STRT Grand Haven Coast Guard

The Coast Guard located in Grand Haven, Michigan had its beginnings as a life-saving station starting in the year 1877. This station, funded by the local community, first used row boats in their mission of search and rescue. They operated 24 hours a day seven days a week. In 1915 the "Revenue Cutter Service" was called into operation by George Washington using Tall Ships to protect our merchant vessels combined with life-saving services to form what we know today as the US Coast Guard. On June 13, 1943, during WWII, the U.S. Coast Guard Cutter "Escanaba" was destroyed and only 2 out of 103 members of the crew survived. The crew was made of up of Grand Haven residence, so each year the U.S. Coast Guard in Grand Haven celebrates their birthday on the week of August 4th and on Friday of this week long celebration they honor the men that lost their lives during their service for the U.S. Coast Guard.

Cindy Woods, President and founder of Clear Vision has the disability of blindness caused by a degenerative retinal disease which developed at nine years old. Through Clear Vision Cindy hopes to help people understand how to include the disability community.

After attending a summer camp meeting, she discovered there was not much accessibility for someone with a disability to participate in activities on their own, without a resource to tap into. Cindy's goal, after her experience at camp, is to train the community to know how to help those with disabilities to be able to participate in life with those who have no disabilities. To make places and events accessible some things need to be tweaked and she is willing to share those.

Cindy has a 3-part seminar that can be used in the workplace, clubs, schools, churches or anywhere people are that are willing to be educated.

Property values have gone up through the roof this past year with the downside being that usually means your tax assessment will be going up. In Spokane, Washington the average tax bill in 2019 was \$2500 but \$3000 in 2021, which is a 20% increase. 2022 looks like they may increase again this year. You do have the right to appeal your new tax assessment. First check for the appeal deadline so you don't miss that. Then find out how your home was assessed, in most cases that's a percentage of the market value. Make sure your local tax assessment office has applied any tax reductions or credits have been applied. You may be required to prove that you are entitled to a particular benefit. Lastly, look for any discrepancy and then compare your home with those that match yours' in your neighborhood.

Gary Heilig, master gardener, shared that August begins the harvest season as the gathering of leafy greens starts to wind down. Some sweet corn is ripening, early melons like cantaloupe and summer squash and zucchini are ready for picking. He suggested that you can go online to find information on when to harvest certain vegetables and fruits. Beets are better when picked at 2 inches across, zucchini are best at 7-8 inches long and sweet corn taste best when the kernels are still milky. Pears ripen from the inside to the outside, so lightly press on the stem end to see if it's soft and ripening.

Besides fruits and vegetables, you can also grow medicinal herbs in your garden. Gary pointed out that if we come to a time when we can't buy food we can grow it. Also, if we can't get to a doctor with a minor injury that there are plants we can grow that may help us. Common plantain, which is readily available in Michigan is a great plant for its wound healing abilities and it's also edible both raw and cooked. He suggests to find someone that knows about these plants to help you know what to grow and how to use them.

What was the first culture to cultivate roses? Samaritans. What is the oldest color of roses? Pink What roses have a heavy fragrance? In the family of hybrid Tea roses is a variety called double delight which has an absolutely wonderful scent. A general indication of fragrant roses is darker colors and the ones with a very high petal count.

September is turf improvement month. In order to have a plush, beautiful lawn, there are many inputs that need to be added to the yard. It's best not to cut your grass too short as that will encourage weed development. It is better to keep your mower at a 3-inch cut. There are many types of diseases that can get in your lawn, but if you can wait until the weather changes most of them will correct themselves.
