# **ISSUE-RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING**

KRON-TV programs that regularly address issues of community concern include (but are not limited to) the following:

**KRON 4 Morning News**, a weekday news/informational program aired 4 am to 10 am, includes reports and indepth features, typically of 30 seconds to 2 minutes in duration, dealing with community issues.

**KRON 4 News @ 5** a daily news/informational program aired 5pm to 6 pm, includes reports and features, typically of 30 seconds to 2 minutes in duration, dealing with community issues.

**KRON 4 News @ 6**, a weekday news/informational program aired 6 pm to 7 pm, includes reports and features, typically of 30 seconds to 2 minutes, dealing with community issues.

**KRON 4 News @ 8**, a prime time news/informational program aired from 8 pm to 9 pm, includes reports and features, typically 30 seconds to 2 minutes long, dealing with community issues and the day's major news stories.

**KRON 4 News @ 11**, a daily news/informational program aired 11 to 11:30 pm, includes reports and in-depth features, typically of 30 seconds to 2 minutes, dealing with community issues, and major national and international news.

**KRON 4 Morning News Weekend**, a weekend news/informational program aired Saturdays and Sundays 7 am to 10 am, includes reports and in-depth features, dealing with community issues.

**KRON 4 News @ 8 Weekend**, a Saturday and Sunday news/informational program aired 8 pm to 9 pm, includes reports and in-depth features, typically of 30 seconds to 2 minutes, dealing with community issues.

**CRIME** 10/20/14 KRON 4 Evening News Baffling vandalism spree in San Jose

MORE SURVELLIANCE CAMERAS ARE GOING UP IN ONE SAN JOSE NEIGHBORHOOD AFTER A RASH OF VANDALISM. AND ONE BUSINESS OWNER WAS TARGETED MORE THAN ONCE. KRON 4'S ROB FLADEBOE HAS MORE:

PLYWOOD NOW COVERS WHAT'S LEFT OF A LARGE, PLATE-GLASS WINDOW HERE AT THE DI MODA SALON IN DOWNTOWN WILLOW GLEN. EARLY SUNDAY MORNING AS THIS SURVEILLANCE VIDEO SHOWS, SOMEONE SMASHED THAT WINDOW. OWNER AMBER LOPEZ SAYS IT'S HAPPENED THREE TIMES NOW. LOPEZ TURNED OVER TO POLICE AN IMAGE FROM A SURVEILLANCE CAMERA THAT SHOWS ONLY THE SMASHED WINDOW AND THIS, A PAIR OF PLIERS FOUND AMONG THE BROKEN GLASS.

Amber Lopez, owner of Di Moda Salon: "The first time we had the window and the door broken and they stole our computers. We lock everything up now. The second time, they just broke the window and again this time. Just vandalism."

SAN JOSE POLICE ARE INVESTIGATING AS LOPEZ AND OTHER MERCHANTS HERE SUSPECT SUNDAY'S INCIDENT MAY BE RELATED TO PREVIOUS WINDOW SMASHING EPISODES.

ELSEWHERE ON OR NEAR BUSY LINCOLN AVENUE, THE BASKIN ROBBINS STORE, BEVERAGES AND MORE STORE AND A STARBUCKS HAVE ALSO HAD WINDOWS SMASHED IN RECENT WEEKS. MERCHANTS LIKE JERRY BROYLES AT THE ALLIED DRIVING SCHOOL NEXT DOOR TO THE SALON ARE STEPPING UP SECURITY.

Jerry Broyles, Allied Driving School: "We have video cameras here, so we're somewhat protected. If someone decides to throw a wrench, they may wind up with their picture on TV."

BROYLES SAYS WILLOW GLEN RESIDENTS AND MERCHANTS WHO LOOK OUT FOR ONE ANOTHER ARE NOW ON HIGH ALERT AND HE IS CONFIDENT THAT WHOEVER IS TO BLAME FOR THE VANDALISM WILL BE CAUGHT.

11/11/14 KRON 4 News at 8pm Richmond violence – the mayor and the community react

THE SHOOTING DEATH OF POPULAR RICHMOND HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL PLAYER RODNEY FRAZIER JR. APPEARS TO BE A CASE OF THE TEEN BEING IN THE WRONG PLACE AT THE WRONG TIME EVEN THOUGH HE WAS KILLED IN FRONT OF HIS OWN HOME.

RODNEY FRAZIER WAS REPORTEDLY NOT IN A GANG, BUT POLICE SAY A FEUD BETWEEN RIVAL GANGS IS HEATING UP AND THAT SAME FEUD MAY BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE RECENT SHOOTINGS WHICH INJURED FOUR OTHER RICHMOND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS.

ONE OF THEIR TEACHERS SPOKE OUT TODAY ABOUT THE VIOLENCE.

Juan Ledesma, Richmond High School math teacher: "All these kids are really good kids, with good hearts. It's so bad that they have to go out there and look behind their backs all the time. Even myself, when I have my soccer players in North Richmond I feel I have to be watchful, I need to be watching everything I do in these neighborhoods. It's sad when a 16 year old can't go outside and just play."

ON WEDNESDAY, A VIGIL WILL BE HELD AT RICHMOND CITY HALL IN MEMORY OF RODNEY FRAZIER. IT WILL ALSO SERVE AS A CALL FOR AN END TO THE VIOLENCE.

WE HAVE TEAM COVERAGE ON THIS IMPORTANT PUBLIC SAFETY ISSUE AS KRON 4'S ALECIA REID ASKED RICHMOND'S NEW MAYOR-ELECT HOW HE PLANS TO ADDRESS THIS VIOLENCE:

MAYOR-ELECT TOM BUTT PLANS TO CONTINUE USING MULTIPLE RESOURCES FOR CRIME PREVENTION. HE SAYS HIS GOAL IS TO ERADICATE HOMICIDES IN RICHMOND.

Mayor Butt: "They are disputes which are just plain stupid. We're going to get on top of this. We're going to increase our resources and we won't be happy until we totally wipe it out."

CRIME HAS BEEN DOWN IN RICHMOND. LAST YEAR THE CITY HAD FEWER HOMICIDES THAN ANY TIME IN THE LAST 33 YEARS. BUT THIS RECENT UPTICK IN MURDERS IS CAUSING CONCERN. MAYOR-ELECT TOM BUTT SAYS CRIME PREVENTION STRATEGIES WILL BE RAMPED UP. A HUGE CHUNK OF THE 90 MILLION DOLLAR BENEFITS AGREEMENT WITH CHEVRON HAS A PURPOSE.

Mayor Butt: "A significant portion of that money will go to things like youth activities and job training which are actually important, particularly for young people who are likely to be the perpetrators and victims of violent crime.

NORTH RICHMOND IS UNDER COUNTY JURISDICTION. BUTT'S GOAL IS TO ANNEX IT INTO THE CITY OF RICHMOND TO MAKE CRIME-FIGHTING EFFORTS COHESIVE ACROSS THE BOARD

Mayor Butt: "You have two law enforcement agencies trying to do a job in two different jurisdictions that are totally intertwined."

A RALLY WITH RODNEY FRAZIER'S TEAM AND OTHER TEAMS FROM THE AREA IS PLANNED FOR TOMORROW AT 5PM. THEY WILL GATHER HERE AT CITY HALL TO CALL FOR AN END TO THE VIOLENCE.

IT'S HAPPENING MORE AND MORE – THIEVES STEALING WATER IN CONTRA COSTA COUNTY. THE CROOKS ARE TARGETING HYDRANTS AS WELL AS WATER LINES ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES. THIS HAS HAPPENED IN THE PAST, BUT COUNTY OFFICIALS ARE NOW SEEING A SPIKE IN WATER THEFT.

THIEVES USUALLY BYPASS WATER METERS, SO THE WATER DISTRICT HAS NO IDEA HOW MUCH IS BEING STOLEN.

THE WATER BOARD WILL CONSIDER INCREASING FINES WHEN THEY MEET IN DECEMBER. INSTEAD OF A 25 DOLLAR FINE, IT COULD BE RAISED TO 250 BUCKS. AND REPEAT OFFENDERS WOULD BE FINED 500 DOLLARS.

OFFICIALS SAY INSTEAD OF STEALING WATER, PEOPLE WHO NEED IT, ESPECIALLY IN RURAL AREAS, CAN EITHER RENT A TEMPORARY WATER HYDRANT METER OR BUY A PERMANENT ONE FROM THE DISTRICT.

11/22/14 KRON 4 Evening News Operation Second Chance in Santa Clara

POLICE IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY ARE OFFERING A SECOND CHANCE TO SOME PEOPLE WHO HAVE WARRANTS OUT FOR THEIR ARREST. THE PROGRAM, THAT RUNS THROUGH THE MONTH OF DECEMEBER, OFFERS INDIVIDUALS WITH NON-VIOLENT MISDEMEANOR CRIMINAL AND TRAFFIC WARRANTS, THE OPPORTUNITY TO TURN THEMSELVES IN, INSTEAD OF BEING BOOKED INTO THE COUNTY JAIL.

INDIVIDUALS CAN GO TO ANY SANTA CLARA COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY TO RECEIVE THEIR WARRANT CITATION, WHICH WILL REQUIRE A NEW "PROMISE TO APPEAR" COURT DATE.

NEW CRIME DATA FROM BART TELLS WHICH STATIONS ARE THE MOST DANGEROUS FOR YOU AND FOR YOUR CAR. KRON4'S SCOTT RATES JOINS US LIVE AT THE BAY FAIR BART STATION IN SAN LEANDRO WITH THE INFORMATION:

ACCORDING TO A NEW CHRONICLE ANALYSIS, CRIME IS SPREAD OUT AMONG ALL 44 BART STATIONS. BUT SOME HAVE MUCH MORE OF A CRIME PROBLEM THAN OTHERS. THE ANALYSIS LOOKS AT 10 MONTHS OF CRIME STATISTICS PROVIDED BY BART POLICE AND SHOWS VIOLENT CRIME ROSE 5.6 PERCENT FROM 2013 TO 2014.

SERIOUS INJURY ASSAULTS UP 27 PERCENT AND BATTERIES UP 26%, WITH CALLS FOR ASSISTANCE UP 10% AND CAR THEFTS ALSO ON THE RISE. THE BART STATION WITH THE MOST OVERALL CRIME WAS POWELL STREET STATION, THE MOST VIOLENT CRIME RIDDEN STATION WAS RIGHT HERE AT HE BAYFAIR BART STATION IN SAN LEANDRO. THAT'S WHERE I SPOKE TO RIDERS ABOUT THE DUBIOUS DISTINCTION. [comments from BART riders]

THE GOOD NEWS? DURING THE 10 MONTH PERIOD THERE WERE FEWER HOMICIDES, DOWN BY 31%, AND ROBBERIES DECREASED BY 32%.

THE MURDER OF THE TWO POLICE OFFICERS IN NEW YORK HAS OFFICERS IN THE BAY AREA WATCHING THEIR BACKS. TONIGHT KRON 4'S DAN KERMAN TELLS US WHAT SAN FRANCISCO POLICE ARE DOING AND HOW THEY'RE REACTING TO THE SHOOTING:

AS A RESULT OF THE FATAL AMBUSH OF TWO NEW YORK CITY POLICE OFFICERS, SAN FRANCISCO POLICE HAVE ISSUED A HEIGHTENED SAFETY ALERT FOR ITS OFFICERS

SFPD Chief Greg Suhr: "Just to tell the officers to be aware of their surroundings, don't go anywhere by themselves, back each other up and err on the side of caution to make sure we're safest."

SAN FRANCISCO POLICE CHIEF GREG SUHR SAYS ALERT OR NOT, IT WON'T DETRACT FOR HIS DEPARTMENT DOING ITS JOB

Suhr: "Our hearts are heavy, but everyone has their priorities straight. We're going to keep San Francisco safe."

SAN FRANCISCO POLICE OFFICERS HAVE SEEN THEIR FARE SHARE OF ANTI-POLICE PROTESTS IN RECENT WEEKS, BUT THIS AMBUSH IS A DIFFERENT STORY

Martin Halloran, president, S.F. Police Officers' Association: "When it leads to an eye for an eye or vigilante behavior against officers who are merely doing their job, its disturbing."

SAN FRANCISCO POLICE OFFICERS ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT MARTIN HALLORAN SAYS HE SUPPORTS THE CHIEF'S HEIGHTENED ALERT, BUT SAYS OFFICERS REMAIN ON EDGE.

Halloran: "The officers are concerned. They, too, have families they want to go home to at the end of their shift. They are just doing their jobs 24/7. The communities are also very disturbed about what happened in New York and we need to work together to keep the dialogue alive where this type of action does not happen here in San Francisco."

WHILE OFFICIALS ADMIT THIS DEPARTMENT HAS ITS DETRACTORS AS WELL, THEY ARE HOPEFUL THE REALTIONSHIPS THEY'VE BUILT UP WITH VARIOUS COMMUNITIES, PLUS THE ONGOING DIALOGUE WILL PREVENT A SMILAR SITUATION FROM HAPPENING HERE.

GAS PRICES, ALREADY DOWN IN RECENT WEEKS, ARE FALLING EVEN MORE. TRIPLE A ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT THE AVERAGE PRICE IN CALIFORNIA IS \$3.59. THAT'S DOWN 23 CENTS FROM ONE MONTH AGO.

HERE IN THE BAY AREA, A GALLON OF REGULAR IS SLIGHTLY HIGHER AT \$3.61. THAT'S THE AVERAGE IN OAKLAND. IN SAN JOSE IT'S \$3.58 WHILE SAN FRANCISCO IS THE MOST EXPENSIVE AT \$3.73 PER GALLON.

11/3/14 Drivers taking advantage of declining gas prices

WE HAVE BEEN TRACKING THE FALLING GAS PRICES AROUND THE BAY AREA. TAKE A LOOK AT THIS VIDEO FROM THE GAS & SHOP AT 33<sup>RD</sup> AND MCKEE AVENUE IN SAN JOSE. PEOPLE LINED UP AROUND THE BLOCK FOR A CHEAP FILLUP. SO WHAT DO PEOPLE THERE THINK ABOUT IT? KRON 4'S ANNIE ANDERSEN HAS MORE:

WTH PEOPLE SHELLING OUT BIG BUCKS TO FILL UP, SMILES AREN'T VERY COMMON AT GAS STATIONS. BUT MONDAY AT THE GAS AND SHOP ON THE CORNER OF MCKEE ROAD AND 33RD STREET IN SAN JOSE THERE WERE SMILES ALL AROUND.

Markeeta Greenwood, consumer: "Because of the price. Did you see the price? It's awesome."

UNLEADED GAS WAS JUST 2.85 A GALLON, AND THAT'S A BIG CHANGE FROM WHERE IT WAS JUST A FEW MONTHS AGO. MANY WHO STOPPED BY THE GAS STATION TO FILL UP WERE EXCITED ABOUT THEIR SAVNGS.

Miriam Gutierrez, consumer: "Before it was 80 dollars, so I'm hoping it's going to be cheaper."

Ariana Caldera, consumer: "Every time, just to fill it up, it was 50, 60 dollars. Right now it's not that much. It's only about 25, 30."

SO HOW ARE PEOPLE PLANNING TO SPEND THEIR SAVNGS?

Greenwood: "Probably go to Walmart."

Gutierrez: "It will probably buy groceries."

Caldera: "That, I don't know. We'll still find out."

GAS PRICES ARE HISTORICALLY LOW BEFORE ELECTIONS. THAT'S WHY SOME PEOPLE CHOSE TO FILL UP ON MONDAY.

Greenwood: "I'm apprehensive that the prices will go back up after the election. Like maybe Wednesday, they'll shoot back up."

THAT SAID, THIS CUSTOMER IS STAYING OPTOMISTIC.

Greenwood: "But I hope they go down even lower. I hope they last forever."

ACCORDING TO TRIPLE A, PRCES ARE EXPECTED TO KEEP GOING DOWN ABOUT ANOTHER 15 CENTS AND STAY DOWN THROUGH THE HOLIDAY SEASON.

WE SAW HUNDRED OF FAMILIES CAMPING OUT OVERNIGHT, BRAVING THE COLD AND THE FOG, TO ENSURE THEY WILL BE GETTING SOME HELP OVER THE HOLIDAYS. THIS IS HERE AT SACRED HEART COMMUNITY SERVICE IN SAN JOSE. AFTER THESE FAMILIES REGISTER TODAY, LATER THIS MONTH OVER THANKSGIVING AND NEXT MONTH OVER CHRISTMAS THEY CAN RECEIVE A THANKSGIVING OR A CHRISTMAS FOOD BOX STOCKED FULL WITH A TURKEY AND ALL THE SIDES. THEY CAN ALSO REGISTER FOR A TOY GIVEAWAY THAT TAKES PLACE THE END OF DECEMBER TO ENSURE THEIR KIDS RECEIVE GIFTS OVER THE HOLIDAYS.

Samantha Skinner, San Jose resident: "This is my first time coming out. I have volunteered here in the past, but this year I need the help myself."

ORGANIZERS HERE AT SACRED HEART EXPECT TO HELP SEVEN THOUSAND PEOPLE HERE OVER HOLIDAYS, BUT THEY SAY, UNLIKE IN YEARS PAST, THEY'RE SEEING A LOT OF PEOPLE WHO DO HAVE JOBS BUT ARE NOT MAKING ENOUGH MONEY TO AFFORD HOLIDAY TOYS OR MEALS.

Poncho Guevara, Sacred Heart representative: "They still need help. They need support. They are feeling frustrated because they see the wealth and prosperity all around them, but they're not seeing it in their pocketbooks and they find they are falling further and further behind."

11/12/14 KRON 4 News at 8pm Lower gas prices predicted

GASOLINE PRICES WILL FALL BELOW 3 DOLLARS A GALLON NEXT YEAR. THAT WHAT THE THE GOVERNMENT IS PREDICTING. THE ENERGY DEPARTMENT SAYS, ON AVERAGE, AMERICAN DRIVERS WILL PAY\$2.94 A GALLON. AND THAT'S ALMOST 50 CENTS CHEAPER THAN THIS YEAR.

BASED ON CURRENT GAS CONSUMPTION, THE LOWER ESTIMATE WILL SAVE DRIVERS AND THE ECONOMY MORE THAN 60 BILLION DOLLARS. ECONOMISTS EXPLAIN THAT LOWER GAS PRICES ACT LIKE A TAX CUT, LEAVING PEOPLE MORE MONEY TO SPEND ON OTHER THINGS. 11/12/14 KRON 4 News at 8pm Local food bank received windfall donation

ABOUT 25 THOUSAND POUNDS OF FROZEN TURKEY SPILLED ONTO THE FREEWAY AFTER A BIG RIG OVERTURNED AND CRASHED IN SAN RAMON. THE CRASH SNARLED TRAFFIC FOR MUCH OF THE MORNING ON SOUTHBOUND INSTERSTATE 680. THE DRIVER WAS HEADED TO A COSTCO IN TRACY, WHEN HE ACCIDENTALLY GOT OFF AT THE WRONG OFF-RAMP WHERE A SHARP TURN LED TO THE TRUCK TIPPING OVER.

THE DRIVER SUFFERED A MINOR HEAD INJURY, BUT AFTER THE ACCIDENT ALL OF THOSE TURKEYS WERE HEADED TO THE DUMPSTER. UNTIL KRON4 STEPPED IN AND CONNECTED THE DRIVER WITH A LOCAL FOOD BANK. KRON 4'S MAUREEN KELLY WAS AT THE FOOD BANK AS THE SURPRISE WINDFALL WAS DELIVERED AND SHE GOT THE REACTION:

THANKSGIVING CAME EARLY TO THE ALAMEDA COUNTY COMMUNTIY FOODBANK, IN THE FORM OF THIS BIG RIG HAULING IN THE TRUCKLOAD OF THE 15 TO 20 THOUSAND POUNDS OF FROZEN TURKEYS DEEMED SALVAGEABLE AFTER THE CRASH.

BEFORE THEY COULD BE ACCEPTED, A HEALTH INSPECTOR HAD TO CHECK THEM OUT AND TEST THEM TO MAKE SURE THEY WERE STILL COLD ENOUGH. THEY HAD BEEN FROZEN SOLID BEFORE THE ACCIDENT, BUT SPENT A CHUNK OF TIME UNREFRIGERATED AFTERWARDS. BUT THE TEMPERATURE READING WAS GOOD NEWS FOR THE CHARITY.

Gene Ostrovsy, Alameda County Health Agency inspector: "It's tells me that it's frozen. It's good to be loaded into the walk in freezer."

AND THEN THE FOOD BANK EMPLOYEES WENT TO WORK, USING FORKLIFTS TO HAUL THE 9 PALLETS OF BUTTERBALL TURKEYS OUT OF THE TRAILER AND INTO COLD STORAGE.

Suzan Bateson, Alameda County Community Food Bank director: "I think it did a happy dance when the health inspector said they were okay."

THE CHARITY'S EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SAYS THE SURPRISE DONATION CAME AT THE PERFECT TIME.

Bateson: "We are so grateful that KRON4 was able to make that connection for the company and help them hear about food banks who need turkey's year round, but especially this time of year. It's a wonderful windfall for us. We are looking at record need in our community, so we know these will be put to good use. Protein like turkeys is very expensive for food banks like ours to acquire."

THEY SAY THESE TURKEYS WILL GO OUT FOR THANKSGIVING AND MAKE A DENT INTO THE 5 TO 10 THOUSAND BIRDS THEY TYPICALLY GIVE OUT DURING THE HOLIDAY SEASON.

Bateson: "While it's really terrible for the driver, it's really great for food banks in the East Bay."

TODAY SERVERAL PROMINENT DRAG QUEENS, INCLUDING SISTERS ROMA AND HECKLINE, HELD A VICTORY RALLY AT SAN FRANCISCO CITY HALL. THE GROUP APPLAUDED FACEBOOK'S DECISION TO CHANGE ITS "REAL NAME" POLICY, A DECISION WHICH COMES WEEKS AFTER THE DRAG QUEENS WERE KICKED OFF THEIR ACCOUNTS.

TWO MEN WHO SUED THE STATE WERE AMONG THE FIRST TO GET THEIR MARRIAGE LICENSE IN VIRGINIA.

"Thank you so much. It was a pleasure suing you."

THEIR CASE ENDED THIS WEEK AS THE U.S. SUPREME COURT REFUSED TO ISSUE A RULING ON LAWS BANNING STATES FROM RECOGNIZING SAME SEX MARRIAGES. FIVE STATES DEFENDING THOSE BANS NOW HAVE TO START ISSUING SAME SEX MARRIAGE LICENSES. SIMILAR BANS IN SIX OTHER STATES LIKELY ARE NOT FAR BEHIND.

IN NORTH CAROLINA FOR EXAMPLE, 61% OF VOTERS SUPPORTED A LAW DEFINING MARRIAGE AS BETWEEN A MAN AND A WOMAN, BUT THE GOVERNOR SAYS HIS ADMINISTRATION WILL NO LONGER FIGHT TO KEEP THAT LAW ON THE BOOKS.

Governor: "My chief legal counsel has advised me that it's probably a matter of time."

THE LACK OF A SUPREME COURT DECISION CAUSES FRUSTRATION ON BOTH SIDES OF THE ISSUE, MAKINJG SAME SEX MARRIAGE LEGAL IN ABOUT HALF THE U.S., AND LEAVING IT UNRECOGNIZED IN THE REST OF THE STATES. UTAH'S GOVERNOR SAYS IT LEAVES THE COUNTRY WITH A PATCHWORK OF LAWS.

Gary Herbert, governor of Utah: "I am surprised about this and disappointed. I believe that the people deserve to have this hearing. To have the Supreme Court do that job I thought was appropriate to resolve the issue and give us some finality."

WHILE SOME CEREMONIES STARTED RIGHT AFTER THE ANNOUNCEMENT, OFFICIALS SAY THIS TIME THERE'S NO RUSH.

Joseph Czarnezki, Milwaukee County Clerk, "The ban on same sex marriage is not ever going to go into effect here in the state of Wisconsin."

Same sex partner: "We can finally plan our wedding. We can invite our family members and our friends and celebrate together!"

And this morning, I began to take some of those actions."

PRESIDENT OBAMA HIT THE ROAD TODAY TO SELL HIS NEW IMMIGRATION PLAN. SPEAKING AT A HIGH SCHOOL IN LAS VEGAS, THE PRESIDENT SAID NOW IS THE TIME TO ACT. THE PLAN WILL OFFER WORK AUTHORIZATION FOR NEARLY FIVE MILLION UNDOCUMENTED PARENTS OF U.S. CITIZENS OR LEGAL PERMANENT RESIDENTS, AS LONG AS THEY HAVE LIVED IN THE U.S. FOR FIVE YEARS OR MORE.

ONE DAY AFTER THE PRESIDENT ANNOUNCED A PATH FOR MILLIONS OF UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS TO LEGALLY STAY IN THIS COUNTRY, THERE IS A LOT OF INTENSE REACTION TO THE CONTROVERSIAL PLAN. TONIGHT, WHAT THE REPUBLICANS ARE SAYING AND WHAT SOME PEOPLE IN THE BAY AREA THINK ABOUT IT ALL. BUT FIRST, CATHERINE HEENAN IS HERE TO SHOW US HOW MR. OBAMA SYMBOLICALLY ENACTED HIS NEW LAW TODAY:

DETERMINED TO GO IT ALONE, PRESIDENT OBAMA WAS IN NEVADA TODAY TO SIGN AN EXECUTIVE ORDER AIMED AT HELPING MILLIONS OF IMMIGRANTS WHO ARE IN THE COUNTRY ILLEGALLY. HE WAS AT THE SAME LAS VEGAS HIGH SCHOOL WHERE HE UNVEILED HIS PLAN TO OVERHAUL IMMIGRATION NEARLY TWO YEARS AGO. HE'S TAKING STEPS DESIGNED TO MAKE NEARLY 5 MILLION IMMIGRANTS ELIGIBLE FOR PROTECTION FROM DEPORTATION AND FOR WORK PERMITS.

HE GOT A MOSTLY WARM RECEPTION, BUT WAS ALSO HECKLED AT ONE POINT. THE HECKLER WAS A TEACHER WHO SAYS HE DOESN'T THINK THE PRESIDENT IS TAKING HIS REFORMS FAR ENOUGH. MEANTIME, REPUBLICAN LEADERS ARE VOWING TO FIGHT THE PRESIDENT ON HIS PLAN EVERY STEP OF THE WAY, FURIOUS THAT HE'S BYPASSING CONGRESS. STEVE NANNES HAS THAT STORY:

THIS MORNING, REPUBLICANS FIRED BACK.

Rep. John Boehner, (R) House Speaker: "We will not stand idle as the president undermines the rule of law in our country and places lives at risk."

HOUSE SPEAKER JOHN BOEHNER SAYS THE PRESIDENT IS OVERSTEPPING HIS AUTHORITY BY BYPASSING CONGRESS.

Boehner: "The president has taken actions that he, himself, has said are those of a king or an emperor, not an American president."

THE PRESIDENT CALLS HIS ACTIONS LAWFUL AND IN HIS ADDRESS, THE PRESIDENT LEFT THE DOOR OPEN TO A BIPARTISAN DEAL.

Obama: "I want to work with both parties to pass a more permanent legislative solution."

BUT, AT LEAST FOR NOW, THAT DOOR APPEARS TO BE SLAMMED SHUT.

Boehner: "The President has chosen to deliberately sabotage any chance of enacting bipartisan reforms."

IN WASHINGTON, I'M STEVE NANNES REPORTING

LOCAL IMMIGRATION REFORM ACTIVISTS ARE HAILING THE PRESIDENT'S ACTION AS THE ONLY WAY FORWARD FOR THE MILLIONS OF UNDOCUMENTED WORKERS IN THE COUNTRY. KRON 4'S ROB FLADEBOE HAS THEIR REACTION NOW FROM THE SOUTH BAY:

THIS WAS THE SCENE AT A SAN JOSE UNION HALL THIS AFTERNOON, WHERE DOZENS OF IMMIGRANTS AND ACTIVISTS ALIKE GATHERED TO WATCH THE PRESIDENT'S LAS VEGAS SPEECH. EMOTIONS WERE RUNNING HIGH, AS SEVERAL UNDOCUMENTED RESIDENTS OF SILICON VALLEY EXPRESSED THEIR HOPE THAT CONGRESS OR A NEW PRESIDENT WILL NOT UNDO MR. OBAMA'S ACTION.

ERNESTO PEREZ, WHO SAYS HE HAS BEEN LIVING IN THE SHADOWS FOR YEARS, SAYS HE WILL BE AMONG THE FIRST TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE PROGRAM WHEN THE TIME COMES.

Perez: "I just look at this. This is the future for me. Even for my daughters, the future is here."

LOCAL IMMIGRATION REFORM ACTIVISTS ARE CALLING THE PRESIDENT'S EXECUTIVE ACTION BETTER LATE THAN NEVER, AGREEING WITH CONGRESWOMAN ZOE LOFGREN AND OTHERS THAT THIS IS THE ONLY WAY FORWARD.

Zoe Lofgren: "If they don't like this action, the remedy if obvious. Pass a bill. Do your job as legislators. Don't tell the President because you're not doing your job, he can't do his."

THE PRESIDENT'S COMMENT THAT THIS IS NOT JUST A LATINO ISSUE IS ESPECIALLY TRUE IN SILICON VALLEY, NOW HOME TO UNDOCUMENTED WORKERS FROM INDIA AND PACIFIC ISLAND NATIONS, SAYS THE ASIAN LAW ALLIANCE'S RICHARD KONDA.

Richard Konda, Asian Law Alliance: "It could be that they arrive on a temporary work visa and for whatever reason is not at that same job and that visa expired, but they just remained here. Other times, people come as visitors or tourists or students and overstay."

WHILE MANY OF THESE FOLKS REMAIN SKEPTICAL THAT'S THE SO-CALLED ADMINSITRATIVE RELIEF IS TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE AND WORRY THAT CONGRESS OR A NEW PRESIDENT WILL UNDO THE PRESIDENT'S ACTION. ERNESTO PEREZ PLANS TO BE AMONG THE FIRST TO SIGN UP FOR IT.

Perez: "I feel really proud about the decision from the President because right now my daughters feel happy because I'm not afraid any more. I can come out of the shadows and show to people that I'm a good person. I'm a good man and deserve the opportunity to live out of the shadows."

PEREZ SAYS HE UNDERSTANDS THE PRESIDENT'S ADMINISTRATIVE RELIEF PLAN MEANS HE CAN ONLY APPLY FOR DEFERRED ACTION.. TO REMAIN IN THE U.S. TEMPORARILY AND A GET A WORK PERMIT, BUT HE IS HOPEFUL IT COULD BE A STEPPING STONE TO BECOMING A U.S. CITIZEN.

SOME WITNESSES ARGUED THE TEENAGER HAD HIS HANDS IN THE AIR WHEN HE WAS SHOT. BOTTOM LINE, AFTER THREE MONTHS OF HEARING TESTIMONY THE GRAND JURY DID NOT INDICT OFFICER WILSON ON ANY CHARGE. IN FERGUSON, THERE IS CONCERN THAT PROTESTS - NOW UNDERWAY - COULD TURN VIOLENT TONIGHT.

IN A STATEMENT, THE FAMILY SAID, "We are not here to be violent. We are here in memory of our son. We are here for protection of all children."

THE TWELVE JURORS CAME TO THEIR DECISION AFTER MONTHS SPENT REVIEWING EVIDENCE AND TESTIMONY SURROUNDING BROWN'S DEATH.

POLICE SAID THERE WAS A STRUGGLE, WITH BROWN TRYING TO GRAB WILSON'S GUN, AND THAT THE OFFICER FIRED IN SELF-DEFENSE.

BUT BROWN'S FAMILY AND SOME EYE-WITNESSES SAID WILSON WAS THE AGGRESSOR, SHOOTING BROWN AS THE TEENAGER RAISED HIS HANDS TO SURRENDER.

NOW FERGUSON IS BRACING FOR MORE DEMONSTRATIONS...

Daniel Isom, Missouri Public Safety Director: "Our hope is that this will be peaceful, that we will have peaceful protests."

Jeff Roorda, St.Louis Police Officers Association: "We're hoping for the best, but bracing for the worst."

SHOPS ARE BOARDING UP WINDOWS. SCHOOL DISTRICTS ARE CLOSING TUESDAY, INCLUDING THE FERGUSON FLORISSANT DISTRICT. AUTHORITES SAY THEY WILL NOT TOLERATE VIOLENCE... AND NATIONAL GUARD TROOPS ARE ON THE GROUND TO HELP POLICE KEEP THE PEACE.

NEAR FERGUSON, MISSOURI, I'M CHRIS WELCH REPORTING.

WHILE OAKLAND HAS SEEN MORE THAN ITS SHARE OF PROTESTS AND VANDALISM, THIS TIME AROUND MOST BUSINESSES OPTED NOT TO BOARD UP. KRON 4'S DAN KERMAN SPOKE TO TWO BUSINESSES ABOUT THAT DECISION:

Baker: "They've always been respectful of us being a small business."

SHE IS NOT ALONE

Rudi Wilson: "We don't usually board up our windows for any protests."

OAKLAND ASSISTANT MANAGER RUDI WILSON SAYS THEY TOO DON'T FEEL THE NEED TO BOARD UP, DESPITE BEING VANDALIZED IN THE PAST.

Wilson: "Last year during the Trayvon Martin verdict we were vandalized. We had our windows smashed. But we don't take any extra measures. We close up like normal, like it's a normal day. We give the city so much love that we hope they return it to us."

Bennet Hall, Business Image Group: "The more recent concern we noticed is what we called See Click Not Fix where the city has been actually been robo-signing issues closed when in fact they're not closed and not touched."

THIS IS BENNET HALL A BUSINESS OWNER IN OAKALND AND HE HAS BEEN DOCUMENTING FAILURES IN THE SEE CLICK FIX APPLICATION.

THE WAY IT'S SUPPOSED TO WORK IS YOU SEE SOMETHING LIKE ILLEGAL DUMPING, YOU TAKE A PICTURE OF IT WITH YOUR CAMERA AND YOU SEND IT IN TO THE CITY. THEY FIX IT AND TELL YOU IT'S DONE. THAT IS THE WAY THE APPLICATION SHOULD WORK. HOWEVER, THAT'S NOT WHAT'S HAPPENING, ACCORDING TO BENNET HALL.

Hall: "So what happens – and it's not just here; it's in West Oakland, it's in Lakeshore; it's been a number of other areas – I became aware of other posts on See Click Fix where citizens were saying this was not closed, what do you mean this was closed. And they would reopen it and document it by reshowing the same graffiti or blight still existing after the city had closed the issue."

FOR EXAMPLE, THIS PILE OF ILLEGALLY DUMPED FURNITURE WAS REPORTED ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2014 AND WAS CLOSED BY THE CITY ON SEPTEMBER 11 AS CLEANED UP. BUT AS YOU CAN SEE, IT WASN'T.

HERE'S ANOTHER ONE THAT SAYS CLOSED. WAS IT CLOSED?

Hall: "It was not closed. These same sofas, which have distinguishing look, stayed on the street."

GET THIS – FOR MORE THAN A MONTH AFTER THE CITY CLOSED THE ACCOUNT CLAIMING IT WAS CLEANED UP. AND BENNET HALL HAS THREE MORE EXAMPLES OF THE SAME THING - ITEMS BEING CLOSED BY THE CITY BUT NEVER CLEANED UP.

Eric Linville, Eco Framing: "I submit something to See Click Fix and sometimes it takes a week sometimes it takes only a couple of days before they say they cleaned it up. But they never did."

SO I PUT IN A CALL TO THE CITY OF OAKLAND WHERE OFFICIALS TELL ME THEY ARE AWARE OF SOME GLITCHES IN THE SEE CLICK FIX APPLICATION AND ARE WORKING ON FIXING THEM. AS YOU KNOW, I HAVE BEEN ON THE FOREFRONT OF COMBATTING ILLEGAL DUMPING IN OAKLAND. SO, I ASKED A LOT OF THE PEOPLE RUNNING FOR OFFICE ONE SIMPLE QUESTION: WHAT IS YOUR SOLUTION TO ENDING ILLEGAL DUMPING IN OAKLAND?

Bryan Parker: "My solution to ending illegal dumping in Oakland is to make sure we enforce the laws we have; make legal dumping free to incent people to take their stuff to the city dump; and then to fine them and pursue them criminally if they are caught dumping. With See Click Fix, I would make sure we are keeping an accurate matrix and reporting that out to the public, along with information on how long it took us to fix a complaint and how many closes we've had in each quarter."

Courtney Ruby: "The solution to fixing illegal dumping in Oakland is to have an accountable government. For eight years, I've been reported out that City Hall is broken. We need a mayor who will hold City Hall accountable and making sure when a citizen puts in a report of See Click Fix that it gets picked up. That's about accountable leadership."

Joe Tuman: "The first part of the answer is you have to recognize that there are different causes for illegal dumping in East and West Oakland. They have to do with homelessness. They have to do with illegal haulers who are supposed to take things to the dump, but don't. And also u-haul companies that rent out trailers and have people that leave stuff on the side of the road before they take the truck back. It's not one solution that fits all. But I will say this. The best way to fix illegal dumping in Oakland is to recognize the hot spots that we have and have sting operations there. As mayor of Oakland what I would argue to do is impound vehicles that are involved in that illegal activity, for at least one month, charging a fee to get their vehicles back and send a message to people who are doing this that you will pay a price for this in Oakland."

Ken Houston: "What I would do is exactly what I'm doing right now. I would restructure Public Works. Get rid of the dead weight. I would implement policies that are already in place. And third, I would continue to work with the District Attorney and the FBI to get these violators and I'm already doing it."

THE IDEA IS BACKED BY NURSES, TEACHERS, TRIAL LAWYERS AND CALIFORNIA'S TWO DEMOCRATIC SENATORS. OPPONENTS INCLUDE DOCTORS, INSURANCE COMPANIES AND THE CALIFORNIA REPUBLICAN PARTY. THEIR 20 TO 1 FUNDING ADVANTAGE YIELDED AN ADVERTISING BLITZ THAT CUT A MAJORITY SUPPORT LAST SUMMER TO JUST 39 PERCENT IN THE LATEST POLL BY THE PUBLIC POLICY INSTITUTE.

PROPOSITION 46 WOULD DO THREE THINGS: INCREASE THE CAP ON PAIN AND SUFFERING DAMAGES IN MEDICAL MALPRACTICE SUITES; REQUIRE RANDOM DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTS FOR DOCTORS; AND MAKE IT MANDATORY FOR HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS TO CONSULT A STATEWIDE DATABSE BEFORE DISPENSING POTENTIALLY ABUSIVE DRUGS TO MAKE SURE THE PATIENT WAS NOT GETTING THE SAME DRUG FROM ANOTHER DOCTOR. IN SAN FRANCISCO, THERE IS A PROPOSAL TO CHARGE AN ADDITIONAL TWO CENTS PER OUCE ON SUGAR SWEETENED BEVERAGES LIKE SODA. IN BERKELEY THE CITY WOULD CHARGE 1 CENT PER OUNCE IF PASSED. SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS IN BOTH CITIES WERE QUICK TO GIVE THEIR THOUGHTS ON THE MATTER.

Shop owner: "It's totally crazy. It's going to be crazy. I think they shouldn't do it. If they pass it, it will be hard on our business for sure."

A 20 OUNCE SUGARY DRINK WOULD BE TAXED 20 CENTS IN BERKELEY AND 40 CENTS IN SAN FRANCISCO. THAT ANGERED MANY THAT I TALKED WITH ON MONDAY NIGHT.

Consumer: "Why are they always going after us, the middle class and us poor people who can't afford it with a tax? If we find pleasure in soda, why are they allowing it to come on the market at all?"

Consumer: "I don't like to see it coming from the government. I don't like the government telling me what to do, telling me to pay an extra 50 cents for a soda."

Grocery store owner: "I know how much additional will come into my registers to the tune of 4 thousand to 6 thousand dollars every month that we will be collecting additionally from our customers."

THOSE SUPPORTING THE MEASURES SAY IT'S ABOUT HEALTHY LIVING.

Erwin: "When you have Type 2 diabetes, this is a serious impact on your body."

THE CAMPAIGN FOR SAN JOSE MAYOR ENDED A COUPLE OF DAYS AGO BUT YOU WOULDN'T KNOW IT JUDGING FROM THE SCENE OUTSIDE THE POLICE DEPARTMENT THURSDAY AFTERNOON. COUNTY SUPERVISOR MAYORAL CANDIDATE DAVE CORTESE, THE APPARENT RUNNER-UP SO FAR IN THE CAMPAIGN, COULD BE SEEN MEETING AND GREETING RANK AND FILE OFFICERS DURING THEIR SHIFT CHANGE, THANKING THEM FOR THEIR SUPPORT. ALTHOUGH HE TRAILS CITY COUNCILMAN SAM LICCARDO AS THE VOTES CONTINUE TO BE COUNTED, CORTESE HAS SO FAR REFUSED TO CONCEDE THE RACE BECAUSE THERE ARE STILL THOUSANDS OF VOTES TO BE COUNTED AND CORTESE SAYS IT ISN'T OVER UNTIL LICCARDO IS OFFICIALLY DECLARED THE WINNER.

Supervisor Dave Cortese: "The Registrar of Voters counts votes, first in first out. And we believe the last batch of votes that they are counting is most likely to represent the GOTV effort that we made with hundreds of volunteers and I put a lot of money behind it. So we'll see what happens, but we want to see. That's the main point here."

BASED ON WHAT HE SAYS IS A LEAD THAT IS NOT LIKELY TO CHANGE MUCH, SAM LICCARDO DECLARED VICTORY ON WEDNESDAY. I ASKED SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY POLITICAL SCIENCE PROFESSOR MELINDA JACKSON ABOUT THE RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH THAT. Melinda Jackson, San Jose State University: "Well there is a little bit of a risk, I will say that. Every vote counts and you want to make sure every vote is counted. A NEW RULING CAME TODAY FROM SAN FRANCISCO'S FEDERAL APPEALS COURT THAT AFFECTS GUN OWNERS AND LAW ENFORCEMENT. IT HAS TO DO WITH CONCEALED WEAPONS HERE IN CALIFORNIA. KRON 4'S VICKI LIVIAKIS IS HERE TO EXPLAIN:

GUN OWNERS ARE PLEASED. SHERIFFS ARE WORRIED.

GUN-RIGHTS ADVOCATES CHALLENGED THE CURRENT LAW. RIGHT NOW IT REQUIRES CONCEALED CARRY PERMIT APPLICANTS TO SHOW GOOD MORAL CHARACTER, GOOD CAUSE, AND TAKE A TRAINING COURSE AT A FIRING RANGE. THOSE PERMITS ARE ISSUED BY EITHER POLICE CHIEFS OR THE COUNTY SHERIFF. THIS NEW RULING BY THE NINTH CIRCUIT COURT DRAMATICALLY LOOSENS UP THE RESTRICTIONS.

RESPONSE FROM ONE GUN RIGHTS GROUP: "WE'RE STARTING TO SMELL THE HINT OF FREEDOM IN THE AIR AND IT SMELLS GOOD."

POLICE GROUPS SAY ANY CITY SHOULD HAVE THE RIGHT TO REASONABLY RESTRICT THE CARRYING OF LOADED, HIDDEN HANDGUNS IN PUBLIC. CALIFORNIA'S ATTORNEY GENERAL IS REVIEWING THE RULING TO DECIDE WHETHER OR NOT TO APPEAL. IT MIGHT EVEN MAKE IT TO THE SUPREME COURT.

Aguirre: "We have 300 people who are all trying to find a place to live and those people are going to go wherever they can go."

AND THAT'S EXACDTLY WHAT HAPPENED. AFTER THE JUNGLE WAS CLEARED OUT LAST THRUSDAY, THE HOMELESS PEOPLE WHO HAD BEEN LIVING THERE MOVED TO DIFFERENT PARTS OF THE CITY. SOME WENT JUST A FEW MILES A WAY TO A WOODED AREA ON COYOTE CREEK OF TULLY ROAD. THIS ENCAMPMENT IS ALREADY BEING REFERRED TO AS THE JUNGLE 2.0. OTHERS MOVED CLOSER TO DOWNTOWN – LIKE A NEW ENCAMPMENT AT 22<sup>ND</sup> AND TAYLOR STREETS RIGHT NEAR AN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL.

AND THAT, AGUIRRE SAYS, IS EXACTLY WHAT THE CITY DIDN'T WANT.

Aguirre: "The city has spent a lot of money trying to get people to move out of the downtown area and out of the creeks and the river."

BUT, ACCORDING TO AGUIRRE, CLOSING THE JUNGLE IS INDICATIVE OF A MUCH LARGER PROBLEM.

Aguirre, "This is not an issue of homelessness that the city is looking at; they are not looking at the problem of homelessness. But that the homeless people are the problem. Not the other way around, where we have a homeless problem and we need to solve that problem for homeless people. There's a big difference."

HUNDREDS OF FISH DEAD AT LAKE CUNNINGHAM IN EAST SAN JOSE. DEAD CARP, SOME MORE THAN TWENTY POUNDS, ARE WASHING UP ON THE ROCKS, ALONG WITH VARIOUS OTHERS KIDS OF FISH. FREQUENT PARK VISITOR MARY MIRANDA BROUGHT THE PROBLEM TO OUR ATTENTION IN THIS "MY KRON 4 STORY":

Mary Miranda: "The smell is just getting worse. We were walking here today and I thought, I don't want to come back. But this is my normal routine that we come here with my daughter and my husband. But, it's not pleasant. It's not a pleasant environment."

MARY MIRANDA FOUGHT BACK THE URGE TO HOLD HER NOSE AS SHE POINTED OUT THE PROBLEM HERE AT LAKE CUNNINGHAM IN EAST SAN JOSE. DEAD FISH. HUNDREDS OF THEM.

Miranda: "You can see them all around the lake, in the corners. If you really look, they are underneath the rocks and on the side. All along the trail you can see them.

DEAD CARP ARE WASHING UNDER THE ROCKS, ALONG WITH SUCKERS, CAT FISH AND OTHER ROUGH FISH. MARY MIRANDA WANTS TO KNOW WHY.

Miranda: "I'm worried. I don't want to see sick people around. There are so many viruses and people are getting sick. So, yes, I am concerned."

THE SAN JOSE PARKS DEPARTMENT IS INVESTIGATING. THIS CREW WAS SCOOPING UP DEAD FISH TODAY AND TESTING THE WATER WHICH HAS GROWN STAGNANT. MIRANDA IS ALSO CONCERNED FOR THE TURKEY VULTURES AND OTHER BIRDS THAT ARE FEASTING ON THE DEAD FISH. THERE IS SO FAR NO BAN ON FISHING HERE, AND MIRANDA FINDS THAT, TOO, A BIT TROUBLING.

Miranda: "I'd like to get an answer as to what's going on with these fish and are they okay to eat? People are fishing out here and there's no signs to prohibit fishing."

A REGULAR VISITOR TO LAKE CUNNINGHAM, MIRANDA HAS SEEN DEAD FISH HERE IN YEARS PAST, BUT NEVER SO MANY. SHE PLANS TO STAY AWAY UNTIL THE MYSTERY IS SOLVED.

Miranda: "I've come here for several years and I've never seen anything like this."

Miranda: "I'm Mary Miranda, and that's my KRON 4 story."

KRON 4'S ROB FLADEBOE BRINGS YOU UP TO DATE ON A STORY WE FIRST TOLD YOU ABOUT EARLIER THIS MONTH, WHEN VISITORS COMPLAINED ABOUT THE DEAD FISH WASHING ASHORE AT LAKE CUNNINGHAM IN SAN JOSE: THE GOOD NEWS IS NOT ALL THE FISH IN LAKE CUNNINGHAM ARE DYING. THIS FOUR-POUND CATFISH WAS LANDED ALONG THE NORTH SHORE EARLY MONDAY BUT FISHERMEN SAY THERE ARE STILL FAR MORE DEAD FISH THAN LIVE ONES.

Toti Marcello, local fisherman: "I fish here every day for many years. This year is the worst year. I have never seen this many fish die."

IN HER 'MY KRON FOUR 4 STORY' EARLIER THIS MONTH, LAKE CUNNINGHAM VISITOR MARY MIRANDA CALLED OUR ATTENTION TO THE PROBLEM.

Mary Miranda: "It's not pleasant. It's not a pleasant environment."

WE HAVE SINCE LEARNED THAT THE ON-GOING DROUGHT AND LOW WATER LEVELS HAVE MADE WORSE A FISH DIE-OFF THAT OCCURS TO A CERTAIN EXTENT EVERY YEAR ABOUT THIS TIME AS THE WATER GROWS STAGNANT.

ROSE PEREZ SAYS IT TAKES THE FUN OUT OF HER DAILY RIDE AROUND THE LAKE.

Rose Perez: "I told my husband something's not right. It didn't feel right and it didn't smell right either."

MOST OF THE DEAD FISH ARE BEING CLEANED UP OR ARE BEING EATEN BY BIRDS, BUT THE WATER IS GREEN WITH ALGAE. BAKED BY THE RELENTLESS LATE SEASON HEAT, THE WATER LEVEL IS GROWING INCREASINGLY SHALLOW IN PLACES AND LACKS SUFFICIENT OXYGEN FOR THE FISH.

EVEN SO, FISHING IS STILL PERMITTED AND THERE ARE NO ADVISORIES ABOUT EATING THE FISH. TOTI MARCELLA FISHES FOR FUN NOT FOOD, BUT HE'S WORRIED THAT SOON THERE WILL BE NO FISH LEFT TO CATCH AT ALL.

Marcello: "If they all die, I have nowhere else to go. This is the only place I can go."

FISH ARE DYING IN OUR FAST DISAPPEARING RESERVOIRS AND STREAMS WITH NO RELIEF UNTIL THE RETURN OF WINTER RAINS. WHEN THAT HAPPENS, LAKE CUNNINGHAM IS EXPECTED TO BOUNCE BACK. AND SO WILL THE FISH.

KATHY MARINELLI IS ONE OF MANY IN PACIFICA UPSET ABOUT SITTING IN THIS TRAFFIC ALONG HIGHWAY ONE WHERE THE SAN PEDRO CREEK BRIDGE IS BEING REPLACED. A CONSTRUCTION SITE THAT, AS OF THIS WEEK, IS BARREN. WILDLIFE RESTRICTIONS MEAN NO MAJOR ONSITE WORK FOR THE NEXT 5 MONTHS.

Marinelli: "Five months! Five months! Oh my god."

YOU CAN BLAME THIS GUY AND THIS GUY FOR THAT DELAY – A RED-LEGGED FROG AND A STEELHEAD TROUT. THEY ARE ENDANGERED ANIMALS THAT HAVE BEEN FOUND IN THIS CREEK AREA. AND BECAUSE THEY'VE BEEN FOUND HERE, CALTRANS CREWS ARE NOT ABLE TO WORK UNTIL APRIL IN THE AREA THAT IS PROTECTED ON A FEDERAL LEVEL BECAUSE OF ITS WETLANDS STATUS.

Marinelli: "It's frustrating... The traffic backs up bumper to bumper. It's very irritating and I'm done with it."

Pacifica resident: "Traffic gets backed up all the way down there and now there is not work being done."

THOSE WORKING ON THE PROJECT TELL ME THAT THE DELAY IS NOT A SURPRISE AND IS SOMETHING THAT WAS WRITTEN WITHIN THE PERMIT OF THE PROJECT. BUT THAT NEWS IS UNLIKELY TO SOOTHE THE THOUGHTS OF THOSE WHO SAY THE TRAFFIC HERE HAS BECOME A NIGHTMARE ON WEEKENDS.

Marinelli "I don't know who makes the decisions around here, but they don't use their brain."

CALTRANS SAYS THAT EVEN WITH THE DELAY, THIS PROJECT SHOULD BE FINISHED BY OCTOBER 2015.

CALTRANS HAS SPENT BIG MONEY TRYING TO LURE THE BIRDS AWAY FROM THE OLD SPAN, BUT IT'S NOT WORKING. SO FAR, THE BIRDS HAVE NOT BUDGED. AND THAT IS LEADING TO COSTLY DELAYS IN THE DEMOLITION OF THE OLD SPAN. A SPOKES PERSON WITH THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORATION COMMISSIONS SAYS THE DELAY IS PUTTING CALTRANS AT RISK OF GOING OVER BUDGET ON THE ENTIRE BAY BRIDGE PROJECT IF THOSE BIRDS AREN'T MOVED SOON. CALTRANS ENGINEERS ARE TRYING TO FIND A SOLUTION, WHICH COULD MEAN PUTTING NETS ON THE OLD BRIDGE. BUT IN THE MEANTIME WORK ON DEMOLISHING THE OLD BRIDGE HAS BEEN DELAYED UNTIL AT LEAST FEBRUARY.

SEA WORLD SAYS IT IS DOING ITS PART TO CONSERVE WATER DURING CALIFORNIA'S DROUGHT AND IT'S A CONCEPT YOU MAY HAVE NEVER SEEN OR HEARD OF – SALTWATER RESTROOMS. JEFF ZEVELY SHOWS US HOW THE NEW SYSTEM WORKS.

John Reilly, Seaworld Park president: "It's a really big deal to us here. It's 1.3 million gallons of water saved. That's especially important during the severe drought here in California."

THE NEW SALTWATER BATHROOMS WILL FEATURE 21 URINALS AND 34 TOILETS. EVERYWHERE YOU SEE A WHITE PLUMBING PIPE STICKING UP WILL SOON CONNECT SEAWATER TO SINKS, TOILETS AND URINALS.

Reilly: "The new facility under construction will open this spring, and we have a second facility under planning and development right now."

SEAWORLD BELIEVES THE FACILITY WILL BE THE FIRST SALTWATER BATHROOMS BUILT ON MAINLAND CALIFORNIA.

Project engineer: "It's been done in Hong Kong and also on Catalina Island."

THE FALLOUT FROM THE DOCUMENTARY "BLACK FISH" HAS HURT THE PARK'S ATTENDANCE AND THE COMPANY'S STOCK PRICE. WE ASKED SEAWORLD OFFICIALS IF SALTWATER BATHROOMS ARE PART OF A NEW PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN.

Reilly: "This is part on an ongoing conservation effort that Seaworld has undertaken for several years on water conservation."

SEAWORLD SAN DIEGO'S PARK PRESIDENT JOHN REILLY SAYS SEAWORLD HAS ALREADY BEEN SAVING MILLIONS OF GALLONS OF WATER EACH YEAR WITH DROUGHT TOLERANT PLANTS AND SPRINKLER HEADS. THE PARK ALSO INVESTED IN A NEW HIGH PRESSURE SCRUBBER THAT DEEP-CLEANS SIDEWALKS AND CUTS DOWN ON THE WASTEFUL METHOD OF SPRAYING DOWN CONCRETE SURFACES WITH HOSES.

AS FOR THE NEW SALTWATER TOILETS WE ASKED SEAWORLD IF THEY'LL FLUSH OR SMELL ANY DIFFERENT FROM THE FRESH WATER ONES.

Engineer: "Absolutely not. If we didn't tell you, you would not know it."

SEAWORLD SAYS, IT IS ALSO SAVING WATER BY REPLACING SOME OF ITS LAWN AREAS WITH ARTIFICIAL TURF.

SONOMA COUNTY WATER OFFICILAS SAY THEY ARE FEELING GOOD ABOUT WATER LEVELS IN THEIR AREA AFTER THIS RECENT SERIES OF STORMS. THE RUSSIAN RIVER IN HEALDSBURGG IS RUNNING HIGH AND FAST COMPARED TO THIS TIME LAST YEAR. THE SONOMA COUNTY WATER AGENCY SAYS THEIR TWO RESERVOIRS ARE ALSO ABOUT 75% FULL. BUT WHILE THEY SAY ALL OF THIS RAIN IS PUTTING A DENT IN THE DROUGHT, THEY NEED MORE STORMS THIS WINTER BEFORE THEY CAN SAY WE ARE IN THE CLEAR.

THE CONSISTENT RAIN HAS BEEN GOOD NEWS FOR THE SOUTH BAY. WATER LEVELS IN THE AREA'S TEN RESERVOIRS HAVE GONE UP A TOTAL OF 10 PERCENT. COUNTY WATER MANAGERS SAY THAT'S BECAUSE THE SATURATED GROUND IS SENDING MORE RAIN WATER INTO LOCAL CREEKS AND INTO THE RESERVOIRS. BUT WATER OFFICIALS ADD THIS DOES NOT MEAN IT'S TIME TO STOP CONSERVING.

Marty Grimes, Santa Clara Valley Water District: "We are definitely still in a drought. We have not seen recovery of our ground water supplies. Imported water, which we depend on in this county is still very low. So we still need to conserve."

ALL THE RAINWATER IS ADDING UP.. THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE SAYS SAN FRANCISCO HAS HAD MORE THAN ONE FOOT OF RAIN SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THE SEAON ON JULY FIRST. OAKLAND AND SAN JOSE ARE NOT FAR BEHIND.

COMPARE THOSE FIGURES TO WHERE WE WERE AT THIS POINT LAST YEAR: JUST OVER 2 INCHES IN SAN FRANCISCO AND OAKLAND AND BARELY AN INCH AND A HALF IN SAN JOSE. NOW LOOK AT THE NORMAL RAINFALL FOR THE THREE CITIES: 6.6 INCHES IN SAN FRANCISCO, 5.5 INCHES IN OAKLAND, AND JUST OVER 3.7 INCHES IN SAN JOSE.

ALL THAT RAIN IS FILLING OUR RESERVOIRS, BUT A NEW STUDY RELEASED TODAY IN SAN FRANCISCO SAYS THE DROUGHT THAT TOOK YEARS TO DEVELOP WILL TAKE YEARS TO RECOVER FROM. HASA SAYS DATA FROM ITS ORBITING EARTH MEASUREMENT SATELLITES SHOW THE DROUGHTS SERIOUS EFFECT ON CALIFORNIA'S GROUNGWATER LEVELS. AND THAT WILL TAKE TIME TO FIX.

Gilbert Jimez, Coulson-Moseley Pest Control: "As soon as the first storm hit we started getting calls left and right. A typical day we get maybe one or two calls. But we've been getting five or six calls."

WE CAUGHT UP WITH RAT SPECIALIST AND TERMITE INSPECTOR GILBERT JIMEZ WHILE RESPONDING TO A HOUSE CALL IN WALNUT CREEK.

Jimez: "We first came here a couple weeks ago. The place had holes in the eaves and you can see how we wired it up."

GILBERT SAYS THIS INFESTATION OF RATS IS A BY-PRODUCT OF THE WET WEATHER.

Jimez: "It's everywhere. Concord, Walnut Creek, Moraga, Orinda."

HE SAYS THE RATS ARE BOLTING FROM CONSTRUCTION SITES LIKE THIS ONE, THE BROADWAY PLAZA SHOPPING CENTER, AND ARE HEADING INTO RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOODS.

Jimez: "They have burrows out there in the vegetation, and when they start getting flooded by so much rain, they're getting wet and they want to get dry just like you and me. So they want to come move in with us, and I'm here to stop them from doing that."

GILBERT SPENDS HIS TIME COVERING UP HOLES CHEWED BY RATS AND SETTING TRAPS.

HE SAYS IF YOU SUSPECT YOUR HOME IS BEING OVERRUN BY RATS, GET IN TOUCH WITH A SPECIALIST IMMEDIATELY BEFORE IT GETS OUT OF CONTROL.

Jimez: "Rats can be in your attic now, ruining on insulation, chewing on wiring, getting into your heating ducts, running around and you may be breathing in their stuff."

MEASLES IS ONE OF THE WORLD'S MOST INFECTIOUS DISEASES. UNLIKE EBOLA, IT SPREADS THROUGH THE AIR. AND THE MEASLES VIRUS IS SO HARDY THAT IT CAN LINGER IN THE AIR FOR TWO HOURS AFTER AN INFECTED PEROSN LEAVES THE ROOM AND STILL INFECT THE NEXT PERSON TO WALK BY, ACCORDING TO THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION. AFTER BEING ALMOST COMPLETELY ELIMINATED IN THE U.S., IT STAGED A COMEBACK LAST YEAR WITH HEARLY 200 CASES REPORTED, NONE OF THEM FATAL.

Dr. Thomas Aragon, San Francisco County Health Officer: "One of the things we've realized is the devil is in the details. The staff need to feel very comfortable with the personal protective equipment, especially being able to take it off without becoming contaminated. Also, having procedures in place so they know how to transport a patient, how to minimize the number of laboratory blood draws that need to be done for the patient."

STAFF AT KAISER PERMANENTE ALSO ARE GETTING ADDITIONAL TRAINING ON HOW TO HANDLE SUSPECTED CASES OF EBOLA.

David Campos, San Francisco supervisor: "This is specifically focused on HIV. We're not here to replace condoms. We want people to use condoms and be responsible."

PEOPLE WHO ARE AT RISK OF CONTRACTING HIV, THAT WANT TO PROTECT THEMSELVES FROM GETTING THE VIRUS CAN TAKE PREP, ALSO KNOWN AS PRE-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS, ONCE A DAY.

Campos: "It's not only something that can help gay men, transgender men and women. We have also heard from many women who have used Truvada PREP to have unprotected sex with their partner for the purpose of having a baby. There's a lot of controversy about it, but I believe anything you can do to prevent a lot of people from being sick and dying, we should do it. It should be available to everybody."

THE NUMBER OF INFECTIONS IN GAY MEN, AFRICAN AMERICANS, LATINOS AND TRANSGENDER PEOPLE CONTINUE TO RISE. SUPERVISOR DAVID CAMPOS SAYS NOT ONLY WILL THIS PILL HELP STOP NEW INFECTIONS, BUT THE CITY WILL SAVE HUNDREDS OF MILLIONS OF DOLLARS BECAUSE OF THIS EFFORT.

Campos: "For every HIV infection that we prevent, we are saving, as a city, anywhere from 350 to 500 thousand dollars in treatment over the life of that individual."

EXERCISING AFTER EATING A LARGE MEAL NOT ONLY KEEPS OFF THE EXTRA POUNDS BUT A MODERATE AMOUNT OF EXERCISE CAN ADD YEARS TO YOUR LIFE. JIM MORELLI HAS THE DETAILS IN TODAY'S HEALTH MINUTE:

Dr. Aaron Baggish: "It's the one thing, the one magic bullet that everyone can do to reduce their risk of heart disease."

DR. AARON BAGGISH IS DIRECTOR OF THE CARDIOVASCULAR PERFORMANCE PROGRAM AT BOSTON'S MASSACHUSETTS GENERAL HOSPITAL. HE SAYS EXERCISE TRULY IS MEDICINE.

Dr. Baggish: "Fewer medications, less depression, better sleep habits, better diet – they are all coupled with being active and exercising."

AND BY EXTENSION, EXERCISE CAN DO SOMETHING ELSE – PROLONG LIFE. IN FACT, CANADIAN RESEARCHERS RECENTLY FOUND THAT YOUNG ADULTS ENGAGED IN 150 MINUTES OF MODERATE EXERCISE A WEEK ADDED UP TO FIVE YEARS TO THEIR LIVES.

Dr. Baggish: "Really, no matter what decade in life you start exercising, you are better off than if you were to maintain a sedentary lifestyle. That applies whether you're in the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh decade of life."

SOME OLDER MEN MAY BE CONCERNED THAT STARTING AN EXERCISE PROGRAM COULD LEAD TO AN INCREASED RISK OF HAVING A HEART ATTACK AND IT TURNS OUT THAT THEY'RE RIGHT. BUT IT ALSO TURNS OUT THAT THE BENEFITS OF REGULAR EXERCISE FAR OUTWEIGH THAT RISK.

Institute of Health physician: "There still are some unanswered questions. And we know from some of the preliminary work that was done in animal studies previously that the antibodies that are generated in response to the vaccine don't last as long as we would like."

THE ADDED GOOD NEWS IS THAT SOME OF THE TEST PATIENTS ALSO DEVELOPED A DIFFERENT SET OF VIRUS-FIGHTING IMMUNE CELLS, CALLED T -CELLS.

RIGHT NOW, THE VACCINE IS ONLY IN THE FIRST STAGE OF TESTING.

IF THERE'S ONE THING THE PINCILOTTI FAMILY IS PASSIONATE ABOUT, IT'S GETTING TECHNOLOGY INTO THE HANDS OF SUTDENTS WHO HAVE AUTISM. AS PARENTS OF AN AUTISTIC SON, THEY SAY THEY'VE SEEN THE DIFFERENCE THT THINGS LIKE IPADS, COMPUTERS AND DIGITAL COMAREAS CAN MAKE.

Jessica Pincilotti, parent and co-founder of Autism Yesterday and Today: "We started this foundation two years ago, my husband and I. We have an autistic child who graduated from high school two years ago and we found out that because of the technology that we were able to provide for him, he did so much better. So we decided to do a foundation to try to provide this benefit for other kids."

THIS DECEMBER THE NON-PROFIT THEY STARTED, AUTISM YESTERDAY AND TODAY, WILL MAKE ITS FIRST DONATION OF 14 IPAD MINIS, AN IMAC COMPUTER, A PRINTER AND A DIGITAL CMAERA TO MISSION SAN JOSE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN FREMONT. THAT'S ABOUT NINE THOUSAND DOLLARS WORTH OF ELECTRONICS. ALL OF IT WILL GO TO THE SCHOOL'S SPECIAL EDUCATION CLASSROOM WHERE THEY SAY STUDENTS WITH AUTISM WILL BENEFIT GREATLY FROM THE DONATION.

Pincilotti: "We feel that technology helps these kids to expand their world. Some of the kids who are usually unable to communicate find they are able to communicate using the iPads and other technology. We believe that if we give them this technology, that is not in the classrooms now, they will do much better in the future."

THE PINCILOTTI'S SAY THEY PLAN TO CONTINUE RAISING FUNDS SO THEY CAN MAKE AT LEAST ONE DOATION TO A BAY AREA CLASSROOM EACH YEAR AND THEY ENCOURAGE POTENTIAL DONORS TO STEP FORWARD AND VISIT THEIR WEBSITE AT AUTISM YESTERDAY AND TODAY DOT ORG.

Public Advocates spokesperson: "Required volunteer hours is something public schools can't do."

HILARY HAMMAL WITH PUBLIC ADVOCATES SAYS THE RESEARCH FOUND CHARTER SCHOOLS REQUIRED PARENTS TO VOLUNTEER ANYWHERE FROM 1 TO 96 HOURS A YEAR AS A CONDITION OF THEIR CHILD'S ENROLLMENT. SHE SAYS THAT'S NOT ONLY ILLEGAL BUT INEQUITABLE

Hillary Hammal: "The person it excludes are hard working families who maybe can't afford to give those hours and excludes kids who are not lucky enough to come from a household that has highly motivated or well-resourced parents."

THIS BAY AREA MOTHER, WHO PREFERRED WE DIDN'T REVEAL HER IDENTITY FOR FEAR OF RETALIATION FROM HER CHILD'S SCHOOL, KNOWS ALL ABOUT THE CONSEQUENCES OF THIS FORCED VOLUNTEERING

Anonymous mother, "The experience I had was when I went to enroll my son for the second year, they told me I wasn't enrolled because I hadn't paid the hours."

THIS MOTHER SAID SINCE SHE HAD NOT FULFILLED HER 35 HOURS OF VOLUNTEERING THE PREVIOUS YEAR SHE WAS GIVEN A CHOICE, FIND ANOTHER SCHOOL PAY \$350 IN CASH OR BY PURCHASING SCHOOL SUPPLIES.

Mother: "I thought it was unjust, but I liked the school and I wanted to stay in the school so I decided to go and buy the items."

THE REPORT SAYS THAT IS NOT A CHOICE CHARTER SCHOOL PARENTS SHOULD HAVE TO MAKE.

THE WEEK-LONG PROTEST AT U-C BERKELEY OVER TUITION HIKES IS OVER. STUDENTS AND ACTIVISTS STAGED A SIT-IN AT WHEELER HALL FOR SEVERAL DAYS AFTER THE U-C BOARD OF REGENTS APPROVED A 5 PERCENT TUITION HIKE FOR EACH OF THE NEXT FIVE YEARS. KIDS SHOULD NOT HAVE ACCESS TO GUNS AT HOME. THAT'S REJINA SINCIC'S ULTIMATE MESSAGE.

Rejina Sincic, Sleeper 13 Productions: "The message is NOT for kids to take the gun and take it to school and give it to the teacher. That's what the video shows, but the message is that kids should not have access to guns at home. They should not be able to do what you see in the video. The guns should be locked up."

SINCIC HAD A HARD TIME FINDING A SCHOOL THAT WAS OKAY WITH SHOOTING THIS TYPE OF MESSAGE, BUT SAYS NORTH OAKLAND COMMUNITY CHARTER SCHOOL APPROVED THE SCRIPT AND GAVE HER THE OKAY. THE SCHOOL'S EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SAYS THE CREW WAS ALLOWED ACCESS TO FILM THE PSA ON SCHOOL GORUNDS, BUT THE SCHOOL DID NOT REVIEW, APPORVE OR ENDORSE THE VIDEO, AND THAT NORTH OAKLAND COMMUNITY CHARTER SCHOOL DOES NOT CONDONE OR SUPPORT BRINING WEAPONS OF ANY KIND, WHETHER REAL OR A REPLICA, TO SCHOOL. THEY'VE ALSO ASKED THE PRODUCER TO REMOVE THE SCHOOL'S NAME FROM THE VIDEO.

Sincic: "They were the ones to ask us from the beginning to put their name in the credits. Now they wanat it off, so we're okay with removing it."

SINCIC SAYS A TOY GUN WAS USED IN THE PSA AND IT WAS SECURED THROUGHOUT THE FILMING. ALL THE STUDENTS WERE CASTED ACTORS. AND THE MESSAGE – MEANT FOR PARENTS – KEEP YOUR GUNS LOCKED UP.

Sincic: "I want a safer world for the kids."

THE PRODUCER SAYS THE MESSAGE IS GETTING A LOT OF BACKLASH BECAUSE IT IS BEING TAKEN TOO LITERALLY.

Brandi Childress, VTA: "This is a major milestone. We are bringing BART here. SFO OFFICIALS SAID IT WOULD NEVER HAPPEN AND IT WAS NOT THAT LONG AGO WHEN RIDESHARE DRIVERS WERE THREATENED WITH CRIMINAL TRESPASSSING IF THEY BROUGHT PEOPLE TO THE AIRPORT. ALL THAT CHANGED LAST WEEK WHEN SFO SHOCKED THE GROUND TRANSPORTATION INDUSTRY BY ANNOUNCING A DEAL WITH THE RIDE SHARING APP SIDEDAR. UBER AND LYFT WERE SOON TO FOLLOW. THE PERMITS ARE ON A TEMPORARY BASIS AND WILL BE REVIEWED AT A LATER DATE, BUT ALL THREE RIDESHARING OPERATIONS WILL START SERVICE HERE WITHIN THE NEXT 30 DAYS.

SO, WHAT HAPPENED? WHY DID THE AIRPORT CHANGE COURSE ON THE ISSUE? IT'S SIMPLE: MONEY.

THE DEAL STATES THAT EACH DRIVER WILL PAY THE AIRPORT \$3.85 EVERY TIME THEY COME ONTO AIRPORT PROPERTY. DRIVERS WILL BE ALLOWED TO BOTH PICK UP AND DROP OFF PASSENGERS AT THE AIRPORT IN EXCHANGE FOR THAT FEE.

COMPARE THAT WITH THE \$2.00 THAT TRADITIONAL CABS HAVE TO PAY TO OPERATE AT THE AIRPORT. THE DIFFERENCE MIGHT SEEM EXCESSIVE, BUT THE ADDITIONAL MONEY IS A SMALL EFFORT TO LEVEL THE PLAYING FIELD WITH CAB COMPANIES THAT HAVE HIGHER OPERATIONAL COSTS THAN THE RIDE SHARING APPS.

CAB DRIVERS HAVE COMPLAINED ABOUT THE RIDE SHARING SERVICE SINCE THEY STARTED OPERATING IN THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA, SAYING THE COMPANIES ARE TAKING FARES AWAY BECAUSE OF LOWER COSTS. CABBIES ALSO SAY THE COMPANIES ARE NOT PROPERLY INSURED, BUT SEVERAL LEGAL JUDGMENTS AND THE RECENT DECISION BY THE STATE PUC TO REGULATE THE INDUSTRY HAVE MADE MANY OF THOSE COMPLAINTS INVALID.

WE'VE HEARD SO MUCH ABOUT THIE MOVEABLE BARRIER AND NOW THE 30 MILLION DOLLAR PROJECT IS GOING TO HAPPEN. THERE HAS BEEN A LOT OF WORK ON AND AROUND THE BRIDGE LATELY. IF YOU TRAVEL IT, YOU HAVE PROBABLY NOTICED THE OLD BOOTH THAT USED TO BE AT THE NORTHBOUND ENTRANCE HAS BEEN REMOVED.

ALL OF THIS AS CREWS GET READY TO INSTALL THE MOVEABLE MEDIAN BARRIER THAT IS OVER 13,000 FEET IN LENTGH, 12 INCHES WIDE AND 32 INCHES IN HEIGHT. ONCE INSTALLED, IT WILL TAKE 45 MINUTES TO REPOSITION THE BARRIER AS NEEDED. EACH SECTION IS VERY HEAVY, ABOUT 1500 POUNDS.

BRIDGE OFFICIALS WILL BE RELEASING LOTS MORE INFORMATION TOWARD THE MIDDLE OF NEXT WEEK. AND THE BRIDGE WILL BE ENTIRELY CLOSED TO TRAFFIC THE WEEKEND OF JANUARY 10<sup>TH</sup> TO START WORK ON THE PROJECT.

THE HEAVY EQUIPMENT MOVED IN AND STARTED TAKING OUT THE CONCRETE BARRIERS. SOON THOSE BARRIERS ARE GOING TO BE REPLACED WITH THE NEW, STATE OF THE ART MOVEABLE BARRIER LIKE YOU SEE IN THIS ANIMATION PROVIDED BY THE BRIDGE DISTRICT.
