The training costs \$75 with a one year volunteer commitment. A limited number of scholarships are available and a scholarship application must be submitted in order to be considered. Those seeking the training for personal or professional purposes and who do not intend to volunteer with Saving Grace will be charged the full cost of the training, \$150.
