Support for Veterans and their Families

DATE: 7/2/23 Time: 6:30 a.m.

<u>Description</u>: Emily McNally from The Red Sox Foundation was our guest. Emily discussed the annual "Run To Home Base" coming up at Fenway Park in Boston on July 22nd. The annual 9K / 5K Run –Walk ends with participants crossing home plate at Boston's historic Fenway Park. The Run to Home Base provides vital funds for the clinical care and support of Veterans and their Families who are impacted by the invisible wounds of war. With a 20% increase in Veteran suicides during the COVID pandemic, the event's critical support is more important than ever. 100% of the proceeds goes directly toward the life-saving care provided by Home Base.

Against the Tide Breast Cancer fundraiser

<u>Description</u>: Against the Tide is a family-friendly, multi-sport event to benefit the Massachusetts Breast Cancer Coalition. The event consists of multiple run/walk and swim options for participants. MBCC is the only non-profit in the state dedicated to the prevention of breast cancer from environmental causes. The funds raised at the event on August 12th help to support and expand their community education programs. Cheryl Osimo, event organizer explained the mission of Massachusetts Breast Cancer Coalition, their history and how they are helping raise funds to support those fighting breast cancer. Event details and fundraising options were also discussed.

<u>Description</u>: As part of our ongoing "Hometown Heroes" initiative on Easy 99.1, we accept nominations from our listeners of people making a difference in the local community. Today's show featured our most recent Hometown Hero, Jen Walker and the neighbor that nominated her, Libbie Cieri. Jen was the founder of a group, "Helping Hands" at her over 55 community, Halifax Estates in Halifax, MA made up of 430 units. Helping Hands is a neighborhood support group that encourages the idea of neighbor helping neighbor. Helping Hands assists those in the community with transportation to medical appointments, financial assistance for those in need, home repairs and companionship. Jen outlined how the group was formed and gave tips and instruction on how those in similar communities could formulate their own support group of neighbors helping neighbors in a time of need.

Walk To Fight Breast Cancer

<u>Description</u>: Program featured Cynthia Spitler from the American Cancer Society and featured details on the upcoming Making Strides Against Breast Cancer Walk on October 1st at the DCR Hatch Shell in Boston. Cynthia explained how local listeners and businesses could get involved in fundraising for the Walk and also participate in activities leading up to Walk day. She also detailed the importance of this fundraising event and how the funds raised helped in research, advocacy and support programs for those fighting breast cancer.
