In an effort to keep the test top-secret, the government had not evacuated or informed residents who lived nearby the Trinity Test Site. Known only to top scientists and military officials, the test site was about 200 miles southeast of Los Alamos National Laboratory. The poor farming communities of New Mexico lived off the land and were now forced to do so in a toxic environment — completely unaware of the lasting impacts of the fallout from the Trinity Test. Radiation that is present in nuclear fallout can damage and alter a cell's DNA, which can lead to mutations and other effects. New Mexicans have been continually left out of the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act (RECA) that was passed in 1990 to compensate "Downwinders," those affected by nuclear testing.
