Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WODC provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Avoiding foreclosure scams/9/11 Day:** Local mortgage servicing representatives talked about how people can avoid losing their homes by working with their mortgage lenders and avoiding foreclosure scams. Also, a look back at September 11, 2001 and how it changed the way we live today. Host Mike Eiland discussed 9/11 Day activities.
- **Avoiding sports injuries and dehydration:** Local school sports representatives discussed the sports programs in full swing for the new school year, and the increased concern about proper hydration and avoiding serious injuries.
- **Colon cancer awareness and prevention:** Local representatives of the American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy talked about how colon cancer is largely preventable.
- **Concerns of insurance consumers:** Representatives from the Ohio Insurance Institute answered listeners concerns about ensuring ethical insurance practices by companies.
- **Detecting abnormal memory loss:** Representatives from the Alzheimer's Foundation talked about how early assessment is the key to detecting abnormal memory loss or the early stage of Alzheimer's disease.
- **Disability insurance information:** Local insurance professional Brad May talked about paycheck protection with disability insurance. He said that it replaces a major portion of your income if you are sick or injured and unable to work. We posted helpful information about disability insurance on our iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Heroin/opioid epidemic:** iHeartRadio Communities host Bernie Lucas discussed how a heroin addict is not always the guy hiding under a bridge shooting up with a dirty needle. He said the addicts are often soccer moms and honor students. He talked with U.S. Attorney General Loretta Lynch as a part of National Heroin and Opioid Awareness Week to help raise awareness and seek solutions to the growing problem.
- **Improving student-teacher relationships:** Concerned local parents of school-aged children discussed an increasing interest in having kids wear uniforms in school. They said they believe that student-teacher

relationships improve and student performance in class and on standardized has been found to increase.
