Below are the issues the station's programming addressed:

### **ECONOMY**

Mayor McGinn announces a promising city budget for next year; SODO Arena proposal passes city council with a vote of 6-2.

### **PUBLIC SAFETY**

Seattle PD make deal with DOJ to reform its history of excessive force; SPD is putting more officers on the ground to combat a gradually increasing emergency response time.

### **ENVIRONMENT & HEALTH**

The impact of Seattle's ban on plastic shopping bags going into effect; the state's response to debris from the Japanese tsunami reaching its shores; the resolution of a strike by Waste Management in Seattle;

### **EDUCATION & YOUTH DEVELOPMENT**

Controversy over college tuition rates; the federal government waiving most of the No Child Left Behind law in Washington state; efforts to cope with an increase in teen dating violence; the formation of a new task force on state education funding; the possibility of tuition hikes at state colleges; a decrease in diversity in Seattle Public Schools due to cutbacks in busing; a new Skills Center in SPS.

The debate over potential traffic congestion if the proposed SODO sports arena is built; a legal challenge to the state's monopoly on ferry service; improvements and issues with traffic flow after the opening of new lanes on Seattle's Mercer Street corridor;

### **GOVERNMENT**

Preview of the 2<sup>nd</sup> of 3 Gubernatorial debates between Rob McKenna and Jay Inslee; Review of the Gubernatorial debate; Preview of the upcoming senatorial election between incumbent Maria Cantwell and Michael Baumgartner; Mayor McGinn laid out his budget plan for the next two years.

### **COMMUNITY**

Amazon founder Jeff Bezos backing efforts to legalize same sex marriage; Seattle Chamber of Commerce votes to support legalization of same sex marriage; progress and challenges in managing homelessness in King County; the annual fundraising event for the Muscular Dystrophy Association called Fill the Boot.

WE TOLD VIEWERS THAT FOR SEATTLE BASKETBALL FANS IT WAS THE MOST IMPORTANT VOTE THE CITY COUNCIL HAS TAKEN ALL YEAR... ANOTHER PIECE OF THE PUZZLE IS NOW IN PLACE FOR THE EVENTUAL RETURN OF THE SEATTLE SONICS.

NEWS OF THE VOTE SPREAD QUICKLY TO SEATTLE STREETS AND EVEN THOUGH THE SEAHAWKS WERE FRONT AND CENTER TONIGHT -- FANS WERE CLEARLY THRILLED ABOUT THIS BIG STEP FORWARD FOR THEIR OTHER FAVORITE TEAM.

IT IS NOT LOST ON THE FANS THAT THE VOTE WAS NOT UNANIMOUS. COUNCILMEMBERS RICHARD CONLIN AND NICK LICATA BOTH SAID NO TO THE DEAL CITING ECONOMIC ISSUES AND AN UNCERTAIN FUTURE FOR KEY ARENA. AND THEN THERE IS STILL THE POTENTIAL ISSUE OF TRAFFIC CONGESTION WITH A THIRD STADIUM IN SODO.

CRITICS SAY IT IS BAD ENOUGH ALREADY ON GAME NIGHTS AND COULD GET WORSE.

THE PORT OF SEATTLE ISSUED A STATEMENT AFTER THE VOTE REITERATING IT'S CONCERNS.

SO THERE ARE STILL SOME HURDLES AHEAD, BUT FOR THE FANS NOTHING CAN RUIN THE EXCITEMENT OF THIS DAY.

MORE POLICE, MORE TRANSIT, MORE STREET REPAIRS, MORE LATE COMMUNITY CENTERS, MORE OF A LOT OF THINGS! ALL THIS BECAUSE OF BETTER THAN EXPECTED REVENUES. IT'S THE BEST SPENDING PLAN HE'S BEEN ABLE TO GIVE SINCE TAKING OFFICE NEARLY THREE YEARS AGO.

IN ALL, THE CITY'S GENERAL FUND WILL HAVE OVER \$30 MILLION MORE TO SPEND NEXT YEAR THAN THIS YEAR. THERE'S MORE TAXES COMING IN FROM THE THE RECOVERING AS WELL AS FROM THE REVIVED REAL ESTATE MARKET. THE CITY GETS A CUT ANYTIME A HOUSE OR A BUILDING IS SOLD AND THAT ACTIVITY HAS PICKED UP GREATLY.

HERE ARE THE HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MAYOR'S SPENDING PLAN FOR THE NEXT TWO YEARS:

10 NEW POLICE OFFICERS, FIVE MILLION DOLLARS FOR ADDITIONAL STREET REPAIR, MONEY TO STUDY A NEW RAIL LINE FROM DOWNTOWN TO THE U DISTRICT, FUNDS TO COMPLETE THE MISSING LINK OF THE BURKE GILMAN TRAIL, AND A MILLION DOLLARS MORE FOR HOMELESS FAMILIES.

BRUCE HARRELL SAYS HE'S HAPPY TO SEE NEW COPS IN MCGINN'S BUDGET, BUT THE CITY COUNCIL'S PUBLIC SAFETY CHAIR WANTS 30 ADDITIONAL POLICE NOT JUST 10. AND HE'S DISAPPOINTED THERE'S NO MONEY FOR HIS TOP PRIORITY, COP CAMS.

ONE MORE ITEM OF NOTE IN TERMS OF PUBLIC SAFETY SPENDING, THE MAYOR DID INCLUDE A 'GUN FIRE LOCATOR SYSTEM' IN NEIGHBORHOODS THROUGHOUT THE CITY THAT WILL ALERT POLICE EVERY TIME SHOT IS FIRE AND WHERE EXACTLY IT HAPPENED.

THE ONLY WAY TO STEHEKIN IS BY FLOAT PLANE OR A FERRY--OWNED BY THE LAKE CHELAN BOAT COMPANY--THAT RUNS JUST ONCE A DAY IN THE SUMMER, HALF THAT IN THE OFFSEASON. ITS OWNER, JACK RAINES HAS SO FAR SUCCESSFULLY FOUGHT ANY AND ALL COMPETITION. ALLOWING THE MONOPOLY IS WASHINGTON'S UTILITIES AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION WHICH DEFENDS IT BY SAYING, 'A SINGLE, REGULATED PROVIDER CAN...MAINTAIN SERVICE WITHOUT THE THREAT OF HAVING CUSTOMERS DRAWN AWAY BY A COMPETING PROVIDER.' THE INSTITUTE FOR JUSTICE, WHICH IS ARGUING THE COURTNEY'S CASE IN THE 9TH CIRCUIT COURT OF APPEALS, SAYS THAT VIOLATES THE 14TH AMENDMENT AND THE FOUNDING FATHER'S PRINCIPLE OF "ECONOMIC" LIBERTY. BOTH SIDES AGREE SOME MONOPOLIES MAKE SENSE..LIKE RAILROADS AND UTILITIES. Block: I don't think it overpromised. Our circumstances have changed a lot in 10 years and we've made huge progress, and, again, a nationally and internationally known for our progress. But we are fighting a lot of other cuts and a lot of systemic problems And I think people realize that it's the shredding of the social safety net and resource constraints, not the strategies of the plan that is limiting what is going on.

The plan is not a plan to end homelessness, the plan is a plan to manage homelessness. We need to be clear on that. You can't end homelessness without addressing inequality and issues that have led to 4 decades of rising in equality. You can only manage homelessness.
