WODC provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Ashville Food Pantry services:** Staff and volunteers from the Ashville Food Pantry discussed the continuing need for food donations. They also talked about their food delivery program for people confined to their homes due to illness or injury.
- **Ashville holiday activities:** Staff and volunteers from the Ashville Area Heritage Society discussed their Labor Day weekend events taking place at Ashville Park.
- **Ashville student volunteer activities:** Volunteers and school administrators from the Teays Valley High School Student Volunteer Committee discuss their community service activities for Ashville planned so far for the new school year.
- **Auto safety and care:** Rich White, Executive Director of the Ohio Car Care Council, discussed the importance of getting a vehicle inspected to ensure road safety and savings. He talked about how a tune-up can help an engine deliver the best of balance and power, along with fuel economy and produce the lowest level of emissions. We posted the Council's car safety tips on the WODC Communities Web page.
- **Heart health event:** Dr. Anne Albers, cardiologist with Ohio Health Heart and Vascular Physicians, discussed the latest heart disease and stroke research news from the American Heart Association. She also talked about the upcoming American Heart Walk. Ohio Health was the presenting sponsor of the walk and WODC the media sponsor.
- **Homeowner flood insurance:** Stacey Whitaker of the Central Ohio Homeowners Association discussed that half the homeowners living in high risk flood areas, or special flood hazard areas, are not covered

She stated that three-quarters of adults polled in a recent statewide survey said they believe owning a home is the best long-term investment they can make, better than retirement savings or stock market investments.
- **Ohio-born product support:** In this program recorded live from the Ohio State Fair, staff from the Ohio Farmers Market talked about the importance of making purchases of Ohio-born meat and vegetable products.
- **Programs and services for veterans:** Staff members from the Ohio Department of Veteran Affairs talked about VA-operated programs designed to provide the best possible care for veterans along with offering rewarding job alternatives for experienced nurses.

Ashville is the city-of-license for WODC-FM. We realize an obligation to do community-specific programming for the Village of Ashville via *Ashville Community Profile*, a weekly 30-minute public-affairs program produced by WODC-FM.

Ascertainment of issues of substantive importance for the Village of Ashville is accomplished through visits to Ashville and interviewing many of the community leaders there. It is helped by having the editor of *The Ashville News* as a primary show contributor. Rose Jamison allows us to use excerpts from her weekly column for broadcast. In addition, she lends her voice to the introduction of the *Ashville Community Calendar* segment of the program, where an audio version of excerpts from her weekly column is broadcast. She has also been a regular guest to deliver news about the Village of Ashville herself. Many people in the Village of Ashville depend on Mrs. Jamison to get the word out about many issues, events and causes, and then she passes the information along to us. She includes the information in her newspaper column.

Many non-profit agencies based in Columbus have satellite offices in Village of Ashville and Pickaway County office buildings so that they can serve the area. As a result, many of the contacts we need to report on the Village of Ashville are in Columbus as well. The village depends on many Columbus agencies for help. On several occasions an interview about causes and issues of interest to the entire Central Ohio area are shared with our Columbus-licensed stations as well as the Village of Ashville such as family health, employment, safety, race relations and education.

In addition, Mrs. Jamison graciously mentions our station on a regular basis in her *The Ashville News* column which also appears in *The Circleville Herald*. Circleville is another nearby town that the Village of Ashville depends on for services.
