Problem # 6: Causeway Flooded Again, Build The Bridge

Mayor Sandy Stimpson agrees that the Mobile River Bridge needs to be built—and fast.

Stimpson posted recently about the bridge on his Facebook page, with over 1200 comments—most of them in favor of building it. The bridge would include six lanes of traffic over the river and will add four lanes to the existing four over the bay.

"We're getting ready to have Wal-Mart distribution center,
Amazon sortation center, you will have growth at Brookley, and the I10 corridor has got to function better than it is now or you will not
experience the growth in this geographical area if you don't have it,"
says Stimpson.

And with all the growth planned for Mobile, the situation could get worse before it gets better.
