Friday, January 9, 2015

A FEW OF OUR FAVORITE THINGS

- With money on her mind, Jaqueline Luongo was charged with murdering – and then impersonating – her roommate. The key witness: Luongo's friend and confidante Maria Calderon. For Luongo that was one witness too many, and police say that from jail she tries to put out a hit on Maria. But when the Broward County Sherriff's office gets wind of the scheme, they give "20/20" rare access to their operation as they go undercover with a fake hitman, a fake lawyer, and even a fake corpse to give Ms. Luongo a special surprise. Matt Gutman reports.
- The California DMV lies in wait along popular hiking routes, looking for able-bodied motorists parking in coveted handicapped spaces. Jim Avila and "20/20" cameras are there as the cops swoop in.
- "20/20" outfits a Brooklyn brownstone with hidden cameras to put exterminators and their heavily-marketed bedbug dogs to the test. Is that beagle really smelling the dreaded pest, or is he just hungry for a snack? Paula Faris reports.
- Federal agents rigged up a Social Security office with hidden cameras to catch Lawrence Popp as he came in to be assessed by a local benefits administrator -- making bold, categorical claims about his inability to drive or read because of blindness, moments before he hit the freeway as he headed home. Rebecca Jarvis reports on one man caught on camera defrauding social security.

Friday, January 16, 2015

MEET THE PARENTS

- Why on earth would two highly educated lawyers and parents plant drugs in the car of a fellow parent who is the president of the PTA and a school volunteer? Chris Connelly's report on the bizarre case out of Irvine, California includes revealing interviews with the victim, prosecutor, and police.
- Nick Watt reports on a family caught between new relaxed marijuana laws and older tighter child protection statutes. "20/20" follows all the twists and turns of a custody case involving parents whose five year old son is taken into state custody because of marijuana use even though it is legal in their state.
- They are a typical American family – a father, mother and two biological children. But in one important respect, they are anything but typical -- the parents are both transgender. Bianca was born a boy and transitioned to live as a woman, while Nick was born a girl and has lived as a man. They met and fell in love, can't afford sex reassignment surgeries, and will remain as they are for now. Nick bore the children and they are raising their children and preparing to face the many questions from their kids and the world. They say they are ready for anything. Elizabeth Vargas has their story.
- Police allege that Diane Staudte woke up one morning and decided she had enough of being a wife and mom. With the help of her daughter and some well-mixed anti-freeze cocktails, police allege she successfully killed her husband, then her son, and very nearly another daughter – who lived to tell the tale to "20/20." Deborah Roberts reports.

CAMPUS CONFIDENTIAL

- Logan, a junior on a scholarship at University of Massachusetts Amherst, was busted for selling drugs on campus, he was offered – and accepted – a deal not to be arrested if he became a confidential informant, helping campus police bust his former roommate for drugs. He ended up dying of his own addiction problem months later. Did the campus police forsake Logan's well-being for its own interests? Elizabeth Vargas reports.
- Nearly one in five women are sexually assaulted on college campuses every year, and many schools are under fire for the way they handle these crimes. But Southern Oregon University's "You Have Options" is a unique program that works to break down the barriers so many victims face -- guaranteeing confidentiality, giving victims the choice to proceed with a criminal or campus investigation, and most importantly partnering closely with local law enforcement to ensure perpetrators are held accountable. Niki, who was raped by her boyfriend during her junior year, speaks candidly to 20/20.

VANDERBILT ASSAULT TRIAL

It is the scandalous crime that has made headlines across the country -- college football stars at one of the country's most prestigious schools just this week convicted of assaulting a fellow student while she was unconscious after a night of out-of-control drinking. What really happened inside a Vanderbilt dorm room? ABC News Correspondent Ryan Smith reports.

Friday, February 6, 2015

FAMILY SECRETS

- When former White House Counsel J. Michael Farren learned of his wife's plans to divorce him, he beat her nearly to death in their Connecticut mansion. Mary Margaret Farren barely escaped with her life and her two young daughters. Now, in an exclusive "20/20" interview, Mary Margaret reveals to ABC's Amy Robach the harrowing details of her escape from domestic violence and the nearly deadly marriage.
- Catch Him If You Can... The young man's hospital badge said he was a physician's assistant at Osceola Hospital in Florida. He wore scrubs, a stethoscope, and examined patients while dropping medical terminology, even performing CPR on a patient who had overdosed. Months later, he was allegedly cruising South Beach in what looked like a police cruiser, stopping other drivers to tell them to put on their seat belts. Matthew Scheidt was neither a physician nor a cop -- he was a fraud. Matt Gutman reports.

Friday, February 13, 2015

REAL ESTATE ROULETTE

How far would one woman go after losing her dream home in a bidding war to another couple? Kathy Rowe of San Diego turned to pranks on the new home owners, from re-listing the house for sale online and even advertising for a fake New Year's Eve party at the house. Yet, she was sentenced for stalking the young married couple. Rowe speaks exclusively to ABC News' Chris Connelly.

Also: As the spring real estate season kicks into gear, real estate agents are on guard as an uptick in open house criminal activity -- everything from robberies to murders -- makes showing a home a potentially risky proposition. "20/20" speaks to a survivor of an assault; relives some caught-on-cam moments; get tips from Barbara Corcoran; and attends a self-defense class customized for brokers. Rebecca Jarvis reports.

And: What happens when a very wealthy couple gets divorced but decide to continue co-habiting with their daughters in their multi-million dollar Manhattan apartment? Complicating matters, mom gets married again and has another baby. Such is the situation in the swanky building on the Upper West Side as real estate agent Carol Levy and her husband try to find some way to make it work. Deborah Roberts reports.

SLENDER MAN

What started out as a normal middle school sleepover took a horrifying turn when one 12 year-old girl was stabbed 19 times by her two best friends and left for dead in the Wisconsin woods. The girls' motive and the miraculous recovery of the survivor made headlines around the world since the May attack. The two girls, who are both charged with attempted first-degree intentional homicide, say they attacked their friend because they wanted to prove themselves to a mysterious, fictional internet character called "Slender Man," who they believe to be real. Who is "Slender Man" and why should parents be aware of him? New details have emerged in the trial and, together, "20/20" goes inside the interrogation room and David Muir's reports.

Friday, March 13, 2015

STRANGE AFFLICTION

"20/20" takes viewers into the lives of people with some of the most unusual medical mysteries.

- Cynthia and Brandon Ross of Maine rushed their infant son to the hospital with swollen legs. When doctors examined the baby, they found fractures all over his little body. They charged Brandon with child abuse and their two children were placed in foster care. Brandon and Cynthia believe their son suffers from a rare medical condition called Ehler Danlos Syndrome, which causes bruising and flexible joints. Brandon is awaiting his day in court or for the charges to be dropped. Deborah Robert reports.
- What if you woke up one morning to discover your partner was no longer the person you thought you married? After Heather suffered a potentially life threatening brain trauma and two weeks in a coma, she awoke with a change in personality. Her brain trauma seemed to make her hypersexual, pursuing men in addition to her husband. Elizabeth Vargas reports.
- Sixteen-year-old "Beckie O" went viral when she disclosed her most closely held secret to thousands of fans on her YouTube channel. She's a "Trichster," suffering from a hair pulling disorder. She shares with us her years of documenting her experience. Elizabeth Vargas reports.

- Jessica Mellen, 29, suffers from Anxiety Disorder. Jessica's most intense fear is the fear of vomiting. Jessica tells her fiancé she does not think she can have kids because she is too fearful of morning sickness. Wanting to marry the man she loves, Jessica decides to put herself through "exposure therapy" and, for five months, our cameras follow her as she confronts her fears. Will she make it to the altar?

Friday, March 20, 2015

TERROR ON THE TRESTLE

- There may be no boss who commands more power than a movie director. But what happens when the safety of the crew is compromised for the sake of getting a great shot? When a dream sequence scene soon turns into a nightmare, tragically, 27-year-old camera assistant Sarah Jones is killed instantly and others are injured. Sarah's death shocks the film community. Director Randall Miller pleads guilty to involuntary manslaughter making it the first time a director in the history of filmmaking is sent to jail for the death of a crewmember. Sarah Jones' parents take a journey up the Altamaha River to see, first hand, the trestle where their daughter tragically lost her life. "20/20" reports.
- Robert Durst, the son of a real estate mogul, is under suicide watch at a Louisiana prison after being arrested in New Orleans earlier this week on a warrant out of Los Angeles, where he was charged in the 2000 murder of his friend, Susan Berman. He was arrested the day before HBO aired the finale of "The Jinx," its documentary series about Durst covering the 1982 disappearance of his first wife in New York, his acquittal for the dismemberment murder of a neighbor in Texas and Berman's slaying. Elizabeth Vargas reports.

OCCUPATIONAL HAZARDS

- Dov Charney, one of the most outrageous and controversial CEOs, discusses his ouster from the iconic retailer American Apparel and his plans to re-take control of the company. Gio Benitez reports.
- **Confessions of a Customer Service Rep:** Does anything make the blood boil more than getting stuck on the line with a horrible customer service rep? "20/20" interviews a customer service rep who says lowly paid and overworked reps sometimes deliberately antagonize their customers.
- **Don't Hit Send:** That super snarky tweet or post could give you 30 seconds of happiness and a lifetime of career-crippling shame. "20/20" chronicles the case of Adam Smith, who uploaded a YouTube video of himself confronting a drive-thru clerk at a Chick-Fil-A that went viral and caused a downward spiral that took him from the CFO's office to unemployment.

Sixteen-year-old Skylar Neese disappeared from her home one summer night, last seen on surveillance video sneaking out of her window and getting into a sedan. The police had no leads until a surprising break in the case. Correspondent Ryan Smith interviews Neese's parents, police and high school classmates to unravel the horrific mystery and murder, and ultimately the surprising suspects.

BURNING BED

Who killed Lucy Johnson, shot in the head twice and left in a house set on fire? With no shortage of suspects including her ex-boyfriend and her fiancé, pregnant after just three weeks together and engaged after three months, "20/20" follows the twists and turns of this explosive whodunit story. Police focused on four men in her life, believing it was not a stranger since no locks in the house were forced. Even Lucy had an opinion about who might have wanted her dead, as her journal was read in court.

COLLEGE LOVE TRIANGLE

A beautiful college student loved by two young men. One vanishes. A frantic search uncovers his body in the swamps of Florida. After a two-year investigation, Pedro Bravo was accused of strangling his romantic rival and one-time best friend Christian Aguilar to death, and faced first degree murder. This murder mystery made national headlines and Bravo's trial was watched by millions. Aguilar's family speaks out about the jealous rage that cost a young college student his life. And the woman at the center of the tragic love triangle, Erika Friman, also breaks her silence with Matt Gutman reports.

DESIGNING WOMEN

- In one of the most sensational cases Houston has ever seen, a Texas jury found Ana Trujillo guilty of stabbing her boyfriend, University of Houston professor Stefan Andersson, to death with a stiletto high heel after a night of drinking. Trujillo, who has claimed all along that she was acting in self-defense, speaks exclusively to ABC News' Ryan Smith. (OAD: 4/11/14)
- Tawny Blazejowski is a one-of-a-kind stalker who set her sights on her ex-boyfriend, Joe Good, and strangely, just about everyone he knew – from his landlord to his current girlfriend's daughter to his neighbor. Blazejowski would physically threaten her victims, plant drugs, make accusations of child molestation, and her specialty -- she distributed lots of porn. MYSTERY ONJOHNSBURG ROAD

How does a man wind up being convicted of committing a murder at a grocery store when no body, no weapon, and no DNA link him to the scene? That is exactly what happened to Mario Casciaro in 2013 when he was convicted of killing 17-year-old Brian Carrick, and is now serving a 26-year sentence. Prosecutors were successful in getting a conviction on the very rare and controversial charge of murder by intimidation because another stock boy, Shane Lamb—in exchange for an immunity deal—told prosecutors he knocked Carrick out during a fight, and then left Casciaro with the unconscious Carrick. Yet could potentially explosive evidence, including Shane Lamb's recent recanting of his story, help Casciaro prove his innocence? ABC News Correspondent Ryan Smith reports.

Before that night, the now 20-year-old Doan was a typical 10-year-old girl in a hardworking family of farmers in Pampa, Texas. They became the targets of an intruder who enjoyed killing just for the thrill of it. The immediate investigation yielded few clues. Doan, however, had a remarkable ability to recall the details of that traumatic night. Investigators would later learn that the gunman who killed Doan’s family had killed before, hundreds of miles away in Missouri. A day before the Pampa shootings, Orlie McCool and his daughter-in-law Dawn were killed and the family pickup stolen. Levi King was later found behind the wheel of the stolen vehicle in El Paso, Texas. He also told law enforcement that there were four more bodies in Texas. King told law enforcement officers that the feeling he got from killing the McCools was better than any drug he had ever done. This was the lead needed to solve the Pampa murders. Robin Doan was willing to help by testifying about the night her family was gunned down while they slept. King took a plea deal in Missouri -- to avoid execution he agreed to two consecutive life sentences without the possibility of parole. In Texas, he also took a guilty plea, but the DA refused to take the death penalty off the table. Robin testified at the trial. There was one holdout for the death penalty; King received a life sentence. He will serve his time in Missouri. Robin Doan is satisfied. **On-screen text graphic:** Robin has decided to leave Pampa. The investigation took the case in another direction when police found out that her husband, Travis McGraw, was secretly dating Mary Beth Fisher. His cell phone records revealed he was sending intimate text messages to Fisher. Fisher claims McGraw had told her he wasn’t married, and the relationship, though intimate, was not sexual. Fisher found out the truth and gave him an ultimatum -- make up your mind by Sunday. Mintz was shot dead on Saturday. Travis McGraw willingly turned over his cache of guns to police. One of his guns matched the cartridge found at the scene and he was arrested for

murder. Mintz's daughters emerged as powerful advocates for their mother, and prosecutors, after consulting with them, offered a plea deal to McGraw: second-degree murder with a sentence of 16-20 years. He accepted, but at the last moment changed his mind about pleading guilty. Three years after the murder the trial began. Schirmer, the pastor of the Reeders United Methodist Church in Reeders, Pennsylvania; and the eventual investigation to determine if the deaths of the pastor’s previous wives were really accidental. Musante’s sister, Rose Cobb, knew something wasn’t right and pressed authorities to keep looking. Musante’s daughter, Samantha, told police that she had discovered the affair between her mother and Schirmer and had told her father. Further investigation revealed Musante’s death was truly a suicide. This led to questions regarding the death of the pastor’s second wife, Betty Schirmer, just three months earlier in an auto accident. Her death was determined to be suspicious and police suspected Schirmer. Questions then arose about the death of Schirmer’s first wife, Jewel. The cause of her death, from a fall, was initially classified as undetermined, but was now ruled a homicide. A.B. Schirmer was arrested and charged with the murder of his second wife, Betty. At trial, A.B. Schirmer was found guilty of murder. Cindy Musante continues to stand by him. Original on-screen text graphic: Schirmer is awaiting trial for the murder of his first wife, Jewel. Retired policeman Ron Friedli, Vicki’s ex-husband and Becky’s father, had a theory about what happened: Becky was deathly afraid of fire and he suspected she knew her killer. Police searched

Hayes, a successful, wealthy, married Santa Cruz, California technology genius was found dead from a heroin overdose aboard his 46-foot yacht. The yacht had been outfitted with a sophisticated security system, which eventually led investigators to Alix Tichelman, a young woman with whom he had a secret liaison aboard the yacht. Hayes and Tichelman met on an online dating service known for connecting wealthy men with women looking to be spoiled. The video footage recorded Tichelman injecting Hayes, cleaning up the scene and stepping over him to leave. At issue is whether Tichelman knew Hayes was in distress when she left, as police maintain, or if his death was accidental, as public defenders representing Tichelman claim. Tichelman led a troubled life which included eating disorders, drugs, and specialized schools. Investigators learned that just months before Hayes’ death, Tichelman’s then-boyfriend, Dean Riopelle, an Atlanta night club owner, also died from a heroin overdose. After an elaborate sting, Tichelman was arrested for the death of Forrest Hayes. Riopelle’s death, originally classified as accidental, is being given a second look by Georgia authorities. **On-screen text graphic:** Alix Tichelman pleaded not guilty to manslaughter in the death of Forrest Hayes, and pleaded not guilty to prostitution and drug charges. Tichelman’s next court appearance is on February 23, 2015. If convicted of manslaughter, Tichelman could face a maximum of fifteen years in prison. In 2008, Olsen, a model-turned-housewife, wanted to re-start her career, Guglielmelli was not happy. He became very controlling, dating other women and eventually filing for divorce. He tried various schemes to discredit his wife. In 2012, when he couldn’t get his way in the divorce, he confided his problems to business associate/friend Richard Fuhrmann, asking him to “take care” of his wife; Fuhrmann told Guglielmelli that he would take the job. Instead of murdering Olsen, he went to the authorities in Los Angeles, California, and agreed to wear a wire. In October 2013, Fuhrmann got Guglielmelli to repeat that he would pay \$80,000 to have Olsen killed. To the

authorities, it was a clear-cut case of murder for hire; Guglielmelli was arrested. Guglielmelli, in a telephone interview from jail, claims he is the victim; he was conned by Richard Fuhrmann. Authorities agree that Fuhrmann is a con man, but the conspiracy to kill Olsen was very real. In a surprise move, they offered Guglielmelli a plea deal: plead guilty to attempted murder in the second degree and serve only nine years in jail. He accepted. In a telephone interview from prison, Guglielmelli discusses his decision. Olsen is proceeding with the divorce and worries about the future. Falciani is now a fugitive living in France because Swiss authorities charged him with industrial espionage. - “**ZMapp**” – a report on the development of ZMapp, a promising drug to combat Ebola, which has killed nine thousand in West Africa. There are no approved vaccines or drugs available to fight the disease and although researchers believe ZMapp is the cure, randomized trials have not yet been conducted to confirm this. It takes six weeks to produce enough ZMapp to cure only dozens. The process consists of dousing the main ingredient, tobacco plants, with three different antibodies and giving the plants time to harvest and duplicate antibodies repeatedly. Cherif and Amedy met while they were incarcerated for non-terrorist crimes at the Fleury-Merogis Prison, and came under the influence of al Qaeda operative Djamel Beghal. Although the Kouachi brothers declared allegiance to al Qaeda and Coulibaly to ISIS (ISIL), it is believed to be more of a psychiatric problem with the men, than terrorist notions. 02/07/15 **48 HOURS: “Gone”** - a report about Mark Castellano, a man who claimed to be so desperate to find Michelle Warner, the mother of his three-year-old son, that he agreed to talk to Dr. Phil McGraw on McGraw’s daytime talk show regarding her 2012 disappearance. Within forty-eight hours, Castellano then told police a much different version of events. Warner had been living in Houston, Texas with Castellano, her on-again/off-again boyfriend. Castellano claimed Warner stormed out of the house after a fight and vanished without a trace, leaving her child behind. Warner’s family did not believe it and filed a missing persons report. Houston homicide detectives later received the case. Castellano agreed to appear on “The Dr. Phil Show”. Dr. Phil interviewed Castellano at his parents’ home in West Texas; he wasn’t buying Castellano’s version of events and had serious doubts about his story. The police investigation continued, but there were few if any clues. Two days after the interview with Dr. Phil, Castellano voluntarily went in for an interview with the police. During the interrogation, Castellano finally cracked and admitted that he had killed Warner, put her body in his car, and buried it in a shallow grave outside of Midland, Texas. Local police and the FBI tried to locate her body but were unsuccessful. Eventually, using Apple’s Face Time app and an iPhone, and with help from Castellano, police were able to scan the area and locate Warner’s body. Castellano was arrested and charged with murder. Eight days later, “The Dr. Phil Show” aired its episode about the case. Also includes: Tracy Smith’s interview with Mark Castellano in which he reveals deep-seated anger and resentment towards women and claims it was all an accident. At his trial, attorneys presented a new version of what he now says is the truth. After more than a week of testimony, Castellano was found guilty in the strangling death of Michelle Warner. **On-screen text graphic:** Mark Castellano will be eligible for parole in thirteen and a half years. Marriott accepted an invitation from McDonough to hang out with her and her boyfriend and watch a movie – and she never returned home. Mazzaglia used McDonough to bring other women into their relationship for his pleasure -- and that, for him, involved ropes and bondage gear, a fantasy brought into the mainstream by the book series and current motion picture, “Fifty Shades of Grey”. Police investigation led to Mazzaglia and McDonough. During interrogation, Mazzaglia said Marriott died accidentally during a BDSM encounter. McDonough told police Marriott was never there, but later, in a plea deal, changed her story. She said Mazzaglia killed Marriott when, after playing strip poker, she twice turned down his requests to initiate sex. After Marriott’s death, they

disposed of her body in the ocean. At Mazzaglia's 2014 trial, McDonough's testimony was critical. Bethany Deaton was a young wife and nurse, whose lifeless body was found in the backseat of a minivan, in Grandview, Missouri -- a plastic bag over her head, a suicide note, and an empty pill bottle nearby. Deaton’s mother believed it was not a suicide and that someone else had a hand in her daughter’s death; possibly someone involved in the fundamentalist Christian religious group to which she belonged, and which some people likened to a cult. While in college, and devoted to religion, Bethany was drawn to Tyler Deaton, the leader of the group called “The Community”, which was associated with the International House of Prayer (IHOP). Deaton told members what to wear, when to eat and even controlled their romantic relationships. One member says the group had become a full-blown cult. Bethany eventually married Tyler, but the marriage wasn’t perfect. There were questions about Tyler’s own sexuality; Bethany fell into a deep depression. Police did not believe Bethany killed herself. After the Medical Examiner ruled it a suicide, Micah Moore, another member of “The Community”, told police that he had killed Bethany, and was subsequently charged with murder. The case was upended when he recanted his confession. Investigators were unable to substantiate his confession and just weeks before the trial was to begin, charges were dropped against Micah. Questions remained. Was Micah manipulated? Did Tyler have something to do with it? Tyler is ready to admit he played a role in her death, but to what end? Did Bethany really commit suicide, or was it murder, as her mother believes? **On-screen text graphic:** Tyler has filed a claim to Bethany’s forty thousand dollar life insurance policy. He plans to pay back the Leidleins for the wedding. Kennedy’s ex-husband, stockbroker Steven DeMocker, became the chief suspect. Police investigation revealed a man who was a serial philanderer, who was struggling with a heavy financial burden, and had a toxic relationship with his ex-wife. Police arrested DeMocker saying they had a strong circumstantial case, but legal maneuvers, court delays and the death of a judge would prolong the case for five years. DeMocker’s girlfriend, Renee Girard, then revealed critical information about DeMocker’s activities after Kennedy’s death: he lived in fear of being arrested for a crime and revealed information about an insurance policy. His large family, including his two daughters Charlotte and Katherine, believe he is innocent. Prosecutors believe he killed Kennedy to avoid paying alimony and to gain access to an

02/28/15 **48 HOURS: "Blaming Melissa" (10:00-11:00p)** - an investigation into the 2009 case of Melissa Calusinski, a young woman who claims she did not murder 16-month-old Ben Kingan while working at a day care center in Lake County, Illinois, despite having confessed to the crime. Also examined are police interrogations, what happens after a confession, and what can happen when a key player in the investigation admits he made a life-altering mistake. Two days after Ben Kingan's death, Calusinski was brought in for questioning; police told her Ben died from a blunt-force trauma to the head and that she was the last adult to have seen him alive. She was interrogated for nine hours, never asked for a lawyer, and eventually confessed to dropping the child in a way that may have led to a head injury. She was convicted of murder, largely on the fact that she had confessed and that the Medical Examiner's report said that the child suffered from fresh injuries to his head. Her family persuaded a newly-elected coroner, Dr. Thomas Rudd, to re-examine the evidence. His findings revealed an older head injury -- a significant discovery. Eventually, state pathologist Dr. Eupil Choi, admitted to missing the old injury in his report. With this information, attorney Kathleen Zellner, who specializes in cases pertaining to false confessions, says that Melissa Calusinski did not receive a fair trial. Advocates say that, under extreme conditions, 60% of people confess to crimes they did not commit. The police say they played by the rules. Two courts have allowed the conviction to stand. Attorney Zellner believes the medical evidence needs to be re-examined, but the State Attorney will not pass it on. 03/29/15 **“Bashar al-Assad”** – an interview with the President of Syria, Bashar al-Assad, who sat down with Charlie Rose in Damascus last week to discuss how the Syrian government has lost control over significant amounts of its territory to terrorist groups like ISIS (ISIL), al Qaeda or Syrian rebel groups during the three-year-old civil war. The dictator is questioned about: attacks on civilians with chemical and “barrel bomb” weapons, the future of his relationship with the United States, and his characterization of surrounding countries in the Middle East. “Killing Cancer” – a report on a Duke University clinical trial of an immunotherapy that uses a re-engineered polio virus to kill cancer cells in brain cancer patients, specifically those diagnosed with glioblastoma, a deadly type of brain tumor. So far, 11 of 22 patients treated have died, but the remaining 11 have seen their tumors shrink, and two people introduced in this report have been declared cancer free: Stephanie Lipscomb, the first patient in the trial and Dr. Fritz Andersen, the second. A third patient Donna Clegg died, most likely due to too much of the polio virus injected into her tumor, creating too large an immune response. However this helped guide doctors to lower the dosage for another featured patient, Nancy Justice, who appears to be on the same track to remission as Lipscomb and Andersen, as her tumor continues to shrink with each MRI. 03/07/15 **48 HOURS: “Murder in Aspen”** – a report on the 2013 murder of Nancy Pfister, an Aspen, Colorado socialite/ski resort heiress, and the investigation to find her killer. Pfister came from a family of high achievers, but was also known for a demanding demeanor; even her friends were treated with disrespect, as friend Kathy Carpenter had personally experienced. Nancy Pfister was found dead from blunt force trauma, in the bedroom closet of her home by Kathy Carpenter. She had been alerted that something was amiss by Nancy Styler, who had recently rented the place with her husband Trey Styler, and was in the process of moving out. Police focused on the Stylers because they were involved in a public dispute with Pfister involving the rental home. Pfister came back three months earlier than expected, saying the couple had owed her a large amount of money. Police believed Nancy Styler harbored anger over the way Pfister treated the couple. They also believed Trey Styler, who suffered from a neurological disorder, was incapable of killing anyone. Days after the murder, both were arrested and charged with murder. Soon after, Kathy Carpenter was also arrested, and charged with murder. Police believed the women had bonded over Pfister’s seeming indifference to them. Three months later, a bombshell: Trey Styler confessed and said that he and he alone had killed Nancy Pfister. He agreed to tell the details of the crime in exchange for a 20-year sentence and his wife’s unconditional freedom. The charges were dropped against both women, but they claim that the prosecution’s continued insistence that they were somehow involved in the murder has convicted them in the court of public opinion. Kathy Carpenter still faces the threat of prosecution should more evidence be found. 03/14/15 **48 HOURS: “Bruce Beresford-Redman: The Verdict” (9:08 - 10:08p)** – an updated followup to “Prison Diaries” (OAD: 11/15/14), itself an update of “Fatal Episode: The Producer’s Story” (OAD: 02/25/12; Rebroadcast: 09/22/12), a report on former reality show producer Bruce Beresford-Redman, who was accused of murdering his wife Monica Burgos, while on a 2010 vacation in Cancun, Mexico. This broadcast includes the verdict: Beresford-Redman has been found guilty of homicide and sentenced to twelve years in prison. Included are new interviews with his mother Juanita Beresford-Redmond, his wife’s sister Carla Burgos and her attorney, Allison Treesle. The 09/22/12 rebroadcast included a phone interview with Beresford-Redman, who maintained his

innocence, from the Mexican prison where he was being detained while awaiting trial. Today, until the Mexican court system decides his guilt or innocence, Beresford-Redman remains incarcerated. Recently, over a period of four months, with a camera provided by 48 HOURS, he recorded diary entries in his cell and elsewhere around the prison compound and took viewers inside his life behind bars. Unlike many of his cellmates, Beresford-Redman has been able to pay for food to be brought in, but he describes the Mexican prison system as a dirty, rat-infested village with razor wire around it. There are about 1,800 men, women, and children living in a prison originally built for 700 people. - 03/14/15 **48 HOURS: COLD CASE: “Who Killed Amy Gellert?” (10:08 - 11:08p)** - the first in a new short-run series focusing on long-unsolved murders. Each broadcast will go in-depth into a hard-to-close case and present new reporting along with the existing evidence. This report focuses on a 1994 home invasion in Cocoa Beach, Florida, which led to the murder of 21-year-old Amy Gellert. Gellert had interrupted an intruder holding her parents hostage. Startled, the masked man stabbed her mother Charlotte (Bunny) Lehton and her stepfather, Robert Lehton. He fled, where he encountered Gellert in the driveway. Her killer was never caught. Multiple suspects have emerged since that fateful night. The cold case team of Major Todd Goodyear, Lt. Carlos Reyes, Marlon Buggs and Wayne Simock discuss their theories about the case: the unusual weapons used (a dagger and a prop gun), the intruder (characteristics, accent, etc.), and the possibility of a targeted attack. - 03/21/15 **48 HOURS PRESENTS: “The Bizarre Saga of Robert Durst”** - a report on new details in the case of millionaire Robert Durst (and a followup to 48 HOURS MYSTERY: “The Mystery of Robert Durst” (OAD: 03/17/04, Rebroadcast 09/09/04). Durst was recently arrested in New Orleans for the 2000 murder of his friend Susan Berman, following the broadcast of the six-part HBO documentary “The Jinx”. He still remains a suspect in the disappearance of his first wife, Kathie Durst. Also included is an exclusive interview with his attorney Dick DeGuerin, who tells 48 HOURS Correspondent Erin Moriarty that he’s eager to go to court and that the prosecution has a “weak circumstantial evidence case” against Robert Durst. Durst, the son of a prominent New York City real estate family, is no stranger to controversy. He remains a suspect in the 1982 disappearance of his first wife, Kathie Durst. At the time of Berman’s death, Durst was hiding out in Galveston, Texas, masquerading as a woman and trying to avoid authorities who wanted to talk to him about his wife’s disappearance. Berman, the daughter of a well-known Las Vegas mobster, was shot dead in her Los Angeles home; police suspected a mob hit. Durst was not considered a suspect until he became involved with the death of Morris Black in Galveston, claiming he accidentally killed Black in self-defense, then cut up his body. A jury eventually acquitted him of murder. Now, the HBO documentary has raised questions regarding Berman’s death, and police now believe that a destitute

Berman was possibly blackmailing Durst because she knew details about Durst's disappearance, and that comments made by Durst during the program will lead to a conviction. 03/28/15 **48 HOURS: “The Pretender”** - an updated rebroadcast of “The Pretender” (OAD: 05/31/05), a report on the case that has inspired the 2015 theatrical film “True Story”, which recounts how Christian Longo posed as discredited New York Times journalist Michael Finkel, while on the run in Mexico -- after murdering his wife and children in Oregon in 2001. At the time, Finkel, who admitted to fabricating a portion of a story on child slavery in Africa, was fired by the newspaper and had retreated to Montana in disgrace. Christian Longo, a married father of three, was living in Oregon where he moved for a fresh start, after committing a series of crimes in Michigan. In reality, Longo was a pathological liar and con man. Soon after, Longo was on the run, charged with killing his wife MaryJane and his three children. It was then that Finkel and the police learned that Longo had assumed Finkel’s identity. Finkel, curious to learn why someone would want to steal his identity, met with Longo and, based on conversations, a series of letters and phone calls, put together an account of events leading up to the murders and Longo’s apprehension, which he used as a way to resurrect his ruined writing career. Christian Longo was tried, found guilty of the murders and sentenced to death. He has since changed his story and is working on an appeal. Finkel authored a book, “True Story: Murder, Memoir, Mea Culpa”, which is the basis for the theatrical release starring Jonah Hill and James Franco. **On-screen text graphic:** Prosecutors say Christian Longo’s appeals are likely to last five to ten years. Oregon now has a moratorium on the death penalty. Michael Finkel took Longo’s advice and married his girlfriend, Jill. The couple now has three children.
