Programs to address issues for 3rd quarter of 2023

Public health

Kanzaland Local News—broadcast July 3 at 12 & 5 pm and July 4 at 6, 7 & 8 am. News story about a boil water advisory being issued for the city of White Cloud in Doniphan County due to a water line break. Length, 1 minute.

Kanzaland Local News—broadcast July 11 at 12 & 5 pm and July 12 at 6, 7 & 8 am. News story about a boil water advisory begin issued for the city of Reserve in Brown County due to an equipment malfunction. Length, 1 minute.
