets and a little bit of gas."

Lynda DeManti, Santa Teresa Church: "A safe place for them to park so they can get a good night's sleep and not be interrupted. To also provide them with some fellowship and meals so that they might be able to focus on making their own lives better."

RIGHT NOW ABOUT TEN CARS ARE SPENDING THE NIGHT HERE IN THE PARKING LOT OF SANTA TERESA CATHOLIC CHURCH AND THAT COMES WITH ACCESS TO BATHROOM FACILITIES AND A KITCHEN.

Monifa Edwards-Lincoln: "This is a big deal because it gives us a place to feel safe at night."

FOR MONIFA EDWARDS-LINCOLN AND DANIEL SATTERWHITE, WHO HAVE BEEN LIVING IN THIS TOYOTA SEDAN FOR MONTHS, SAFE PARKING IS A BLESSING.

Daniel Satterwhite: "Having a place to use the restroom and have a kitchen where you can actually cook some food for yourself and have a hot meal. Before this we were having trouble just getting a night's sleep."

Edwards-Lincoln: "Not just getting by, but actually living. And that is what this church has offered us – a shot at living."

AS KRON 4'S TERISA ESTACIO REPORTS, THE GROUP AGAINST IT SAYS THE TOILET IS INDECENT AND MUST GO. BUT NOT EVERYONE IS UPSET ABOUT THE URINAL:

THERE IT IS – THE CEMENT CIRCULAR PUBLIC URINAL AT THE CENTER OF THE CONTROVERSY AND NOW AT ISSUE IN A LAWSUIT BROUGHT ON BY THIS GROUP, THE SAN FRANCISCO CHIESE CHRISTIAN UNION.

Frank Lee, San Francisco Chinese Christian Union: "We are very concerned and outraged. We do not want this to be a prototype for other areas to follow. This ridiculous proposal must be condemned and terminated."

Dr. Brad Dacus, against the public urinal: "We have a number of violations of the law. For example, the disabled. Those who are handicapped cannot use this facility. And, it's impossible for any woman to use without exposing themselves in a very demeaning and inappropriate manner."

THE URINAL SITS AT THE CORNER OF DOLORES PARK, BY A MUNI STOP. ON THIS DAY, AS RIDERS PASSED BY AND THIS MOM WALKED BY TAKING HER SON TO THE PARK, THERE WAS NOT MUCH LOVE FOR THE URINAL.

Meghan Daniel, San Francisco resident: "I don't really like having a urinal right when you step off the bus at the bus station. That's not something that I would expect or ever think to have in a city space like this."

Beth, Mission Dolores resident: "We do see many people using it. And it's causing people to be a little more brazen around the neighborhood, urinating everywhere in public."

AND USING IT OUT IN THE OPEN IS A BIG ISSUE WITH THE CHRISTIAN GROUP.

Lee: "Unsanitary, chaotic, and disgusting. It's major regression of mankind and we must stop this."

THE CITY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE RESPONDED, SAYING THE 16-ACRE PARK IS WELL KNOWN FOR ITS "COUNTER CULTURE." THE CITY INSTALLED THE PUBLIC URINAL AS PART OF THE RECENT 20 MILLION DOLLAR UPGRADE AT THE PARK. IN A STATEMENT, A PARK AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT SPOKESPERSON TOLD KRON FOUR THAT IT WAS PLACED AFTER PUBLIC INPUT ON HOW TO DEAL WITH PUBLIC URINATION ISSUES IN THE AREA. IN ADDITION TO THE PUBLIC OPEN URINAL, THERE ARE 26 TRADITIONAL BATHROOMS.

ALTHOUGH THE GROUP IS NOW FIGHTING TO HAVE IT REMOVED, NOT EVERYONE SAYS IT IS A BAD IDEA. PEOPLE WHO LIVE NEAR THE PARK ADVOCATED FOR THE URINAL, SAYING IT WOULD STOP PEOPLE FROM URINATING ON WALLS, BUSHES, AND SIDEWALKS.

James Carlson, Mission Dolores resident: "Well, it's not necessarily a bad thing. People from the park were just coming up the hill to take care of their bodily functions. It's better than my driveway."

THE CHINESE CHRISTIAN UNION GROUP SAYS IT WILL CONTINUE TO FIGHT UNTIL THIS CEMENT URINAL IS GONE.

FACEBOOK EMPLOYEES ARE COMING FORWARD SAYING THEY'VE NEVER BEEN TOLD TO BE ANTI-CONSERVATIVE OR PRO-LIBERAL.

DESPITE THE FACT THAT MARK ZUCKERBERG ONCE CRITICIZED DONALD TRUMP'S IMMIGRATION RHETORIC, FACEBOOK SAYS IT WANTS TO BE A PLACE FOR ALL PEOPLE AND PERSPECTIVES ACROSS THE POLITICAL SPECTRUM.

A MUNI DRIVER WAS CAUGHT ON CAMERA THIS MORNING, CALLING A WOMAN THE N-WORD.

TONIGHT, MUNI SAYS IT IS TAKING SWIFT ACTION AND THE BUS DRIVER HAS ALREADY BEEN TAKEN OFF HIS LINE. KRON 4'S KATE CAGLE SPOKE TO THE WOMAN WHO SHOT THE VIDEO THAT IS GOING VIRAL AT SAN FRANCISCO STATE WHERE SHE IS A STUDENT:

THE WOMAN IS A BUSINESS MAJOR HERE AT STATE, MAYRA VILLAREAL IS IN CLASS NOW, BUT SHE WAS ON HER WAY TO WORK THIS MORNING AT FISHERMAN'S WHARF WHEN THIS HAPPENED. IF YOU KNOW THAT AREA, YOU KNOW THAT PARKING CAN BE CUT THROAT, BUT MAYRA SAYS THIS SIMPLY WENT TOO FAR.

THIS ALL HAPPENED ON POWELL STREET THIS MORNING NEAR THE KIRKLAND BUS YARD. SOURCES HAVE IDENTIFIED THE BUS DRIVER AS JOHN HOLDEN. MUNI TELLS US HE DRIVES ON THE 28 / 19TH AVENUE ROUTE WHICH GOES ALL THE WAY TO DALY CITY FROM SAN FRANCISCO. THE DRIVER IS CLEARLY WEARING HIS UNIFORM IN THE VIDEO.

Mayra Villarreal, took video of MUNI driver: "I just took out my video because I was scared. This man is next to my car, yelling crazy things at me. So I mainly did it just for safety reasons."

Paul Rose, MUNI spokesperson: "We are doing an investigation. We've already taken immediate action and will take corrective action going forward."

THE DRIVER HAS ALREADY BEEN PULLED OFF HIS ROUTE WHILE MUNI INVESTIGATES. THEY COULDN'T GO INTO DETAIL ABOUT WHAT MIGHT HAPPEN TO THE DRIVER, BUT A SPOKESMAN CALLED THE VIDEO DISTURBING. HE SAYS THEY BEGAN LOOKING INTO THE MATTER AS SOON AS SOMEONE SHARED THE VIDEO WITH THEM ON TWITTER.

AS FOR MAYRA, SHE SAYS SHE'S THANKFUL FOR ALL THE SUPPORT SHE'S RECEIVED. AT THIS TIME, THE VIDEO HAS BEEN VIEWED MORE THAN 30 THOUSAND TIMES ON FACBOOK.

THE SOCIAL WEBSITE CALLED "NEXT DOOR" ANNOUNCED CHANGES TO THEIR PLATFORM TO ADDRESS RACIAL PROFILING. THE COMPANY DECIDED TO MAKE THE CHANGES BECAUSE OF GROWING PROBLEMS BROUGHT UP BY ITS USERS IN OAKLAND. KRON 4'S JEFF BUSH EXPLAINS WHAT IS DIFFERENT AND HAS REACTION FROM CONCERNED COMMUNITY GROUPS:

Shikira Porter, Neighbors for Racial Justice: "The issue is when you describe a person who is. not doing anything wrong, but you are, based on the color of their skin, determining that they are probably doing something wrong."

THERE WAS A GROWING PROBLEM WITH POSTINGS ON THE SOCIAL WEBSITE, NEXT DOOR. MANY OF THEM WERE FROM RESIDENTS WHO WERE USING RACIAL DESCRIPTIONS WHEN REPORTING QUESTIONABLE ACTIVITY IN THEIR NEIGHBORHOOD. OFTEN TIMES, THE DESCRIPTIONS WERE INCOMPLETE AND VAGUE AND BIASED, WHETHER CONCIOUSLY OR UNCONCIOUSLY. THE PRACTICE MADE SOME PEOPLE UNCOMFORTABLE AND THEY WANTED IT TO STOP.

SEVERAL COMMUNITY GROUPS MADE IT AN ISSUE AND THE TECH COMPANY RESPONDED WITH CHANGES. THE ANNOUNCEMENT WAS MADE DURING THE LIFE ENHANCEMENT MEETING AT CITY HALL.

Nirav Tolia, Next Door: "You can see the help text here: 'focus on the crime or activity that is potentially criminal and where and when it occurred.' This is probably the most important line: "Please save any descriptions of people involved for the next step."

NEXT DOOR NOW ENCOURAGES USERS TO FOCUS MORE ATTENTION ON CLOTHING, HAIR AND OTHER THINGS LIKE CARS OR OTHER VEHICLES TO DESCRIBE PEOPLE IN PLATFORM POSTINGS. THAT HAS BEEN FOUND TO BE A BETTER WAY TO DESCRIBE A PERSON, RATHER THAN JUST ON RACE. COMMUNITY GROUPS LIKE THE NEIGHBORS FOR RACIAL JUSTICE WERE DIRECTLY INVOLVED WITH RECOMMENDING THE CHANGES AND SAY NEXT DOOR IS DOING THE RIGHT THING.

Shikira Porter: "The fact that now there's going to be a form where neighbors are no longer allowed to do that in neighborhoods has a huge impact and it's going to allow people to ride their bikes and to walk slowly by and look at their neighbors' yard and not be described as being up to something."

THE CHANGES TO THAT WEB SITE WILL GO INTO EFFECT IMMEDIATELY AND WILL BE NATION WIDE.

A LOT OF INQUIRIES FOR BLOOD DONATIONS STARTED COMING IN ON MONDAY. THERE'S BEEN A 36% INCREASE DONATIONS, BUT GAY MEN ARE STILL BEING HELD BACK. GAY MEN CAN'T JUST WALK INTO A BLOOD BANK AND DONATE. KRON 4'S ALECIA REID JOINS US FROM THE NEWSROOM, WITH MORE ON THEIR FRUSTRATION:

BLOOD CENTERS OF THE PACIFIC IS ON STANDBY TO GIVE BLOOD TO ORLANDO AS NEEDED, AND THEY'VE BEEN WELCOMING LOTS OF DONORS.

Scott Rowe, blood donor: "I think it's really important for peole to donate blood because there is a need and especially after a huge tragedy like this one. I have a lot of friends in the LGBT community and I donate because a lot of them can't."

GAY MEN, MEN THAT HAVE SEX WITH OTHER MEN OR M-S-M HAVE TO BE CELIBATE FOR ONE YEAR BEFORE GIVING BLOOD.

Dr. Suchitra Pandey: "I can understand the frustration in the gay community."

THERE WAS A PERMANENT BAN FOR MEN, BUT LAST DECEMBER THE F-D-A CUT IT DOWN TO A ONE YEAR. THAT DEFERRAL IS ALSO IN PLACE FOR OTHER HIGH RISK BEHAVIORS .

Dr. Suchitra Pandey: "Any behavior that would put someone at greater risk for getting HIV or Hepatitis C. So this would include sex with someone who does IV drugs without a prescription. Anytime somebody gets an accidental needle stick at work, that would be a one year deferral. Or a transplant."

OR SOMEONE HAVING SEX WITH AN INDIVIDUAL THAT HAS HIV. THE HIGHEST PRIORITY IS KEEPING THE BLOOD SUPPLY SAFE. DR. HYMAN SCOTT SAYS SCIENCE AND TESTING HAVE MARGINALIZED OVER THE YEARS ... AND THAT THE BAN IS HARSH.

Dr. Hyman Scott: "The science supports that this 12 month ban isn't necessary. Some tests are extremely sensitive. They can detect in less than two weeks and some of them are down to less than a week."

EVEN WITH THE NEW DONATIONS, BLOOD SUPPLY IS LOW.

Dr. Pandey: "Very low inventories in all blood types right now. We're appreciating the support from the community."

THIS BAN WAS LIFTED 6 MONTHS AGO, AND IT'LL TAKE TIME FOR THE WORD TO SPREAD. IN THE MEANTIME, THE BLOOD BANK IS ENCOURAGING MORE PEOPLE TO COME IN AND DONATE.

THIS CHANGE BY THE FDA IS STILL BEING IMPLEMENTED ACROSS THE COUNTRY AND THEN MORE DATA NEEDS TO BE GATHERED AND STUDIES DONE. SO CHANGES TO THIS NEW LAW PROBABLY WON'T HAPPEN ANY TIME SOON.

TWO ACTIVE-DUTY CAMP PENDLETON MARINES ARE UNDER INVESTIGATION FOR A SOCIAL MEDIA POST IN THE WAKE OF THE ORLANDO SHOOTING. REPORTER BRANDON LEWIS HAS THE DETAILS.

THIS PICTURE APPEARING TO FEATURE A CORPORAL IN UNIFORM WITH THE CAPTION QUOTE "COMING TO A GAY BAR NEAR YOU" WENT VIRAL AFTER IT WAS POSTED ON FACEBOOK. COMMENTERS SAY IT APPEARS TO HAVE INITIALLY STARTED AS A "SNAPCHAT" AND THEN WAS POSTED TO THE PRIVATE "CAMP PENDLETON RESALE" PAGE FOR MALE MARINES. IT'S RUN BY THE MENDLETON FOUNDATION -- A NON-PROFIT THAT WORKS TO HELP VETERANS IN NEED.

THE ORGANIZATION SAYS IT IMMEDIATELY DELETED THE POST AS SOON AS IT WAS NOTIFIED. IN A STATEMENT THEY SAID QUOTE "We believe that it was a very insensitive and possibly dangerous photo that needed to be taken seriously given the nature of the possible threat.....As a group, we do not condone any type of hate speech or threats."

STILL, ONE OF ITS 25 THOUSAND MEMBERS TOOK A SCREEN GRAB AND POSTED ON PUBLIC PAGES WHERE IT WENT VIRAL WITH HUNDREDS OF VETERANS AND CIVILIANS CHIMING IN.

THIS PERSON SAID THEY REPORTED THE PICTURE TO THE MARINES, ADDING QUOTE (JT BYRD) "As Marines, we learn to police our own and realize that we are responsible and accountable for our actions." OTHERS QUESTIONED THE CORPORAL'S INTENT, (SUZANNE) ASKING "Isn't it possible they were eluding to taking on the terrorist instead of everyone automatically assuming it was hate-related toward the gay community?"

BUT THE ONE MARINE EXPEDITIONARY FORCE APPEARED TO DISAGREE WITH THAT THEORY IN A STATEMENT OF ITS OWN SAYING QUOTE "This type of behavior and mindset will not be allowed and it is not consistent with core values of honor, courage and commitment that are demonstrated by the vast majority of Marines on a daily basis."

THE TASK FORCE SAYS THEY'VE IDENTIFIED THE CORPORAL IN THE PICTURE AND ARE INVESTIGATING ONE OTHER MARINE. THEIR NAMES HAVE NOT BEEN RELEASED.

IT ASKED CHURCH OFFICIALS TO CONSIDER LEAVING BEFORE THE LEASE IS UP.

THE STATEMENT FROM HARSCH INVESTMENT PROPERTIES READS IN PART:

"We have many places of worship and other religious organization in the properties we manage. Like all our tenants, their occupancy rights are protected in their leases, but we will not tolerate tenants who advocate hatred and the taking of innocent lives."

ROGER JIMENEZ SAYS HE HAS NO REGRETS ABOUT WHAT HE SAID IN HIS JUNE 12 SERMON WHERE HE ASKED HIS CONGRETATION "ARE YOU SAD 50 PEDOPHILES WERE KILLED?" ALSO ADDING "IT'S A TRAGEDY MORE DIDN'T DIE."

THE PROPERTY COMPANY SAYS IT SUPPORTS THE LGBT COMMUNITY AND MANY OTHER ORGANIZATIONS AND SAYS IT WILL CONTINUE TO WORK WITH THE CHURCH TO MOVE OUT OF THE PARK.

Spokesperson for Harsch Investment Properties: "They're trying to distance themselves and let people know that as the owners of the building they don't support what this person has said."

HUNDREDS OF PEOPLE PROTESTED OUTSIDE THE CHURCH THIS PAST SUNDAY. JIMENEZ HAS YET TO RESPOND TO THE REQUEST TO MOVE OUT.

Bill deBlasio, New York City mayor: "So, we're not going to sanitize our history, we're going to remember the moment when things were wrong. We're going to remember the struggle. is a fundamental part of the founding documents of this nation -- the pursuit of happiness. The right to be who you are. And, nothing, in this nation can stop the pursuit of happiness and nothing can stop love.">

TONIGHT SEVEN THOUSAND HOMELESS PEOPLE WILL BE LOOKING FOR A PLACE TO SLEEP IN SAN FRANCISCO. MOST OF THEM WON'T FIND ONE - AT LEAST NOT INDOORS. KRON 4'S SPENCER BLAKE INTRODUCES US TO ONE WOMAN WHO'S HELPING PEOPLE FIND SOME STABILITY. SHE TOLD HIM ABOUT HER OWN JOURNEY FROM HOMELESS TO HELPER:

THREE YEARS AGO, REGINA BATES HAD WORKED AS A RECEPTIONIST AT A MEDICAL GROUP UNTIL SHE CAME BACK FROM DISABILITY LEAVE TO FIND OUT SOMEBODY ELSE HAD BEEN GIVEN HER JOB. THAT WAS JUST AS BATES GAVE A 30 DAY NOTICE TO MOVE OUT OF HER APARTMENT BECAUSE SHE THOUGHT SHE'D BE ABLE TO AFFORD A NICER ONE. INSTEAD, SHE ENDED UP UNEMPLOYED AND HOMELESS.

SUPER: Regina Bates | Peer Organizer, Coalition on Homelessness

Regina Bates, peer organizer, Coalition on Homelessness: "You feel like everyone's looking at you. My kids were constantly saying, 'Mom, don't tell people we're homeless,' you know, and they had a stigma behind it. They didn't feel good about themselves."

FOR THE NEXT SEVERAL MONTHS, BATES AND HER FAMILY STAYED AT CHURCH SHELTERS AND IN FRIENDS' HOMES. THROUGH THE TOUGH TIMES, THOUGH, SHE DECIDED TO PULL HERSELF UP BY HER OWN BOOTSTRAPS – AT THE PUBLIC LIBRARY.

Bates: "I was like, 'This is my job to get myself out of homelessness, and I gotta research my way out of this situation.'"

THAT RESEARCH INCLUDED WAYS TO GET FREE CLOTHES FOR HER KIDS. SHE FOUND OUT HOW TO USE HER LIBRARY CARD TO GET FREE TICKETS TO THE ZOO AND OTHER FUN PLACES IN THE CITY. SHE ALSO APPLIED FOR JOBS, AND HER ADMINISTRATIVE EXPERIENCE KICKED IN, EVENTUALLY LANDING HER TWO JOBS, ONE OF THEM WITH THE COALTION ON HOMELESSNESS.

NOW, BATES IS HELPING OTHER FAMILIES WHO ARE IN A PICKLE SHE KNOWS ALL TOO WELL.

Ghaimah Cutkelvin, homeless mother: "It keeps us comfortable. It gives us hope for a brighter future. It gives us inspiration. People like Regina, she feels where we're coming from."

THINGS GOT BETTER FOR THE BATES FAMILY, TOO. THEY'RE ON A FIVE-YEAR PLAN WITH A HOME SUBSIDY PROGRAM THAT PUTS A ROOF OVER THEIR HEADS.

WHILE SHE WORKS TO GET OTHERS ON THEIR FEET, REGINA SAYS SHE WANTS EVERYONE TO KNOW THAT HOMELESSNESS IS NOT A DISEASE.

Bates: "When you go by a person that is in need, you feel like they might be homeless - or even if they're not homeless - I think it's really good for people to at least acknowledge the person. Say hello. You might make their day."

Marc Vicenti, teacher: "I don't understand it."

WITHIN THE LAST SEVEN YEARS, TEN PALO ALTO STUDENTS COMMITTED SUICIDE. THE CDC CALLS IT AN EPIDEMIC IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY. WITH HIGH EXPECTATIONS TO SUCCEED, STUDENTS FIND THEMSELVES UNDER PRESSURE. Vicenti: "The other kids are whispering about those are the kids from the suicide school. It's there. It's painful for everybody."

Vicenti: "Til we're a chorus of voices so loud that we can't be denied"

Joren Quintana, Palo Alto Unified School District: "There have been many ideas and suggestions and the school district has looked at the best practices and data. It's an ongoing effort. We look at data and we implement."

LeVar Burton, chairman of Reading Rainbow: "I'm interested in how we collectively can do better job of educating our kids. And I know that technology is a large part of it. I've known that. I mean, I've been using technology to educate kids for over 30 years. Television was the technology we used back in the day because it gave us access to where kids are. Now, reading Rainbow isn't on TV. It's an app. It's on tablet computers. It's on the web. We're in classrooms. It's about meeting kids where they are and taking them where we want them to go, and these are some of the best and brightest people in the world who are actually thinking about it. How do we do this better?"

Andre Agassi, Andre Agassi Education Foundation: "So, we can educate a child at an early age or we can incarcerate them and spend four times more doing it. We have to figure it out. And I'm scared, quite frankly."

ANDRE AGASSI TALKED ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF CHILDREN LEARING THE BASICS OF PHONICS BEFORE ENTERING THE SCHOOL SYSTEM. STUDIES SHOW THAT THE MOST IMPORTATN TIME FOR BRAIN DEVELOPMENT IS BIRTH TO EIGHT YEARS AND ALMOST 35% OF CHILDREN ENTERING KINDERGARTEN LACK THE BASIC LANGUAGE SKILLS NEED TO LEARN HOW TO READ. SO HE TEAMED UP WITH A SILICON VALLEY START UP NAMED SQUARE PANDA AND THEY CREATED THIS PLAY SET THAT TEACHES CHILDREN PHONICS IN A FUN WAY. IT HITS THE MARKET IN JUNE.

Agassi: "It's a device that works with your tablets and puts you in a world that inspires motivates and incentivizes the child to learn with text tiles, too. So you get to pick the letters and put them in and you evolve in activity of learning combined with seeing the letters. Science has proven how much faster you can learn to read if you have that. I'm a parent. I don't want my kid just sitting in front of a table, pushing buttons and scrolling. This gives them a way to engage with the tablet."

MORE PEOPLE ARE SKIPPING COLLEGE AND SOME EXPERTS THINK THAT'S GOOD NEWS FOR THE ECONOMY. ACCORDING TO NEWLY RELEASED GOVERNMENT DATA, COLLEGE ENROLLMENT IN THE U.S. DROPPED FROM ITS PEAK IN 2010 BY MORE THAN 812 THOUSAND STUDENTS.

KRON 4'S MAUREEN KELLY HAS BEEN SPENDING MONTHS DIGGING DEEPER INTO THE TOBINWORLD SCHOOL WHERE THE ABUSE TOOK PLACE. SHE JOINS US IN THE STUDIO LIVE WITH WHAT SHE'S FOUND OUT.

THIS VIDEO WAS FIRST POSTED ON A FACEBOOK PAGE FOR PARENTS OF AUTISTIC CHILDREN, AND IT WAS THEIR OUTRAGE THAT CAUSED IT TO GO VIRAL. THE SHOCKING FOOTAGE DREW A LOT OF ATTENTION TO THE TOBINWORLD SCHOOL, FROM STATE OFFICIALS TO THE POLICE. TWO AIDES ENDED UP BEING FIRED, AND BOTH HAVE PLEADED NOT GUILTY TO MISDEMEANOR CRIMINAL CHARGES.

THE VIDEO ALSO CAUSED THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO STEP IN AND ORDER REFORMS AT THE SCHOOL. SOME OF THE PEOPLE WHO SAW IT COMMENTED ON SOCIAL MEDIA ABOUT SIMILAR EXPERIENCES THEY OR THEIR CHILDREN ALLEGEDLY HAD WHILE AT THE TOBINWORLD ANTIOCH CAMPUSES. IT ALSO PROMPTED FORMER STAFF MEMBERS TO SPEAK OUT. WE TRACKED DOWN SOME OF THOSE PEOPLE, ONE OF THEM A FORMER STUDENT WHO IS NOW AN ADULT. HE WAS DISTURBED BY THE VIRAL VIDEO BUT NOT SURPRISED.

Former student: "They claim they are restraining these students for their safety and the safety of their students, but they use far more force than is actually necessary."

THE EXCUTIVE DIRECTOR OF TOBINWORLD SAYS NOTHING IS MORE IMPORTANT TO THEM THAN STUDENT SAFETY, SHE SAYS HER STAFF ARE TRAINED TO USE STATE APPROVED NON-VIOLENT TECHNIQUES, BUT ONLY WHEN THE STUDENT IS CLEARLY A DANGER TO HIM OR HERSELF, OTHER STUDENTS OR STAFF.

YOU'LL HEAR MORE FROM THAT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR DURING MY WEEK LONG INVESTIGATIVE SERIES THAT GOES IN-DEPTH INTO THE TOBINWORLD SCHOOL. YOU'LL ALSO HEAR FROM FORMER STAFF MEMBERS WHO TALK ABOUT WHAT THEY SAY THEY'VE SEEN BEHIND CLOSED CLASSROOM DOORS.

BUT YOU'LL BE SHOCKED BY SOME OF THE THINGS I'VE UNCOVERED, INCLUDING ABOUT THE BACKGROUND OF ONE PERSON INVOLVED IN TOBINWORLD. I'LL HAVE STORIES ALL WEEK LONG, STARTING TONIGHT AT 10.

THIS VIDEO PROMPTED A STATE INVESTIGATION. IT ALSO CAUSED MORE PEOPLE TO COME FORWARD TO SAY THEY OR THEIR CHILDREN HAD BEEN ABUSED WHILE STUDENTS AT TOBINWORLD.

A 9 YEAR OLD BOY IS SLAPPED BY A TEACHER'S AIDE, AS TWO OTHER PEOPLE HOLD HIS ARMS AND LEGS. THAT AIDE, IDENTIFED LATER AS 26 YEAR OLD KAMALJOT KAUR, IS SEEN GOING AFTER THAT SAME BOY AGAIN AND AGAIN.

THE IMAGES ENDED UP BEING POSTED ON A FACEBOOK GROUP PAGE FOR PARENTS WITH AUTISTIC CHILDREN SOME OF WHOM CALLED THE SCHOOL DEMANDING ACTION. THE SCHOOL CALLED ANTIOCH POLICE IN TO INVESTIGATE.

KAUR WAS ARRESTED AND CHARGED WITH MISDEAMOR CHILD ABUSE, AND A SECOND AIDE 23 YEAR OLD CHAD CORBIN, HAS ALSO BEEN CHARGED FOR FAILING TO REPORT SUSPECTED CHILD ABUSE. THEY HAVE BOTH PLEADED NOT GUILTY AND ARE BACK IN COURT JUNE 6TH.

BOTH WERE FIRED BY TOBINWORLD, A SCHOOL THAT SPECIALIZES IN TEACHING AUTISTIC, SEVERLY EMOTIONALLY OR DEVELOPMENTTALLY DISABLED STUDENT RANGING IN AGE FROM 5 TO 22 YEARS OLD. TOBINWORLD'S EXECTUTIVE DIRECTOR SAID IN A STATEMENT THAT SHE WAS HORRIFIED BY THE INCIDENT AND THEY WOULD NOT TOLERATE THE MISTREATMENT OR ABUSE OF A CHILD.

THE BOY SEEN VICTIMIZED IN THAT VIDEO TALKED EXCLUSIVELY TO KRON4 NEWS. WE ARE BLURRING HIS FACE BECAUSE OF HIS AGE.

Reporter: "How did you feel when all of that was happening?" Victim: "I felt angry."

THE BOY'S FAMILY NOW HAS A LAWYER AND ARE EXPECTED TO SUE. THIS PHOTO OF SHOWS AN ABRASION ON THE FACE OF ANOTHER CLIENT OF THAT SAME LAWYER THAT THE CHILD ALLEGEDLY GOT AT THE HANDS OF YET ANOTHER TOBINWORLD AIDE.

Victim's attorney: "That video shows a culture of abuse."

ANTIOCH POLICE ARE VERY FAMILIAR WITH THE INSTITUTION. WE POURED OVER THE POLICE LOG OF CALLS FOR SERVICE INVOLVING THE TOBINWOOD TWO CAMPUS SINCE 2008. MANY CALLS INVOLVED STUDENTS ALLEGEDLY ACTING OUT VIOLENTLY, AGAINST OTHER KIDS, THEIR TEACHERS, OR EVEN THEMSELVES. BUT I COUNTED CLOSE TO A DOZEN INSTANCES OF POLICE COMING TO LOOK INTO ALLEGATIONS OF STAFF BEING ABUSIVE.

WE SHOWED THE VIDEO TO A FORMER TOBINWORLD STUDENT. JAMAL VICTORIA SAYS HE ATTENDED THE SAME TOBINWORLD CAMPUS IN ANTIOCH FOR APPROXIMENTLY EIGHT YEARS. HE WAS DISTRUBED BY WHAT HE SAW

Victoria: "She's straight up attacking him at this point."

BUT NOT SURPRISED. WHEN JAMAL WAS 11 YEARS OLD HE CAME HOME WITH BROKEN CAPALIARIES AROUND HIS NECK. THESE ARE PHOTOS TAKEN AT THE TIME. JAMAL TOLD HIS MOTHER THAT HE HAD BEEN CHOKED AND RESTRAINED BY A TEACHER FOR REFUSING TO DO HIS WORK.

WHEN JAMAL'S MOTHER SAW HIS INJURIES SHE FILED A POLICE REPORT AND PULLED HIM OUT OF THE SCHOOL. SHE SAYS SHE TRIED TO GET HELP BUT COULDN'T FIND A LAWYER TO TAKE THEIR CASE.

Jamal's mom: "When I talked, nobody would listen. If somebody had listened, then maybe that child in the video wouldn't have been hurt. It hurts these children; it hurts them for the rest of their lives."

SHE IS WORRIED MOST ABOUT WHAT MIGHT BE HAPPENING TO KIDS WHO ARE SO DISABLED THEY CAN'T SPEAK UP FOR THEMSELVES.

Jamal's mom: "No one is there to help them. No one is there to save them. It's just a horror story. They are just suffering and it's unacceptable."

WE'VE REACHED OUT TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF TOBINWORLD ABOUT THESE LATEST ALLEGATIONS. IN A STATEMENT SHE SAYS:

"Nothing is more important to Tobinworld than the safety and wellbeing of our students. Tobinworld and its staff are doing everything they can to provide the best education and support services possible to emotionally disabled, autistic and developmentally disabled students. The California Department of Education vigorously investigated claims against Tobinworld and continues to certify and approve the operation of our schools."

I TRACKED DOWN FORMER TOBINWORLD TEACHER'S AIDES WHO SAY THEY HAVE SEEN OTHER STAFF USING UNNECESSARY FORCE WITH STUDENTS MANY TIMES AT THAT SCHOOL . THEIR EYEWITNESS ACCOUNTS OF WHAT THEY SAY IS ABUSE TOMORROW.

TODAY, A NATIONAL NON-PROFIT WITH A CHAPTER IN DOWNTOWN OAKLAND CALLED "GIRLS INCORPORATED" GAVE THE GIRLS EVERYTHING, FROM SCHOOL SUPPLIES TO DORMATORY ITEMS TO MAKE THEIR COLLEGE TRANSITION A BIT EASIER.

EARLIER TONIGHT, AN EVENT WAS HELD AT U.C. BERKELEY TO CELEBRATE THEIR ACHIEVEMENTS. THE NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION AIMS TO HELP GIRLS, PARTICULARLY GIRLS

FROM LOW- INCOME FAMILIES. MANY OF THE GIRLS ARE THE FIRST IN THEIR FAMILIES TO GO TO COLLEGE.

Girls Inc. spokesperson: "So many children from low-income communities get into college but they don't actually go because they are worried about all the other expenses. So we are showering them with items like laptops, with calculators, sheets and towels for their dorms – all the things they need to focus on their academics when they get there."

Student: "They gave me so many items. Like post-its and index cards, pens, pillows. So many things that I know I will absolutely need."

Student: "I'm going to be taking calculus or AP calculus because I'm going to be and investment banker. So the TI84 calculator is really going to help out a lot. The laptop will help out a lot."

THE GIRLS HONORED TONIGHT WILL BE ATTENDING VARIOUS PRESTIGIOUS COLLEGES INCLUDING GEORGETOWN AND U-C-BERKELEY. CONGRATS TO ALL OF THEM!

THE AVERAGE COLLEGE STUDENT IS WELL FAMILIAR WITH STRESS THAT COMES FROM PAPERS AND EXAMS, BUT A FIRST OF ITS KIND STUDY SHOWS SOME CAL STATE STUDENTS ARE EVEN MORE WORRIED ABOUT WHERE THEY'LL SPEND THE NIGHT OR GET THEIR NEXT MEAL. THE STUDY FINDINGS ARE VERY DISTURBING. KRON 4'S ELLA SOGOMONIAN MET WITH SOME STUDENTS IN THE EAST BAY TODAY AND HAS MORE:

I'M HERE AT CAL STATE EAST BAY. IT'S ONE OF THE CAMPUSES WHERE STUDENTS COULD BE WALKING BY CLASSMATES WHO ARE HOMELESS OR DON'T KNOW WHERE THERE NEXT MEAL WILL COME FROM.

ACROSS CALIFORNIA, ONE IN TEN CAL STATE UNIVERSITY STUDENTS ARE HOMELESS AND ONE IN FIVE DON'T KNOW WHERE OR WHEN THEY'LL GET THEIR NEXT MEAL. THAT'S WHAT A STUDY COMMISSIONED BY THE CSU SCHOOLSYSTEM REPORTS.

Anthony Noriega, Cal State East Bay freshman: "That's a pretty high number right there, so that's a little sad to be honest."

SEVERAL STUDENTS WE SPOKE WITH SAID THEY PERSONALLY KNEW OF OTHERS ON CAMPUS WHO ARE STRUGGLING JUST TO MAKE ENDS MEET, LET ALONE FOCUS ON STUDIES.

Karina Foores, Cal State East Bay sophomore: "Sadly there are people who sleep in their cars. I know people who do not know where they're going to stay next year, so it's very frustrating to see that."

IN FEBRUARY CAL STATE EAST BAY BROUGHT IN CASE MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR ALEX BAKER TO HELP THESE UNDERSERVED STUDENTS.

Alex Baker, case management coordinator: "Our students of concern have been reported to us by our staff or faculty. Or sometimes they've been referred by friends on campus that are concerned about their friend who may be experiencing some hardship."

NEW INITIATIVES ARE NOW LAUNCHED ACROSS 23 CAL STATE CAMPUSES TO COMBAT THE PROBLEM. CAL STATE UNIVERSITY OFFICIALS MET THIS WEEK IN LONG BEACH TO DISCUSS WHAT MORE THEY CAN DO FOR THEIR STUDENTS WHO ARE CONFRONTING THESE ISSUES.

IN HAYWARD ELLA SOGOMONIAN KRON 4 NEWS

IN THE SOUTH BAY, HIGH PROFILE ATTORNEY GLORIA ALLRED IS NOW INVOLVED IN LAWSUITS AGAINST THE GILROY SCHOOL DISTRICT.

SHE SPOKE TODAY ON BEHALF OF A MOTHER WHOSE CHILD WAS ALLEGEDLY A VICTIM OF A TEACHER'S SEXUAL MISCONDUCT. TWENTY-FIVE-YEAR-OLD DOUGLAS LE WAS ARRESTED AT HIS HOME BACK IN APRIL. HE IS ACCUSED OF POSING AS A YOUNG GIRL ON SOCIAL MEDIA AND ASKING HUNDREDS OF MINORS TO SEND HIM SEXUALLY EXPLICIT PHOTOS.

LE WORKED AS A SCIENCE TEACHER AT GILROY HIGH SCHOOL FOR THE PAST SEVERAL YEARS. NOW, THE PARENTS OF ONE TEENAGER ARE SUING THE SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR NOT DOING ENOUGH TO PROTECT STUDENTS

Allred: "We allege the GUSD failed to protect and safeguard our clients from sexual misconduct against them by Mr. Le even though GUSD know that Mr. Le had previously engaged in unlawful, sexually related conduct with minors at Gilroy High School."

THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SAYS THE TEACHER HAD PASSED A BACKGROUND CHECK WHEN HE WAS HIRED. THEY SAY THEY ARE WORKING TO KEEP ALL STUDENTS SAFE.

AN ANTIOCH SPECIAL NEEDS SCHOOL THAT HAS BEEN UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE STATE AND KRON4 NEWS FOR ALLEGATIONS OF ABUSE IS SHUTTING DOWN SOME OF THEIR CAMPUSES. KRON4'S MAUREEN KELLY HAS BEEN DIGGING INTO THE TOBINWOOD SCHOOLS FOR MONTHS. TODAY SHE UNCOVERED A NEWLY RELEASED PUBLIC RECORD THAT DETAILS WHAT'S NEXT FOR THE EMBATTLED PRIVATE SCHOOL:

HERE'S THE VIDEO OF A 9 YEAR OLD SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENT BEING SLAPPED BY A TEACHER'S AIDE. IT HAPPENED BACK IN JANUARY. TWO AIDES WERE FIRED AS A RESULT. THE SHOCKING TAPE ALSO PROMPTED CRIMINAL CHARGES AGAINST THOSE AIDES AND LAUNCHED AN INVESTIGATION BY THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. IT ALSO GOT KRON4NEWS TO DIG DEEPER.

I FOUND SEVERAL FORMER AIDES WILLING TO COME FORWARD WHO HAD OTHER TALES TO TELL ABOUT STAFF MEMBERS ALLEGEDLY ABUSING THEIR POWER OVER THE SPECIAL NEEDS STUDENTS UNDER THEIR CARE.

Nic, a former Tobinworld aide: "I've seen staff instigate with students to the point of setting them off so they have to be restrained Staff talking down, being really disrespectful to students because they feel the students are lower than them.".

WE'VE JUST LEARNED THAT TWO OTHER TOBINWORLD AIDES WE TALKED TO WERE SUBPOENAED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE AFTER COMING FORWARD TO KRON 4 WITH THEIR STORIES. BEHIND ME IS THE CAMPUS CALLED TOBINWORLD TWO....THAT'S WHERE CELL PHONE VIDEO CAPTURED THE BOY BEING ABUSED. THIS SCHOOL SITE IS NOT SHUTTING DOWN. BUT I GOT MY HANDS ON A RECENTLY RELEASED PUBLIC RECORD THAT SHOWS HOW TOBINWORLD IS PULLING OUT OF FOUR SCHOOL SITES, THREE OF WHICH JUST OPENED UP THIS MOST RECENT SCHOOL YEAR.

HERE'S THE LETTER FROM JUDY WEBER, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF TOBINWORLD, DATED TWO MONTHS AFTER THE EXPLOSIVE CELL PHONE VIDEO CAME TO LIGHT AND AFTER KRON4 NEWS HAD BEGUN LOOKING INTO THEIR HISTORY. IT'S ADDRESSED TO ANTIOCH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, LETTING THEM KNOW THE TIMELINE OF WHEN THEY ARE SHUTTERING THOSE CAMPUSES.

TOBINWORLD THREE LOCATED AT FREMONT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL ALREADY SHUT DOWN ON JUNE 2ND. DVT ACADEMY LOCATED AT DIABLO VISTA AND A &T PRESCHOOL AT GRANT ELEMENTARY ARE CLOSING ON WEDNESDAY. KT ACADEMY ON THE KIMBALL ELEMENTARY CAMPUS CLOSES ON THURSDAY.

TOBINWORLD SAYS THEY CAN'T RESPOND BECAUSE OF PENDING LITIGATION PROMPTED BY THE VIDEO. AND THE ANTIOCH UNIFIED OFFICES WERE NOT OPEN, SO WE DON'T KNOW THE EXACT REASON WHY THE CAMPUSES ARE SHUTTING DOWN.

A SOURCE FAMILIAR WITH SPECIAL EDUCATION IN THE DISTRICT SAYS TWO OTHER PRIVATE SCHOOLS THAT WORK WITH SPECIAL NEEDS KIDS, SPECTURM AND SIERRA, ARE IN THE PROCESS OF TAKING OVER THE PROGRAMS. ONE OF THE FORMER AIDES WE SPOKE SAYS THAT'S GOOD NEWS FOR ANTIOCH PARENTS.

Nic: "It gives parents another resource, to put their children in a different rather than Tobinworld. I feel that Tobinworld kind of said they were their last resort so that parents felt trapped that they had to go there. But now there are other resources available, so that's good."

A WORKER HERE AT TOBINWORLD TWO SAYS SHE HASN'T HEARD OF ANY PLANS TO SHUT THIS CAMPUS DOWN, IN FACT SUMMER SCHOOL STARTS HERE ON MONDAY.

WE ARE NOW HEARING FROM THE STATE ATTORNEY GENERAL ABOUT HER INVESTIGATION INTO THE ANTIOCH SPECIAL NEEDS SCHOOL WHERE THIS DISTURBING VIDEO WAS SHOT. IT SHOWS A TEACHER'S AIDE BEING VIOLENT WITH A 9- YEAR OLD STUDENT IN HER CARE. THE NEWS OF THIS INVESTIGATION IS COMING ON THE HEELS OF KRON 4'S SERIES OF REPORTS UNEARTHING OTHER ALLEGATIONS OF ABUSE AT THE TOBINWORLD SCHOOL. KRON 4'S MAUREEN KELLY HAS THE LATEST ON THIS NEW STATE INQUIRY AND REACTION FROM A PARENT WHO WISHES IT HAD BEEN LAUNCHED SOONER:

Kamala Harris, California Attorney General :"We are concerned and we are doing something about it."

THE CALIFORNIA ATTORNEY GENERAL IS TALKING ABOUT THE INVESTIGATION LAUNCHED BY THE BUREAU OF CHILDREN'S JUSTICE. IT'S FOCUSING ON TOBINWORLD, WHERE THIS ABUSE WAS CAUGHT ON TAPE, AS WELL AS OTHER NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS, RELATING TO THEIR TREATMENT OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES. THE RECENTLY FORMED DEPARTMENT OF THE DOJ IS LOOKING FOR POTENTIAL CIVIL RIGHTS VIOLATIONS OF THE MOST VUNERABLE IN OUR SYSTEM. TODAY TWO FORMER AIDES WHO SPOKE OUT TO KRON4 NEWS, ALLEGING OTHER STUDENTS AT TOBINWORLD WERE RESTRAINED TOO AGRESSIVELY, TOO OFTEN AND FOR TOO LONG, ARE TESTIFYING IN FRONT OF DOJ INVESTIGATORS AFTER BEING HIT WITH SUPEONAS.

KAMALA HARRIS COULDN'T GIVE SPECIFICS ABOUT THE INVESTIGATION, BUT SAYS SHE WANTED TO COME FORWARD ABOUT WHAT HER AGENCY IS LOOKING INTO.

Harris: "To encourage victims to come forward and to let the public know that these children do matter. We want to know what's going on with them."

Andrianne Pantell, parent: "That was the only reason I chose to push, so it would go public."

ANDRIANNE PANTELL IS HAPPY THAT THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IS LOOKING INTO WHAT IS HAPPENING AT TOBINWORLD AND OTHER SCHOOLS LIKE IT. SHE SAYS IT'S PART OF THE REASON SHE FILED THIS LAWSUIT AGAINST THE SCHOOL AFTER WHAT SHE SAYS HAPPENED TO HER DISABLED SON WHEN HE ATTENDED TOBINWORLD WHEN HE WAS EIGHT YEARS OLD.

Pantell: "They would just throw him to the floor. They would sit on him, sometimes for 2-4 hours at a time. He would get bloody noses. They would withhold food as punishment and there were times they wouldn't let him use the bathroom. He would have sit in wet pants until I picked him up."

SHE SAYS SHE KNEW SHE HAD TO PULL HIM OUT WHEN SHE SAW BRUISES ON HER SON'S BODY AND ASKED HIM WHERE THEY CAME FROM.

Pantell: "He said that's from when they throw me down and sit on me. That's when they restrain me. He says isn't that why you sent me there, because my brain doesn't work like everybody else's?"

SO FAR WE'VE HAD NO RESPONSE FROM TOBINWORLD ABOUT ANDRIANNE'S CLAIMS.

MEANWHILE THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IS LOOKING FOR PEOPLE LIKE ANDRIANNE TO COME FORWARD VIA THE BUREAU OF CHILDREN'S JUSTICE WEBSITE. YOU CAN FIND A LINK ON KRON4 DOT COM.

TODAY THE SPECIAL NEEDS SCHOOL UNDER FIRE FOR ALLEGED ABUSE OF DISABLED STUDENTS CLOSED UP ITS LAST SCHOOL SITE ON A PUBLIC SCHOOL CAMPUS TODAY. KRON4'S MAUREEN KELLY WAS THERE AND HAS NEW INFORMATION FROM THE ANTIOCH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ABOUT HOW MUCH MONEY TOBINWORLD STANDS TO LOSE AS STUDENTS ARE PULLED FROM THEIR CLASSROOMS:

Tobinworld employee: "I hope I can see you guys again."

TOBINWORLD STAFF MEMBERS SAY GOODBYE TO STUDENTS AT THE KT ACADEMY. AS THEY HELP THEM BOARD THE BUS FOR THE FINAL TIME THIS YEAR.

Employee: "Bye!"

IT'S THE LAST OF TOBINWORLD'S FOUR SATELITTLE CAMPUSES TO CLOSE IN ANTIOCH THIS MONTH. IN ALL, CLOSE TO 115 KIDS FROM THE ANTIOCH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT WERE TAUGHT AT THOSE SCHOLS, BUT NOT ANYMORE.

TOBINWORLD MADE THE DECISION TO PULL OUT AFTER THIS VIDEO SURFACED SHOWING THE ABUSE OF A 9 YEAR OLD STUDENT BY A TEACHER'S AIDE INSIDE A CLASSROOM.

Antioch school district superintendent: "Tobinworld informed us several months ago that they were pulling out of the collaboratives which we had much more oversight of. That leaves students the only option of T2."

T2 OR TOBINWORLD 2, IS THE SCHOOL'S MAIN ANTIOCH LOCATION AND IS NOT ON PUBLIC SCHOOL GROUNDS. IT'S ALSO WHERE THE EXPLOSIVE CELL PHONE VIDEO WAS TAKEN.

MORE THAN 30 ANTIOCH STUDENTS WERE TAUGHT THERE THIS YEAR AND SOME OF THOSE PARENTS WANTED A CHANGE AFTER the VIDEO SURFACED.

Superintendent: "Many parents wanted understandably to get out."

ACCORDING TO THE ANTIOCH SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPERIDENDENT AFTER THEY GOT THIS LETTER ALERTING THEM THAT THE COLLARBOTIVES WERE CLOSING, PARENTS WITH STUDENTS THOSE SITES TOLD THEM THAT WAS TOBINWORLD ENCOURAGING THEM TO MOVE THEIR KIDS INTO TOBINWORLD TWO.

TOBINWORLD WAS GETTING 112 DOLLARS PER STUDENT, PER DAY FROM THE DISTRICT FOR KIDS AT THE COLLABROTIVES. BUT AT TOBINWORLD TWO, IT WOULD GET 146 DOLLARS A DAY. IF ALL OF THE KIDS AT THE SATELLITE SCHOOLS MOVED TO T2, THE NON-PROFIT STANDS TO GAIN MORE THAN A MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE DISTRICT. SO FAR THIS YEAR, THE ANTIOCH SCHOOL DISTRICT HAS PAID TOBINWORLD NEARLY TWO AND HALF MILLION DOLLARS.

I TALKED TO ONE WOMAN PICKING UP HER GRANDSON WHO SAYS SHE WANTS TO TRANSFER HIM TO T2.

Grandmother: "They didn't talk me into staying. I just think this is the perfect school for my grandson. I like Tobinworld."

KRON 4 NEWS HAS BEEN INVESTIGATING TOBINWORLD FOR SEVERAL MONTHS NOW, UNCOVERING OTHER ALLEGATIONS OF ABUSE. JUST LAST WEEK, THE STATE ATTORNEY GENERAL ANNOUNCED IT WAS LAUNCHING ITS OWN INVESTIGATION.

THAT PROMPTED THE ANTIOCH SCHOOL DISTRICT TO SEND OUT THEIR LETTER, TELLING PARENTS IT WAS PULLING OUT OF TOBINWORLD.

TOBINWORLD'S LAWYER SAYS THEY DISPUTE THE DISTRICT'S CHARACTERIZAITON OF EVENTS, BUT THEY ARE UNABLE TO COMMENT FURTHER DUE TO ONGOING LITIGATION, ADDING THAT TOBINWORLD CONTINUES TO "WORK COLLABORATIVELY WITH THEIR PARTNERS AS WELL AS INTERESTED STATE AGENCIES."

A EUROPEAN AIRPLANE MAKER IS TAKING THE HYBRID CAR CONCEPT TO THE SKIES. AIRBUS PLANS TO START SELLING HYBRID PASSENGER PLANES BY 2030. THE PLANES WOULD CARRY UP TO A HUNDRED PASSENGERS AND HAVE A RANGE OF ABOUT 620 MILES. THAT'S ENOUGH, FOR EXAMPLE, TO GET YOU FROM SAN FRANCISCO TO SALT LAKE CITY.

OFFICIALS SAY THE HYBRID PLANES WOULD USE LESS FUEL AND BE MORE QUIET, JUST LIKE A TOYOTA PRIUS. THEY WILL USE ELECTRIC ENGINES FOR TAKEOFF AND LANDING, BUT STILL USE JET FUEL AT CRUISING ALTITUDES. AIRBUS SAYS ITS ULTIMATE GOAL IS TO DEVELOP "ZERO-EMISSIONS AVIATION."

THERE MAY BE FEWER OF THESE BIRDS AROUND OVER THE NEXT DECADE. IT HAS BEEN CALLED ONE OF THE TOP BIRD KILLERS IN NORTH AMERICA, AND NOW THERE ARE PLANS UNDERWAY TO REPOWER A MASSIVE WIND ENERGY FARM IN THE ALTAMONT PASS. KRON 4'S KATE CAGLE SHOWS US WHAT THE CLEAN ENERGY MEANS FOR PROTECTED CALIFORNIA BIRDS:

EVERY THURSDAY YOU CAN SEE TOPAZ ON HER PERCH IN THE EAST BAY. SHE'S A FAN FAVORITE AT THE LINDSEY WILDLIFE CENTER..AND A STAFF FAVORITE AS WELL.

Amber Paczkowski, animal keeper: "She's really calm. She's one of the few birds I trust as close to my face as she gets."

GOLDEN EAGLES ARE MASSIVE MAJESTIC BIRDS. TOPAZ WEIGHS 11 POUNDS. HER WING SPAN IS ABOUT 6 FEET. SHE CAME HERE INJURED, DISCOVERED WITH A BROKEN WING NEAR LAKE TOPAZ AND NEVER FULLY RECOVERED.

Paczkowski: "We don't know what happened. She was found with that injury. It's the same story for a lot of our raptors."

BUT BIRD ADVOCATES KNOW EXACTLY WHAT IS HAPPENING TO GOLDEN EAGLES IN THE ALTAMONT PASS. EVERY YEAR THEY ARE KILLED BY WIND TURBINES. THIS PROJECT ALONE WAS ESTIMATED TO KILL 80 RAPTORS EVERY YEAR, UP UNTIL IT SHUT DOWN AMID CONCERNS FOR THE WILDLIFE.

Paczkowski: "All California raptors are protected. So much so, it's illegal to even own a feather of a golden eagle like Topaz."

BUT A NEW PLAN IS IN THE WORKS TO GET THIS FARM BACK UP AND RUNNING. THE "SUMMIT REPOWERING PROJECT" WILL REMOVE AND DISMANTLE MORE THAN 500 OF THESE OLD, OUTDATED TURBINES AND REPLACE THEM WITH ABOUT 30 OF THE BIG GUYS. THE NEW MODELS WILL BE SIMILAR TO THESE ON A NEIGHBORING PROJECT, TOWERING 42 STORIES FROM TOP TO BOTTOM.

Bob Cooper, wind project neighbor: "We'll sit on our back patio and they'll swirl around. Sometimes we have three golden eagles."

NEIGHBORS TO THE SITE IN LIVERMORE, LIKE BOB COOPER, ARE USED TO THE WIND TURBINES – THEY'VE BEEN HERE FOR DECADES – AND THEY'VE SEEN THE DEVASTATION THEY CAN CAUSE. THIS VIDEO SHOWS NEIGHBORS RESCUING A GOLDEN EAGLE THEY BELIEVE WHACKED BY A TURBINE THE RAPTOR LATER DIED.

Cooper: "It was really sad and that happens too often."

ALAMEDA COUNTY APPROVED REPOWERING THE PROJECT IN JANUARY AND WHILE THEY THINK THE BIG TURBINES WILL KILL FEWER BIRDS, PLANS NOTED THE DEATH RATE WOULD BE SIGNIFICANT AND UNAVOIDABLE.

REPORTING IN LIVERMORE KATE CAGLE KRON 4 NEWS

PART OF THE AGREEMENT TO RESTART THE PROJECT INCLUDED A FEE. "ALTAMONT WINDS LLC" WILL HAVE TO PAY 580 DOLLARS FOR EVERY RAPTOR KILLED. THAT MONEY WILL GO TO CONSERVATION EFFORTS. ALTAMONT WINDS DID NOT RESPOND TO OUR REQUEST FOR COMMENT.

4/4/16 KRON 4 Evening News Officials already concerned about fire season

LATE APRIL OR EARLY MAY IS TYPICALLY THE BEGINNING OF FIRE SEASON HERE IN THE BAY AREA. THERE'S NOTHING OFFICIAL SO FAR, BUT AS KRON 4'S ROB FLADEBOE REPORTS NOW, THERE ARE SOME UNNERVING SIGNS INDICATING IT HAS ALREADY STARTED:

HERE'S A SCENE THAT LOOKS MORE LIKE SUMMER THAN SPRING AND IF WE SEE TEMPERATURES IN THE 90'S THIS WEEK, AS FORECAST, ANY MOISTURE THAT'S LEFT IN THIS GRASS WILL BE LONG GONE AND WITH IT, ANY DOUBTS ABOUT WHETHER IT CAN BURN.

Pam Temmermand, CalFire spokesperson: "You get those higher temperatures. You get a little bit of wind blowing and if the humidity is lower than you are starting to get that right recipe for fire starting."

THIS GRASS FIRE LAST WEEK IN MENLO PARK, AS SEEN IN VIDEO FROM OUR HELICOPTER PARTNERSHIP WITH ABC 7, WAS ONE OF 63 FIRES RESPONDED TO BY CALFIRE LAST WEEK AND THERE HAVE BEEN 325 SUCH FIRES STATEWIDE SINCE JANUARY 1ST.

Temmermand: "We've already had our first round of seasonal firefighter hirings. They will be hiring a second round here pretty soon. In the next few weeks they'll start that academy. And, of course, we'll be brining more engines on line."

OFFICIALLY, FIRE SEASON IS PERHAPS TWO WEEKS TO A MONTH AWAY. IT'S GOING TO BE A BUSY TIME FOR WEED ABATEMENT CREWS LIKE THIS ONE AND CALFIRE IS ONCE AGAIN PUSHING RESIDENTS WHO LIVE NEAR WILDLAND AREAS TO GET A HEAD START ON THEIR DEFENSIBLE SPACE.

Temmermand: "We've got these warm temperatures coming up. Before you know it, all these weeds and grasses are going to start growing up around their homes. So get out there with the weed whacker or the lawn mower and start creating your defensible space around your home."

THE HILLS LOOK GREEN NOW, BUT THEY CAN GO FROM THIS TO THIS IN JUST A FEW DAYS WHEN THE WEATHER WARMS UP AND AS WE SAW IN MENLO PARK THE OTHER DAY, EVEN IF IT'S STILL A LITTLE BIT GREEN, THAT GRASS CAN STILL BURN.

THE RETURN OF EL NINO AND SPRING RAINS COULD DELAY THE ONSET OF FIRE SEASON SOME, BUT ON THE OTHER HAND IT WILL ONLY MEAN THAT MUCH MORE GRASS, THAT MUCH MORE FUEL FOR LATER IN THE SUMMER.

THE MARINE MAMMAL CENTER IS ALMOST OUT OF ROOM BECAUSE NEW PATIENTS KEEP COMING IN EVERY DAY, MOSTLY BECAUSE OF MALNUTRITION. SCIENTISTS SAY THE EL NINO CONDITIONS IN THE PACIFIC ARE MOSTLY TO BLAME. KRON 4'S JEFF BUSH HAS MORE FROM THE MARIN HEADLANDS: EIGHTY SEA LIONS, 110 ELEPHANT SEALS AND 50 HARBOR SEALS – THE MARINE MAMMAL CENTER IS PACKED AND IT'S ALL BECAUSE THE EL NINO CONDITIONS IN THE PACIFIC OCEAN HAVE FORCED THE MACKEREL, SARDINES AND OTHER FISH THAT ARE THEIR MAIN DIET TO HEAD NORTH WHERE THE WATER IS COLDER. THE CENTER SAYS THERE ARE MORE ANIMALS THAN AVERAGE BEING TREATED HERE.

Dr. Shawn Johnson, lead veterinarian: "We are about at capacity. All our pools are completely full and our pens. We are doing the best we can to take care of every animal that needs our help."

THE CENTER RESCUES ANIMALS FROM AS FAR SOUTH AS SAN LUIS OBISBO AND AS FAR NORTH AS FORT BRAGG. LATELY THE CENTER REPORTS MORE PATIENTS THAN NORMAL, AND THEY KEEP COMING IN.

THE REHABILITATION IS A LONG PROCESS. DAILY TUBE FEEDINGS ARE NECESSARY TO GET THE ANIMALS STRONG ENOUGH TO BE RELEASED. THE CENTER FFEEDS THEM MORE THAN A THOUSAND POUNDS OF FISH A DAY. THEY ARE CHECKED AND WEIGHED FREQUENTLY. THEIR PROGRESS IS MONITORED UNTIL THEY ARE STRONG ENOUGH TO GO BACK INTO THE WILD.

THE SEA LION PUPS ARE COMING IN BECAUSE THEY ARE MALNOURISHED AND CONFUSED, TOO YOUNG TO KNOW HOW TO HUNT DOWN THE HARD-TO-FIND FISH AND, NOT VERY STRONG TO BEGIN WITH BECAUSE THEIR MOTHERS AREN'T PRODUCING ENOUGH MILK FOR THEM.

Dr. Johnson: "It's worse this year because the last three years we've had elevated ocean temperatures so the fish stocks are at record lows for this time of year. The sardine and anchovy populations have just plummeted off the west coast. There's really not a lot of food our there for these newly weaned animals."

SCIENTISTS AT THE MARINE MAMMAL CENTER SAY IT IS UNCLEAR HOW LONG EL NINO WILL BE AFFECTING THE WATER TEMPERATURE AND THEY SAY AS LONG AS THAT IS IN EFFECT THE FISH ARE GOING TO STAY AWAY AND THEY EXPECT TO SEE MORE PATIENTS COMING INTO THE CENTER.

THERE IS GROWING EVIDENCE THAT A BIG EARTHQUAKE COULD SEVERELY DAMAGE SAN FRANCISCO'S WATERFRONT. NOW A NEW STUDY CLAIMS THE CITY'S AGING SEAWALL IS NEED OF AN UPGRADE. KRON 4'S CHARLES CLIFFORD IS LIVE TONIGHT ALONG THE EMBARCADERO WITH MORE ON WHAT IT WILL TAKE TO FIX THE PROBLEM:

FROM AT&T PART OT FISHERMAN'S WHARF, SAN FRANCISCO'S EMBARCADERO IS A SCENIC AND POPULAR SPOT WITH LOCALS AND TOURISTS ALIKE. BUT THIS ENTIRE STRETCH OF WATERFRONT RESTS ON TOP OF MUD AND A NEARLY 100 YEAR OLD SEAWALL THAT ALSO SITS ON MUD. THE SEAWALL HAS A PYRAMID SHAPE THAT RUNS THE LENGTH OF THE EMBARCADERO AND IT'S MADE UP OF ROCKS THAT WERE DUMPED INTO THE BAY STARTING IN THE 19<sup>TH</sup> CENTURY. IN THIS NEW REPORT, COMMISSIONED BY THE PORT OF SAN FRANCISCO, ENGINEERS STUDIED THE SEAWALL. THEIR CONCLUSION IS THAT DURING A MODERATE-TO-LARGE EARTHQUAKE THE WALL COULD MOVE SEVERAL FEET OUTWARD TOWARDS THE BAY. THEY SAY THE SEAWALL PROBABLY WON'T FAIL, BUT THAT MOVEMENT COULD RESULT IN SEVERE DAMAGE TO THE EMBARCADERO, THE BUILDINGS THAT SIT ON IT AND LARGE PARTS OF THE FINANCIAL DISTRICT.

Elaine Forbes, Port of San Francisco: "The study is really a call to action that we need to invest in our seawall."

ELAINE FORBES IS THE INTERIM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE PORT OF SAN FRANCISCO.

Forbes: "It's time to shore it up so that in a big earthquake, The Embarcadero is in good shape and can be an area of response in an emergency."

ON TUESDAY, THE STUDY WAS PRESENTED TO THE PORT COMMISSION. FORBES SAYS THAT THEY ARE WORKING ON A PLAN TO IMPROVE THE SEAWALL. POSSIBLE OPTIONS INCLUDE DRILLING THROUGH THE WALL AND INJECTING CEMENT INTO THE MUD BELOW TO STABILIZE THE GROUND. OR, THEY COULD STRENGTHEN THE WALL ITSELF WITH CONCRETE AND BULKHEADS. FORBES SAYS THE WORK WOULD PROBABLY BE DONE IN STAGES, RATHER THAN ALL AT ONCE, AND, AS YOU CAN PROBABLY GUESS, IT WON'T BE CHEAP OR QUICK.

Forbes: "We are estimating 2 to 3 billion dollars and up to 5 billion, if we are also addressing sea level rise, and we would like to see major investment in the seawall in the next 8 to 10 year period."

4/14/16 KRON 4 News at 8pm Is La Nina coming in El Nino's wake?

FOR THE PAST YEAR, METEOROLOGISTS HAVE BEEN TRACKING A LARGE EL NINO IN THE PACIFIC OCEAN, BUT THAT MASS OF WARM WATER MAY BE COOLING OFF. BY NEXT FALL, A LA NINA COULD TAKE ITS PLACE, BRINGING COLD AND DRY WEATHER TO CALIFORNIA. KRON 4'S CHARLES CLIFFORD IS LIVE TONIGHT IN SAN FRANCISCO WITH DETAILS:

ONE OF THE LARGEST EL NINO'S EVER RECORDED IS FADING AWAY. NOAA SAS THAT OCEAN TEMPERATURES NEAR THE EQUATOR IN THE PACIFIC HAVE STARTED TO COOL OFF, SIGNALING THE END OF AN EL NINO THAT HAS LASTED ALMOST A YEAR.

HISTORICALLY, WHEN A WARM EL NINO ENDS, IT'S OFTEN FOLLOWED BY A PERIOD OF COOLER OCEAN TEMPERATURES KNOWS AS LA NINA. ON THURSDAY, NOAA ISSUED A LA NINA WATCH, MEANING THAT THEY BELIEVE ONE COULD DEVELOP IN THE NEXT SIX MONTHS.

IF THAT HAPPENS, IT COULD BE BAD NEWS FOR CALIFORNIA. HOPES WERE HIGH THIS PAST WINTER THAT EL NINO-FUELED STORMS MIGHT END THE ONGOING DROUGHT. BUT THE STATE ONLY RECEIVED AN AVERAGE AMOUNT OF RAIN AND SNOW. THE LATEST U.S. DROUGHT MONITOR RELEASED ON THURSDAY SHOWS THAT 90 PERCENT OF CALIFORNIA IS STILL DEALING WITH SOME FORM OF MODERATE TO EXTREME DROUGHT CONDITIONS. WHERE AN EL NINO IS ASSOCIATED WITH WARM AND WET WEATHER, A LA NINA IS THE OPPOSITE, USUALLY RESULTING IN COLD AND DRY WEATHER FOR CALIFORNIA.

ACROSS THE COUNTRY, A LA NINA COULD MEAN WET WEATHER NI THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST, DRY WEATHER ACROSS THE SOUTH AND COLD WET WEATHER IN THE NORTHEAST. THERE ALSO TEND TO BE MORE HURRICANES IN THE ATLANTIC OCEAN AND FEWER IN THE PACIFIC DURING A LA NINA YEAR.

FINES FOR SAVING WATER. THAT'S THE THREAT RESIDENTS IN ONE GATED COMMUNITY IN THE EAST BAY ARE NOW FACING. THIS THREAT COMES DESPITE THE STATE'S DROUGHT AND THE GOVERNOR'S MANDATE TO CUT BACK ON WATER USE. THE BLACKHAWK HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION SENT A LETTER TO ITS TWO THOUSAND RESIDENTS, URGING THEM KEEP UP GREEN LAWNS OR ELSE. BROWN, DEAD YARDS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED ANYMORE DURING THIS DROUGHT. KRON 4'S JUSTINE WALDMAN HAS THIS STORY FROM BLACKHAWK:

THE ENTRANCE TO THE UPSCALE GATED COMMUNITY OF BLACKHAWK HAS LUSH GREEN GRASS. THE PLANTS HERE DO NOT LOOK THIRSTY.

Mick Yertin, Blackhawk resident; "Our sprinklers have been off. We turn them on maybe once a week."

MICK YERTIN LIVES IN BLACKHAWK. DURING THE DROUGHT, HIS FAMILY OF SIX HAS TRIED TO CUT BACK ON THEIR WATER USE. ANOTHER PERSON WHO LIVES HERE SENT KRON 4 NEWS THESE PHOTOS TO SHOW THEIR DRIED UP BACK YARD. BUT A LAWN LIKE THIS MIGHT GET A HOMEOWNER IN TROUBLE.

THIS LETTER SENT FROM THE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION TELLS THE TWO THOUSAND MEMBERS "THE BEAUTY OF OUR COMMUNITY HAS REALLY SUFFERED. ALLOWING THE DROUGHT TO NEGATIVELY IMPACT THE LANDSCAPING DOES A DISSERVICE TO PROPERTY VALUES AND IS A VIOLATION OF OUR CC&Rs."

Yertin: "There's a lot of water shaming going on."

SO A DEAD BROWN YARD LIKE THIS COULD SOON GET PEOPLE HERE FINED, SUED OR HAVE THE REMOTES THEY USE TO ENTER THE GATED COMMUNITY TURNED OFF. ON THE HOA WEBSITE, THERE ARE PHOTOS POSTED SHOWING THE BEAUTIFUL LANDSCAPING STANDARD AND SUGGESTS THAT REIDENTS USE ALTERNATIVE LANDSCAPE LIKE LOW-WATER-USE PLANTS OR TURF.

Yertin: "This is more about just taking care of your property. We live in an upscale community."

THERE IS A LAW THAT SAYS HOA'S CANNOT PENALIZE A PERSON FOR SAVING WATER. EVEN SO, THE HOA HERE AT BLACKHAWK PROMISES IT WILL START AGGRESSIVE ENFORCEMENT OF ITS LANDSCAPING STANDARDS ON JUNE FIRST.

EAST BAY WATER OFFICIALS SAY THEY ARE CURRENTLY RE-EVALUATING DROUGHT WATERING REQUIREMENTS AND SAY BLACKHAWK'S DIRECTIVE IS TOO SOON.

SOME OF THE MOST POLLUTED AIR IN THE COUNTRY IS RIGHT HERE IN THE BAY AREA. THAT'S ACCORDING TO A NEW REPORT, BUT NOT ALL OF THE BAY AREA IS ON THE LIST. GRANT LODES IS HERE TO SHOW US HOW WHERE YOU LIVE AFFECTS WHAT YOU BREATHE:

TAKE A LOOK AT THIS MAP. THE AMERICAN LUNG ASSOCIATION SAYS SAN FRANCISCO, MARIN AND SONOMA COUNTIES HAVE LITTLE TO NO POLLUTION. THEY GET AN "A" WHILE SAN MATEO AND NAPA COUNTIES EARN A "B". SOLANO AND CONTRA COSTA EACH GET A "D", WITH FAILING MARKS GOING TO ALAMEDA AND SANTA CLARA COUNTIES.

THE GOOD NEWS IS THAT THE AIR IS GETTING CLEANER. UNHEALTHY OZONE DAYS HAVE DROPPED 73 PERCENT IN 16 YEARS. PARTICLE POLLUTION, DUST, POLLEN AND INDUSTRIAL

EXHAUST IS DOWN EVEN MORE. THE LUNG ASSOCIATION SAYS THE CREDIT GOES TO TOUGHER EMISSION LAWS.

ALTHOUGH THOSE NUMBERS ARE DECLINING, THERE'S STILL A LOT MORE THAT NEEDS TO BE DONE. ALAMEDA, CONTRA COSTA, SANTA CLARA COUNTIES ALL EXCEED THE OZONE STANDARD. KRON 4'S ALECIA REID SPOKE WITH THE BAY AREA AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT AND TELLS US HOW WE CAN ALL HELP ELIMINATE AIR POLLUTION:

THERE ARE SOME PLACES IN THE BAY AREA WHERE THE AIR IS CLEAN AND OTHERS WHERE IT'S DIRTY. IT'S A MATTER OF MAKING SOME CHANGES SO WE CAN BREATHE CLEAN AIR ALL AROUND.

Bill Stulburg, East Bay resident: "The traffic situation seems to be a continuous hemorrhage."

THESE DAYS IT SEEMS TRAFFIC IS GETTING WORSE. AND A BIG PROBLEM WE FACE - SMOG – FROM ALL THE CARS ON THE ROAD.

Lisa Fasan, Bay Area Air Quality Management District: "The biggest culprit is transportation. Car-pooling, taking public transit and biking are areas where we really need the public's help."

BECAUSE AIR POLLUTION GENERATED ON THE PENISULA AND MARIN BLOWS OVER INTO THE EAST BAY, ALAMEDA, CONTRA COSTA, AND SANTA CLARA COUNTIES ALL EXCEED THE OZONE STANDARD. WHICH MEANS, THE AIR THERE IS UNHEALTHY.

Stulburg: "I would be more in favor of mass transit and carpooling because they just keep adding more lanes and it's a band aid on a major wound."

LISA FASANO FROM THE BAY AREA AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT AGREES PEOPLE SHOULD CUT DOWN ON THE AMOUNT OF TIME THEY DRIVE ALONE IN OUR CARS, BUT COOLER WEATHER IS ALSO A GREAT TIME TO CUT ANOTHER HABIT THAT POLLUTE THE AIR.

Fasano: "In the winter months the more we can reduce our wood burning or eliminate it all together, the better it will be for our air quality and that will be an immediate improvement."

THE BAY AREA AS A WHOLE IS DOING MODERATELY WELL. AIR POLLUTION IS DECLINING, BUT HERE IN THE EAST BAY WE STILL HAVE A LONG WAY TO GO.

LOCAL WATER AGENCIES ARE ASKING THE STATE TO EASE UP ON WATER RESTRICTIONS AND ALLOW LOCAL AGENCIES TO DETERMINE WHAT THE APPROPRIATE WATER USE SHOULD BE FOR CUSTOMERS. KRON 4'S JEFF BUSH EXPLAINS WHAT THE DISTRICTS ARE ASKING FOR AND WHY.

LOCAL WATER AGENCIES HAVE BEEN UNDER ORDER FROM THE STATE WATER BOARD TO MAINTAIN A 25 PERCENT REDUCTION BECAUSE OF THE DROUGHT CONDITIONS IN CALIFORNIA FOR THE LAST YEAR OR SO. BUT THIS WINTER BROUGHT A LOT OF RAIN AND THE RESERVOIRS ARE GETTING BACK TO NORMAL. THAT IS WHY THE ASSOCIATION OF CALIFORNIA WATER AGENCIES HAVE ASKED THE STATE TO EASE UP AND LET THE LOCALS DETERMINE WHAT IS APPROPRIATE.

Steve Ritchie, SFPUC: "What all of the agencies in California have done over time is subscribe to a list of best management practices that we have all been trying to practice for years."

WHICH MEANS THAT DIFFERENT REGIONS HAVE DIFFERENT NEEDS. HERE IN THE BAY AREA, THE EL NINO CONDITIONS BROUGHT A LOT OF RAIN AND SNOW PACK. OTHER REGIONS IN THE STATE MIGHT NOT HAVE HAD AS MUCH RAIN AND WOULD NEED TO CONSERVE MORE WATER.

AGENCIES LIKE THE SAN FRANCISCO P.U.C. ARE ASKING TO CONTROL THE WATER STOCK IN THEIR LOCAL AREAS.

Steve Ritchie, San Francisco P.U.C.: "Let's take into account our realistic supply and the fact that we have been conserving a whole lot of water so far. Everyone has been doing a great job here in the Bay Area and our customers in particular have conserved well beyond the requirements."

THE SANTA CLARA VALLEY WATER DISTRICT SAYS:

"Rather than a tiered system based on an urban water agency's gallons per capita per day, the District recommends an urban water agency's standard be based on local conditions."

EAST BAY MUD SAYS:

"Following the State's determination on the water needs of California as a whole, the EBMUC Board of Directors will evaluate our improved drought status and consider easing conservation targets, water use restrictions, and other measures. EBMUD will review these actions on May 24<sup>th</sup>."

STATEWIDE, CALIFORNIANS USED 24 PERCENT LESS WATER OVER THE NINE MONTHS ENDING IN FEBURARY, UNDER ORDERS TO USE 25 PERSCNET LESS WATER COMPARED TO THE SAME MNTHS IN 2013. AND WE'RE NOW UNDER ORDERS TO CUT BACK BY AT LEAST 20% THROUGH OCTOBER.

Ritchie: "People have to keep conserving, no matter what. Do they have to keep conserving in a draconian way? Maybe we can ease up a little bit there. Certainly, as a lifestyle, Californians have to conserve because we live on the edge of a desert."

THE STATE WATER BOARD IS GOING TO MAKE A DECISION ON THIS SOMETIME NEXT MONTH BUT, UNTIL THEN, THE RESTRICTIONS REMAIN IN PLACE.

Rufus Jeffris, Bay Area Council: "This is definitely a wake-up call."

RUFUS JEFFRIS OF THE BAY AREA COUNCIL SAYS ONE SOLUTION IS TO INCREASE HOUSING SUPPLY AND BRING DOWN PRICES.

"WATER CONSERVATION MUST BE A PART OF OUR EVERYDAY LIFE" THOSE WORDS TODAY COMING FROM GOVERNOR JERRY BROWN. HE IS WARNING PEOPLE THAT THE EL NINO-FUELED STORMS WE HAD OVER THE WINTER DO NOT CHANGE THE LONG-TERM DROUGHT SITUATION IN CALIFORNIA. GRANT LODES IS HERE WITH MORE:

IT'S THE NEW REALITY. THE GOVERNOR SAYS GET USED TO CONSERVING, BASICALLY FOREVER. HE'S SAYS CLIMATE CHANGE MEANS THAT DROUGHT CONDITIONS IN CALIFORNIA WILL BECOME A WAY OF LIFE, AND WE CANNOT RELAX AFTER A GOOD, BUT NOT GREAT, YEAR OF RAIN AND SNOW.

HE'S ORDERING THAT ALMOST ALL RESTRICTIONS CURRENTLY IN PLACE BECOME PERMANENT, INCLUDING BANS ON WASHING YOUR CAR WITHOUT A SHUT-OFF HOSE, NO HOSING DOWN DRIVEWAYS, OR WATERING THE GARDEN WITHIN 48 HOURS AFTER A RAINFALL.

THE GOVERNOR SAID TODAY THAT WHILE CITIZENS HAVE BEEN STEPPING UP AND DOING A GOOD JOB, THE DROUGHT IS NOW A 'REGULAR' OCCURRENCE. HE'S ASKING STATE WATER AUTHORITIES TO DEVELOP LONG-TERM PLANS FOR EACH OF CALIFORNIA'S 400 BIGGEST WATER SUPPLIERS.

Marty Grimes, Santa Clara Valley Water District: "What will likely be changing is that instead of the State mandating what each city needs to do to reduce water use local areas will be able to propose their own standard base on their local water supply situation. We have climate change, stresses on our water supply, growing population – so we're looking at the fact that there's never going to be a time where we can waste water

THE CURRENT RATIONING PROGRAM HAS RESULTED IN A NEARLY 25% DROP IN WATER USE BETWEEN LAST JUNE AND MARCH OF 2016, COMPARED TO THE SAME MONTHS IN 2013 WHICH WAS BEFORE THE GOVERNOR ANNOUNCED A DROUGHT EMERGENCY.

FOUR YEARS INTO CALIFORNIA'S DROUGHT AND VINEYARDS ACROSS THE BAY AREA CONTINUE TO HARVEST GRAPES AND PUMP OUT WINE. GROWERS TELL US THE CHALLENGES ARE REAL. THIS WEEK WE TOOK QUADCOPTER4 TO SONOMA COUNTY TO GET AN UP-CLOSE LOOK AT THE VINEYARDS, ONE MONTH INTO GROWING SEASON. KRON4'S J.R. STONE JOINS US WITH THE STORY:

PAM, WE ARE JUST ONE MONTH INTO THE GROWING SEASON SO WE'RE NOT SEEING GRAPES JUST YET BUT THE VINES ARE GROWING. YOU CAN SEE BEHIND ME THE VIEWS FROM QUADCOPTER 4 ARE NOTHING SHORT OF SPECTACULAR. ROW AFTER ROW OF VINES.

IT'S THE FIFTH YEAR OF CALIFORNIA'S DROUGHT, BUT YOU'D NEVER KNOW FROM THIS VIEW OF A RODNEY STRONG VINEYARD IN SONOMA COUNTY. ONE GREEN VINE AFTER THE NEXT.

Ryan Decker, Rodney Strong winery: "One of the misconceptions is that we have no water. Here we're pretty lucky. Here in Sonoma county if you go ten miles to the west towards the coast it's the wettest place in California. Sometimes they get a 100 inches in Calidero. So even last year when it was in the middle of the big drought, we got 20 inches of rain in the wintertime."

RYAN DECKER FROM RODNEY STRONG SAYS HE IS ALREADY STARTING TO SEE A BLOOM WHICH IS ABOUT TWO TO THREE WEEKS AHEAD OF NORMAL, SIMILAR TO LAST YEAR BUT NOT QUITE AS EARLY.

MANY OF THE WINERIES HERE IN NAPA AND SONOMA COUNTY SOURCE THEIR GRAPES FROM A NUMBER OF DIFFERENT VINEYARDS. RIGHT NOW I'M 750 FEET UP AND AS FOR THE CONDTION OF THESE VINES, SO FAR SO GOOD.

Decker: "Well the vines are a little bit taller than they were last year, so I think all that extra moisture they got really gave them a boost. But the crop looks pretty spotty. Spotty means you'll see some vineyards that look really great, maybe an average or better than average crop. But then some vineyards might have two thirds of a crop. It's all over the place. It's definitely not uniform like some years you see."

ACCORDING TO THE U.S. DROUGHT MONITOR THIS AREA IN SONOMA COUNTY IS ABNORMALLY DRY ON THE DROUGHT SCALE. OTHER PARTS OF THE BAY AREA ARE IN A SEVERE AND EXTREME DROUGHT. DECKER SAYS WHEN IT COMES TO THESE VINEYARDS, RAIN OR NO RAIN, THEY ARE STILL FEELING LINGERING EFFECTS FROM LAST YEAR.

Decker: "I think because of the lack of moisture and conditions during last spring, we're seeing a little bit of a shorter crop this year. I'd expect an average crop this year."

RYAN DECKER SAYS DURING THESE DROUGHT YEARS THEY STILL PRODUCE GREAT WINE. THEY JUST DON'T ALWAYS PRODUCE THE SAME AMOUNT OF GRAPES WHICH CAN SOMETIMES PUSH PRICES HIGHER. AND PAM A SPECIAL THANKS TO THOSE AT RODNEY STRONG VINEYARDS WHO ALLOWED US THIS UP CLOSE ACCESS. AFTER OUR EL NINO WINTER, THERE ARE STRONG SIGNS TONIGHT IN THE SIERRA JUST HOW MUCH OF A DENT ALL THE RAIN AND SNOW MADE IN THE DROUGHT. TOURISTS HAVE TAKEN NOTICE AS WELL. THEY ARE FLOCKING TO THE MOUNTAINS TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF IT ALL. REPORTER MIKE LUERY DESCRIBES JUST HOW MUCH THINGS HAVE IMPROVED AND THE SHOW THAT MOTHER NATURE IS NOW PUTTING ON:

LISTEN TO THE SOUND OF NATURE TODAY ALONG THE NORTH FORK OF THE AMERICAN RIVER. THE SNOW IS MELTING FAST HERE AS TEMPERATURES START TO CLIMB.

Boater: ""It's pretty high compared to the other years."

THESE RAGING WATERS ARE GOOD NEWS NOT ONLY FOR SWIMMERS AND BOATERS, BUT ALSO FOR NOTHREN CALIFORNIA RESERVOIRS THAT ARE FILLING UP FAST.

LAKE SHASTA IS 93 PERCENT FULL TODAY THANKS TO A HEALTHY SNOWPACK, AS YOU CAN SEE IN THIS VIDEO CAPTURED LAST WEEKEND AT THE TOP OF MT. SHASTA WITH AN ELEVATION OF MORE THAN 14 THOUSAND FEET. AND LAKE OROVILLE IS AT 96 PERCENT OF CAPACITY FOR THIS DATE.

BUT IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, IT'S A VERY DIFFERENT STORY.

Doug Carlson, California Department of Water Resources: "There are many parts of the state that are suffering extreme drought conditions."

STATEWIDE, WATER EXPERTS SAY THAT CALIFORNIA'S TEMPERATURES HAVE BEEN CLIMBING FOR SIXTEEN YEARS.

Carlson: "We have set records almost every year since the year 2000 on the warmth of the year. I think these are the conditions that we face now - not as much precipitation in the winter - and warmer temperatures."

WATER IS CALIFORNIA'S MOST PRECIOUS RESOURCE AND THE PROSPECT OF MINIMAL SNOWPACKS IN THE FUTURE IS A DAUNTING ONE FOR THESE TWO HIKERS WE FOUND TODAY ALONG THE AMERICAN RIVER.

Teresa Conaghan, hiker: "From a recreational standpoint we want to go up to the Sierra and Tahoe and go skiing and snowboarding. And in the next few years, if this keeps happening, we're not going to be able to do that."

Sydney Sharp, hiker: "When I think about all the snow melting because of the higher temperatures - it makes me upset - like we should do something about global warming."

A LARGE NUMBER OF TREES IN THE SIERRA NEVADA FORESTS HAVE DIED BECAUSE OF THE RECENT DROUGHT. NEW FIGURES RELEASED BY THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHOW THAT A TOTAL OF 66 MILLION DEAD TREES WERE COUNTED. GOVERNOR JERRY BROWN DECLARED CALIFORNIA'S TREE DIE-OFF AN EMERGENCY. OFFICIALS SAY THIS EPIDEMIC CAN CREATE A HIGH RISK OF CATASTROPHIC WILDFIRES AND ENDANGERING LIVES. A CALL TO CALIFORNIA'S LEGISLATURE TO INCREASE SPENDING ON MANAGING FORESTS HAS BEEN MADE. KRON 4'S CHARLES CLIFFORD HAS MORE:

ON WEDNESDAY, THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE RELEASED THE RESULTTS OF IT SLATEST AERIAL SURVEY OF CALIFORNIA'S TREES ANDA THE NEWS IS NOT GOOD. THEY ESTIMATE THAT SINCE 2010 MORE THAN 66 MILLION TREES HAVE DIED FROM DROUGHT-RELATED STRESS AND BARK BEETLE INFESTATOINS. THAT ESTIMATE IS MORE THAN TWICE AS MANY TREES AS LAST YEAR'S COUNT AND MORE THAN 20 TIMES AS MANY TREES AS IN 2014.

HERE IN THE BAY AREA, THERE ARE TREES THAT HAVE DIED FROM DROUGHT RELATED PROBLEMS AND DISEASES, SUCH AS SUDDEN OAK EATH, BUT THE VAST MAJORITY OF THE DEAD TREES ARE IN THE CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN SIERERA.

THE MOST IMMEDIATE PROBLEM IS ALL THAT DRY DEAD WOOD IS A SERIOUS FIRE HAZARD.

CAL FIRE DIRECTOR KEN PIMLOTT ISSUED A STATEMENT ON WEDNESDAY.

Pimlott: "If a wildfire burns in an area with high tree mortality we know it will burn fast than many residents may be ready for."

IN RESPONSE, A COORDINATED EFFORT IS UNDERATY IN TEN OF THE HARDES HIT COUNTIES TO REMOVE AS MANY DEAD TREES AS [PSSOB;E/ CAL FIRE, CALTRANS, PG&E, COUNTY WORK CREWS AND OTHER UTILITY PROVIDERS ARE FOCUSING ON REMOVING DEAD TREES FROM AROUND ROADS, POWER LINES AND HIGHWAY. CAL FIRE IS ALSO BUILDING FUEL BREAKS AROUND VULNERABLE AREAS.

OFFICIALS ARE ALSO ASKING THAT HOME OWNERS REMOVE AS MANY DEAD TREES AS THEY CAN FROM THEIR PORPERTY AND TO BE PREPARED TO EVACUATE QUICKLY IF WILDFIRE BREAKS OUT.

California's hidden water supply

WITH CALIFORNIA IN ITS 5TH YEAR OF DROUGHT, ANY NEWS OF MORE WATER IS GOOD NEWS. MILLIONS OF AMERICANS ARE IN DANGER OF DRINKING TOXIC WATER. THAT'S ACCORDING TO A NEW RESEARCH ON DRINKING WATER NATIONWIDE. CNN HAS LEARNED MILLIONS OF AMERICANS ARE DRINKING WATER FROM SYSTEMS WHICH VIOLATE LEAD RULES. AND IT IS NO SECRET TO THE GOVERNMENT. CNN'S SARA GANIM REPORTS:.

MORE THAN 18 MILLION AMERICANS ARE GETTING THEIR DRINKING WATER FROM SYSTEMS THAT HAVE VIOLATED FEDERAL LEAD RULES AND NOT ONLY DOES THE EPA KNOW ABOUT IT, THEY'VE DONE ALMOST NOTHING TO ENFORCE THEIR OWN REGULATIONS, ACCORDING TO MULTIPLE INDUSTRY EXPERTS.

Erik Olson, Natural Resources Defense Council: "I think that the public needs to be told the truth about contamination in their water supply."

MORE THAN 5 THOUSAND WATER SYSTEMS ARE IN VIOLATION, INCLUDING FAILURE TO PROPERLY TEST WATER, FAILURE TO REPORT CONTAMINATION, AND FAILURE TO TREAT WATER PROPERLY, ACCORDING TO A NEW ANALYSIS BY THE NATURAL RESOURCES DEFENSE COUNCIL OR NRDC.

IN NINE OUT OF TEN CASES, THE EPA TOOK NO ENFORCEMENT ACTION WHEN WATER SYSTEMS VIOLATED THE "LEAD AND COPPER RULE," AFEDERAL REGULATION MEANT TO KEEP AMERICA'S TAP WATER SAFE FROM LEAD.

Olson: "Imagine a cop sitting, watching people run stop signs, and speed at 90 miles per hour in small communities and still doing absolutely nothing about it. That's unfortunately what we have now."

OLSON IS AMONG THE EXPERTS SAYING WATER UTILITIES ARE ROUTINELY "GAMING THE SYSTEM", USING INCORRECT TESTING METHODS TO "AVOID DETECTING HIGH LEVELS OF LEAD." WHAT THAT MEANS IS THERE ARE MORE WATER SYSTEMS WITH LEAD ISSUES, THAT AREN'T OFFICIALLY IN VIOLATION.

Olson: "They don't care if they're violating the law. They don't feel like they're going to face any penalties."

PHILADELPHIA IS ONE CITY ACCUSED OF GAMING THE SYSTEM. IN 2014, CITY OFFICIALS SENT RESIDENTS QUESTIONABLE INSTRUCTIONS FOR TESTING, TELLING THEM TO PRE-FLUSH THEIR WATER, AND TO REMOVE AERATORS WHICH OFTEN TRAP PARTICLES OF LEAD. EXPERTS SAY BOTH TECHNIQUES WOULD MAKE LEAD LEVELS APPEAR LOWER THAN THEY ACTUALLY ARE. IN FACT, THE EPA INSTRUCTED AS FAR BACK AS 2007 THAT THEY "SHOULD NOT REMOVE OR CLEAN AERATORS."

Jonathan King, The Philly Unleaded Project: "I wanted to test my water."

JONATHAN KING'S 18 MONTH OLD DAUGHTER HAS BEEN DRINKING PHILADELPHIA'S WATER FROM THE TAP SINCE SHE WAS BORN. HE'S ORGANIZING A GROUP OF HOMEOWNERS TO GET INDEPENDENT ANSWERS BECAUSE HE DOESN'T TRUST THE WAY THE CITY CONDUCTED ITS TESTING.

King: "It concerns me that they're not using the best practices available. It concerns me that they're not following the latest EPA regulations."

SO WHY DOESN'T THE EPA ENFORCE ITS OWN RULES? MULTIPLE SOURCES AND INDUSTRY EXPERTS TELL CNN IT COMES DOWN TO TWO KEY REASONS. WATER ISN'T A MAIN PRIORITY FOR THE EPA BECAUSE ITS RESOURCES ARE STRETCHED THIN, AND THE EPA HAS A COZY RELATIONSHIP WITH THE WATER SYSTEMS IT'S SUPPOSED TO REGULATE.

Olson: "They're friends. They hang out with each other. They ask for each other's advice, and you get close after a while."

Reporter: "So should citizens be worried?"

Alan Morrissey, Retired, EPA Office of Civil Enforcement: "Citizens should be very concerned."

WHEN ALLAN MORRISSEY RETIRED LAST YEAR FROM HIS JOB AS AN EPA WATER DEPARTMENT ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, HE SAID HE WAS FRUSTRATED BECAUSE BLATANT VIOLATIONS WOULD GO WITHOUT PUNISHMENT. MORRISSEY SAYS EVEN EPA EMPLOYEES DON'T TRUST WHAT COMES OUT OF THE TAP.

Morrissey: "So most of my colleagues have all chosen to install a water filter underneath our kitchen sink."

Reporter: "You're saying that people who work at the EPA are buying water filters because they aren't confident in the quality of their tap water."

Morrissey: "Yes."

BEING A KID DOES NOT ALWAYS MEAN BEING CAREFREE. EMOTIONAL CUES SUCH AS NEGATIVE BEHAVIOR, SICK FEELINGS AND SHIFTS IN INTERACTIONS MAY BE SMPTOMS OF STRESS. CNN'S MELISSA RANEY LOOKS AT HOW TO FIND OUT WHAT STRESSES KIDS OUT AND HOW TO HELP THEM COPE:

STRESS CAN AFFECT ANYONE WHO FEELS OVERWHELMED, INCLUDING KIDS. HERE ARE A FEW SIGNS FOR PARENTS TO LOOK OUT FOR.

NEGATIVE CHANGES IN BEHAVIOR. FOR YOUNGER KIDS, WITHDRAWAL FROM THEIR FAVORITE ACTIVITIES, BECOMING CLINGY TO A PARENT OR EVEN A SUDDEN CHANGE IN THEIR APPETITE ARE ALL RED FLAGS. BECOMING HOSTILE TOWARDS FAMILY AND ABANDONING FRIENDSHIPS ARE MORE COMMON SIGNS AMONG TEENS. INTERACTION WITH OTHERS. HOW YOUR CHILD INTERACTS WITH OTHERS, OUTSIDE OF THE HOME, CAN INDICATE IF STRESS IS FACTOR.

EXPERTS SAY A GOOD WAY FOR PARENTS TO TAP INTO THEIR CHILD'S BEHAVIORS IS COMMUNICATING WITH EACH OTHER, TEACHERS AND COACHES.

LISTEN TO YOUR CHILD. KIDS MAY OFTEN EXPRESS HOW OVERWHELMED THEY ARE WITH WORDS LIKE, "ANGRY" OR "ANNOYED" OR SPEAK NEGATIVELY ABOUT THEMSELVES. PARENTS SHOULD KEEP AN EAR OUT FOR KEY WORDS OR PHRASES THAT MAY INDICATE A SOURCE OF STRESS.

SEEK SUPPORT. PARENTS SHOULD KNOW THAT TACKLING THE STRESS IN THEIR CHILD'S LIFE IS NOT SOMETHING THEY HAVE TO DO ALONE. LICENSED THERAPISTS CAN PROVIDE THE SUPPORT AND GUIDANCE THEIR CHILD NEEDS.

Annie Campbell Washington, Oakland Vice Mayor: "I am thrilled to be here today to celebrate our first step."

THIS BIG ANNOUNCEMENT COMING TODAY FROM OAKLAND'S VICE MAYOR AND SUPPORTED BY SEVERAL OTHER COUNCIL MEMBERS. AT ISSUE, THEY SAY - THE HEALTH OF CHILDREN AND THEIR PARENTS AS WELL AS OTHER RESIDENTS.

Rebecca Kaplan, City Council member: "We have got a crisis in this community of obesity, diabetes and dental problems."

Dr. Tom Sugarman, Alameda County Medical Association: "Surprising enough, there's a huge number of patients who don't have access to adequate dental care who have bad teeth due to sugary beverages."

THE PROPOSED TAX CALLED THE SUGAR SWEETENED BEVERAGE DISTRIBUTORS TAX WITHIN THE CITY OF OAKLAND WOULD CALL FOR A 1 CENT TAX PER OUNCE AND WOULD BE TACKED ON TO ALL COMPANIES THAT SELL SWEETENED DRINKS TO BUSINESSES IN OAKLAND. THIS BUSINESS OWNER IS NOT AT ALL PLEASED ABOUT THE PROPOSAL.

Allen Michaan, small business operator: "This hits low income people the most and makes it difficult for businesses like the Grand Lake Theater which I operate to keep prices low. It forces us to pass along the price increase."

AT CROCKER HIGHLANDS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN OAKLAND TODAY THERE WAS THE BOARD SUPPORT.

Krista VonGlohn, parent: "I think response is probably going to be neighborhood by neighborhood. I think parents who really look into nutrition for their kids and buy organic would probably be more likely to support it. And people who are just looking for the cheapest thing on the aisle, maybe not."

CITY OFFICIALS SAY RESEARCH SHOWS REVENUE COULD GENERATE FROM 6 TO 12 MILLION ANNUALLY AND COULD BE USED TO SUPPORT HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMS. THE CITY OF

BERKELEY PASSED A SIMILAR TAX AND OFFICIALS THERE SAY IT HAS WORKED WELL BY REDUCING THE SALE OF SUGARY DRINKS.

RICHMOND AND SAN FRANCISCO VOTERS REJECTED A SUGAR DRINK TAX IN RECENT YEARS, BUT OAKLAND IS FEELING CONFIDENT ABOUT THEIR MEASURE.

Washington: "San Francisco ran a different tax. They were trying to do two cents and they were trying to do a two thirds ballot measure. We are not doing that. We are doing the exact same tax that Berkeley did. One cent per ounce and a simple majority vote."

EVIE IS AN ADVANCED PIECE OF MACHINERY EQUIPPED WITH THOUSANDS OF SENSORS, VIDEO CAMERAS IN HER EYES, AND 32 GIGABYTES OF MEMORY, ALL WRAPPED UP IN FURRY, CUDDLY, BLISS.

U.S. HEALTH OFFICIALS ARE CONFIRMING TONIGHT WHAT MANY HAVE FEARED... THAT THE ZIKA VIRUS DOES INDEED CAUSE BIRTH DEFECTS IN BABIES. (DOUBLE BOX) KRON 4'S DAN KERMAN IS LIVE IN THE NEWSROOM WITH MORE TONIGHT.

THE LINK BETWEEN PREGNANT WOMEN WITH ZIKA INFECTIONS AND NEWBORNS WITH BIRTH DEFECTS WAS FIRT MADE LAST YEAR BY DOCTORS IN BRAZIL. BUT NOW DOCTORES IN THE U.S. SAY THERE'S NO DOUBT ZIKA CAUSE MICROENCEPHALY AND OTHER SERIOUS DEFECTS.

Dr. Ann Schuchat, Centers for Disease Control: "I don't expect there to be large outbreaks in the continental U.S. I can't give a number to how many cases, but I can't assume we won't have a big problem. We know with other viruses we have had bigger problems than we expected, so we are taking this very seriously."

PRESIDENT OBAMA HAS SOUGHT 1.9 BILLION DOLLARS IN EMERGENCY MONEY TO FIGHT THE EPIDEMIC INTERNATIONALLY AND TO PREPARE IN CASE THE VIRUS COMES TO THE U.S. BUT THE REQUEST HAS STALLED IN THE GOP-CONTROLLED CONGRES. THE ADMINISTRATION HAS SAID THEY WOULD USE 589 MILLION DOLLARS IN FUNDS LEFT OVER FROM THE EBOLA OUTBREAK.

PARENTS - LET YOUR TEENS SLEEP IN. IT COULD SAVE LIVES!

WHEN TEENAGERS GET LESS THAN SEVEN HOURS OF SLEEP, A NEW STUDY SAYS, IT'S NOT ONLY DANGEROUS, BUT COULD BE DEADLY.

THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL SAYS TEEN WHO DON'T GET ENOUGH SLEEP TEND ENGAGE IN RISKY BEHAVIOR, LIKE TEXTING AND DRIVING OR DRINKING AND DRIVING, IF THEY DON'T GET NINE HOURS OF SHUT EYE.

OTHER CONCERNS FOR SLEEPY TEENS INCLUDE OBESITY, DEPRESSION AND ACCIDENTS. IN THE PAST THE C-D-C FOUND INSUFFICIENT SLEEP WAS ASSOCIATED WITH ALCOHOL AND MARIJUANA USE, SEXUAL ACTIVITY, AND SUICIDAL THOUGHTS.

IN 2014, DOCTORS RECOMMENDED SCHOOLS BEGIN CLASSES AT 8:30 OR EVEN LATER TO MAKE UP FOR HOURS TEENS MISS IN THE BED. STILL, MOST SCHOOLS ACROSS THE COUNTRY DO NOT ADHERE TO THE RECOMMENDATION.

4/19/16 KRN 4 evening News Wet winter increases West Nile worries

CONTRA COSTA COUNTY VECTOR CONTROL SAYS ITS CREWS ARE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR WEST NILE VIRUS. TODAY, SOUTHERN CALIFRONIA OFFICIALS REPORTED THE VIRUS HAD BEEN FOUND IN MOSQUITO TRAPS. AND AS KRON-4'S CHARLES CLIFFORD REPORTS, VECTOR CONTROL AGENCIES ARE CONCERNED THAT AFTER A RAINY WINTER THIS COULD BE A VERY ACTIVE YEAR FOR THE VIRUS.

WEST NILE VIRUS IS ENDEMIC TO CALIFORNIA AND THE BAY AREA. THAT MEANS IT'S HERE TO STAY. NEW CASES ARE FOUND EVERY YEAR. IN 2015, 783 PEOPLE WERE DIAGNOSED WITH THE DISEASE STATEWIDE. FIFTY-THREE OF THOSES CASES WERE FATAL.

WHILE NO HUMAN INFECTIONS HAVE BEEN FOUND SO FAR THIS YEAR, VECTOR CONTROL AGENCIES ACROSS THE BAY AREA ARE KEEPING AN EYE OUT. AFTER FOUR YEARS OF DROUGHT, CALIFORNIA HAS FINALLY HAD A SOMEWHAT WET WINTER. THAT MEANS THERE'S PROBABLY MORE STANDING WATER ON THE GROUND, THE KIND OF PLACES WHERE MOSQUITOES LIKE TO BREED.

Deborah Bass, Contra Costa County Vector Control: "Right now in Contra Costa County, we don't have any West Nile activity that we have found."

DEBORAH BASS IS WITH CONTRA COSTA MOSQUITO & VECTOR CONTROL. SHE SAYS CREWS ARE CHECKING MOSQUITO TRAPS, TESTING DEAD BIRDS AND LOOKING FOR PROBLEMS.

Bass: "We are seeing mosquitoes at this time and we're also seeing other insects – midges, crane files, gnats."

BASS ALSO SAYS THERE ARE SOME SIMPLE THINGS PEOPLE CAN DO TO DRAMATICALLY REDUCE THEIR RISK OF CONTRACTING WEST NILE VIRUS.

Bass: "Make sure you're not breeding mosquitoes in your backyard. Dump out all standing water. Even water in a soda cap can produce hundreds of mosquitoes. Report dead birds to the dead bird hotline. Also, make sure you wear mosquito repellant when you're out so you don't get bitten."

IN ADDITION TO WEST NILE VIRUS, VECTOR CONTROLS ACROSS THE BAY AREA ARE ALSO ON THE LOOKOUT FOR ZIKA VIRUS. FORTUNATELY, THAT DISEASE IS TRANSMITTED BY TWO TYPES OF MOSQUITOES THAT ARE NOT FOUND IN THE BAY AREA.

Bass: "We are looking for them, but we haven't found any here."

BIG CHANGES ARE COMING TO CALIFORNIA'S HEALTH CARE SYSTEM. NEARLY 200 THOUSAND UNDOCUMENTED CHILDREN IN THE STATE CURRENTLY ARE NOT COVERED BY INSURANCE. BUT THAT WILL NO LONGER BE THE CASE NEXT MONTH.

REPORTER LEMOR ABRAMS SAYS SOME LAWMAKERS STILL AREN'T SATISFIED AND WANT TO EXPAND THE PROGRAM:

AN ESTIMATED 170,000 UNDOCUMENTED CHILDREN IN CALIFORNIA DON'T HAVE MEDICAL INSURANCE. BUT THAT'LL CHANGE, COME MAY 16TH. THAT'S WHEN MEDI-CAL, CALIFORNIA'S MEDICAID PROGRAM, WILL EXTEND COVERAGE TO CHILDREN 18 YEARS OLD AND YOUNGER.

Jose Hernandez, resident with no medical insurance: "Thank God that we have that."

JOSE HERNANDEZ WAS ABLE TO ENROLL HIS CHILDREN INTO MEDI-CAL, BECAUSE THEY WERE BORN HERE. IT SAVED HIS SON'S LIFE WHEN HE HAD HIS APPENDIX REMOVED.

Son: "Painful, but I'm happy I had the coverage."

BUT MANY FAMILIES AT THE CHURCH THEY ATTEND CAN'T SAY THE SAME. THE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT ALSO EXCLUDES UNDOCUMENTED CHILDREN AND ADULTS.

Sen. Ricardo Lara, (D) State Assembly: "We're California. Our job is to explore our values and to ensure no one is left behind."

SENATOR RICARDO LARA WASN'T DISCOURAGED THE FIRST TIME HIS "HEALTH FOR ALL" ACT FAILED. FOR HIM, GETTING THE LAW PASSED WAS PERSONAL.

Lara: ""Growing up in L.A. to two undocumented parents who lived over ten years as undocumented immigrants, I understand first-hand the plight that many of these undocumented families go through."

THE EXPANSION OF UNDOCUMENTED CHILDREN INTO MEDI-CAL IS PROJECTED TO COST 40 MILLION DOLLARS THIS FISCAL YEAR AND \$132 MILLION DOLLARS ANNUALLY. BUT LARA MAINTAINS ACCESS TO PREVENTATIVE CARE WILL SAVE CALIFORNIANS MORE MONEY IN THE LONG RUN.

Lara: "Even the most conservative numbers estimate that we currently spend 1.3 billion dollars annually in emergency room care, and we know it'll cost much less to be able to give people the access to see a doctor."

LARA WON'T STOP HERE. HE HOPES THE NEW LAW WILL EVENTUALLY LEAD TO COVERAGE FOR ADULT UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS IN CALIFORNIA.

HERNANDEZ IS WAITING FOR THAT DAY. HIS CHILDREN MAY HAVE INSURANCE, BUT HE'S STILL FIGHTING FOR HIS.

Hernandez: "No matter where you go you need to be covered with that, because, you know...it's your health."

WITH SUMMER FAST APPROACHING, THE WORLD'S HEALTH COMMUNITY IS ONCE AGAIN TURNING ITS ATTENTION TO A POTENTIAL CRISIS: THE ZIKA VIRUS.

CDC spokesperson: "Everything we know about this virus seems to be scarier than we originally thought."

FEDERAL HEALTH EXPERTS EXPECT THE VIRUS – WHICH CAN LEAD TO FEVER, RASH, AND BIRTH DEFECTS FOR WOMEN WHO ARE PREGNANT – TO BE A MAJOR PROBLEM THIS SUMMER.

TO FIGHT BACK, THE OBAMA ADMINISTRATION WANTS 1.9 BILLION DOLLARS IN EMERGENCY FEDERAL FUNDING, BUT GETTING THE CASH FROM CONGRESS CONTINUES TO HIT ROADBLOCKS.

Senator Mitch McConnell (R): "It's an important issue. We're in a discussion with them about how much do they really need."

SENATE REPUBLICANS SAY THEY NEED MORE TRANSPARENCY ABOUT WHERE THE MONEY WOULD END UP BEFORE HOLDING ANY VOTE. SOME HOUSE DEMOCRATS CONSIDER THE SLOWDOWN RIDICULOUS.

Representative Rosa DeLauro (D): "We have more information about this than we had about going to war in Iraq, where we couldn't find a weapon of mass destruction."

THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL SAYS SO FAR THERE ARE NO REPORTS OF MOSQUITOS IN THE UNITED STATES FOUND TO BE CARRYING THE VIRUS. DATA SHOWS THE HIGHEST RISK REMAINS IN COUNTRIES SOUTH OF THE U.S. BORDER. BUT WITH A POTENTIAL CRISIS LOOMING, SENATE LEADERS SAY THEY'RE MORE LIKELY THAN NOT TO FIND A SOLUTION.

McConnell: "We're working with them to figure out the right amount of money, how's it going to be spent, and I don't think it'll be the end to any opposition to what we think is going to be a fairly significant public health crisis."

SO FAR, THE SENATE HASN'T SET A DATE FOR A VOTE ON A ZIKA FUNDING BILL. HEALTH OFFICIALS CONTINUE TO SEE THE BIGGEST RISK COMING FROM TRAVELERS WHO VISIT COUNTRIES WHERE THERE'S A ZIKA OUTBREAK AND THEN BRINGING THE VIRUS BACK TO THE U.S. SOME PEOPLE CAN BE INFECTED AND NOT EVEN KNOW IT.

PAIN MEDICATIONS SUCH AS OXYCODONE, MORPHINE, AND HYDROCODONE ARE SOME OF THE MOST WIDELY PRESCRIBED DRUGS IN THE COUNTRY. OPIOIDS REDUCE PAIN BY SWITCHING OFF PAIN RECEPTORS IN THE BRAIN. HEROIN, MEANWHILE, IS AN ILLEGAL OPIOID DERIVED FROM THE SAME POPPY PLANT AS GOVERNMENT-APPROVED MEDICATIONS. HEROIN ABUSE HAS SKYROCKETED AS WELL, PARTLY BECAUSE OF GREATER STREET AVAILABLITY.

Dr. Manejwala: "Even when you look at people who are using heroin, the vast majority of them now started with pain pills."

IT'S A DANGEROUS CRISIS THAT MANEJWALA SAYS IS CURRENTLY SENDING SEVEN THOUSAND PEOPLE A DAY TO THE EMERGENCY ROOM.

AS THE INDUSTRY CONTINUES TO GROW, THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAS MOVED TO REGULATE E-CIGARETTES, MUCH LIKE TRADITIONAL CIGARETTES.

Sylvia M. Burwell, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Secretary: "We cannot let the enormous progress that we have made toward a tobacco-free generation be undermined by products that impact our health and economy in this way."

SINCE E-CIGARETTES DON'T ACTUALLY CONTAIN TOBACCO, THEY DIDN'T FALL UNDER PREVIOUS REGULATION. THE DEVICES TURN NICOTINE INTO A VAPOR, HENCE, "VAPING." VAPING HAS NOW TURNED INTO A MULTIBILLION-DOLLAR BUSINESS, LEADING PUBLIC HEALTH ADVOCATES TO CLAMOR FOR OVERSIGHT IN PART BECAUSE IT'S NOT CLEAR IF VAPING INTRODUCES HEALTH ISSUES OF ITS OWN.

THE RULES ANNOUNCED THURSDAY WILL BAN THE SALE OF E-CIGARETTES TO MINORS BEGINNING IN AUGUST. THEY WILL ALSO REQUIRE NEW HEALTH WARNINGS AND ANY PRODUCTS THAT HIT THE MARKET AFTER FEBRUARY 2017, WILL HAVE TO SUBMIT TO A FEDERAL REVIEW.

THIS ALSO EXTENDS TO CIGARS, AND HOOKAH AND PIPE TOBACCO, AMONG OTHER PRODUCTS.

Dr. Robert Califf, FDA Commissioner: "The rule will also allow the FDA to evaluate the ingredients of these additional tobacco products, how the products are made and their potential impact on public health."

THIS COMES THE DAY AFTER ANTI-SMOKING ADVOCATES CLAIMED A VICTORY IN CALIFORNIA WHERE GOVERNOR JERRY BROWN SIGNED A SERIES OF BILLS THAT INCLUDED RAISING THE SMOKING AGE TO 21.

THE VAPING INDUSTRY POINTS TO THOSE WHO USE E-CIGS AS A MEANS OF SMOKING CESSATION. IN A STATEMENT, AN INDUSTRY GROUP -- THE VAPOR TECHNOLOGY ASSOCIATION -- CITED THE POTENTIAL BURDEN OF NEW RULES, SAYING, "TODAY'S ACTION WILL YANK RESPONSIBLY MANUFACTURED VAPOR PRODUCTS FROM THE HANDS OF ADULT SMOKERS AND REPLACE THEM WITH THE TOBACCO CIGARETTES THEY HAD BEEN TRYING TO GIVE UP."

RESEARCHERS TOOK A LOOK AT 25 INACTIVE MEN AND ASSIGNED THEM INTENSE OR MODERATE WORKOUTS THREE TIMES A WEEK FOR ABOUT THREE MONTHS. A PORTION OF THE MEN WERE IN A CONTROL GROUP THAT DID NO EXERCISE. A SPOKESPERSON FOR THE STUDY SAYS SHORT INTENSE WORKOUTS DON'T EVEN HAVE TO BE IN A GYM. CLIMBING A FEW FLIGHTS OF STAIRS ON YOUR LUNCH HOUR CAN ALSO BRING SIGNIFICANT HEALTH BENEFITS.

THE REPORT CONDUCTED BY A BAYLOR UNIVERSITY EPIDIMIOLOGY PROFESSOR IN CONJUCTION WITH GALLUP FOUND THAT 80 PERCENT OF PEOPLE SURVEYED HAVE PRAYED FOR THEIR OWN HEALING. THAT NUMBER GOES UP TO 90 PERCENT WHEN THOSE IN THE STUDY WERE ASKED IF THEY HAD PRAYED FOR OTHERS' HEALTH.

THE SURVEY WAS CONDUCTED BY TALKING TO 17-HUNDRED PEOPLE OVER THE PHONE AND HAS A MARGIN OF ERROR OF PLUS OR MINUS FOUR PERCENTAGE POINTS. IT ALSO FOUND MOST WHO DO USE PRAYER FOR HEALING DO SO IN CONJUNCTION WITH REGULAR MEDICAL CARE.

THE REPORT'S AUTHOR SAID HE EXPECTED THE NUMBERS TO BE STRONG -- BUT SAID THE FINAL RESULTS QUOTE "BLEW ME AWAY". HOWEVER HE SAYS THIS STUDY IS JUST THE BEGINNING AND MORE QUESTIONS NEED TO BE ASKED. HE HOPES FURTHER RESEARCH CAN BE DONE TO LOOK MORE INTO WHETHER PRAYER IS ACTUALLY HELPING PEOPLE HEAL.

IT MEANS AN ASTONISHING NUMBER OF AMERICANS ARE WALKING AROUND UNAWARE THAT THEY'VE HAD ONE OR MORE HEART ATTACKS. ONE ESTIMATE SAYS THAT EVERY 43 SECONDS AN AMERICAN HAS A HEART ATTACK.

THIS STUDY TRACKED MORE THAN 9 THOUSAND MEN AND WOMEN FROM 1987 TO 2013. THREE HUNDRED EIGHTY SIX WERE REPORTED TO HAVE HAD A HEART ATTACK.

BUT ANOTHER 317 TURNED OUT TO HAVE HAD A 'SILENT' HEART ATTACK, AND UNTIL THEIR MEDICAL RECORDS WERE CHECKED THEY HAD FAILED TO RECOGNIZE SOME OF THE MAJOR SYMPTOMS.

MEN HAVE MORE SILENT HEART ATTACKS, BUT WOMEN ARE MORE LIKELY TO DIE FROM THEM. SIGNS CAN INCLUDE UNEXPLAINED FATIGUE AND DISCOMFORT IN THE JAW, UPPER BACK OR ARMS. PAIN CAN EVEN BE MISTAKEN FOR INDIGESTION. SILENT HEART ATTACKS CAN BE DETECTED BY AN EKG.

UNLESS THE DECISION IS SUCCESSFULLY APPEALED IN A HIGHER COURT, THE LAW CAN GO INTO EFFECT AS EARLY AS JULY 25TH.

BASICALLY, THE 400 PAGE REPORT FINDS NO DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE CHEMICAL COMPOSITION OF GENETICALLY ENGINEERED FOODS CURRENTLY ON THE MARKET AND CONVENTIONAL FOODS, AND SAYS THERE IS NOT A HIGHER RISK TO HUMAN HEALTH. IN OTHER WORDS, IN THEIR VIEW, MESSING WITH MOTHER NATURE HASN'T PRODUCED FOOD THAT MAKES US HUMAN MUTANTS.

AS YOU CAN IMAGINE, THIS IS A CONTROVERSIAL STUDY AND SOCIAL MEDIA IS EATING IT UP. SO, WE HAVEN'T HEARD THE LAST OF IT.

DOCTORS HAVE BEEN WARNING US ABOUT THE EFFECTS OF THE SUN AND TELL US TO ALWAYS USE SUNSCREEN. BUT WORD TONIGHT, BARELY HALF OF THE SUNSCREENS ON THE MARKET EVEN WORK. KRON 4'S VICKI LIVIAKIS IS HERE TO TELL US ABOUT THE DISTURBING NEW STUDY:

IT'S PRETTY UN-NERVING. YOU SLATHER UP YOURSELF WITH SPF 30 THINKING YOU'RE PROTECTED FROM HARMFUL RAYS AND SKIN CANCER, BUT CONSUMER REPORTS SAYS NEARLY HALF OF THE SUNSCREEN BRANDS IT TESTED DIDN'T LIVE UP TO THE LABEL. BEFORE YOU BREAK OUT THE BOTTLE FOR YOUR NEXT TRIP TO THE BEACH, TAKE HEED.

CONSUMER REPORTS TESTED 65 LOTIONS, SPRAYS, AND STICKS MARKED WITH SPF 30 OR HIGHER AND CLAIMS 43% TESTED BELOW THE ADVERTISED SPF LEVEL. FOR INSTANCE, BANANA BOAT KIDS TEAR-FREE LOTION AND CVS KIDS SUN LOTION WERE BOTH LABELED AS SPF 50 BUT WERE FOUND TO HAVE ONLY SPF 8. CONSUMER REPORTS SAYS CHEMICAL-BASED SUNSCREENS PERFORMED BETTER THAN MINERAL-BASED ONES.

THE RECOMMENDATION IN GENERAL IS TO GO FOR A HIGHER NUMBER LIKE SAY 50 SPF TO BE ON THE SAFE SIDE. ALSO APPLY LOTION EVERY TWO HOURS AND MORE IF YOU'RE IN THE WATER OR SWEAT A LOT.

OF COURSE, COMMON SENSE SAYS MAYBE WEAR A HAT AND STAY IN THE SHADE WHEN YOU CAN.

WITH ALMOST 150 THOUSAND MELANOMA CASES IN THE U.S. EXPECTED THIS YEAR, SOME EXPERTS ARE OUTRAGED THAT THE FDA HAS DELAYED THE APPROVAL OF SEVERAL POTENTIALLY LIFE-SAVING SUNSCREEN INGREDIENTS. KRON 4'S NATIONAL CORRESPONDENT CHANCE SEALES EXPLAINS:

IN JANUARY 2011 CASSIE BISILLE FOUND A LUMP. DAYS LATER DOCTORS TOOK A BIOPSY AND THEN IT WASN'T LONG...

Bisille: "Ten minutes later he came back in the room, flung the door open and said oh my gosh you need surgery right away. Pretty sure you have breast cancer,"

BUT IT WAS MELANOMA, THE DEADLIEST FORM OF SKIN CANCER. WITHIN DAYS, CASSIE HAD HER LYMPH NODES REMOVED AND BEGAN TREATMENT.

Senator Isaacson: "Most people don't think about a mole or a skin cancer as being a dangerous cancer. But melanoma is the most deadly cancer there is.

SENATOR JOHNNY ISAACSON OF GEORGIA IS A TWO-TIME MELANOMA SURVIVOR HIMSELF AND SAYS IT'S UNACCEPTABLE THAT POTENTIALLY LIFE-SAVING ADDITIVES EXIST BUT ARE BANNED FORM AMERICAN SHELVES.

Senator Isaacson: "There are sunscreen ingredients that are being actively used in Europe today that have been withheld from American sunscreen products for twelve years pending approval by the FDA."

A TOTAL OF EIGHT OF THESE CRITICAL INGREDIENTS ARE AWAITING APPROVAL HERE IN THE U.S., SOME FOR FOURTEEN YEARS. LIKE AT V3 SIGMA IN GEORGETOWN, SOUTH CAROLINA. THE OWNER SAYS HE CAN'T SELL HIS PRODUCT UVASORB HERE IN THE U.S., BUT GET THIS – HE SHIPS TRUCKLOADS OF THE PRODUCT EVERY DAY TO EUROPE WHERE IT'S BEEN SELLING FOR TWENTY YEARS. ISACCSON WANTS THE FDA TO CUT THE RED TAPE.

Isaacson: "The death from melanoma is just as bad as death from a heart attack or other cancers or ALS.

THE FDA DECLINED TO RESPOND ON CAMERA, BUT SAID PART:

FDA statement: "The FDA must balance the public health benefits of access to a broader range of sunscreen active ingredients against the importance of providing an adequate margin of safety."

IF COMPANIES EVER WANT TO GET THOSE PRODUCTS ON STORE SHELVES, THE FDA-MANDATED TESTS COULD RUN NORTH OF TEN MILLION DOLLARS. STILL, SENATOR ISAACSON AND CASSIE REMAIN HOPEFUL.

Bisille: "We need to bring them here, to help our chances, to better our chances of survival."

HADID WAS IN THE SOUTH BAY FOR AN EVENT CALLED STAND4LYME TO SUPPORT STANFORD RESEARCH ON THE MYSTERIOUS DISEASE CAUSED BY TICKS.

Dr. Laura Roberts, Stanford Lyme working group: "It is a medical mystery. We don't have the solutions yet, but we've got pieces coming together."

SYMPTOMS INCLUDE FEVER, FAITIGUE, JOINT PAIN. RIGHT NOW THERE'S NO REAL CURE, ONLY EARLY DETECTION AND PREVENTION.

Reporter: "How did you get it?"

Kyla Cagan, Lyme sufferer: "I love catching lizards and they carry a lot of ticks. They must have gotten onto me, but I didn't notice it."

SOME TIPS TO AVOID TICKS...

Kandace Cota, Project Lyme: "You don't want them to get on your skin. Wear light-colored clothing and do frequent tick checks."

IF YOU DO SUSPECT YOU'VE BEEN BITTEN AND HAVE FLU-LIKE SYMPTOMS, CALL YOUR DOCTOR. ANTIBIOTICS ARE EFFECTIVE, BUT ONLY IN THE EARLY STAGES.

A NEW TEST IS BEING DEVELOPED, ONE THAT SHOWS THE PRESENCE OF LYME DISEASE IN URINE. IT'S ONLY IN THE EARLY STAGES THOUGH. INTERESTINGLY ENOUGH, IT WAS INVENTED BY A HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT.

THE CDC HAS COMPLETED ONE OF THE LARGEST AND BROADEST SURVEYS OF HEALTH IN THE UNITED STATES. WHILE SOME OF THE FINDINGS ARE ENCOURAGING, OTHER AREAS REMAIN PROBLEMATIC. REID BINION BREAKS DOWN THE RESULTS:

AMERICANS ARE FATTER THAN EVER. THAT'S ACCORDING TO A 2015 SURVEY COMPLETED BY THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION. IN 2015, 30.4% OF AMERICANS AGE TWENTY OR OLDER SAID THEY WERE OBESE. THAT'S UP FROM 29.9% THE YEAR BEFORE. WHILE THAT'S NOT SIGNIFICANTLY HIGHER, IT REPRESENTS A TROUBLING TREND THAT HAS GROWN STEADILY SINCE AT LEAST 1997 WHEN RESEARCHERS BEGAN USING THE CURRENT SURVEY.

OBESITY RATES WERE HIGHEST AMONG THE MIDDLE-AGED AND AFRICAN AMERICANS. THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE WHO SAY THEY HAVE DIABETES ALSO CONTINUES TO RISE.

IT'S NOT ALL BAD NEWS, THOUGH. ABOUT HALF OF ADULTS SAY THEY ARE GETTING THE RECOMMENDED AMOUNT OF EXERCISE. THAT NUMBER HASN'T CHANGED MUCH SINCE 2009. MORE AMERICANS ARE REPORTING THEY HAVE HEALTH INSURANCE AND ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE AND FEWER SAY THEY REGULARLY SMOKE CIGARETS.

WHEN IT COMES TO STROKES, A NEW STUDY SAYS THERE'S GOOD NEWS AND BAD NEWS. ACCORDING TO UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA RESEARCHERS, BETWEEN 2000 AND 2010 THE NUMBER OF STROKES DECLINED OVERALL AMONG AMERICANS. THAT INCLUDES A 50 PERCENT DROP AMONG PEOPLE 65 AND OLDER.

HOWEVER, THE SAME STUDY SAYS STROKES INCREASED 49 PERCENT AMONG 25 TO 64 YEAR OLDS. RESEARCHERS ALSO FOUND HOSPITALIZATIONS INCREASED 14 PERCENT AMONG AFRICAN-AMERICANS.

ONE NEUROLOGIST SAYS THAT FIGURE IS PROOF MANY AFRICAN-AMERICANS AREN'T GETTING THE ACCESS TO MEDICAL CARE THEY NEED. EXPERTS DIDN'T HAVE A CLEAR ANSWER ON WHY STROKES ARE UP AMONG YOUNGER PEOPLE, BUT SAY BETTER AWARENESS OF SYMPTOMS IS THE MOST LIKELY REASON. DOCTORS MEANWHILE SAY THEY CAN'T STRESS ENOUGH THAT A HEALTHY LIFESTYLE IS KEY TO AVOIDING STROKES. INCLUDED IN THAT IS BEING ACTIVE, NOT SMOKING AND MONITORING CHOLESTEROL AND BLOOD PRESSURE LEVELS.

THE CDC HAS A NEW REPORT ON THE ZIKA VIRUS IN THE U.S, LINKING IT TO BIRTH DEFECTS. CATHERINE HEENAN IS HERE WITH THE TROUBLING DETAILS:

THE LATEST – ZIKA HAS BEEN TIED TO BIRTH DEFECTS IN THE BABIES AND FETUSES OF SIX WOMEN IN THE U.S. THREE OF THE WOMEN HAD BABIES BORN WITH BIRTH DEFECTS, INCLUDING BRAIN DAMAGE. THREE OTHERS LOS' BABIES WITH BIRTH DEFECTS, EITHER THROUGH MISCARRIAGE OR STILL BIRTH.

THE INFECTIONS WERE ALL TRAVEL RELATED AND AT LEAST TWO OF THE WOMEN WERE INFECTED THROUGH SEXUAL CONTACT.

AS OF JUNE 9<sup>TH</sup>, A TOTAL OF 234 PREGNANT WOMEN HAD TESTED POSITIVE FOR THE ZIKA INFECTION IN THE U.S. MORE THAN HALF THE PREGNANCIES ARE STILL UNDERWAY, MEANING THE NUMBER OF ZIKA-RELATED BIRTH DEFECTS HERE COULD SOON GO HIGHER.

DOES THIS LOOK FAMILIAR? IT'S SOMETHING PARENTS SEE A LOT THESE DAYS – THEIR KIDS HUNCHED OVER, WITH THEIR FACES GLUED TO A SCREEN. OUR TECH REPORTER GABE SLATE MET WITH CHIROPRACTORS WHO ARE WARNING PARENTS ABOUT THE DANGER OF KIDS OVER-USING GADGETS. A NEW CONDITION IS ON THE RISE CALLED "TEXT NECK":

Dr, Ken Thomas, chiropractor: "Text Neck is a repetitious, over-use syndrome with the person in this hunched position more than they should be. In fact we should almost never be in this position."

WELL, THAT'S NOT GOOD. JUST LOOK AROUND. EVERYONE IS ALMOST ALWAYS LOOKING DOWN AT THEIR DEVICES, ESPECIALLY THE YOUNG CROWD. UNFORTUNATELY, THIS IS NOT THE BEST POSITION FOR THE HUMAN SPINE.

Dr. Thomas, demonstrating with a model spine: "So, this should be curved this way. But if someone's looking down at their phone, going way in the opposite direction, they're actually pulling their spinal cord longer and stressing out the muscles, the tendons and the ligaments of the neck. Because as you go forward, the head is actually heavier on the neck so the muscles of the neck have to work much, much

harder. Some early studies are showing that prolonged posture in this way is actually leading to early spinal arthritis and that's really alarming. It's something that doesn't usually show up until the thirties or forties."

DR. THOMAS RUNS A CHIROPRACTIC PRACTICE IN THE BAY AREA AND IS A DIPLOMATE OF THE AMERICAN CHIROPRACTIC ASSOCIATION'S BOARD OF NEUROLOGY. HE SAYS TEN YEARS AGO HE TREATED VERY FEW KIDS AND TEENAGERS. NOW, DAILY HE'S SEEING YOUNGER PATIENTS IN PAIN FROM OVER-USING GADGETS.

Dr. Thomas: "In the old days we might take a test, or eat, or maybe driving a little bit and that was it. But now the focus is down all the time. So they're bending their necks the wrong direction."

BESIDES THE OBVIOUS – CUTTING DOWN ON USING DEVICES – DR. THOMAS SAYS THERE IS A GREAT SIMPLE STRETCH TO HAVE YOUR KIDS DO THROUGHOUT THE DAY AND KEEP THEM FROM HAVING TO SEE HIM.

Dr. Thomas, demonstrating the exercise, "Just interlock your fingers behind your back, squeeze your shoulder blades together and look up at the ceiling and sort of squeeze and pump. This position is the opposite of text neck and that will really be reliving for people who are working at desks of for your kids."

4/6/16 KRON 4 Evening News 2 stories on Oakland's 90 day rent freeze

BECAUSE OF SCARCE AND HIGH-PRICED HOUSING, RENTAL PRICES IN OAKLAND ARE FROZEN, AT LEAST FOR NOW. THE CITY COUNCIL APPROVED A 90-DAY MORATORIUM, ALLOWING CITY LEADERS TIME TO COME UP WITH A SOLUTION TO WHAT THEY SAY IS A GROWING CRISIS. BUT AS KRON 4'S HAAZIQ MADYUN DISCOVERED TODAY, EVEN NEW UNITS THAT ARE BEING BUILT RIGHT NOW MAY BE OUT OF REACH FOR MANY OAKLAND RESIDENTS:

Noel Gallo, Oakland City Councilmember: "You look at that property right there, Brooklyn Basin, 3400 units and 3100 of those units are going to be market rate. You're going to have to make 100 to 120 thousand dollars to live there."

THAT IS A BIT OUT OF THE PRICE RANGE FOR THE INCOME OF THE AVERAGE OAKLAND RESIDENT, SAYS OAKLAND CITY COUNCILMEMBER NOEL GALLO. HE IS GIVING ME A TOUR OF CURRENT AND NEW HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS THAT HE SAYS ARE NOT GOING TO ADDRESS OAKLAND'S HOUSING AFFORDABILITY CRISIS. WE ARE NOW IN HIS DISTRICT.

Gallo: "This community, they call it Jingle Town, but it's known as the Kennedy Track area. You see what they call the Phoenix Commons, that senior housing that just got built. Brand new, it hasn't opened yet, beautiful development. These here are condominiums. Affordable? I don't think so."

IN HIS DISTRICT ALONE, THERE ARE OVER 6000 NEW UNITS BEING DEVELOPED, BUT THE RENTS WILL BE HIGH. HE SAYS SOME OF THE PEOPLE WHO ALREADY LIVE IN THE AREA ARE FEELING THE PINCH FROM THE NEW HOUSING OPTIONS GOING UP ALL AROUND THEM.

Gallo: "I've gotten some complaints by some of the artists that have moved in here. They're concerned. They're being displaced because landlords are raising the rents."

HOWEVER, OVER THE NEXT 90 DAYS, THERE WILL BE A FREEZE ON RENT HIKES THANKS TO GALLO AND HIS CITY COUNCIL COLLEAGUES WHO APPROVED A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM, GIVING CITY LEADERS A CHANCE TO TRY TO FIND A SOLUTION. OAKLAND MAYOR LIBBY SCHAAF EXPLAINS THE 90 DAY PLAN:

Mayor Libby Schaaf: "We've got to do two things. We've got to protect the people who live here now and make sure they are not displaced from Oakland. Secondly, we have got to build more housing in this city."

BUT THE ULTIMATE GOAL IS FOR THAT NEW HOUSING TO BE AFFORDABLE FOR LONG- TIME OAKLAND RESIDENTS.

# BACK TO BACK RENTAL INCREASES IN THE SAME YEAR?

Victoria Herrera, Oakland Resident: "

IT IS STORIES LIKE VICTORIA HERRERA'S THAT PROMPTED OAKLAND CITY COUNCIL TO PLACE A 90-DAY MORATORIUM ON RENT INCREASES. THE 26 YEAR-OLD WORKS AS AN AIDE IN THE CITY COUNCIL OFFICE AND LIVES IN THE CITY'S FRUITALE DISTRICT.

Herrera: "There were two rent increases of \$200 dollars each. Yes and they were unforeseen. Unfortunately, I did not know at that time that I could challenge them and I went from paying \$1,200 a month to \$1,650 per month."

Oakland Mayor Libby Schaaf: "There is a lot of focus right now on improving renter protection and that is part of what we need to do."

OAKLAND MAYOR LIBBY SCHAAF SAYS OVER THE NEXT 90 DAYS THERE WILL BE A LOT OF WORK DONE TRYING TO SOLVE THE CITY'S HOUSING CRISIS.

Schaaf: "We're also going to be looking for existing buildings that we can buy, fix up, and put affordability protections on them to benefit the people who are already living there."

HERRERA SAYS THOSE PROTECTIONS ARE SORELY NEEDED

Herrera: "We actually get on a weekly basis anywhere from 10 to 20 complaints from renters that are going through the same situation."

SOME HOUSING ADVOCATES WANT THE CITY TO IMPOSE RENT CONTROL ON THE HOUSING MARKET, BUT MAYOR SCHAAF SAYS THAT IS UP TO THE VOTERS.

Schaaf: "No-cause evictions was enacted by Oakland voters, so the City Council cannot do a moratorium or in any way change eviction laws."

IN ORDER FOR THAT TO HAPPEN, NO-CAUSE EVICTIONS WOULD HAVE TO BE PLACED ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT. HERRERA SAYS SHE FAVORS THE IDEA

Herrera: "I hear as I walk through our community, through District 5, my landlord is trying to evict me. It is a real reality for a lot of people"

IN OAKLAND HAAZIQ MADYUN KRON4NEWS

ANCHOR: EARLIER THIS WEEK SAN MATEO OPTED NOT TO PUT A RENT FREEZE IN PLACE. HOWEVER, THAT DOES NOT MEAN THE ISSUE IS DEAD, AND IN FACT IT COULD BE PUT TO A VOTE. A COALITION IS NOW WORKING TO GATHER ENOUGH SIGNATURES TO PLACE A RENT CONTROL MEASURE ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT. IT WOULD CAP RENT INCREASES, PREVENT TENANTS FROM BEING EVICTED WITHOUT JUST CAUSE AND CREATE AN ANNUAL RENTAL HOUSING FEE. THE GROUP HAS JUST A FEW MONTHS TO GATHER THE SIGNATURES IT NEEDS TO QUALIFY FOR THE NOVEMBER ELECTION.

4/11/16 KRON 4 News at 11pm San Mateo emergency housing ordinance falters

THE RISING COST OF LIVING IN SAN MATEO IS LEADING TO MORE AND MORE TENANTS LOSING THEIR HOMES SIMPLY BECAUSE THEY SIMPLY CANNOT AFFORD THEIR RENT. NOW THE CITY IS PROPOSING AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE, THAT REQUIRES LANDLORDS TO PAY TENANTS RELOCATION ASSISTANCE WHEN THERE ARE 'NO CAUSE' EVICTIONS. KRON 4'S ALECIA REID ATTENDED TONIGHT'S CITY COUNCIL MEETING, ALONG WITH SOME VERY UNHAPPY LANDLORDS:

Speaker: "I just don't see it as a solution. Please vote against it."

THAT WAS THE OVERALL CONCENSUS AT TONIGHT'S MEETING.

Speaker: "It's going to be a very big financial burden for people."

THE CITY COUNCIL CHAMBER WAS COMPLETELY PACKED, WITH PEOPLE STANDING OUTSIDE IN THE OVERFLOW ROOM, AND IT WAS PRETTY EASY TO FIGURE OUT WHO THE MAJORITY WAS.

IT WAS MOSTLY LANDLORDS THAT WERE HERE FOR THIS SPECIAL MEETING, TO SAY "NO" TO AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE, THAT WOULD MAKE IT MANDATORY FOR THEM TO PAY RELOCATION EXPENSES FOR NO FAULT EVICTIONS. THAT COULD BE UP TO 6 MONTHS WORTH OF RENT. AT THE CURRENT RATE, THAT COULD BE UP TO 30 THOUSAND DOLLARS. SMALL LANDLORDS WOULD FEEL THE BRUNT OF IT.

Steve Blanton, San Mateo County Association of Realtors: "It's incredibly punitive to small landlords. No one disputes the fact that there is a housing shortage in the area and that renters in particular are feeling that very acutely right now. But there are other alternatives that can be pursued that address the problem without penalizing small landlords."

Landlord: "We've just got a little family unit and we're renting it out just to supplement our income. It would be a financial disaster for us to have to pay six months market rate rent and do any necessary repairs of whatever problems the renter has created."

RENT IN SAN MATEO COUNTY INCREASED DRAMATICALLY OVER THE LAST 8 YEARS, AND WITHIN THE LAST 4, THOSE NUMBERS HAVE SKYROCKETED.

County official: "Something has to be done. People are being displaced. I know some of them personally. And some of them have actually passed away through it."

THIS ORDINANCE HAS BEEN A CONVERSATION FOR MONTHS AT CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS. IT WOULDN'T APPLY TO EVERY APARTMENT. LANDLORDS CAN INCREASE RENT UP TO 10%, AND HAVE NO OBLIGATION TO PAY RELOCATION ASSISTANCE, AND IT DOES NOT APPLY TO GOVERNMENT-OWNED HOUSING OR RENT CONTROLLED APARTMENTS BUILT BEFORE 1994.

IN ORDER FOR THE ORDINANCE TO PASS, IT NEEDED 4 OUT OF 5 OF THE CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS TO VOTE YES, BUT WITH VIRTUALLY NO SUPPORT FOR THE ORDINANCE THE CITY COUNCIL DECIDED NOT TO VOTE ON IT AND DROPPED THE MATTER ALL TOGETHER. BUT, THEY ARE ENCOURAGING PEOPLE TO CONTINUE THE CONVERSATION ABOUT HOW TO GET AFFORDABLE HOUSING INTO THE COMMUNITY.

IN THE SOUTH BAY, A PLANNED REDEVELOPMENT OF AN APARTMENT COMPLEX IN WEST SAN JOSE IS NEARING THE FINAL STAGES OF BEING FULLY APPROVED, AND THAT WILL RESULT IN THE DISPLACEMENT OF ALL FAMILIES LIVING IN THE 216 UNITS AT THE RESERVE APARTMENTS. TODAY, KRON FOUR'S PHILIPPE DJEGAL WAS THERE AS THOSE TENANTS RALLIED FOR RELOCATION BENEFITS.

# ON THE STREETS, THEY CHANTED ...

Protesters: "Greystar lies; people move."

AND, IN TURN, DRIVERS PASSING ALONG SOUTH WINCHESTER BOULEVARD HONKED IN SUPPORT AS ABOUT TWO DOZEN TENANTS AT THE RESERVE APARTMENTS LINED UP OUTSIDE THEIR COMPLEX IN WEST SAN JOSE SATURDAY.

Tyrone Lockett: "My main concern is my sick wife."

THE GROUP WAVED SIGNS READING "DON'T MAKE ME A REFUGEE AGAIN" AND "STOP MASS DISPLACEMENT," JUST FIVE DAYS AFTER RECEIVING A LETTER FROM THE PROPERTY OWNER AND MANAGER, GREYSTAR, NOTIFYING TENANTS THAT THE PLANNED REDEVELOPMENT OF THIS PLACE IS NEARING FINAL APPROVAL, AND THAT DEMOLITION COULD START AS SOON AS NEXT MARCH. GREYSTAR SAYS TENANTS WILL RECEIVE AT LEAST 120 DAYS NOTICE, MEANING EVICTION NOTICES MAY BE POSTED ON DOORS AS EARLY AS NOVEMBER.

Lockett: "I'm out of luck."

FACED WITH THE PROSPECT OF AN EVICTION, THESE TENANTS SAY THEIR TIME IS RUNNING OUT.

Lockett: "I think that's not fair for a tenant that's been paying rent for over 12 years on time, or before, to deserve this treatment."

GREYSTAR WANTS TO TEAR THE CURRENT 216-UNIT PROPERTY DOWN AND REPLACE IT WITH 640 NEW MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL UNITS AND 8 THOUSAND SQUARE FEET OF COMMERCIAL SPACE. BUT TYRONE LOCKETT, WHO WORKS AS A SCHOOL CHEF, SAYS SINCE HIS WIFE HAD A STROKE FOUR YEARS AGO, THEY'VE RELIED ONLY ON HIS INCOME AND CAN'T AFFORD TO MOVE OUT OF WHAT ARE CURRENTLY RENT-CONTROLLED APARTMENTS.

Lockett: "And, it's already hard now when the rent is three times the amount that we can afford."

THOUGH A COUNCILMEMBER RECENTLY PROPOSED ONE, IN ADDITION TO SUGGESTED CHANGES TO THE CITY'S RENT CONTROL ORDINANCE, SAN JOSE DOESN'T HAVE A RELOCATION BENEFITS PROGRAM OR REQUIRE PROPERTY OWNERS TO PROVIDE ANY. IN THIS CASE GREYSTAR HAS OFFERED, BUT STILL, TENANTS LIKE BRANDIE LOCKE SAY THEY AREN'T GOING FAR ENOUGH.

Brandie Locke: "We don't believe they're fair."

GREYSTAR SAYS ALL TENANTS WILL RECEIVE A FULL REFUND OF THEIR SECURITY DEPOSITS, BUT OTHER THAN THAT, BASED ON INCOME, FAMILIES NEED TO QUALIFY TO RECEIVE THE OTHER BENEFITS, WHICH COULD MEAN UP TO SEVERAL THOUSAND DOLLARS. BUT LOCKE SAYS MOST TENANTS, INCLUDING HER AND HER FINACEE, WON'T QUALIFY. NOW, SHE SAYS THE ONLY HOPE IS THAT FINAL APPROVAL ON THE PLANNING DEVELOPMENT PERMIT SCHEDULED FOR THE END OF THIS MONTH IS DELAYED, SO TENANTS AND GREYSTAR CAN NEGOTIATE A BETTER DEAL.

Locke: "There's some people here that wondering, are we going to be able to live with a roof over our heads or we going to have to live down in the car?"

IN WHAT IS EXPECTED TO BE A MARATHON SESSION TONIGHT, THE SAN JOSE CITY COUNCIL IS EXPECTED TO TAKE ACTION TO TIGHTEN RENT CONTROL. WITH PASSIONS RUNNING HIGH ON BOTH SIDES OF THE ISSUE, KRON 4'S ROB FLADEBOE BRINGS US UP TO DATE ON THE STORY NOW LIVE FROM SAN JOSE CITY HALL:

RIGHT NOW, SAN JOSE'S CURRENT RENT CONTROL ORDINANCE ALLOWS PROPERTY OWNERS TO RAISE RENT A MAXIMUM OF EIGHT PERCENT PER YEAR. TONIGHT, THE CITY COUNCIL IS EXPECTED TO LOWER THAT CAP TO PERHAPS FIVE OR SIX PERCENT. THEY'RE ALSO BEING ASKED TO CONSIDER A NEW IDEA THAT WOULD TIE THOSE INCREASES TO INFLATION. BUT THE COUNCIL WON'T DO ANYTHING UNTIL THEY HEAR FROM HUNDREDS AND HUNDREDS OF RENTERS AND THEIR LANDLORDS.

A PACKED CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS ON TUESDAY IS SPLIT BETWEEN RENTERS WEARING TEE SHIRTS THAT READ 'SAN JOSE, WE BELONG' AND PROPERTY OWNERS WEARING BADGES THAT SAY 'AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROVIDER.' AT ISSUE, BY HOW MUCH SHOULD THE CURRENT 8 PERCENT ANNUAL INCREASE BE LOWERED FOR RENT CONTROLLED APARTMENTS.

Anthony King, Renters Rights Coalition: "We feel attaching the annual rent increase to CPI is a much fairer way for both landlords and tenants because when the economy is running high rents are high when the economy is running low rents are low."

Gina Marciano, property owner advocate: "An eight percent increase really isn't that bad. I think that we'd find if they did the research that probably most landlords don't raise rents on people until they move."

THE PROBLEM IS TOO MANY JOBS AND NOT ENOUGH RENTALS. WHAT'S MORE, ONLY ABOUT ONE THIRD OF THE CITY'S RENTAL UNITS, THOSE BUILT BEFORE 1979, ARE RENT CONTROLLED. INCREASINGLY, MORE AFFORDABLE APARTMENTS LIKE THOSE IN 'THE RESERVE,' ARE BEING REPLACED BY HIGH DENSITY, MARKET-RATE UNITS WHICH WILL NOT BE RENT CONTROLLED. MAYOR SAM LICCARDO...

Sam Licardo, San Jose mayor: "What is most important to recognize is that there is nothing about this law that we can enact that is really going to solve the problem for thousands of families who struggle every day against higher rents. The real solution is building more affordable housing and that's where we really need to focus most of our efforts."

THE CHALLENGE WILL BE FOR THE CITY TO STRIKE A BALANCE BETWEEN PROTECTION FOR RENTERS AND RULES THAT ARE ACCEPTABLE TO OWNERS AT THE SAME TIME.

THE COUNCIL IS ALSO EXPECTED TO CONSIDER A PROPOSAL THAT WILL REQUIRE RELOCATION HELP FOR THOSE RENTERS WHOSE RENT-CONTROLLED APARTMENTS ARE CLOSING. BUT WITH

SEVERAL HUNDRED PEOPLE HAVING FILLED OUT CARDS TO SPEAK, I DON'T EXPECT THE COUNCIL TO ACTUALLY VOTE ON ANY OF THIS UNTIL VERY LATE TONIGHT.

A REDWOOD CITY COUPLE HAD TO MOVE OUT OF THEIR HOME BECAUSE THE MOLD PROBLEM WAS CAUSING HEALTH PROBLEMS AND THEY SAY THE OWNER OF THE HOUSE IS NOT DOING ANYTHING ABOUT IT. KRON 4'S JEFF BUSH SHOWS YOU THE PROBLEM AND TRIED TO GET SOME ANSWERS FROM THE LANDLORD. IT'S A STORY YOU WILL ONLY SEE ON KRON 4.

RICKY MARTINEZ MOVED INTO THE YELLOW HOUSE AT 3328 BAY ROAD IN REDWOOD CITY WITH HIS PREGNANT WIFE AND YOUNG DAUGHTER BACK IN JANUARY. RICKY SAYS EVERYONE IN THE FAMILY STARTED FEELING SICK AFTER THE LAST BIG RAIN STORM.

Ricky Martinez: "My wife, my daughter and I all had what was almost like the common cold, but the symptoms kept persisting. None of us were getting any better."

RICKY SAYS THAT WAS BAD ENOUGH BUT HIS WIFE AND DAUGHTER STARTED HAVING ADDITIONAL HEALTH PROBLEMS.

Martinez: "Both her and my daughter, about ten weeks in, developed a rash over their entire bodies. It was severe enough that we decided to go and seek medical attention."

IT WAS DIAGNOSED AS A REACTION TO MOLD. RICKY STARTED PULLING FURNITURE AWAY AND DISCOVERED MOLD GROWNING ALONG THE BASE BOARDS IN THE HOUSE. IT WAS EVEN GROWING ON THE SOLES OF A PAIR OF SHOES THAT WERE SITTING IN THE CLOSET.

RICKY SAYS THE LANDLORD SENT A HANDY MAN WHO SAID THE PROBLEM WAS NOT THAT BAD, BUT RICKY HIRED AN INDEPENDENT EXPERT WHO SAYS THE HOUSE IS UNSAFE, ESPECIALLY FOR YOUNG CHILDREN AND PREGNANT WOMEN.

RICKY AND THE FAMILY HAVE BEEN IN A HOTEL FOR THE LAST THREE WEEKS. HE SAID THE LANLORD OFFERED TO RELEASE THEM FROM THEIR LEASE,, BUT WITHOUT REFUNDING THEIR DEPOSIT. RICKY SAYS HIS FAMILY IS NOT BEING TREATED FAIRLY.

Martinez: "Never once have we been offered help for us to move our stuff out of the house and have it professionally cleaned.

KRON 4 REACHED OUT TO THE OWNER OF THIS HOME TO GET SOME REACTION FOR THIS STORY BUT SO FAR THERE HAS BEEN NO RESPONSE.

WHEN THE DUST SETTLED, FOLLOWING A MARATHON SESSION LAST NIGHT, THE SAN JOSE CITY COUNCIL VOTED TO TIGHTEN SOME OF THE RULES GOVERNING RENT CONTROL. LANDLORDS SAY THE COUNCIL'S DECISION TO LOWER ANNUAL RENT INCREASES FROM 8 TO 5 PERCENT WILL MAKE IT HARDER FOR THEM TO MAKE A LIVING AND FORCE MANY TO SELL BUT AS KRON 4'S ROB FLADEBOE REPORTS NOW, MANY RENTERS ARE ALSO NOT HAPPY, SAYING THE REFORMS DID NOT GO FAR ENOUGH:

Robert Benscoter, evicted from apartment: "I love the area. I love the neighborhood. I love a lot of my neighbors.".

ROBERT BENSCOTER HAS LIVED HERE IN THIS WEST SIDE RENT-CONTROLLED APARTMENT FOR 27 YEARS, BUT NOW HE'S FACING EVICTION.

Benscoter: "The new owner of the building, who bought the place a few years ago, wants to get me out so he can renovate the place and then jack up the rent. I don't think it's fair to me or anybody else living in a rent-controlled situation that the owners have the ability to just do that without some sort of justifiable cause."

BENSCOTER WAS AMONG THE HUNDREDS OF RENTERS AND THEIR LANDLORDS WHO MADE THEIR RESPECTIVE CASES TO THE CITY COUNCIL ON TUESDAY. FOR BENSCOTER, A REDUCTION IN RENT IS TOO LITTLE TOO LATE.

Benscoter: "I would have liked to have seen t hem act now on the eviction without cause situation and on maybe equalizing the rent control so that the people who own buildings that are as old as mine are not the only ones shouldering the burden of not being able to raise their rents."

AS HE PACKED BOXES, BENSCOTER TOLD ME HIS RENT WAS WELL BELOW MARKET FOR MANY YEARS, BUT IT WENT UP BY 8 PERCENT IN EACH OF THE PAST FIVE YEARS AND NOW HE SIMPLY CAN'T AFFORD IT ANYMORE.

Benscoter: My previous owner didn't give me an increase for ten years. He saw the value of keeping good tenants who look after the place. I took care of the building for him."

NEXT MONTH THE CITY COUNCIL WILL CONSIDER ACTION ON POSSIBLE RELOCATION HELP FOR TENNANTS WHOSE RENT-CONTROLLED APARTMENTS ARE CLOSING. BUT THAT WON'T HELP BENSCOTER EITHER BECAUSE HE SAYS HE COULD BE ON THE STREET BY THEN.

Benscoter: "I never in my life dreamed I would be one of these people. Not having a place to go. Right as of this minute, I have no place to go."

Steve Hanleigh, property owner: "Most landlords are good guys."

I CAUGHT UP WITH PROPERTY OWNER STEVE HANLEIGH, WHO WAS DOING WHAT HE DOES EVERY DAY, CARING FOR HIS 40 PLUS UNITS ACROSS THE VALLEY AND, HE EMPHASIZES, THE TENANTS WHO RENT FROM HIM

Hanleigh: "You've got to put your heart into it. You've got to improve it, paint it, nurture it. And the only way you can do that is if you have tenants who will work with you to do that."

HANLEIGH WAS AMONG THE SCORES OF LANDLORDS WHO MADE THEIR CASE BEFORE THE CITY COUNCIL ON TUESDAY, WHOSE ACTION TO REDUCE RENT INCREASES WAS COUNTER-PRODUCTIVE, SAYS HANLEIGH. Hanleigh: "I think the five percent increase is going to become automatic. Those who haven't been raising now have to, in order to get any kind of return."

HANLEIGH SAYS HE SAW ALL OF THIS COMING AND SOLD MOST OF HIS APARTMENTS IN SAN JOSE. HE SAYS THE LAST THING LANDLORDS WANT ARE EMPTY UNITS AND SAYS HE HAS SEVERAL THAT ARE RENTING FOR WELL BELOW MARKET.

Hanleigh: "We've had five years of tough times where in order to keep tenants we reduced the rents. Nobody ever talks about that."

HANLEIGH INSISTS HE AND MOST OF THE OTHER RESPONSIBLE MOM AND POP LANDLORDS ARE THE NEXT BEST THING TO THE CITY'S STATED GOAL OF CREATING MORE AFFORDABLE HOUSING BUT FEELS LIKE THEY HAVE, IN HIS WORDS 'BEEN THROWN UNDER THE BUS.'

Hanleigh: "Good landlords don't want bad landlords. What happened last night is going to do nothing but create more bad landlords."

AND IT DOESN'T END HERE. IN MAY, THE CITY COUNCIL IS GOING TO BE CONSIDERING SOMETHING ELSE PROPERTY OWNERS ARE NOT GOING TO BE SUPPORTING – RELOCATION BENEFITS FOR TENANTS FORCED OUT OF RENT-CONTROLLED APARTMENTS.

Knige: "The sidewalk just put it in. The trees just put in."

ROBERT'S THREE BEDROOM CONDO WITH A VIEW IS STILL UNDER CONSTRUCTION. HE THINKS IT'S A PART OF SOMETHING BIG.

Knigge: "Out here it's quiet. It's nothing. But you do know it's coming."

Knigge: "I didn't think it would be this quick. The time is right."

IN APRIL, HE SOLD IT FOR 14 PERCENT MORE.

Knigge: "The price that I listed this place for is very reasonable with what else is in the city. It's pretty much brand new, but it's ready to go."

IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO KNOW JUST HOW HIGH PRICES WILL CONTINUE TO GO. EXPERTS SAY THE LUXURY CONDO MARKET HERE MAY BE QUIETING DOWN, BUT HOUSING FOR THE MIDDLE CLASS IS STILL IN HIGH DEMAND.

James: "I want to put in 1000 square foot two bedroom two bath rental unit."

SO HIS PLAN FOR THE CONCRETE SLAB IN HIS BACKYARD IS AS MUCH ABOUT SELF-INTEREST AS IT IS ABOUT SOLVING A BIG PROBLEM.

James: "We have our budget here."

BUT THERE'S A WALL HE JUST CAN'T GET OVER.

James: "Twenty thousand in fees and ten thousand in a sprinkler system."

Regan: "We believe the home has already paid those fees when it was originally built."

# MATT REGAN SAYS IF "NOT IN MY BACKYARD" CREATED THIS PROBLEM, THE "YES IN MY BACKYARD" IS THE SOLUTION.

Regan: "These things will be built by families. By small contractors. Not by big businesses."

James: "We might get two young people who want to split the rent."

# JAMES SAYS IN THE SHORT TERM HIS UNIT COULD HELP OUT HIS DAUGHTER WHO GRADUATED FROM COLLEGE AND NOW PAYS HIGH RENT IN SAN FRANCISCO, OR BRING HOME HIS SON WHO UP AND MOVED TO PORTLAND.

James: "And it's a solution that's so simple! It doesn't cost any funding to just say yes."

THE BILL IS MAKING ITS WAY THROUGH THE SENATE RIGHT NOW. IF IT PASSES, IT WOULD GO INTO EFFECT IN JANUARY NEXT YEAR. SO HOMEOWNER ANDRES JAMES IS WAITING UNTIL THEN TO BUILD HIS SECOND UNIT.

HOMEOWNER SANDRA FORBES HAS BEEN HAVING A TOUGH TIME GETTING THE ALLEGED SQUATTER OUT OF HER HOUSE. SHE SAYS THE WOMAN HAS BEEN LIVING IN HER HOME WITHOUT HER PERMISSION FOR THE PAST TWO MONTHS. THE WOMAN CLAIMS SHE SIGNED A LEASE, BUT FORBES SAYS THAT DOCUMENT IS A FAKE. AND THAT SHE NEVER EVEN MET THE WOMAN.

BUT FORBES IS NOT THE ONLY VICTIM. SUSAN HALTOM SAYS HER NIGHTMARE BEGAN IN 2012.

Susan Haltom: "We decided to tell her if you just leave we won't file charges against you. We gave her ample time to go, but she never left."

AS FOR FORBES, SHE SAYS LAW ENFORCEMENT HAVE THEIR HANDS TIED AND ARE UNABLE TO HELP. THE WOMAN LIVING IN THE HOUSE NOTED THAT SHE IS NOT A CRIMINAL AND DID NOT FORCE THE FORBES OUT OF THEIR HOME.

BACK IN THE DAY, YOU COULDN'T WAIT TO MOVE OUT OF MOM'S AND DAD'S HOUSE, BUT BOY HAVE TIMES CHANGED. KRON 4'S VICKI LIVIAKIS HERE WITH A REPORT ON THE MILLENNIALS WHO ARE HANGING OUT WITH THE FOLKS:

FROM THE LOOKS OF IT, YOUNG ADULTS APPEAR TO BE IN NO HURRY TO LEAVE THEIR OLD BEDROOMS. IN FACT, CENSUS FIGURES SHOW MORE MILLENNIALS LIVE WITH THEIR PARENTS THAN PARTNERS. EMPTY NEST, WHAT EMPTY NEST?

FOR THE FIRST TIME ON RECORD, "LIVING WITH PARENT" IS NOW THE MOST COMMON ARRANGEMENT FOR PEOPLE AGES 18 TO 34. IN FACT, A THIRD OF MILLENNIALS NOW LIVE WITH THEIR FOLKS. IT'S OUT-PACING THE YOUNG PEOPLE WHO LIVE WITH A SPOUSE OR PARTNER. SOMETHING THAT HASN'T HAPPENED SINCE RECORD-KEEPING BEGAN IN 1880. IT'S A BIG CHANGE AND IT REFLECTS A LONG-RUNNING DECLINE IN MARRIAGE. THERE ARE SIMPLY MORE SINGLE PEOPLE. THE TREND IS PARTICULARLY STRONG WITH AMERICANS WHO DON'T HAVE A COLLEGE DEGREE.

I TALKED WITH SOME MILLENNIALS IN SAN FRANCISCO WHERE RENTS ARE SKY HIGH TO GET THEIR PERSPECTIVE.

MOS: "I wouldn't. Absolutely not."

MOS: "I like to think they live with me, by the way."

MOS: "In my culture it's very common to live with parents. In fact, in the Filipino culture you can still live with parents until you have grandkids."

MOS: "I think my parents would like to try to get me back in, because of the grandkid, but I wouldn't do that to my wife."

MOS: "It's actually quite nice, especially when Mom cooks for you!"

SOME ECONOMISTS SAY THE TREND IS NOT A GOOD THING FOR THE ECONOMY. FEWER PEOPLE NEED TO BUY THINGS LIKE APPLIANCES, FURNITURE OR CABLE SUBSCRIPTIONS WHEN THEY LIVE AT HOME WITH THE FOLKS. THE UPSIDE TO NOT PAYING RENT, OF COURSE, IS THAT MILLENNIALS ARE INTO SAVING MORE, SOCKING AWAY CASH FOR OTHER THINGS.

MAYBE THEY CAN TAKE THEIR PARENTS OUT FOR A NICE MEAL TO THANK THEM!

SAN FRANCISCO VOTERS CAN WEIGH IN ON THE CITY'S HOMELESS ENCAMPMENTS... AT THE POLLS THIS NOVEMBER. SUPERVISOR MARK FARRELL SUBMITTED AN INITIATIVE TODAY WHICH WOULD MAKE IT EASIER FOR POLICE TO REMOVE HOMELESS TENTS ON 24 HOURS NOTICE.

THE MEASURE IS LIKELY TO FACE STIFF OPPOSITION. THE ENCAMPMENTS HAVE BECOME A HIGHLY VISIBLE AND CONTENTIOUS SYMBOL OF THE CITY'S HOUSING CRISIS. HOMELESS ADVOCATES SAY THERE ARE ALREADY LAWS ALLOWING POLICE TO REMOVE TENTS AND THAT THE MEASURE IS NOT A REAL SOLUTION. BUT SUPERVISOR FARRELL SAYS "It is not compassionate to allow human beings to live in tents on our streets," CALLING IT "both dangerous and unhealthy."

HOUSING 6/23/16 KRON4 News at 8pm Rent-controlled apartments lose vote in San Jose, set for demolition HUNDREDS OF SAN JOSE RESIDENTS WILL NEED TO START LOOKING FOR NEW HOMES AFTER A LAST DITCH EFFORT TO SAVE THEIR APARTMENT COMPLEX FROM THE WRECKING BALL FAILS. THOSE RESIDENTS HAD HOPED AN APPEAL TO THE SAN JOSE CITY COUNCIL WOULD STOP A PLANNED DEMOLITION OF THEIR HOMES BUT THE EFFORT FAILED. KRON 4'S CHARLES CLIFFORD VISITED THE APARTMENT COMPLEX THIS AFTERNOON AND SPOKE WITH RESIDENTS WHO SAY THEY ARE DISSAPOINTED.

Danica Espinoza: "I like living here. The neighborhood is great."

DANICA ESPINOZA IS ONE OF THE MORE THAT 600 PEOPLE WHO LIVE HERE AT THE RESERVE APARTMENTS ALONG SOUTH WINCHESTER BOULEVARD IN SAN JOSE. SHE, ALONG WITH HER MOTHER AND SPECIAL NEEDS SISTER, MOVED IN LAST FALL AND DANICA SAYS NO ONE TOLD THEM THE APARMTNET COMPLEX MIGHT EVENTUALLY BE DEMOLISHED. THEY ONLY OFUND OUT WHEN DANICA SAW THIS PUBLIC NOTICE SIGN ALONG WINCHESTER.

Espinoza: "At first it was a shock to me. I had only been living here for two weeks and when I saw the sign it was pretty disappointing."

NOW, WHAT WAS JUST A POSSIBILITY HAS BECOME A REALITY. THE OWNERS OF THE PROPERTY, GREYSTAR REAL ESTATE PARTNERS, HAVE WONE APPROVAL FROM THE CITY TO DEMOLISH THE 216 RENT-CONTROLLED APARTMENTS HERE AND REPLACE THEM WITH 640 MARKET RATE APARTMENTS ALONG WITH 8,000 SQUARE FEET OF RETAIL SPACE.

EVERYONE WHO LIVES HERE, INCLUDING DANICA AND HER FAMILY, WILL HAVE TO MOVE BY APRIL 2017.

ON TUESDAY EVEING, THE SAN JOSE CITY COUNCIL CONSIDERED A LAST DITCH APPEAL BY A GROUP OF RESERVE RESIDENTS TO STOP THE DEMOLITION. THE ISSUE WS HOTLY DEBATED WITH SOME COUNCIL MEMBERS SAYING THE PROJECT WOULD AD BADLY NEEDED HOUSING TO THE CITY OF SAN JOSE.

Johnny Khamis, San Jose City Councilmember: "If we don't start understanding the business of housing, we're never going to be able to succeed at our goals of making housing affordable."

OTHER CONCILMEMBERS ARGEUS THAT APPROVING THE PROECT WOULD FORCE HUNDREDS OF PEOPLE, SOME OF WHOM ARE LOW INCOME, OUT OF THEIR HOMES AND INTO A HIGHLY COMPETITIVE HOUSING MARKET.

Ash Kalra, San Jose City Councilmember: "Let's take a pause, figure out what the needs are of the residents and try our best to mitigate those needs.

IN THE END, THE COUNCIL DENIED THE APPEAL AND THE PROJECT IS NOW SET TO MOVE FORWARD. THE OWNERS ARE OFFERING FINANCIAL HELP TO A HANDFUL OF RESIDENTS WHO QUALIFY, BUT DANICA MAKES TOO MUCH MONEY.

Espinoza: "I won't qualify for that even if my sister is in a wheel chair."

SHE'S ALSO NOT SURE WHERE THEY WILL MOVE TO.

Espinoza: "Prices keep going up every year. In this area, it's just not going to be affordable."

THIS WEEK KRON4 NEWS IS TAKING PART IN AN UNPRECEDENTED MEDIA EVENT WHERE 71 MEDIA OUTLETS ARE JOINING FORCES TO SHINE A SPOTLIGHT ON THE HOMELESS PROBLEM IN SAN FRANCISCO AND AROUND THE BAY AREA. TONIGHT AN OPENING LOOK AT THE ISSUES FACED IN THE CITY OF SAN FRANCISCO. KRON 4'S DAN KERMAN IS LIVE TONIGHT AT CITY HALL WITH HOW HOMELESS ADVOCATES FEEL THE CITY IS DOING.

FINDING HOMELESS PEOPLE IN SAN FRANCISCO IS NOT DIFFICULT TO DO. THE MOST RECENT SURVEY IN 2015 FOUND 3500 LIVING ON THE STREET, DOWN ABOUT A THOUSAND FROM 2002.

Jennifer Friedenbach, San Francisco Coalition on Homelessness: "We had a lot of investment in supportive housing. We are basically housing 6000 in San Francisco who were homeless before and that has helped our numbers to go down slowly, but it hasn't been enough."

JENNIFER FRIENDENBACH WITH SAN FRANCISCO'S COALITION ON HOMELESSNESS SAYS PART OF THE PROBLEM HAS BEEN BUDGET CUTS ON THE STATE AND FEDERAL LEVEL, BUT THAT'S NOT ALL.

Friedenbach:"In San Francisco most recently with our driving up of rents we've seen huge numbers of people be displaced and more on the street. So our efforts locally have not kept up with that rate."

FRIEDENBACH SAYS AN EVER INCREASING PROBLEM OF DRUG ADDICTION AND MENTAL HEALTH ISUES AMONG THE HOMELESS CONTINUES TO BE A PROBLEM AS WELL.

Friedenbach: "If they don't have housing, those health issues continue to deteriorate, and so what we have now is a population in San Francisco that is a lot sicker and a lot more at risk."

WHILE SHE ALSO HAS CONCERNS ABOUT WHETHER THE CITY IS COMMITTED TO HAVE ENOUGH UNITS FOR HOMELESS PEOPLE TO TRANSITION INTO, SHE DOES NOTE A SEA CHANGE IN THE CITY'S ATTITUDE

Friedenbach: "A part of the culture of homelessness in the city has been to make it as uncomfortable for homeless people so they will disappear. There's finally a recognition that that philosophy has been a failure and we instead need to engage people in services and work hard to get them off the street and the homeless department has certainly come together with that idea in mind. We love that we are focusing on ending homelessness. That's exactly the direction we'd like to see the city go in."

THIS WEEK KRON FOUR NEWS IS PLEASED TO BE TAKING PART IN AN UNPRECEDENTED MEDIA EVENT. SEVENTY-ONE DIFFERENT MEDIA OUTLETS ARE JOINING FORCES TO SHINE A SPOTLIGHT ON THE HOMELESS PROBLEM IN SAN FRANCISCO AND THE BAY AREA.

WE LIVE AT THE EPICENTER OF A NATIONAL PROBLEM. ONE FOURTH OF THE NATION'S HOMELESS LIVE IN CALIFORNIA. IN SAN JOSE, SEVEN OUT OF TEN HOMELESS ARE CLASSIFIED AS "UNSHELTERED," MEANING THEY SLEEP IN CARS, DOORWAYS OR TENT CITIES ON PUBLIC LAND. THE BAY AREA'S BIGGEST CITY HAS MORE THAN FOUR THOUSAND HOMELESS, ABOUT 400 FOR EACH 100 THOUSAND RESIDENTS. OAKLAND HAS THREE THOUSAND, 128 PER 100 THOUSAND RESIDENTS.

SAN FRANCISCO HAS THE DENSEST HOMELESS POPULATION. MORE THAN 75 HUNDRED MEN, WOMEN AND CHILDREN ARE LIVING ON THE STREETS OR IN TEMPORARY SHELTERS. THAT'S NEARLY 991 PER 100 THOUSAND RESIDENTS.

MORE THAN ONE THIRD HAVE DRUG OR ALCOHOL PROBLEMS. MORE THAN ONE THIRD HAVE PSYCHOLOGICAL OR EMOTIONAL DIFFICULTIES. TWENTY-EIGHT PERCENT HAVE PHYSICAL DISABILITIES.

AFRICAN AMERICANS MAKE UP 36 PERCENT OF THE TOTAL, MORE THAN FIVE TIMES THEIR SHARE OF THE GENERAL POPULATION.

BUT THE CITY'S HEAD COUNT CASTS DOUBT ON THE COMMON IDEA THAT SAN FRANCISCO IS A MAGNET FOR THE HOMELESS. SEVEN IN TEN SAID THEY WERE LIVING IN SAN FRANCISCO WHEN THEY BECAME HOMELESS. NEARLY HALF OF THEM HAD LIVED HERE FOR MORE THAN TEN YEARS. THE MOST COMMON CAUSES WERE LOSS OF A JOB, DIVORCE, OR DRUGS AND ALCOHOL.

BUT 13 PERCENT SAID THEY WERE EVICTED, AND THAT'S A FOURFOLD INCREASE IN FOUR YEARS.

BART UNVEILED A NEW TRAIN TODAY - IT IS ONE OF SEVERAL HUNDRED which WILL BE PUT INTO THE SYSTEM. THE 'FLEET OF THE FUTURE' BOASTS MANY IMPROVED FEATURES AND UPGRADES, COMPARED TO THE OLDER ONES. AS KRON 4'S TERISA ESTACIO SHOWS US, OFFICIALS ARE EAGER TO GET THESE TRAINS ON THE TRACKS. HOWEVER, THERE IS A CATCH.

TAKE A LOOK AT THIS! THIS IS CENTRAL AIR CONDITIONING, AND IT RUNS ALL THE WAY DOWN THE SLEEK NEW BART TRAIN. ON A WARM DAY IT'S CERTAINLY A WELCOMED FEATURE, COMPARED TO THE OLD TRAINS THAT PUMPED AIR BY THE WINDOWS. AND IT IS JUST ONE OF MANY IMPROVEMENTS ON THIS NEW 2 MILLION DOLLAR CAR.

Grace Crunican, BART general manager: "This is historic for us. This is not an inexpensive proposition. It cost about 2.5 million dollars to bring this car to the Bay Area. They will help relieve congestion and improve our reliability."

ON THIS WEDNESDAY, BART OFFICIALS WERE EXUBERANT TO UNVEIL THIS TRAIN. IT IS ONE OF 775 THAT WILL ULTIMATELY REPLACE THE CURRENT FLEET. THERE ARE COUNTLESS UPGRADES. BESIDES CENTRAL AIR, THERE ARE LED MONITORS THAT WILL HIGHLIGHT ROUTES AND GIVE DISTANCE ALERTS. THIS IS ONE OF 6 SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS THAT WILL WORK AND RECORD CONSTANTLY. AND THIS LARGE AREA IS RESERVED FOR THOSE WITH DISABILITIES.

Aaron Weinstein, BART chief of marketing: "We're at the middle door location on the new train car and this location has two wheelchair parking areas. We've also eliminated the floor to ceiling pole in this location to provide a nice wide accessible path."

ANOTHER BIG DEAL - THE SEATS. THEY ARE COLORFUL, MORE NARROW FOR EASIER ACCESS PLUS ANOTHER NEW FEATURE ABOUT THESE SEATS IS THAT THEY ARE MADE OUT OF VINYL WHICH BART OFFICIALS SAY MAKES THEM EASIER TO CLEAN. PLUS, THERE'S BUILT-IN LUMBAR SUPPORT FOR COMFORT.

THE NEW DOORS ARE ANOTHER IMPROVEMENT. THEY BLOCK SOUND, MAKING FOR A QUIETER RIDE. AND THIS AREA TUCKED AWAY IS FOR BIKES.

OFFICIALS SAY THE FEATURES ARE A RESULT OF RIDER FEEDBACK. FUNDING WAS A MIX OF FEDERAL, AND LOCAL MONIES. BART WANTS TO ADD 300 MORE AS THEY DEAL WITH AN INCREASE IN SERVICE. ALTHOUGH THIS TRAIN CAR IS HERE, THE OTHERS ARE STILL EN ROUTE. OFFICIALS SAY THEY MUST FIRST TEST THEM, THEN PUT INTO SERVICE. BUT THE PLAN IS TO PHASE IN THE CARS STARTING WITH TEN BY THE END OF 2016.

BART MAY BE EXPANDING SOON IN ORDER TO EASE THE CONSTANT GRIDLOCK ALONG INTERSTATE 80. A TEAM OF RESEARCHERS FROM THE WEST CONTRA COSTA COUNTY TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE CONDUCTED A STUDY. KRON 4'S ALECIA REID REPORTS FROM SAN PABLO WHERE TONIGHT A BART BOARD MEMBER CALLED FOR MORE BART SERVICE AROUND THE BAY:

Commuter Pamela Wagner: "I've been waiting for this ... "

AN EXTENSION ...

Wagner: "...for over ten years."

IS WELL OVERDUE.

Wagner: "The traffic is horrendous."

THE I-80 CORRIDOR IS THE MOST CONGESTED IN THE REGION, AND IT'S BECOMING MORE AND MORE OF A NIGHTMARE FOR DRIVERS.

Wagner. "We need something that's gonna get these people off the road, so I'm really excited."

THE BART TRANSIT STUDY SHOWS ONLY A SMALL PERCENTAGE OF WEST CONTRA COSTA COUNTY RESIDENTS USE TRANSIT TO GET TO WORK.

Wagner: "More people that I know work in San Francisco and Berkeley, but commute from Vallejo, Fairfield, even Sacramento."

THEY DRIVE TO GET CLOSER TO A BART STATION OR HAVE ACCESS TO BUS SERVICE. THE RICHMOND STATION HASN'T BEEN EXPANDED SINCE THE INCEPTION OF THE BART SYSTEM, YET THE POPULATION CONTINUES TO GROW.

John Nemeth, West Contra Costa Transportation Advisory Committee: "BART has expanded in a lot of different directions. This is really the only part of the line that hasn't expanded yet."

THERE ARE SOME POSSIBLE OPTIONS.

Zakhary Mallett, BART director: "A extended express bus system, bus rapid transit including dedicated bus lanes along San Pablo Avenue or 23<sup>rd</sup> Street..."

IN ADDITION TO TONIGHT'S MEETING HERE IN SAN PABLE, THERE WILL BE TWO MORE PUBLIC MEETINGS, ONE AT PINOLE CITY HALL ON WEDNESDAY AND THE OTHER AT RICHMOND CITY HALL ON THURSDAY SO PEOPLE CAN ASK QUESTIONS OR MAKE SUGGESTIONS ABOUT WAYS TO ALLEVIATE TRAFFIC.

IF WE'RE TALKING ABOUT EXTENDING THE RICHMOND BART LINE, THAT COULD TAKE DECADES, AND MILLIONS OF DOLLARS. SO, FOR NOW THEY'RE TALKING ABOUT SHORT TERM GOALS THAT CAN BE ACCOMPLISHED IN THE NEXT COUPLE OF YEARS.

THE BART BOARD OF DIRECTORS GOT A LOOK AT THE COMING YEARS FISCAL BUDGET, AND WHILE THAT LOOKS GOOD, THE OVERVIEW FOR THE NEXT TEN YEARS DOES NOT. KRON 4'S DAN KERMAN IS LIVE AT BART HEADQUARTERS IN OAKLAND WITH NEWS OF A SUBSTANTIAL BUDGET DEFICIT:

WHEN THEY FORECAST OUT FOR TEN YEARS, THE BUDGET DEFICIT IS MORE THAN 400 MILLION DOLLARS AND THAT'S SOMETHING BART DIRECTORS SAY THEYMUST ADDRESS RIGHT AWAY.

WHILE BART IS ON BUDGET FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR, THE OUTLOOK FOR THE NEXT TEN YEARS SHOWS A TROUBLING BUDGET GAP.

Alicia Trost, BART spokeswoman: "The 400 million dollar gap that's our 10-year shortfall. That number is basically because of wanting to get to 1000 railcars and the new train control system."

AVOIDING THOSE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IS PRETTY MUCH A NON-STARTER AND MEANS FINDING OTHER WAYS TO TRIM THE FAT.

Trost: "We're actually talking with our partner counties on how much they can help us fund BART railcars."

A BART BOND MEASURE ON THIS NOVEMBER'S BALLOT COULD ALSO BE HELPFUL.

Trost: "In that bond measure, 400 million of it would go toward the new train control system. So, if you do look at the long-term picture, if the bond passes we're going to be in a much better place in terms of that tenyear number because it basically washes it away."

IF THE BOND DOESN'T PASS THE BART BOARD WILL HAVE TO GET CREATIVE. BUT THAT DOESN'T NECESSARILY MEAN ADDITIONAL FARE INCREASES.

Joel Keller, BART Director: "I think we've gotten to the point where we are at our limits. People can't afford to pay more than they are paying right now."

BART DIRECTOR JOEL KELLER SAYS HE'S ASKED BART STAFF TO LOOK AT SURCHARGES FOR THOSE WHO TRAVEL ON BART FOR JUST A SHORT DISTANCE WITHIN THE SAME CITY.

Keller: "What I suggested we take a look at is putting a fifty cent surcharge for intra-San Francisco trips and intra-Oakland trips and using that money to make improvements in those two corridors with the money raised

so we can reinvest in those systems and also perhaps use pricing to relieve some of the congestion that riders are currently experiencing."

OF COURSE, THAT'S JUST ONE IDEA., THIS ONE AS WELL AS OTHERS, WILL BE EXPLORED BY BART DIRECTORS OVER THE NEXT WEEKS AND MONTHS.

WE ALL KNOW HOW CROWDED BART TRAINS HAVE BECOME AND HOW OFTEN RIDERS HAVE TO STAND. BUT SOMETIMES THEY ARE STANDING BECAUSE SOMEONE IS TAKING UP TWO SEATS. TODAY THE BART BOARD TOOK AIM AT THOSE PEOPLE, CALLED SEAT HOGS, WITH A NEW ORDIANNCE. KRON 4'S DAN KERMAN IS LIVE AT BART HEADQUARTERS IN OAKLAND WITH WHAT'S CHANGING ON THE TRAINS:

A VERY DIVIDED BART BOARD DEBATED AND VOTED 5-4 IN FAVOR OF THIS NEW ORDINANCE WHICH WILL ALLOW POLICE TO CITE AND FINE PEOPLE IF THEY ARE TAKING UP TWO SEATS.

HAVE YOU EVER BOARDED A BART TRAIN AND FOUND SOMEONE TAKING UP TWO SEATS? WHAT DO YOU DO?

Joel Keller, BART Director: "I didn't want them to be placed in a position where the rider taking up more than one seat refuses to give up the seat and their only opportunity is to walk away and do nothing. I fear that in that circumstance a really minor matter could escalate into something much more serious."

THAT'S WHY BART DIRECTOR JOEL KELLER HAS AUTHORED A SEAT HOG ORDINANCE GIVING POLICE THE AUTHORITY TO ISSUE WARNINGS, CITATIONS AND EVEN FINES FOR THOSE WHO ARE TAKING MORE THAN ONE SEAT.

Keller: "We need to find a way to protect our riders and be sure they have the necessary seats that they're paying for."

Tom Radulovich, BART Director: "We are jumping right to criminalization of rudeness and that is difficult to enforce. It's a lot of resources that would go into that. And where does that end? Where do we stop being human beings who interact in a society and become human beings who just ask the police to mediate every interaction between us?"

SOME BART DIRECTOR THOUGH THINK THE ORDINANCE GOES TOO FAR

Radulovich: "I think the thing you do, I think the way society works, the glue is social sanction. It's shame. I think a courtesy campaign, which we've never done, could work."

BUT BY A 5-4 VOTE THE BOARD PASSED THE ORDINANCE WHICH WILL GO INTO EFFECT ONCE BART POLICE DRAFT ENFORCEMENT POLICIES. WHENEVER THAT HAPPENS, BART POLICE CHIEF KENTON RAINEY SAYS HE DOES NOT BELIEVE IT'S GOING TO LEAD TO LOTS OF CITATIONS AND FINES. HE THINKS ONCE WORD GETS OUT, PEOPLE WILL SIMPLY COMPLY AND STAY IN THEIR SINGLE SEAT.

THERE'S BEEN A BIG FUSS OVER THE RECENT DECISION TO FIRST SEND THE TRAIN TO NORTHERN CALIFORNIA, RATHER THAN THE LA AREA. SO MUCH SO, A VOTE WAS PUT OFF TODAY ON THE REVISED PLAN JUST TO GIVE STATE OFFICIALS MORE TIME TO TRY TO GET PEOPLE IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA USED TO THE IDEA.

THERE WAS A MEETING IN SAN JOSE AND THE BOARD WAS EXPECTED TO ADOPT THE 64 BILLION DOLLAR PLAN, BUT THAT VOTE WILL HAPPEN LATER.

THE LATEST IDEA CALLS FOR THE BULLET TRAIN TO HEAD FROM THE CENTRAL VALLEY TO SAN JOSE, RATHER THAN SOUTH TO THE SAN FERNANDO VALLEY. THE CHANGES INCLUDE SHIFTING THE CENTRAL VALLEY STARTING POINT TO MERCED AND ADDING ANOTHER STATION NEAR BAKERSFIELD. THE FIRST STRETCH WOULD BEGIN OPERATING IN 2025.

THEY ARE CALLING IT THEIR KITTY HAWK MOMENT. THE HIGH-TECH HYPERLOOP TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM HIT A HUGE MILESTONE TODAY WHEN CREWS RAN THEIR FIRST FULL SCALE TEST. OUR GABE SLATE EXPLAINS HOW IT WORKS AND HOW IT COULD REVOLUTIONIZE HOW WE TRAVEL:

HYPERLOOP TAKES A PASSENGER POD HOLDING A DOZEN PEOPLE AND ROCKETS IT THROUGH A TUBE AT SEVEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY MILES AN HOUR. IT COULD DELIVER PEOPLE FROM SAN FRANCISCO TO LA IN 30 MINUTES. IT COULD REPLACE TRAINS, PLANES, AND BUSSES.

HERE IS A MAP OF HOW THEY SEE THE MAJOR METROPOLITAIN CITIES IN UNITED STATES CONNECTED THROUGH A TRACKING OF HYPERLOOP TUBES.

THIS AFTERNOON IN THE DESERT JUST OUTSIDE OF LAS VEGAS, THEY SUCCESSFULLY PERFORMED THEIR FIRST FULL-SPEED FULL- SCALE TEST OF THEIR PROPULSION SYSTEM.

Hyperloop One spokesperson: "People who had not had faith, who thought it was science fiction will begin to believe that it is possible to move people and things this fast."

THE HYPERLOOP TUBE WILL BE DEPRESSURIZED CREATING A VACUUM, ELIMINATING MOST AIR RESISTANCE. USING THE POWER OF MAGNETS, THE POD IS THRUST THROUGH THE TUBE AT HIGH SPEEDS. THE TUBE IS SUSPENDED OFF THE GROUND TO PROTECT FROM THE ELEMENTS OF WEATHER, BUT COULD ALSO TRAVEL UNDER WATER.

CAPSULES CARRYING THE PEOPLE WOULD DEPART EVERY 30 SECONDS, WITH TICKETS COSTING AS LOW AS TWENTY DOLLARS. THE CREATERS OF HYPERLOOP WANT IT TO BE AN AFFORDABLE MEANS OF TRAVEL.

I HATE FLYING; TRAINS TAKE TOO LONG; TRAFFIC RUINS CAR TRAVEL. SO, THIS SEEMS APPEALING. BUT WE'VE GOT TO TALK ABOUT THE CREEPY FACTOR. IT FEELS CLAUSTROPHOBIC. YOU ARE LOCKED IN THIS SMALL POD ZOOMING AT 700 MILES AN HOUR. A LOT OF SAFETY CONCERNS COME TO MIND, INCLUDING WHAT IF YOU'RE IN ONE DURING AN EARTHQUAKE? OUR PARTNERS AT CNN ASKED A HYPERLOOP ENGINEER ABOUT THAT. Hyperloop One engineer: "The system is the most safe system for an earthquake because it will be built on pylons and pylon technology is fairly far along to be able to withstand earthquakes of 8.0."

THIS IS HAPPENING. THEY ARE BUILDING THIS. THE COMPANY BEHIND THIS, HYPERLOOP ONE, HAS 150 EMPLOYEES, OVER \$80 MILLION IN FUNDING AND NEW INVESTORS JUMPING ON EVERY MONTH.

HYPERLOOP ONE HOPES TO BE MOVING CARGO AS SOON AS 2019 AND PREDICTS IT WILL BE READY FOR PASSENGERS BY 2021.

BART ANNOUNCED PLANS TO INSTALL SPECIAL TRACK BUMPERS ON CERTAIN TRACKS KNOWN FOR BEING NOISY. KRON 4'S JEFF BUSH EXPLAINS WHERE THE IMPROVEMENTS ARE TAKING PLACE AND WHEN PASSENGERS CAN EXPECT SOME RELIEF FROM THE NOISE:

THE NOISE ON BART TRAINS CAN BE DOWNRIGHT PAINFUL AND THOSE WHO RIDE THE TRAINS KNOW SOME PARTS OF THE TRACKS ARE NOISIER THAN OTHERS.

Passenger: "Just lots of screaming and screeching is the best way I can describe it."

Passenger: "When you are on the BART, it does get very loud in there. If you were taking it more often, I would recommend headphones because it gets very squeaky in there."

BART HEARD THE COMPLAINTS AND IS GOING TO INSTALL NOISE DAMPENERS ALONG THE TRACKS NEAR THE BALBOA STATION AND THE WEST OAKLAND STATION. THE WAY IT WORKS IS THE TRACKS WILL BE INSTALLED WITH SPECIAL BUMPERS THAT FIT TIGHTLY ALONG THE RAILS WHICH REDUCES THE OVERALL NOISE IN SOME OF THE NOISIEST PARTS OF THE LINE.

MORE THAN 3000 FEET OF TRACK WILL GET THE TREATMENT. BUT, IT'S NOT CHEAP. BART SAYS THE INSTALLATION WILL RUN ABOUT A MILLION DOLLARS PER MILE.

THE TRACKS NEAR THE BALBOA STATION WILL REQUIRE A SHUTDOWN OVER THE COURSE OF THE LABOR DAY WEEKEND. THE WEST OAKLAND TRACKS WILL BE FITTED LATER THIS YEAR AND WILL NOT REQUIRE A SHUTDOWN.

THE NUMBER OF DEATHS AND INJURIES FROM DISTRACTED DRIVING IS ON THE RISE. THE CALIFORNIA OFFICE OF TRAFFIC AND SAFETY SAYS NEARLY 13 PERCENT OF DRIVERS WERE SEEN USING THEIR MOBILE DEVICES IN APRIL. THAT IS UP BY NINE PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR.

OFFICIALS SAY NEARLY 60 PERCENT OF DRIVERS HAVE REPORTED BEING HIT OR NEARLY HIT BY ANOTHER DRIVER USING A CELLPHONE.

THE CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY PATROL WROTE MORE THAN 13 THOUSAND DISTRACTED DRIVING TICKETS IN APRIL ALONE.

6/23/16 KRON 4 Evening News New cyclist fatalities in San Francisco spark discussion of street safety

POLICE ARE SEARCHING FOR THE DRIVER RESPONSIBLE FOR HITTING AND KILLING A FEMALE BICYCLIST IN GOLDEN GATE PARK YESTERDAY EVENING. THAT WAS THE FIRST OF TWO FATAL HIT AND RUN COLLISIONS IN THE CITY. THEY HAPPENED JUST HOURS APART. KRON4'S MAUREEN KELLY SPOKE WITH CITY LEADERS AND BICYCLE ACTIVISTS WHO SAY THESE DEATHS WERE PREVENTABLE:

HERE'S THE MUG SHOT OF THE MAN ARRESTED IN WEDNESDAY'S SECOND FATAL HIT AND RUN COLLISION. THIRTY-TWO YEAR OLD FARRUKH MUSHTAG HAS BEEN BOOKED ON THE CHARGES OF FELONY HIT AND RUN AND VEHICULAR MANSALUGHTER.

HE ALLEGEDLY SPED THROUGH A RED LIGHT AT 7TH AND HOWARD AROUND 8:30 PM, STRIKING AND KILLING 26 YEAR OLD BICYCLIST KATHRINE SLATTERLY. HE PULLED OVER A FEW BLOCKS AWAY AND WAS HELD ON THE SCENE BY SEVERAL GOOD SAMARATIANS UNTIL POLICE ARRIVED.

POLICE SAY THEY ARE WORKING LEADS TO TRY AND FIND THE DRIVER OF THIS STOLEN WHITE HONDA LEFT ABOUT A MILE AND HALF FROM THE OTHER FATAL HIT AND RUN CRASH THAT HAPPENED ONLY A FEW HOURS BEFORE. WITNESSES SAY THE DRIVER WAS GOING WESTBOUND ON JFK DRIVE AND WHILE GOING 50 TO 60 MILES AN HOUR VEERED INTO THE EASTBOUND LANE, KILLING 41 YEAR OLD HEATHER MILLER AS SHE RODE HER BIKE.

Ed Reiskin, SF MTA: "It's just horrific. The idea that something like this could happen to two people who are lawfully and probably enjoyably riding their bikes through the city."

SFMTA'S ED REISKIN SAYS THERE ARE APPROXIMENTLY 30 TRAFFIC-RELATED FATALITIES IN SAN FRANCISCO EVERY YEAR WHICH IS WHY THEY HAVE ADOPTED VISION ZERO, A TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECT. THE GOAL IS TO ELIMINATE THESE NEEDLESS DEATHS.

Reiskin: "We do believe they are preventable. We're doing what we can to redesign the streets to make them safer and supporting the police to enforce the laws."

THE SAN FRANCISCO BICYCLISTS SAY THE CITY TALKS A GOOD GAME, BUT THEY WANT TO SEE MORE PROTECTED BIKE LANES.

Margaret McCarthy, SF Bicycle Coalition: "The city of San Francisco is behind and it needs to stop now. We need urgent action from our city leaders to make sure these kinds of horrifying and fully preventable fatalities stop occurring on our streets."

THE CITY SAYS IT UPGRADES 13 MILES OF CITY STREETS EACH YEAR AS PART OF VISION ZERO AND THEY ARE BREAKING GROUND ON IMPROVEMENTS TO THREE HIGH INJURY BIKE CORRIDORS IN 2016.

UBER HAS BEEN TESTING THE IDEA IN A FEW CITIES SINCE APRIL. IT WILL ALSO BE CREATING THE ABILITY TO SCHEDULE RIDES IN ADVANC, WHICH COULD HAPPEN IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

STARTING THIS FALL, BART RIDERS WHO TAKE UP MORE THAN ONE SEAT DURING THE BUSIEST TIMES OF THE DAY COULD FACE FINES AND EVEN BE ARRESTED.

THE NEW POLICY WAS ADOPTED IN APRIL AND WILL BE ENFORCED WEEKDAYS FROM 6 TO 10 IN THE MORNING AND THEN 3 TO 7:30 FOR EVENING COMMUNTE HOURS.

BART OFFICIALS SAY FIRST-TIME OFFENDERS WILL HAVE THEIR NAMES ENTERED IN A DATABASE AND BE GIVEN A VERBAL WARNING. IF THEY GET CAUGHT AGAIN, A WRITTEN WARNING WILL BE ADMINISTERED. BUT A THIRD OFFENSE WILL MEAN A ONE HUNDRED DOLLAR CITATION WITH TICKET COSTS RISING FROM THERE FOR FURTHER INFRACTIONS.
