WODC Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WODC provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- 9/11: 17 Years Later A Call For Action: In this special iHeartRadio presentation hosted by Shelli Sonstein, two families told how they turned their personal tragedies into promoting good work and service: The Tunnel To Towers Foundation and the 9/11 Day of Service. Also included, how many people continue to fall ill and die from 9/11 toxins, anyone who was there up to 8 months after 9/11.
- Brain health: Staff members from the Alzheimer's Association discussed ways to help find cures faster such as joining the Brain Health Registry, which is a free and secure online study.
- Cancer treatment update: Officials from the Ohio State University James Cancer Center discussed advanced radiation treatment, which includes proton therapy. They said the therapy treats the tumor directly and spares healthy tissue, resulting in fewer side effects.
- Diabetes management: Gerald Johnson of the American Diabetes
 Association talked about how Certified Diabetes Educators can help
 simplify life and offer information about diabetes, which he said is a
 complex and often overwhelming disease.
- Disability income protection: Officials from the Ohio Insurance Institute discussed full-time workers who are also primary wage earners. They said that two-thirds of unmarried full-time workers are concerned about having enough money to pay bills during a period of sudden income loss. They discussed disability income benefits that will help.
- Eye health: Staff members from the Ohio Optometric Association talked about important steps to protect your sight, such as getting a dilated eye exam. They also discussed living a healthy lifestyle, eating right, managing chronic conditions and not smoking.
- Fire safety: Officials from the American Red Cross talked about the high number of local residential fires this year, and how we can all take a few simple steps that can help keep us out of those statistics.
- Health and children's sports: Chelsea Kaufman, Assistant Coordinator for the Ohio Foundation For Chiropractic Research, talked about how
