Mr. Crimmons talked about the film "Call Me Lucky" that deals with both his long career in comedy and his experiences and work in attacking child pornography and abuse online. He discussed his personal experiences and noted that children can never give consent and that the issues are not about sex but, rather, rape. He noted Robin Williams role in producing the film, which is directed by Bob Goldthwaite. He also discussed his forthcoming show at Johnny D's on Dec. 29.

Mr. Fagin discussed his book, "Toms River", the story of a long running chemical disaster in New Jersey. He looked at Ciba-Geigy Chemical's production of polymers and their dumping policies that led to a documented cancer cluster in this small New Jersey town. His story is one that looks at the difficulties and ambiguities of medical/scientific analysis and he concludes that the situation is both incredibly difficult to demonstrate and to correct. A powerful story.

Mr. Collins discussed his new report on wealth inequality. He noted practices such as family trusts that allow for billions of dollars to evade estate taxes. He also attacked the ability of billionaires to offshore their wealth into the hidden banks and economies that allow for income and wealth to evade taxation. Finally, Collins called for targeted taxes on the super wealthy to support education for all.

## **EDUCATION**

Ms. Lewis discussed this gap and noted that in contrast to the oppositional culture theory, African-American students are not more hostile to educational achievement than Anglo or Asian students. She noted that schools often apply discipline differently between African American and Anglo students. Lewis talked about the differential elevation of white and black students often reflects white parents struggling to keep control of scarce resources.

Presentation of recorded speech by Palestinian/American psychiatrist activist examining the conflict in Palestine/Israel. He argues that at heart, this is a colonial war. In that sense it is an effort to fundamentally deny the legitimacy of the indigenous population.

Ms. Nangaroni and Godine McKenzie discussed issues of transgendered persons' rights and the bill before the Massachusetts legislature. They argued for the expansion of those rights and dissected the criticisms of anti-trans people rights to access to public services including bathrooms, taxis, restaurants, etc. They noted that t-people are the individuals at risk through the deprivation of services and rights.

Ms. Ross spoke of new bill passed by legislature and signed. Bill dramatically reduces time available to homeowners to fight foreclosure in the courts. Ross described how the legislature forced this through and the governor signed it. She asked listeners who are interested in resisting to contact her group. She argued that the court case will challenge the legality of the process at both the legislative and executive levels.

Mr. Lappe' urged that there is sufficient food available to eliminate hunger. Solutions include leaving the GMO regimen and returning to both smaller farming systems. She also argued that the free market as now constituted cannot and will not end hunger at home or abroad.

David Goodman, co-host of this show, presented a special retrospective report on the roots of the "wall" mentality of security. He analyzed the roots of this mentality in recent years by presenting materials from a 2003 speech by Bush administration security officials and places these in relation to visions of America presented by recent GOP candidates. He noted their view of the American polity with the caveat that "the Constitution is not a suicide pact."

# **RACE RELATIONS**

Mr. Golden discussed the little known connection between African Americans who helped Jews escape Nazi Germany in the 1930s. He talked about the restraints put on White/Black relations in the 1930s and 40s and the aggressively anti-Nazi views of the Black press which they saw as the European counterpart to anti-Black racism in the US. Early on, they understood the danger of Nazi ideology long before the Holocaust. They also supported actions by the Black colleges to assist Jews in escaping Nazism.

Professor Choi talked about the events in Paris and the impact of terrorism on the city and country. She examined the long history of terrorist activity in Paris, including that relating to Franco-Algerian repatriats in the 1950s and 1960s. She also discussed the origins of this pattern in the conditions of the suburban Parisian communities and suggested that these are areas where this kind of anger against the west can grow.
