He also noted the resistance of power companies to efforts to move to alternatives in the US and elsewhere and noted the risks of certain systems when inappropriately applied, e.g., geothermal in Hawaii.

He pointed to the importance of Debt Swaps in increasing T problems and explained these arcane financial instruments. Goodman also noted the impact of current Governor Baker's cuts on T problems and the potential for continuing and even worsening the situation on the T. We also discussed alternate funding possibilities.
