WODC provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **2015 Year-End Wrap-Up:** Highlights of discussions on bullying in the Ashville-area school district, hunger, fire safety, distracted driving and family health.
- **Ashville Historical Programs (Fall):** Members and volunteers from the Ashville Area Heritage Society discussed the historical events for Ashville-area students of all ages for the fall season in conjunction with the Village of Ashville School District.
- **Ashville/Pickaway County United Way support:** The Ashville/Pickaway County United Way Volunteer Committee discussed their campaign to create awareness of the various United Way agencies in Pickaway County, and garnering community support for them.
- **Autism/children:** Representatives from Autism Speaks discussed how they are working to improve the lives of children living with autism. They said that the earlier in life children with autism receive services, the more hope they have for their futures.
- **Bullying:** Members of Parents Preventing Bullying talked about protecting children from bullies in several ways, such as helping kids feel more confident about talking to a trusted adult and minimizing situations where bullying can occur.
- **Hunger:** Staff and volunteers from the Ashville Food Pantry talked about their partnership with Teays Valley High School that will have students assist with volunteer work at the pantry during the holiday break.
- **Military & Veterans (Impact of injuries on family):** Representatives from the Veterans Crisis Line talked about the returning soldiers who are affected by post-traumatic stress or traumatic brain injuries. They discussed how their spouses and children are being profoundly impacted. They gave information about how the Veterans Crisis Line connects them with various programs and services that give help and hope.
- **Military and Veterans:** This edition featured success stories from employers and also local veterans, who found jobs through iHeartMedia's in-house community engagement initiative Show Your Stripes, which

focuses on employment opportunities for veterans.

- **Museum programs/events:** Ashville Small Town Museum volunteers talked about their holiday artifacts and special programs for school-aged children.
- **Protecting disability income:** Staff members from the Ohio Insurance Institute offered details on protecting your income should there be a serious illness or injury that prevents you from working. We posted their helpful tips on disability income protection on the iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Small business opportunities:** Carol Wilkerson, Area Manager for the Small Business Administration, talked about progress for small businesses looking for contracting opportunities. SUBSTANTIVE IMPORTANCE REGARDING THE VILLAGE OF
ASHVILLE, CITY OF LICENSE FOR WODC-FM,
ASHVILLE/COLUMBUS**

Ashville is the city-of-license for WODC-FM. We realize an obligation to do community-specific programming for the Village of Ashville via *Ashville Community Profile*, a weekly 30-minute public-affairs program produced by WODC-FM.

Ascertainment of issues of substantive importance for the Village of Ashville is accomplished through visits to Ashville and interviewing many of the community leaders there. It is helped by having the editor of *The Ashville News* as a primary show contributor. Rose Jamison allows us to use excerpts from her weekly column for broadcast. In addition, she lends her voice to the introduction of the *Ashville Community Calendar* segment of the program, where an audio version of excerpts from her weekly column is broadcast. She has also been a regular guest to deliver news about the Village of Ashville herself. Many people in the Village of Ashville depend on Mrs. Jamison to get the word out about many issues, events and causes, and then she passes the information along to us. She includes the information in her newspaper column.

Many non-profit agencies based in Columbus have satellite offices in Village of Ashville and Pickaway County office buildings so that they can serve the area. As a result, many of the contacts we need to report on the Village of Ashville are in Columbus as well. The village depends on many Columbus agencies for help. On several occasions an interview about causes and issues of interest to the entire Central Ohio area are shared with our Columbus-licensed stations as well as the Village of Ashville such as family health, employment, safety, race relations and education.

In addition, Mrs. Jamison graciously mentions our station on a regular basis in her *The Ashville News* column which also appears in *The Circleville Herald*. Circleville is another nearby town that the Village of Ashville depends on for services.
