# WODC Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WODC provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Prostate cancer research: Dr. Kneeland Youngblood, Board Member of the Prostate Cancer Foundation, talked about April being National Minority Health Month and the disparities involving prostate cancer in Black men, and how they are more than two times likely to die from it than white men.
- Students and COVID vaccinations: Ashville and Pickaway County educators discussed the progress of getting schoolchildren vaccinated and prepared for in-classroom learning in the fall.
- Pickaway County crime prevention: Pickaway County Law Enforcement officer talked about their efforts to curb crime as schools begin to let out and plans for lifting pandemic restrictions are being discussed by county safety officials.
- Health & Safety: Pickaway County Fair officials discussed the safety precautions that will be taken despite most pandemic restrictions being lifted.
- Community-based volunteerism: Members from the Ohio Volunteer Collaborative talked about how their community-based organizations are setting up new programs to give seniors services like meals and social opportunities as some restrictions have eased from what was in force during the peak of the coronavirus pandemic.
