WODC provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Ashville history preservation:** Members of the Ashville Area Heritage Society talked about its partnerships with Ashville-area schools to increase historical knowledge among school-aged children about the history of Ashville.
- **Disaster relief volunteering:** American Red Cross Community Development Director Jeremy Steele discussed disaster relief services. He said that when a disaster strikes people want to rush out and help. He said that was fine, but he added that people can be most helpful if they give relief organizations like the American Red Cross time to prepare for volunteers. He also said that every person in a disaster area increases demand on critical resources, such as food, water, sanitation and medical facilities. He stressed that the solution is to register in advance.
- **Energy conservation:** Representatives from the Ohio Energy Council told about how consumers can find ways to lower energy bills as energy prices move higher. They said that citizens can save money and energy and help the community become energy independent. They offered energy-saving tips and we posted them on the WODC iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Health care careers:** Lisa Moore, Community Development Director for Ohio Interim Healthcare, talked about news stories predicting a serious shortage in nurses estimated at 800,000 by the year 2020. She said that presently registered nurses constitute the largest health care occupation, and is projected to create the second-largest number of new jobs among all occupations. We posted job-search information she provided to us on the WODC iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Hunger:** Volunteers from the Ashville Food Pantry talked about how the pantry is coping with extremely cold weather. They said the pantry remains full amid the great need in the Ashville and Pickaway County area. They added that the community has stepped up to fight the hunger problem.
- **News for homebuyers:** Representatives from the Ohio Real Estate Council discussed that the recent changes in the real estate market with stability in prices and appreciation, along with increased inventory are encouraging. They said more inventory means more choices and room to negotiate, plus less pressure on buyers to make hasty decisions.

- **Preparing for retirement:** Representatives from the Ohio Institute for Certified Public Accountants talked about how recent news stories suggest that many people are headed for rough retirement years and may not be able to maintain their current standard of living. They offered information to help set goals and establish priorities along with understanding investment options. We posted their information on the WODC iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Preservation of history:** Rose Jamison, editor of The Ashville News and a regular contributor to Ashville Community Profile, discussed the latest artifacts and other historical information to be included in the archives at the Ashville Small Town Museum.
- **Prevention of fraud crimes:** Representatives from the Ohio Crime Prevention Council discussed how most people think of violent crimes when they think of crime victims. They said that frauds, identity thefts and financial schemes victimize thousands in our community and millions nationwide each year. They offered information to help ensure that people have the opportunity to be heard and be provided assistance to further their recovery process. We posted the information on the WODC iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Protecting your finances:** Joan Coughlin, Executive Director of the Ohio Better Business Bureau, offered information to help people to watch over and guard their financial information. She said that there are Better Business Bureau-recommended services that can potentially avert identity crimes and we posted the information on the WODC iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Saving on health insurance:** Janet Hughes of the Ohio Department of Health discussed how people are increasingly looking to save on health insurance while getting some much-needed tax breaks. She said one way to make insurance more affordable is with a Health Savings Account (HSA), which she said is a high-deductible health insurance plan that's coupled with an IRA-style savings account. She offered information on this type of plan and we posted it on the WODC iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Small business advice:** Carol Wilkerson, Regional Manager of the Small Business Administration said that for businesses, competition means figuring out how to reach more customers, keep costs down and stay one step ahead of others in the industry. She offered information on places to go for advice on staying competitive and we posted their online information on the WODC iHeart Media Communities page.
- **Teen health:** Lisa Miller of the Ohio Center for Adolescent Health discussed that healthy development in adolescence is more than avoiding drugs, staying in school and keeping out of trouble. She offered a brochure to listeners of this program called "The Teen Years Explained."
