On Friday, December 4th Healthy Beginnings will bring its 12-Point Kid Inspection to Bend. At these screening clinics, each child receives nearly \$3,000 worth of assessment services at no cost to the family. There are no eligibility requirements and all families are welcome to attend.

Healthy Beginnings screens young children in hearing, speech and language, motor skills, cognitive development, vision, health and safety, dental, behavior and nutrition, information regarding early literacy and car seat safety is also provided. Access to professionals and trained volunteers in all these essential core areas is available at the time of the screening. Parents and children birth through five meet one-on-one with as many as 12 health and development professionals and families are encouraged to attend regardless of insurance coverage. Referrals are made for any child identified in need of additional services with community resources provided to all families. Healthy Beginnings can even provide information and assistance with Oregon's health insurance application process.

Additional screenings are recommended for autism spectrum disorder at 18 months and at either 24 or 30 months. The CDC also recommends hearing screenings as well. A Healthy Beginnings screening covers all this and much more. It serves as an important first step for caring, concerned parents and one stop shopping for community resources for hundreds of families every year.

Imagine helping return thousands of tax dollars to those in need. All it takes is volunteer time to work with beneficiaries through the highly regarded AARP **Tax-Aide** program, supported by United Way of Deschutes County and CASH Oregon.

Last year, each volunteer on average placed \$48,000 of tax refunds in the hands of lower income seniors, families and individuals. The returns, which take advantage of Earned Income and Child tax credits, make a big difference to those helped. Their average income is less than \$23,000, but the average refund is more than \$1,100.

The tax credits are the country's most effective income-support program. Nationally the returned money boosts more than seven million people above the poverty line. The money also stimulates the economy and creates jobs.

Tax-Aide prepares the returns for free, saving low-income taxpayers hundreds of dollars in preparation fees and helping them avoid high-interest loans advertised as "fast refunds." The call for volunteers comes as **Tax-Aide** gets ready for the tax season starting in late January.

Volunteers receive free training on IRS-supported software. No experience is necessary. The rewards come from using your new skill to work directly with and help those in need.
