To assist you in complying with the reporting requirements for children's television and the requirement that stations air "core" children's programming, we are providing you with episode-specific descriptions (for QUBO Kids on NBC) as set forth in the attached Community Relations Quarterly Children's Programming Report for 1st quarter 2009. The report includes information to help prepare FCC Form 398. Please note that we have not included the specific dates and times for each of the programs as that may be station-specific.

This report is divided into the following categories:

1. Educational Objectives: QUBO for both the 1st quarter 2009 and 2nd quarter 2009.
2. Core programming: Regularly scheduled programming furnished by the NBC Network that is specifically designed to serve the educational and informational needs of children 16 and under. Please note that the age target for QUBO programming on NBC is 4-8 years old. Each of these programs is identified on-air as educational and informational with the "E/I" icon, and is similarly identified to the national listing services. To assist stations with the preemption report section of the new FCC Form 398, we have added specific episode numbers.
3. Other programming: Programming furnished by the NBC Network that contributes to the educational and informational needs of children 16 and under, but is not specifically designed to meet the educational and informational needs of children.
4. Public service announcements targeted to children 16 and under.
5. Non-broadcast efforts that enhance the educational and informational value of NBC Network programming to children.
6. Network on-air promotional efforts, which include a schedule of QUBO programming on NBC on-air promos.

The regularly-scheduled children's programming and promotional content furnished to you by the NBC Network during the 1st quarter of 2009 complied with the commercial limits of the Children's Television Act, provided that you broadcast and distributed such programming as furnished to you by NBC, and did not add any promotional or advertising content there to other than as directed by NBC via weekly postings on APT.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

1st Quarter 2009 Educational Objectives

In compliance with the Children's Television regulations that became effective January 2, 1997, the **QUBO Programming Block on NBC** features an on-air icon indicating that each program is "educational and informational" for children. This icon is displayed at the beginning of each broadcast. Also, in compliance with the regulations, the following document, which includes "educational and informational" objectives of **QUBO on NBC**, must be placed in your public file.

Each of the programs listed below, which make up the **QUBO** programming block, is specifically designed to serve the *educational and informational* needs of children ages 4-8. All of the programs have educational objectives that are central to the content and appropriate to the program genre.

There are six returning shows from last quarter. All shows were developed specifically for a target audience composed of children 4-8 years of age. Four of the shows are book-based series. Five of the shows contain important social-emotional messages for the target audience; one of the returning shows communicates science and astronomy messages. All educational and informational messages are delivered through an animated narrative format.

Set in medieval times, "**Jane and the Dragon**" is an animated show that hails from Martin Baynton's best-selling book about a middle-class girl named Jane. Jane is raised in the Royal Court as a Knight-in-Training after she demonstrates her courage by leaving the castle to conquer the local dragon. The giant green Dragon, whose sense of humor exceeds his ferocity, instead becomes Jane's best friend and a part of the castle community. In each episode, Jane encounters a challenge that tests her problem-solving skills and requires her to demonstrate her strength of character as a Knight of the King's Guard. Sometimes Jane learns a moral lesson, and other times she uses her analytical ability to illustrate how a problem can be made less complicated and easily solved.

Based on the book series by Deborah Manchester, "**The Zula Patrol**" teaches science and astronomy facts to a target audience of children 4-8 years of age. The Zula Patrol is a group of six animated aliens, headed by Captain Bula, who carry out a variety of scientific space missions. During their missions, Captain Bula and his crew often encounter their foe, Dark Truder, and his minion, Traxie, who are trying to take over the universe. Over the course of the story, the audience learns different facts about specific space topics such as stars, planets, orbits, moons, asteroids, comets, gravity, and space probes. The information is then highlighted during a segment where crew member Professor Multo delivers his "Multo-Moments" or summary of scientific facts from the story. Typically, the stories also provide a social-emotional tag based on tolerance and non-violent conflict resolution.

"**3-2-1 Penguins!**" features two children—Jason and Michelle—whose vacation at their grandmother's cottage ends up being more adventure than they expect when their toy spaceship with four toy Penguins comes to life. The children are sucked into the spaceship, where they meet the now live Penguins and journey through space to solve an inter-galactic disaster threatening the Penguins and their friends. Each story begins with a problem, a moral dilemma for one of the siblings that affects his/her relations with the other, and ends after the children have learned an important social-emotional message through their adventure. The show communicates messages on topics such as honesty, being patient with others, and avoiding jealousy.

"VeggieTales" is a show that draws upon characters from stories, which use both long and short form material to provide social-emotional messages to children. The children's series features animated vegetables who teach life lessons through stories. Hosted by Bob the Tomato and Larry the Cucumber, each episode begins by establishing the problem. Using short stories to parallel the situation with a problem and solution, the episodes end by reiterating the proposed solution and the life lesson learned through the experience. The show communicates social-emotional messages based upon the core values of honesty, kindness, forgiveness, and appreciation for all, using music, unusual characters, and allegorical storylines.

"Turbo Dogs" is an animated show based on the books, Racer Dogs, by Bob Kolar. The series follows a group of six dogs from Racerville who love to compete with one another in races. In each story, one or more of the dogs encounter and solve problems that teach them social-emotional lessons on good sportsmanship, teamwork, cooperation, playing fair, and friendship. The show also imparts information on the mechanics of racing such as directionality and concepts of distance and time. The social-emotional messages are embedded through the stories using action and humor. The tags at the end of each episode reiterate and establish the educational message learned by the dogs.

"My Friend Rabbit" is an animated show with two lead characters, Rabbit and Mouse, who work together to tackle challenges that are characteristic of the childhood experience. With each episode, Rabbit and Mouse, along with other friends, face a unique dilemma that compels them to think creatively about how to approach and solve their problem by trying out different solutions and persisting with new ideas when one fails.

2nd Quarter 2009 Educational Objectives

There is one new show for the 2nd quarter of 2009.

All shows were developed for a target audience composed of children 4-8 years of age. Four of the shows are book-based series. Five of the returning shows contain important social-emotional messages for the target audience. One of the returning shows communicates science and astronomy messages. All educational and informational messages are delivered through an animated narrative format.

1ST QUARTER 2009 SHOW SUMMARIES

JANE AND THE DRAGON is a coming-of-age story about a middle-class, medieval girl who lives in the Royal Court with her family. As an only child, Jane is raised to be a Lady-in-Waiting but through her determination and a stroke of luck, she ends up being trained as a Knight in the King's Guard. Accompanied by her best friend, a giant green Dragon that lives in her backyard, Jane experiences a series of adventures that test her character and her skills as a young knight in a castle full of friends and foes. Each episode in the show takes us through the problems and challenges Jane encounters and the process she goes through to find the solutions for them.

THE ZULA PATROL is an animated show about six extraterrestrial characters—Captain Bula, his copilot Zeeter, Professor Multo, their pet, Gorgo, and their flying dictionaries, Wizzy and Wigg—who learn key science concepts as they explore the galaxy through space missions. Often, the group encounters the evil Dark Truder and his talking toupee minion, Traxie, and must thwart Truder's poorly planned schemes to take over the universe. Each character exhibits unique abilities and traits that, combined with their new knowledge, helps them problem-solve their way through their journeys. Using an integrated approach to target diverse learning styles, the show communicates its educational messages through narratives and a two-part information segment at the end of each story.

3-2-1 PENGUINS! draws upon characters from two stories and uses both long and short form material involving these characters to provide social-emotional messages to children. The show features two children, Jason and Michelle, whose vacation at their grandmother's cottage ends up being more adventure than they expect when their toy spaceship with four toy Penguins comes to life. The children are sucked into the spaceship, where they meet the now live Penguins and journey through space to solve an inter-galactic disaster threatening the Penguins and their friends. Each story begins with a problem and ends after the children have learned an important social-emotional message through their adventure with the Penguins.

VEGGIETALES is a show that draws upon characters from stories, which use both long and short form material to provide social-emotional messages to children. Narrated by animated veggies, Bob the Tomato and Larry the Cucumber, the show teaches life lessons through wit and humor. Each episode contains one or two short animated stories that illustrate core values to children in an entertaining way. Stories are interrupted with silly songs, usually sung by Larry the Cucumber, that contain whacky lyrics in a catchy tune. Each episode ends with Bob and Larry reinforcing the lesson learned through the stories.

TURBO DOGS is a show about six canine friends—Dash, GT, Clutch, Stinkbert, Strut, and Mags—who have their own distinct characteristics but share a common love of racing cars. The fastest dogs in Racerville, the Turbo Dogs often compete with one another in races. The dogs each have their own racers, which they maintain regularly, and that are equipped with individual GPS systems to help and guide them. Each story begins with one of the Turbo Dogs encountering a problem that must be resolved while preparing to compete. Usually, the Turbo Dog learns his/her lesson through experience and accountability for negative behavior. Social-emotional messages about sportsmanship, teamwork, cooperation, and fairness developed in the story are emphasized in a separate tag at the end of each episode.

MY FRIEND RABBIT models constructive problem-solving for young children (ages 4-8 years). In each episode, the story characters find themselves facing a different dilemma that is drawn from a typical childhood experience. Rabbit and Mouse usually lead us through creative problem-solving, which involves tenacity and working in teams. The group may figure out how to make the most of a bad situation, invent toys from everyday objects, solve some of nature's riddles, respect their differences, or take care of others who need a little extra help. The characters specialize in converting a challenge into a social activity filled

with optimism, creativity and humor. The series helps children learn to “think out of the box” by showing viewers how the characters work together to come up with possible solutions, and persist with new ideas when one solution fails.

2ND QUARTER 2009 SHOW SUMMARIES

There is one new show for the 2nd quarter of 2009.

BABAR, based on the books by Laurent de Brunhoff, is an animated show about a young orphaned elephant who finds the strength to rise above the challenges he faces, including the death of his parents, as he journeys through life. Each episode of the show develops a social-emotional message such as taking responsibility, being patient and persistent in hard work, respecting people’s privacy, learning to cope with unforeseen changes, and being honest. These messages emerge from the need to resolve a dilemma that is faced by Babar, one of his friends or family members. **BABAR**, first appeared on the schedule in 2007, and is returning with new episodes in 2009.

JANE AND THE DRAGON

RUNE [JAD114]

Jane and Gunther are given the chore of polishing the castle's shields in preparation for the Royal Jubilee, celebrating the castle's 300th anniversary. The squire who polishes the most shields will win the honor of carrying the banner in the Jubilee Parade. Jane has wanted to carry the banner for so long that she immediately gets to work. However, Dragon wants Jane to spend some time with him so they can decipher the runes in his cave. Jane promises Dragon that she will help him once she is done, but Gunther's father sabotages Jane's efforts when nobody is looking. Jane has to use time she promised Dragon to polish her shields all over again. Upset, Dragon leaves Jane and resigns to his cave. Seeing his father's devious actions, Gunther undoes the damage and Jane ends up winning. She sacrifices her win to Gunther to keep her promise to Dragon.

[Educational Message: Integrity and keeping your promises go a long way to preserve a friendship.]

THE ZULA PATROL

THIS LOOKS LIKE A JOB FOR THE ZULA DUDES [ZUL101]

The Zula Patrollers camp out on Planet Zula as a meteor streaks by. Multo uses the Multopedia to explain to his friends that some space rocks are called asteroids, most of which go around the sun in the asteroid belt between Jupiter and Mars. When a piece of the rock falls off and flies through space near a planet, it creates a streak of light or a meteor. Dark Truder listens in and devises a plan to trick all the asteroids in the asteroid belt to head toward Zula, despite the asteroids' warning that once they start they won't be able to stop. As the asteroids head for Zula, Surfer Asteroid makes a distress call to The Zula Patrol to warn them. The Zula Patrol saves their planet by using Multo's newest invention to send the asteroids back into space, thwarting Dark Truder's plans.

[Educational Message: Some of the rocks in space are known as asteroids. Most asteroids go around the sun in a path known as the asteroid belt. When a piece of asteroid falls off and travels through space near a planet, it creates a streak of light known as a meteor.]

COMET'S TAIL [ZUL101]

Multo and his friends see a comet passing over Zula. Using the Multopedia, they learn that a comet is made of dust and ice and has a long tail. Seeing how fast the comet goes, Zeeter decides to race it; Wizzy and Wigg join her. As she races the comet, the spaceship begins freezing, goes out of control, and crashes on the comet. Multo suggests asking the comet to spin fast so it could throw the spaceship off itself into space and they can return home. The comet is hesitant to let them go at first because he enjoys their company. But after Wizzy and Wigg make a snowman for the comet, to give him company, he agrees. They return to their ship and the comet spins fast. The Zula spaceship finally gets thrown off the comet into space and Zeeter returns them home.

[Educational Message: Comets consist of ice and dust and some have tails. They spin really fast, often tracing the same path repeatedly.]

3-2-1 PENGUINS!

IN THE BIG PLACE [PEN307]

When Jason refuses to help Michelle fly her remote-controlled plane, Grandmum reminds him to be helpful to everyone if he's in the position to do so. Instead, Jason retreats to the attic where he and Michelle join the Penguins for another mission. They must help the Penguins retrieve a cookie for the cows that need it to fuel their spaceship, after crash-landing on an asteroid. Though Jason is hesitant about helping them, they return to Grandmum's house to get a cookie when Cavitus interrupts them. Frustrated, Jason wants to return home without helping the cows. But when he sees that nobody's being helped, and they need help retrieving the cookie, he realizes Grandmum's right. He helps Michelle fly her plane so they can outsmart Cavitus, then retrieves the cookie and helps deliver it to the cows. In turn, they help by charging the Galeezel fully and the kids return home.

[Educational Message: If someone asks you for help and you have the power to help them, you should. It's not nice to refuse to help someone in need. You never know when you may need someone else's help.]

VEGGIETALES

SUMO OF THE OPERA [VEG107]

Larry the Cucumber stars as a pro-wrestling goof called the Italian Scallion, who never finishes what he starts because he fears that he doesn't have the ability to do the things he undertakes. So, he clowns around to make people laugh and, eventually, quits when things start to look too challenging. When he lands in the sumo wrestling ring with champion wrestler, Apollo Gourd, he realizes that the time for jokes is up. Motivated by the idea of winning the Tiger Bike, he focuses on training hard for the big championship with his coach, a former sumo champion himself. On the day of the championship, the Italian Scallion faces off with Apollo Gourd. Despite the odds, the Scallion refuses to give up and the match ends in a tie. Even though he doesn't win, the Italian Scallion realizes that he does have the ability to finish what he starts and learns that perseverance has its own rewards.

[Educational Message: When you finish what you start, you always come out a winner just for trying.]

TURBO DOGS

CROCHET SURPRISE [TDO105]

Dash has no time to fix his broken fan belt because he has to visit his Aunt Ratchet. Presuming he'll get bored and not do much because his aunt is old, he assures his friends he'll return home soon. Instead, Dash finds Aunt Ratchet surprisingly active for her age. She makes him tea, moves his car on the driveway, and mows the lawn in record time. He offers to help his aunt who reassures him she's fine but accepts his offer. As he accompanies her through her chores, he learns that his aunt completes her chores with the help of creative devices that make doing things easier. She finally shows him her collection of inventions and the trophies she's won for them. She even crocheted a fan belt for his car. Impressed and apologetic for misjudging Aunt Ratchet due to her age, Dash lets his aunt race on the tracks instead of him.

[Educational Message: Don't judge others by their age or appearance. Give them a chance to show you who they are before you form an impression.]

A STAR TURN [TDO105]

Clutch is on a winning streak because he has been practicing rigorously. When he wins another race, he's invited for a television interview. However, as soon as he gets a taste of stardom, he lets it get to his head and develops a celebrity persona. Instead of practicing for the relay race with Stinkbert, he focuses on

preparing for his interview. On the day of the interview, the host asks Clutch to perform a test run for the audience. Though Stinkbert does well, Clutch performs poorly on television because he hasn't practiced at all. He finally realizes his lack of practice has affected his driving skills. He admits on television that he didn't do well because he let his success get the better of him and stopped working hard. He returns to practice with Stinkbert and they win the next race.

[Educational Message: Don't let success get to your head. If you want to continue to do well, you need to keep working hard and practicing. It's also important to be humble even if you're successful.]

MY FRIEND RABBIT

MOUSE'S MOUNTAIN [MFR205]

Mouse, Jasper and Thunder want to go up the mountain, but each of them is afraid about something. Rabbit offers suggestions on how they can overcome their fears. He reminds Mouse that he won't be lost if they're together, suggests Jasper take his fishing stick to remind him of home, and promises to scare the "Oogie-Boogies" away for Thunder. Together, they head to the mountain and help each other conquer their fears as they climb up. At night, when Rabbit gets anxious in the enclosed cave, Thunder and Jasper remove the rock covering the top. Continuing the next morning, Thunder and Mouse find themselves alone when they go too fast ahead. Remembering how their friends helped, they're able to counter their fears by themselves. Everyone finally meets at the top, realizing they were able to get there not just because they were brave, but also because they had each other.

[Educational Message: Don't let your fears stop you from doing something you want to do. With a little bravery and the help of good friends, you can overcome your fears and accomplish your goals.]

YOU BE ME [MFR205]

While playing, Mouse and Thunder decide to switch roles by pretending to be like each other. First, they use grass and leaves to look like one another. Then, they switch places with their friends. So, Mouse helps Hazel collect nuts and Thunder visits Edweena with Rabbit. Mouse and Thunder soon find that it isn't easy to do things in the same way as someone else. Mouse has trouble collecting the nuts because he's so small, while Thunder is too big to reach into the tree-hole to locate Edweena's lost shell. So each tries to think like the other. Mouse asks a dragonfly for help with Hazel's acorns. And Thunder asks Edweena to stick her trunk in the tree-hole, then makes her laugh so she blows into the tree and the shell flies out. Mouse and Thunder realize that although it's fun to take someone else's place, it's easier to just be yourself.

[Educational Message: Sometimes it is fun to pretend you're someone else and can do things the way they do; but you should also like the specialness of just being yourself.]

JANE AND THE DRAGON

FOUL WEATHER FRIENDS [JAD115]

While out on patrol, Dragon does a spontaneous loop-de-loop that causes Jane to lose her grip and free-fall through the air. Dragon manages to save her in the nick of time, but he is shaken by the experience. He vows that no harm will come to her and becomes like an overprotective parent. Tired of his suffocating affection, Jane sneaks off on patrol alone on horseback, with her cryptically-carved hero sword. When a sudden storm spooks her horse, Jane finds herself stranded in the wilderness. As the storm intensifies, Dragon looks for her and discovers Jane as she unlocks the mystery of the runic sword, sending out a dragon-summoning beacon. Dragon learns while safety is important, overreacting and becoming overprotective can have the reverse effect on people. Jane had learned to take care of herself and called on him when she needed his help.

[Educational Message: It is important to protect those we love, but we must not anticipate the worst and become overprotective. Sometimes we must trust that our friends will know when to ask for help if they are in danger.]

THE ZULA PATROL

DAY FOR NIGHT [ZUL102]

Bula and Gorga wake up one morning to find that it's still night when Dark Truder announces that unless they accept him as their leader, he won't return daytime to them. To find a solution, Multo uses the Multopedia and learns that daytime occurs when one side of the planet is facing the sun and nighttime happens when the planet faces the dark. When Bula, Zeeter and Gorga leave in search of Dark Truder, Multo discovers that day and night change when planets rotate toward or away from the sun. He realizes that Dark Truder must have stopped Zula's rotation, so each side is stuck in day or night. Together, the team prevents Dark Truder's "Planetary Paralyzer Ray" from zapping their planet so it can keep turning and return daylight to their planet.

[Educational Message: All planets rotate around the sun, but the sun stays still. Daytime occurs when one side of the planet is facing the sun and receiving sunlight. Nighttime occurs on the other side of the planet that is not facing the sun and is in the dark.]

BULA'S SPIN PARTY [ZUL102]

Multo tests his "rotasters" that spin on their axes during a barbeque with his friends. Using the Multopedia, Multo explains that an axis is an imaginary line on which the Earth rotates over twenty-four hours or one day. Bula then decides to host a spinning contest for everyone. To prepare, Bula practices his moves using Multo's planet models. Multo advises Bula that he should find his own spinning style just like the planets, which spin in their own way. At the party, Bula's friends pair up with the planets and practice their spinning moves. Dark Truder, disguised as a planet, interrupts Bula's party. Unlike the other planets, however, Dark Truder spins in too many directions. When Bula catches him, Dark Truder challenges Bula to a spinning contest. Instead, he ends up spinning out of control. Bula learns that he, too, can spin in his unique way just like the planets.

[Educational Message: Each planet rotates on its axis around the sun in its own unique way. All planets revolve around the sun and have day and night. Some planets rotate faster than others, so their days and nights are shorter.]

12 ANGRY HENS [PEN301]

When Michelle accuses Jason of denting the spaceship without allowing him to explain, Grandmum advises her to listen to everything before judging. Michelle learns her lesson through a mission in which she and the Penguins must retrieve the royal egg stolen from the hens on Planet Henpecked-A-Lot. When the Penguins find that the hens have captured and accused Gizmoid Fox without evidence or explanation, they suggest a trial. Michelle argues Gizmoid's case and Zidgel judges. Instead of listening to Michelle's arguments, however, Zidgel keeps interrupting. Fidgel reminds them that judging without listening is foolish, but Zidgel refuses until Michelle asks him to listen before answering. After questioning Gizmoid, Michelle cross-examines Henry Penny who also speaks too soon and ends up revealing himself as Cavitus' minion. The Penguins and Michelle find Cavitus and finally rescue the stolen egg. Returning home, Michelle apologizes to Jason for not listening and jumping to conclusions.

[Educational Message: Don't jump to conclusions without first listening to all the evidence.]

MADAME BLUEBERRY [VEG108]

Madame Blueberry has everything she needs and more, but she is not thankful for any of it. Always comparing what she has with her friends and neighbors, she constantly feels blue. She thinks that if she has more things, she'll feel much better. When two sales-veggies show up at her door and tempt her, she rushes to their store for more things that she really doesn't need. On her way there, she sees a little girl sitting under a tree with her parents. They have very little food for themselves, but they seem happy with what they do have. At the store, Madame Blueberry sees a little boy who happily settles on something his dad can get him rather than cry about what he can't have. Seeing the children so content and grateful, Madame Blueberry realizes that she doesn't need so many things because her needs are already met by what she has.

[Educational Message: When you compare your possessions to those who have less, you realize that simply having more things is not what provides happiness.]

TURBO DOGS

MARSHALL DASH [TDO106]

As the new race marshal, Dash takes his role very seriously and immediately begins creating and enforcing new rules. Though his first rule is agreeable to everyone, soon he goes overboard and makes up rules that prevent the dogs from doing anything fun in his clubhouse. When they try to object, Dash insists on his position as the marshal. Mags tries reasoning with Dash, but he doesn't listen, and continues to enforce unfair rules until nobody wants to be around him. When he complains that his friends haven't asked him to join them for pizza, Mags reminds him that he didn't ask them before he made up those rules, either. Realizing she's right and that being marshal means he must lead and listen to others, Dash apologizes and promises to make rules on which everyone agrees.

[Educational Message: Being a leader means you have to listen to the opinions and needs of those around you before making and enforcing rules that affect everyone. You cannot just form your own rules and boss everyone around.]

DOGS IN A FOG [TDO106]

Officer Gruffer visits the dogs to make sure their maps are loaded on the GPS for the next race. As he visits each clubhouse, he startles the dogs with his loud laugh, causing minor accidents in the process. Embarrassed, he heads to Doggone Pizza to eat, but his laugh ends up distracting Five. When he overhears Mags and GT discussing his laugh, he decides to change it so it doesn't cause more trouble. He tries Mag's high-pitched laugh, then a deeper laugh, but the dogs just find his laugh stranger. Disheartened, Gruffer decides never to laugh again. He learns to appreciate his laugh when the dogs get lost in the fog during the race without their GPS systems. The dogs rely on Gruffer's loud laugh to reach safety and explain that although they need to get used to it, they do appreciate his laugh.

[Educational Message: You may have a feature or habit that is different from others, but you do not have to be too self-conscious about it. Your friends will get used to your difference and may even grow to appreciate or rely on it.]

GIBBLE-GOOSE GIRLS GALORE [MFR206]

While practicing their water-dance, The Gobble-Goose Girls perform their moves for their friends. When Rabbit compliments Pearl on her dance, she insists the others use only her moves. Instead, the others decide to do their own dance. The Girls show their individual moves to Rabbit who compliments them all. Amber is "Thunderific," Coral is "Hooplaloopa," and Jade is "Whoozy-doodle-flap." Excited, the Girls try dancing separately while practicing their performance, and then realize that nobody will know who to watch. They decide it's better to do one dance, but can't agree on who goes first. To choose the best dance, they seek help from Jasper who suggests they ask Rabbit himself. When the Girls overhear Rabbit using all the words to describe their dance, Rabbit explains it's because all their moves are great when they're combined. Realizing that Rabbit's right, The Gobble-Goose Girls perform one water dance for their friends combining all their moves.

[Educational Message: When you work with a team, you must use everyone's suggestions to create the best work. Often, you'll find that combining your teammates' suggestions and ideas will make your work much better than working separately on the same project.]

THE SCARDEY SKUNK [MFR206]

Rabbit and Mouse befriend Fowler, the skunk, who joins them to play with Edweena. But both Fowler and Edweena scare each other off. Afraid of Edweena's large size, Fowler releases a powerful smell that frightens Edweena. Fowler later explains that skunks have a spray under their tails that they use when they're frightened to scare off the danger and escape. Rabbit and Mouse hop-think ways to help Edweena and Fowler become less afraid of each other. Knowing that Fowler and Edweena want to be friends, Rabbit and Mouse bring them together so they can overcome their fears. It doesn't work. So, they help each of them pretend to meet each other and practice not being scared. When Fowler and Edweena finally meet, they realize they've got a lot in common. Not afraid of Edweena's size anymore, Fowler doesn't release his smell, which doesn't scare Edweena. So, they finally become friends.

[Educational Message: Learning more about each other can help you become friends and overcome your fears about one another.]

When Jane eats some berries and passes out, she reawakens with amnesia. She cannot remember anyone, but she especially cannot remember Dragon. Scared and disgusted by her former fire-breathing friend, Jane runs from Dragon every time she sees him. All her friends try to help Jane remember who she is and who Dragon is to her – her best friend and her partner in knightly duties. But, Jane simply cannot remember. Dragon formulates a plan to help Jane remember him because if she doesn't, he will have to find another dragon master. He doesn't want to lose Jane, his best friend. Fortunately for him, his plan works and Jane retrieves her lost memory and welcomes Dragon back into her life.

[Educational Message: The bond between friends is sometimes made stronger when they help one another during a time of great need.]

THE ZULA PATROL

SHADOW PLAY [ZUL103]

Gorga mistakes a possum's shadow for a monster until the others follow him and discover his mistake. To explain why the possum's shadow appeared so large, Multo uses the example of a tree and his hand to demonstrate how shadows form when an object blocks light, and how shadows look bigger or smaller depending on the time of day. Using the Multopedia, Multo also shows his friends how shadows appear larger at morning and at night and smaller during midday. Back at home, they notice something blocking the sun and realize it's a monster. They learn of Dark Truder's plan to destroy their spaceship by ordering

the monster to eat the largest spaceship-shaped donut it can find. So, they bake a giant donut just like their spaceship and create a shadow of the spaceship to trick the monster into going after the donut replica instead.

[Educational Message: Shadows are caused when an object blocks light, both outdoors and indoors. Shadows also change their size depending upon the time of day; they appear larger in the morning, smaller in the day and larger again at night. Shadows can appear on any surface that gets light, including the surfaces of planets and moons.]

JEALOUS MOON (ZUL103)

A total solar eclipse occurs while everyone is practicing the performances for the sun festival. Through the Multopedia, Multo explains that an eclipse occurs when the moon passes between a planet and the sun, blocking the sun to create dark shadows on the planet's surface. Sometimes the moon covers the sun completely for a few minutes, causing a total solar eclipse. The problem Zula faces is that its total solar eclipse lasts too long because the moon won't unblock the sun unless it gets the same attention. While Bula and his friends find ways to convince the moon that it matters too, Dark Truder tries to ruin their festival. Finally, Bula, Gorga, Wizzy, and Wigg perform especially for the moon, as Zeeter holds off Dark Truder. Realizing how silly it was to feel jealous of the sun, the moon eventually moves to let the sun shine on the planet.

[Educational Message: A solar eclipse happens when the moon covers the sun as it passes between the sun and the earth, creating a shadow on earth's surface. A total solar eclipse occurs when the moon blocks the sun completely.]

KENNEL CLUB BLUES [PEN302]

Grandmum advises Michelle to either free her bugs or create a terrarium for them so they have a good home. Michelle refuses to listen. She realizes Grandmum's right when she helps the Penguins find and return a missing cato'pillow to the emperor of Planet Kennel. Upon returning Goldie, the cato'pillow, to the emperor, he shows them his cato'pillow collection, which he keeps in cages. Seeing Goldie caged, Michelle realizes Grandmum's right and tries to rescue Goldie. Instead, she finds that Cavitus has transformed the emperor into a hamster. Locked in Goldie's cage with her, the emperor realizes how his pets feel and asks Michelle to release them. Though Cavitus tries to stop her by transforming her and the Penguins into hamsters, they're able to thwart Cavitus, release the cato'pillows, and transform themselves back to normal. The emperor promises to give his pets a better home and Michelle releases her bugs upon returning home.

[Educational Message: If you want to keep pets, you should make sure you create a suitable home for them. If you can't give them a good home, it's better to free them so they can find their own.]

Sad and dejected, little Snoodle Doo decides to go away where he can find something he can do that doesn't make him look silly and worthless. When he comes across a large mountain, he uses all his strength and will to climb it so he can see what lies beyond. Instead, he meets the artist who made him. Seeing himself through his creator's eyes helps Snoodle Doo realize that he is capable of much more than he thinks. He just has to believe in himself and not let others define him.

[Educational Message: Believe in yourself before you accept as truth all the hurtful things others may say about you.]

Ignoring Five's suggestions, it takes Strut much more than five minutes to deliver pizzas, which were ruined because of his tardiness. Despite his embarrassment and Stinkbert's advice that delivering pizzas is not the same as racing cars, Strut is convinced Five must be good at racing as well. When Five joins the Turbo Dogs on the track, however, he is really slow. He picks up speed only after receiving a call for delivery. Motivated by his responsibility, Five hurries through the race and manages to make his delivery on time. Strut realizes that being good at one thing does not always make you good at another. While Five is good at delivering pizzas on time, Strut is successful in racing cars.

[Educational Message: You shouldn't feel envious of someone else's strengths. Nobody is good at everything, but each person has his/her own strengths and weaknesses.]

WRENCHINI'S WRENCH [TDO107]

Wrenchini offers GT the chance to repair his car at Wrenchini's garage and use his wrenches even after he leaves. After fixing his own car, GT decides to help his friends with their repairs, too. When he's done, GT cleans the garage but cannot find one of the wrenches. Although he knows he can't accuse his friends, GT spies on them and accuses them of taking the wrench anyway. Mags suggests GT ask the others if they have the wrench, but GT doesn't listen. Strut takes advantage of the situation and misleads GT into believing Five may have the missing wrench. GT realizes that he was wrong to accuse his friends when Five catches GT spying through Five's pizza deliveries. Then, he runs into Mags and Dash who tell him that Wrenchini's had all his wrenches, all along. So, he apologizes to his friends for wrongly accusing them.

[Educational Message: Trust is essential to friendship and it shouldn't be discarded because you have lost something and need someone to blame. It's better to be honest and seek help finding what you've lost than falsely accusing your friends.]

MY FRIEND RABBIT

EDWEENA'S NEW FRIEND [MFR207]

Edweena befriends Lexie, the bear, and introduces her to Jasper, Rabbit and Mouse. But as winter approaches, Edweena notices Lexie napping more frequently. Jasper explains that bears hibernate during the winter, and leave their caves in spring, because there isn't enough food for them when it's cold. Seeing Edweena sad, her friends hop-think ways in which Edweena can say goodbye to Lexie. They suggest giving Lexie a hug and a wave, saying goodbye, and presenting her with a special gift. Taking Mouse's suggestion, Edweena gives Lexie a moon-shaped rock. Before she leaves to hibernate, Lexie promises them she'll return in the spring. Edweena still isn't happy, so Jasper, Rabbit and Mouse suggest Edweena play the same games with them as she played with Lexie. Realizing how much fun she had with Lexie, Edweena teaches her other friends how to play the games the right way and feels much better.

[Educational Message: It's not easy to say goodbye to a good friend who's going away, but being around your other friends can help you feel better until your friend returns.]

THE BIG GOOSE [MFR207]

The Gobble-Goose Girls meet Tony, an adult goose, while she's flying. When they show Tony how they practice flying, she advises them to wait to fly until they're older because they aren't ready yet. When she leaves, the Girls ask Mouse to help them fly. But their friends tell them that they all waited until they were older to do the things they wanted. Thunder suggests they help the Girls pretend to fly, instead. Edweena lets them ride on her back and Rabbit flips them in the air on his ears. Still disappointed, Jade tries to make herself grow. Tony returns and tells Jade to be patient and keep practicing other skills, like deep-diving, while she waits. The Girls deep-dive and pretend to see the bottom of the pond, but Jade doesn't want to pretend. So, Tony teaches them how to speed-paddle, which is fun and helps them practice their skills in flying.

[Educational Message: Sometimes it's hard to wait until you're big enough to do things you want to do. Practicing and getting stronger when you're young will help you when you are bigger.]

Meanwhile, the Merchant orders Gunther to catapult a cask of flaming tar into the peasants' fields, and they will be rid of Dragon for good. Dragon is blamed for burning the fields down and is ordered to leave the kingdom. Jane learns that the weeds are behind Dragon's allergies and finds traces of tar in the catapult. Gunther is forced to confess he was angry and jealous of Jane and Dragon's win in the catapult contest. Dragon gets to stay in the castle, and both Jane and Gunther realize that pride and jealousy can lead to very dangerous behaviors.

[Educational Message: If you allow your jealousy to consume you, it will drive you to cause trouble. So, give credit where it's due if you lose to a competitor and try harder the next time.]

THE ZULA PATROL

SUN DAY [ZUL104]

While everyone prepares to celebrate the sun's birthday, Dark Truder plans to get rid of the sun so he can take her place. He tricks the delivery comet into giving him the sun's gifts, which he then hides. Meanwhile, Multo teaches Wizzy and Wigg that the sun—made up of hot gases and dust—is a star that's one thousand times the Earth's size. Just then, they hear the sun throwing fireballs in her anger because she thinks nobody remembered her birthday. When she threatens to take a break, The Zula Patrollers try unsuccessfully convincing her that she's needed—to continue providing them with heat and light. Dark Truder's behind the trouble, they search him out and find him with the sun's gifts. They beat him to the gifts' hiding place, retrieve the presents, and return them to the sun who promises to continue to give them sunlight and sunshine.

[Educational Message: The sun is a star that's made of hot gases and dust. It is one thousand times the size of the earth. When looking at the sun, it's important to use proper eyewear otherwise you could go blind because it's so powerful.]

TIME OUT [ZUL104]

When Dark Truder stops all the clocks from working, The Zula Patrollers realize they can't tell time in order to stop incoming asteroids from hitting them. Multo suggests they use the sun to get a general idea of the

time. Seeing their shadow change lengths and direction under the sun helps them figure out the time. They notice that their shadows move along with the sun: stretching and staying on one side in the morning; shortening and moving below them at midday; and elongating again while moving to the opposite side as it gets dark. Suddenly, Dark Truder blocks the sun with sun block to prevent them from telling time. Zeeter follows him and manages to stop him and deflect the asteroids, which crash into Dark Truder's clock-stopper and break it. The clocks start again and everyone returns to their schedules, using their clocks to know the exact time.

[Educational Message: The length and movement of a shadow can give a general idea of the time of day, as the shadow changes shape and moves in the direction of the sun. In the morning, the shadow is long and appears on one side. At noon, the shadow shortens and appears right below the person/object. As it turns dark, the shadow moves to the other side and lengthens again.]

Meanwhile, the other Penguins land on the planet after escaping Cavitus, and Zidgel discovers they've lost his marbles. The king overhears Zidgel's refusal to forgive his friends and imprisons him again. Understanding everyone makes mistakes, Jason finally realizes that Zidgel must show mercy if he wants to receive it. Zidgel finally forgives his friends and is freed. When Jason returns home, he apologizes to Michelle and forgives her.

[Educational Message: Everyone makes mistakes. So, when someone accidentally ruins something that belongs to you, you should try to forgive him/her. If you show mercy to others, they will show it to you when you need it.]

She learns that partners work well when they race their own way after Stinkbert explains that his strategies have a purpose and they help him race better. Realizing he's right, Mags returns to the race with Stinkbert, and their team ends up winning the race.

[Educational Message: When working in a team, your way is not always the best way for everybody. Getting advice from your teammates will help you be successful.]

BOWLED OVER [TDO108]

After bowling once with some success, bowling becomes GT's new hobby. He buys new shoes, a ball, and a portable alley, and recruits Mags to bowl with him. Despite her disinterest in the sport, Mags agrees to bowl with him once. Assuming she'll be on his bowling team, GT has team shirts made for them and stalks Mags to practice with him. Each time, Mags makes an excuse and avoids him, leading him to believe she doesn't like him. GT eventually realizes Mags has been making excuses when she says she needs to change her oil, even though he knows she doesn't need an oil change. Mags finally admits that she doesn't like bowling, which relieves GT. Mags realizes she should have been honest with GT all along, and GT understands that friends don't have to like the same things.

[Educational Message: If there's something you don't like to do, you should be honest and tell your friend the truth rather than make excuses in order to avoid hurting your friend's feelings.]

[Educational Message: To solve a mystery, you must first think about what you know. After you have all the clues, then you can figure out what's going on and solve the problem.]

FROG ON A LOG (MFR208)

Emmett, the frog, interrupts The Gobble-Goose Girls as they're swimming by creating a huge wave while jumping on lily-pads. The Girls suggest sharing their pond and Emmett agrees. He tries tip-toeing across the lily-pads, but finds it's not fun. So, he takes a nap. He's interrupted this time when The Gobble-Goose Girls swim loudly. They try being quieter, but that's not fun for them. So, they ask Rabbit and Mouse for help. Rabbit gives Emmett some moss to cover his ears, but the moss is too heavy and Emmett loses his balance. Not finding a solution, Emmett suggests one of them leave the pond. But Rabbit and Mouse help Emmett and the Girls see that they want the same things. Rabbit suggests using a signal to alert each other during an activity, and invents signals for Emmett and the Girls, which ends up being the best solution.

[Educational Message: If you have to share something with someone else, you need to learn how to take turns so both you and the other person can get what you want while getting along.]

[Educational Message: Space probes help scientists learn about places in space they cannot go themselves. Probes can go only one way usually, so they send back information from their location.]

FORGET-ME-NAUT [ZUL105]

Bula patrols on his own for the first time, but when he returns he doesn't remember anything about himself. Not knowing that Dark Truder has captured the real Bula and this is a Bula-bot, Bula's friends decide to remind their friend of his identity. They teach Bula-bot about astronauts using the Multopedia. Bula-bot learns that astronauts live in space stations doing tests and experiments. He also begins astronaut training to work and live without gravity. After Bula-bot's training, The Zula Patrol picks up a radio signal from an asteroid, but Dark Truder orders Bula-bot to put them off. Wizzy and Wigg suspect something and see Dark Truder instructing Bula-bot. After they tell the others, The Zula Patrollers trick Bula-bot and head to the asteroid. When they get there, Dark Truder captures them all. But Bula-bot ends up helping them instead after remembering everything he learned about being a real astronaut.

[Educational Message: Astronauts explore space and live there in space stations and in spacecrafts where they conduct experiments.]

Michelle realizes it's better not to make promises unless she can fulfill them and to fix them immediately if they're broken.

[Educational Message: Promises shouldn't be taken lightly. If you make a promise, be sure to keep it. If you can't keep or you break a promise, then you must do everything you can to fix it.]

[Educational Message: When you truly love someone, you will do everything you can to help him/her.]

By reading the maps together, they find crates with old antique car parts in them. They share the parts to repair one antique car for an antique car show, and win.

[Educational Message: Cooperation and teamwork will get you farther than trying to do things alone.]

EVERYONE'S A WINNER [TDO109]

Stinkbert is on a losing streak and thinks he's the problem, so he quits racing. His friends try to convince him to keep practicing instead of quitting, but he refuses to listen and spends his time at the dump instead. Upon visiting him, Mags notices that he has built a race track in the dump. Stinkbert denies it and says he made a road through the dump so he can get around better. Then, Mags reminds him of his love for racing after he inadvertently begins racing while driving a golf cart. At Doggone Pizza, Stinkbert uses a pizza as a steering wheel. Unable to resist, he enters the racetrack and asks Ump if he can mow it. He ends up driving the mower as a race car while his friends cheer him on. Finally realizing how much he loves racing, Stinkbert returns to the track, not caring if he wins or loses.

[Educational Message: Don't give up doing something you love because you've had a setback. Instead of worrying about winning or losing, pick yourself back up and keep practicing so you can be better at what you do.]

He decides he'll know if his wish came true when he's able to hop high and far enough to go over trees, rivers and mountains. So, his friends try to make his wish come true. Hazel brings them to a place where saplings grow so Mouse can hop over a young tree. Jasper shows them a stream, a narrow river that Mouse hops over with a vine. And all his friends help Mouse hop over a mountain by creating a smaller mountain with rocks, twigs, a duct, and a bouncy bog moss. Mouse realizes that his wish did come true, with his friends' help.

[Educational Message: It's possible to make even the most impossible wish come true if you use your imagination and your friends' help.]

MOUSE'S MYSTERIOUS SOMETHING [MFR209]

Mouse discovers a mysterious object that looks like bark. Unsure, Mouse and Rabbit decide to ask Jasper. On their way, they meet Thunder who wants to paint a picture but can't find anything on which to paint. Mouse reluctantly offers part of his discovery. Rabbit reminds Mouse that sharing is tricky but fun, and suggests Mouse practice sharing more. As they run into their other friends, Mouse is forced to give up parts of his "mysterious something." Though he's hesitant at first, the more he shares, the better Mouse feels inside about it. They finally reach Jasper who explains that Mouse's object is bark from the birch tree. Mouse thinks his find has made everyone happy, but Jasper tells him it's Mouse's sharing that did it. When Mouse's friends see him, they share a hug with him to show their appreciation. Mouse realizes sharing makes him feel better also.

[Educational Message: Sharing can be difficult at first, but the more you do it, the easier it gets. Sharing with someone also feels good because it allows you to help those in need.]

Jester decides to keep this knowledge to himself and rebuffs Jane's efforts to help him. On the day of the duel, Jester surprises everyone by choosing "wit" as his weapon. Though he outwits Sir Ivan through clever poetry and riddles, Jester apologizes to Sir Ivan for dishonoring him and lets Sir Ivan win.

[Educational Message: You should never amuse yourself at someone else's expense. If you do, you should apologize to the one you've hurt with your jokes.]

THE ZULA PATROL

SMALL IS BEAUTIFUL [ZUL106]

The planets compete for the title of the "Planet of the Year" while The Zula Patrollers judge them. Wizzy and Wigg ask to join, but Bula tells them they're too small to wear the judges' hats. Multo uses the Multopedia to judge the planets in the order of size beginning with Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune, Earth, Venus, Mars, Mercury, and Pluto. As the planets prepare, Dark Truder hides behind the curtains and shrinks them and Multo. The Zula Patrol try to help, but Dark Truder captures them. Wizzy escapes the net because she's so small, and tracks Dark Truder. Then, Wigg leads the others to him. Meanwhile, the planets free themselves by standing on one another according to size. Though Pluto feels he's too small to try, he eventually climbs to the top. Then, Multo gets out and helps them. Using Dark Truder's machine, they return to their normal sizes.

[Educational Message: The largest planets in the solar system are Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune—the Gas Giants. Earth, Venus and Mars are approximately the same size. Mercury and Pluto are the smallest planets in the solar system.]

CASE OF THE MISSING RINGS [ZUL106]

The Zula Patrol gets a call about missing rings. They interview Jupiter whose rings, made of dust, disappeared while he napped. They check the Multopedia to learn about planetary rings, which surround planets and consist of ice, dust and rocks. The four giant gas planets—Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune—have rings. Jupiter's rings are mostly dust. Uranus' and Neptune's rings are dust and rocks. Saturn's rings have dust, rocks and ice. The Zula Patrol learns that Neptune's rings are stolen, too. While they question the other planets, Uranus' rings are also taken. All the other suspects point to Mr. I-Am-Guilty, so they interview him. Then, they stake out Saturn who still has his rings, but they are tricked into leaving and Saturn's rings are also stolen. They finally follow the clues to Mr. I-Am-Guilty who's Dark Truder in disguise, and retrieve all the stolen rings.

[Educational Message: Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune are the four giant gas planets who have rings. Jupiter's rings are mostly dust. Saturn's rings are dust, ice and rocks. Uranus' and Neptune's rings are dust and rocks.]

Sol points out they won't accomplish much if they continue fighting. They discover that Cavitus is holding the others in a wormhole. Michelle suggests going through it. When Jason doesn't agree, she steers the spaceship herself. They're sucked into the wormhole and Cavitus captures them. They realize that they must work together to help each other after their attempts to rescue the others keep failing. Michelle and Jason apologize to each other, team up and help everyone escape. Upon returning home, Jason finds Michelle's doll and Michelle returns the favor.

[Educational Message: It's easy for others to take advantage of a situation when friends argue and fight instead of working together. The only way to solve a problem facing two people is for them to work together as a team.]

When a wise man visits the king, he teaches him that putting yourself before others is very hurtful. King George realizes that when he gets what he wants, others don't get anything and may even lose something as a result.

[Educational Message: Being selfish always hurts someone else because one person gets what he or she wants at the expense of someone else not having it.]

GT, who's having a good run with winning races, attributes his success to a good luck charm, which he keeps with him while racing. Stinkbert eavesdrops on GT's conversation with Mags and Dash, then steals the statue with Strut. When GT discovers his statue missing, he doubts his abilities to race. Though he finishes the next race, he doesn't win, which only makes him sadder. His friends try to bolster his self-confidence, reminding GT of his skill, but it doesn't help. GT's belief in himself is finally restored when he makes a record time even after a near-miss accident on the track during a practice run. During the qualifying race, Dash tries returning GT's statue to him after retrieving it from the dump where Stinkbert has tossed it. Realizing that he doesn't need a lucky charm, GT refuses to take it and ends up winning the race.

[Educational Message: A good luck charm may be something that brings you comfort, but it doesn't change your abilities. Work hard, trust in your skill and you will achieve success in your efforts.]

SPEAK UP [TDO101]

As a reward for winning first, second or third place in most races, Dash is given the chance to be the main announcer for the "Just-for-Fun" race. But Dash has a fear of public speaking. His friends try to help with their advice. GT teaches him breathing techniques for relaxation, Mags helps him dress like a champion, Strut tells him to create a signature move for his entrance, and Stinkbert suggests having a good bark. At the next race, Dash shows up to the commentary booth dressed in Mags' champion outfit and does everything his friends suggested. Instead of making an impression, however, he ends up appearing foolish and making the spectators laugh at his silly antics. Realizing how silly he looks, Dash decides to just be himself and finishes his commentary successfully.

[Educational Message: Though it's helpful to get advice from your friends on how to overcome your fears to perform in public, sometimes it's better to have the confidence to just be yourself.]

THE GREATEST INVENTION [MFR 201]

While thinking about his greatest invention, Rabbit decides to make something multifunctional, necessary and easy to use. He asks his friends for ideas. Thunder can't think of anything and Mouse wants to stay

dry. Jasper, however, already has the best invention—his multipurpose fishing stick. Rabbit thinks Jasper's fishing stick is too simple to be the greatest invention, but as he finds different uses for it, he changes his mind. Rabbit uses Jasper's stick to help Amber walk across the mud and as a beat-maker to help Edweena and Hazel sing in synchronization. When a bird flies off with the fishing stick, Rabbit makes a similar one to retrieve Jasper's stick from a tree. Realizing how useful the fishing stick can be, Rabbit admits he doesn't need to invent the greatest thing because it has already been invented. Rabbit returns Jasper's stick to him and gives Thunder the new one.

[Educational Message: Instead of inventing something new, sometimes it's better to find different ways to use the simplest inventions that have already been created.]

TURTLE IN A HURRY [MFR201]

Rabbit and Mouse meet Logan, a young turtle, who gets left behind on his way to the Jolly-Jumbo-Jamboree race with his friends. Rabbit and Mouse hop-think of ways to get Logan to the race on time. Rabbit tries carrying Logan since he's too slow, but Logan can't recognize the way from that height. Then, Hazel lays down her acorns on the path so they can roll down the path quickly. When they reach the bottom, Logan can't find his next landmark. Rabbit and Mouse realize they need to see things from Logan's viewpoint. So, they bend down to locate the next marker. After finding it, they continue until they reach the pond and Thunder makes a wave on which Logan can surf. Logan's finally able to join the race, and Mouse realizes that he and his friends were able to help Logan by seeing the problems through his perspective.

[Educational Message: It's possible to help friends if you see their problem their way.]

After Dragon owns up to the pranks he's been playing, Jane suspects Jester is plotting something bigger for All Fool's Day. They tell everyone that a dragon migration is heading toward them. Jester is not convinced. Dragon covers himself in berry juice and makes up a chant and dance to welcome the migration. Jane joins in and the others follow. After awhile, Jester discovers he's the only one doing the chant and dance, and seems to realize it's a harmless All Fool's Day joke. When Jane returns to her room later with Jester's juggling stones, she notices they form the pattern of his hat. Jane realizes that Jester made a fool of everyone by pretending to be fooled.

[Educational Message: There's nothing wrong with joking with people as long as everyone is included in the joke and nobody gets hurt.]

BLUE MOON [ZUL107]

Wizzy and Wigg argue about what the moon is made of. Wizzy thinks the moon is made of cheese. Wigg thinks the moon is actually a man. They ask Multo who uses his Multopedia to show them Earth's moon. After dinner, Multo uses his Multoscope to show them the surface of Earth's moon, which is smooth and rocky with craters. While they observe the moon, Wizzy and Wigg decide to head there to find out what it's made of. Gorga tells the others that Wizzy and Wigg have gone to the moon. They find they're both wrong—there's no man or cheese—but they realize they're lost. The Zula Patrol searches for Wizzy and Wigg on the moon's surface. After they're found, Multo tells them that even if they were wrong, their exploration led them to answer their questions and discover something new.

[Educational Message: The surface of the Earth's moon has smooth and rocky parts. It also has grooves called "craters" on it.]

GOING THROUGH A PHASE [ZUL107]

Bula begins to turn into a Zulean weremouse when he's exposed to a plant that turns Zuleans into weremouses during the new moon phase. If he doesn't find a cure before the next new moon arrives, Bula will remain a weremouse. Multo checks the Multopedia to show the different moon phases. He explains that half the moon is lit by the sun, but when it revolves around earth, only parts of that half are seen—the parts are called "phases." So, the moon appears to change shape. The four moon phases are new moon, crescent moon, quarter moon, and full moon. Wizzy and Wigg keep track of the moon phases while Multo tries to find a cure for Bula. As it gets closer to a new moon, Bula turns fully into a weremouse. Multo uses the same pollen that turned Bula into a weremouse to turn him back into himself.

[Educational Message: The moon's shape appears to change. Actually, the moon is experiencing each of its four phases—full, crescent, quarter, new—which occur over a month.]

BETWEEN AN ASTEROID AND A HARD PLACE [PEN306]

Michelle threatens to get Jason back after he tricks her. Grandmum advises Michelle that instead of seeking revenge, it's better to continue being nice to people, even if they've been unkind. When they join the Penguins on the Rockhopper, Michelle plans her revenge on Jason and hides in the space probe awaiting him. Michelle's plan fails when the Penguins unknowingly send the space probe after Cavitus who's stuck in the asteroid belt. Stuck on the asteroid together, Michelle and Cavitus are forced to communicate as their friends work together to save them. Initially, Michelle resists being nice to Cavitus. Then, he tells her he's vengeful because of how he's treated, so Michelle follows Grandmum's advice and offers him food and water. Though Cavitus retracts his promise of being her friend after they're saved, Michelle realizes that revenge doesn't solve anything. Upon returning home, Michelle apologizes to Jason for trying to get him back.

[Educational Message: It's better to continue being kind to people, even those who've been hurtful to you because revenge doesn't solve any problem. It only makes the problem worse.]

DAVE AND THE GIANT PICKLE [VEG113]

Dave is a very little shepherd boy who feels too small to take on a big job. His brothers don't make him feel any better when they give him the smaller tasks while taking on the heavier load themselves. When his big brothers head off to defend their land, little Dave is left behind to tend to the sheep. Though his brothers and others doubt his abilities because of his small size, Dave gets a chance to show his courage by fighting the enemies of his tribal group. He faces off with a giant, nine-foot pickle when nobody else has the courage to fight. Little Dave defeats the giant pickle and realizes that his size does not determine what he can do.

[Educational Message: Achieving your goals is usually not determined by your size, but by your strategy and courage to take on difficult tasks.]

STINK POSITIVE [TDO102]

Thinking he ruined Clutch's surprise party because his friends don't like to be in his presence, Stinkbert decides to change his image. At the next race, Stinkbert's friends are shocked to see both Stinkbert and his car clean. Believing it's the only way his friends will accept him, Stinkbert stops doing the things he loves to avoid getting dirty. He pulls out of the race to wipe his car, doesn't eat his special "extra smelly" pizza, or play in the trash. Noticing that he's not himself, Stinkbert's friends think of a way to make him feel better. When Stinkbert smells a garbage truck driving by, he realizes the new image is not him and decides to revert back to his old, dirty self. He follows the truck to the dump where his friends await him with a surprise, reassuring him they prefer him as himself as long he's happy.

[Educational Message: Your friends may not always like everything about you, but don't change who you are just to please them. If they are your real friends, they will accept you as you are]

MIXED MESSAGE [TDO102]

Strut needs a place to stay after a tree accidentally falls on his house. So, Dash hesitantly accepts Strut's request to stay at Dash's house. Back home, Dash establishes rules for Strut but Strut pays no attention. Behaving inconsiderately, he barges into Dash's private room, uses his grandfather's helmet to cook, and dirties the kitchen. Mags and GT advise Dash to let Strut know how he feels but Dash wants to be a good host. Upon returning home, Dash finds the house is even messier. Strut notices the mess he's made after Clutch suggests that Dash may not like his home untidy, so he cleans up with his friends' help. Realizing he forgot to give Dash Marlene's phone message, he rushes to her shop with Dash but it's too late. Strut realizes he's been a bad house guest and apologizes to Dash. Dash acknowledges he should have said something sooner.

[Educational message: When you stay in someone's home, you need to be considerate and respect your host's rules. If you're the host, then you should be honest about your expectations and communicate them clearly.]

A PRIVATE PLACE [MFR202]

When Edweena doesn't join her friends on their walk, Rabbit suggests they search for her with clues. Using The Gobble-Goose Girls' suggestion, the friends follow Edweena's footprints to her. Though they find Edweena, she tells them she'd rather be alone. At first, nobody understands why Edweena prefers being by herself. Then, Hazel and Thunder realize they also have moments they'd rather be alone to do whatever they want. Rabbit realizes that they've ruined Edweena's time alone by finding out about her private place. So, they hop-think of ways to make Edweena's place private again. Mouse finally suggests they never go to Edweena's private place. Then, they decide to find their own private places where they can enjoy their time alone. Though it's difficult at first, they're all able to find their own secret locations where they can enjoy their privacy and do whatever they want to do.

[Educational Message: Even though it's fun to be with friends, sometimes we like to be by ourselves and have a private place where we can do whatever we want.]

MY DROOPY FRIEND [MFR202]

Mouse plants a sunflower near his bed so he can always see it. Once the seed sprouts, he shows it to Rabbit and Thunder who're unsure if it's a sunflower. After confirming that it is a sunflower, Mouse returns to watch it grow. As it grows, Mouse notices his sunflower looks droopy. Rabbit and Thunder help Mouse find ways to make the sunflower grow upright. When they realize that the sunflower needs sunlight, they replant it on a hilltop, where it receives sunlight and is within Mouse's view. The sunflower begins to droop again when it's fully grown. The Gobble-Goose Girls explain that the plant also needs water. After trying to carry water to the flower, they ask Edweena to water it with her trunk. Realizing that it's unfair to Edweena, Mouse finally returns the sunflower back to the patch and moves his bed near it instead.

[Educational Message: Plants need sunlight and water to grow healthy and strong. If you want to watch a plant grow, it's important to make sure you plant it under the right conditions.]

KNIGHT LIGHT [JAD203]

Jane discovers she's afraid of the dark and asks her friends to keep her secret from Gunther so he doesn't use it against her. Jester advises Jane to face her fears, but nothing they try helps. Gunther ends up discovering Jane's secret and threatens to reveal it to the court. When Sir Ivan and Sir Theodore inform them of a test that requires them to find their way through a maze, Gunther asks them to do it at night so it's more challenging. Jane realizes that to pass the test she must face her fears. Before their test, however, they learn that the princess is lost in the maze and there are wolves lurking nearby. When Gunther leaves her in the maze without a torch, Jane is forced to confront the dark. Jane rescues the princess and realizes that in doing so she has also managed to overcome her fear.

[Educational Message: You cannot let your fears overcome you and prevent you from doing what you need to do. If you confront what makes you fear something, you'll find that it isn't so scary anymore.]

THE ZULA PATROL

GIANT LITTERBUGS FROM SPACE [ZUL108]

When Bula suggests they hike up to Mt. Zula, Multo recommends using a simple machine, like the mountain path, which is an inclined plane that leads up to the mountain. Reaching the top, they see a large cup being dumped on their spaceship. They lift the cup off their spaceship with a lever, which they make with a straw placed on a rock that moves to balance their weight. They also use the lever to lift the cup upright after they notice a slimy creature inside it, tugging on their spaceship. Then, they follow the litterbugs, the Zlogs, to stop them from littering. Catching up to the litterbugs, they learn that Dark Truder is placing signs above Zula to trick others into dumping trash on the planet. They stop Dark Truder from dumping more trash on Zula, and return to Zula where the Zlogs are reunited with their slime pet.

[Educational Message: Simple machines, like the inclined plane and the lever, are used to make work easier to do. An inclined plane is a flat surface that makes going up and down easier. The lever is a bar placed on a fulcrum that shifts back and forth to balance the weight on top and it's used to lift heavy objects.]

RV OF THE GIANTS [ZUL108]

Zeeter's chair gets loose and she can't fly properly, so Multo suggests using a simple machine like a wedge to fix the chair. Multo explains that a wedge—a slanted object with a point—moves things or pushes them apart by being forced between them. He also shows them the pulley—a rope over a wheel that moves things to hard-to-reach places and pulls heavy objects. So, they wedge an old cake piece under Zeeter's chair to fix it. Then, they head to Zula where they meet the Zlogs enjoying a picnic. As they leave, the Zlogs' slime pet, Glopey, grabs their spaceship, thinking it's a toy. When he gets a drink of water, Glopey drops the spaceship in the water bowl. The Zula Patrollers get out, but Glopey leaves with the spaceship, and Dark Truder comes after it. So, The Zula Patrol makes a pulley to get down the table and a wedge to pry the door open and get outside. They command Glopey to fetch the ship

[Educational Message: Simple machines like wedges and pulleys can help make your work a lot easier. A wedge is a slanted object with two surfaces that meet at a sharp point. A pulley is a rope over a wheel that is used to lift things and move objects to places that are difficult to reach.]

IN THE BIG PLACE [PEN307]

When Jason refuses to help Michelle fly her remote-controlled plane, Grandmum reminds him to be helpful to everyone if he's in the position to do so. Instead, Jason retreats to the attic where he and Michelle join the Penguins for another mission. They must help the Penguins retrieve a cookie for the cows that need it to fuel their spaceship, after crash-landing on an asteroid. Though Jason is hesitant about helping them, they return to Grandmum's house to get a cookie when Cavitus interrupts them. Frustrated, Jason wants to return home without helping the cows. But when he sees that nobody's being helped, and they need help retrieving the cookie, he realizes Grandmum's right. He helps Michelle fly her plane so they can outsmart Cavitus, then retrieves the cookie and helps deliver it to the cows. In turn, they help by charging the Galeezel fully and the kids return home.

[Educational message: Never take advantage of your friends' kindness and trick them into believing something that isn't true. You will hurt them with your lies and lose their trust.]

A STAR TURN [TDO103]

Clutch is on a winning streak because he has been practicing rigorously. When he wins another race, he's invited for a television interview. However, as soon as he gets a taste of stardom, he lets it get to his head and develops a celebrity persona. Instead of practicing for the relay race with Stinkbert, he focuses on preparing for his interview. On the day of the interview, the host asks Clutch to perform a test run for the audience. Though Stinkbert does well, Clutch performs poorly on television because he hasn't practiced at all. He finally realizes his lack of practice has affected his driving skills. He admits on television that he didn't do well because he let his success get the better of him and stopped working hard. He returns to practice with Stinkbert and they win the next race.

[Educational Message: Don't let success get to your head. If you want to continue to do well, you need to keep working hard and practicing. It's also important to be humble even if you're successful.]

FOR THE BIRDS [MFR203]

Edweena tries befriending a flock of birds by trying to sing like them, but it doesn't work. Rabbit and Mouse suggest Edweena use The Gobble-Goose Girls' help. The Girls help Edweena learn their language until she reminds them that she needs to learn how to sing like birds, not geese. She describes the birds and learns that they are songbirds. The Girls try teaching Edweena how to sing like songbirds, but that doesn't work either. To help Edweena find ways to befriend the songbirds, they all recount how they made friends. Edweena tries befriending the songbirds again, using her friends' ideas. She rolls down the hill, does the thumpa-thumpa dance, builds them a nest, and makes them acorn-mash. Still, nothing works. But when she bathes in the pond, the songbirds approach her. So, she sprays them with water and finally finds a way to be their friend.

[Educational Message: If you want to approach someone to befriend him/her, don't lose hope when you don't succeed the first time. Keep trying different ways to find something you have in common. Sometimes, it takes a few tries before you know how to make friends with someone you really like.]

PEARL'S PALS [MFR203]

Pearl encounters a tadpole in the pond during a walk with her sisters. Later at night, she hears splashing and discovers six more tadpoles. The next morning, The Gobble-Goose Girls notice Pearl missing and find her at the pond. Afraid the fish will get the tadpoles, Pearl decides not to join them for their walk. Unsure whether they should walk without Pearl who's their leader, the Girls ask Rabbit and Mouse for help. Rabbit suggests finding a new leader and Mouse volunteers. Though initially they can't keep up with Mouse, when the Girls teach him their walking-song and swim-dance, they're able to walk in tune. Meanwhile, Rabbit joins Pearl who shows him the swim-dance with the tadpoles. After the dance is over, the others join Pearl underwater for the swim-dance. The Girls realize that they can do the same things in new ways so that they can stay together.

[Educational Message: Sometimes, unexpected things happen that make it difficult to stick to the same routine. But finding new ways to do the things you always do can help you do what you love and deal with the change.]

[Educational Message: No matter how hard you try, sometimes things still don't go the way you planned. What matters is that you do your best and everything will work out the way it should, even if it's not perfect.]

THE ZULA PATROL

CHILLI COOK-OFF [ZUL109]

Bula creates a new dish called the "galactic goo" and uses a thermometer to take the stew's temperature. Multo explains that temperature is measured in degrees, which is represented by the lines on a thermometer—in Fahrenheit or Celsius. Using the Multopedia to fact-check, Multo also tells his friends that when the temperature of something reaches the freezing point—32 degrees Fahrenheit or zero degrees Celsius—it turns to ice. He then measures his goo and takes it off the stove to cool down because it'll freeze if placed in the freezer. After everyone leaves, Bula enters the kitchen and places the goo in the freezer to hasten the cooling process. The goo reaches freezing point, freezes the kitchen, and creates a small tornado. Everyone rushes back to help. Gorga finally uses his snout to suck the tornado in and Bula reverses the temperature to warm it back up.

[Educational Message: Temperature is measured in degrees using a thermometer. The lines of a thermometer indicate the temperature of something, in Fahrenheit or Centigrade. When something gets too cold, it reaches the freezing point, which is at 32 degrees Fahrenheit or zero degrees Celsius.]

TREASURE IN THE CLOUDS [ZUL109]

Seeing the clouds upon waking reminds Multo of the golden cloud he saw above Mt. Zula as a child. Although the golden cloud isn't real, Multo tells his friends about real clouds that are made of water and dust. Checking the Multopedia, Multo explains that clouds are formed when water evaporates into the sky, becomes cold enough to form water drops, and mixes with dust. He shows them the different cloud types: the low-lying cumulus clouds; the gray cumulonimbus clouds and the gray, blanket-like stratus clouds that bring rain; and the high cirrus clouds made of ice crystals. After Multo leaves, Wizzy and Wigggo go up the mountain with Gorga to surprise Multo with the golden cloud. Along the way, they encounter the four different clouds that guide the trio and keep Dark Truder away. Upon reaching the top, they see the golden cloud but find that it's only the Zula spaceship behind the cloud.

[Educational Message: Clouds are made of water and dust. They are formed when water evaporates in the sky to become water vapor, turns into water drops when it's cold, and mixes with dust. The four types of clouds are cumulus clouds, cumulonimbus clouds, stratus clouds, and cirrus clouds.]

Back at home, the children apologize for accusing each other and getting angry before clarifying the truth.

[Educational Message: Before you accuse someone, you should make sure you know all the facts and get control of your anger. The more you know, the less likely that the situation will spin out of control.]

They refuse and are thrown into the furnace, but because they stand up for what's right against pressure, they're not burned. Their boss finally realizes he was wrong and apologizes for pressuring them.

[Educational Message: If you stand up for what's right and refuse to give in to the pressure of doing something wrong, even if it's out of loyalty to someone important to you, you will be rewarded for it.]

Five suggests using what he knows and loves—garbage—to create his own recipe. Stinkbert finally decides to create a "leftovers' pizza." When the judges try Stinkbert's pizza, they love it, and Stinkbert wins the cook-off.

[Educational Message: Even though you may be different from others, you can still achieve success and stay true to yourself if you just make adjustments to your strategy.]

STRUT DELIVERS [TDO104]

The dogs plan to have a big party to celebrate the unveiling of the first Turbodog, I.B. Quick's statue. Everyone takes on a responsibility, except Strut. So, Ump tells him to deliver the invitations. Instead, Strut distracts himself with other activities. Even when he runs out of excuses, Strut still finds a way to avoid doing his job. Returning back to the clubhouse at the end of the day, he discovers that everyone has done their part except him. When they hear that Strut hasn't delivered the invitations, his friends express their disapproval and doubts about him. Strut finally realizes how much his laziness has let his friends down and promises to deliver the invitations on time. Racing through the day and night, he eventually delivers all the invitations and apologizes to his friends for almost ruining the party.

[Educational Message: When you delay doing your share of the work and neglect your responsibilities, you let your team down and can ruin things for everybody. It's your job to make it right, no matter how much work it takes.]

Using the Multopedia, he shows them how all known planets revolve around the sun on their own paths. As Zeeter leaves for her race, the others notice a new pink planet in the solar system that wasn't there before. In investigating the planet, Multo and Bula find it's actually a balloon covered in glue, and they get stuck on it as it begins to deflate. Dark Truder appears and announces he's taking over the solar system. Bula and Multo remove their shoes, jump into their spaceship, and seek Zeeter's help. Zeeter leaves the race to help her friends. Together, they use the Zula Zoomer to get their ship started, deflate the fake planet, and return home.

[Educational Message: All planets orbit or go around the sun by moving in the same direction. The length of time it takes for Earth to complete circling the sun is one year.]

GO'ER SLOWER MOTION [ZUL114]

Multo explains to his friends that it takes a year or 365 days for their planet to orbit the sun. He elaborates that all planets revolve around the sun, and some go slower than others because they're farther away from the sun and their orbits are bigger. Like Planet Zula, Earth also takes a year to orbit the sun while it rotates. Meanwhile, Dark Truder creates a go'er slower machine to slow down The Zula Patrol so he can take over the galaxy. The Zula Patrollers realize they're moving too slow to catch him. When they discover that the machine's on Earth, they wait in Earth's path as it circles around the sun again. Landing on Earth, they use the machine to reverse the go'er slower motion and switch to a faster blaster motion to set things right in the galaxy, ruining Truder's plans once more.

[Educational Message: All planets revolve around the sun while they rotate. The farther the planets are from the sun, the longer it takes for them to circle it. Earth takes 365 days, or one year, to orbit the sun.]

[Educational Message: If you make a promise to a friend, it is important to follow through and be sure you take care of the things you promised to care for.]

Mags suggests throwing Five a surprise party to celebrate the pizzeria's anniversary. Everyone offers to help, but Mags wants to do it all herself. GT and Dash warn her about the workload, but Mags doesn't listen. She struggles to get the party supplies, make and deliver the invitations, bake a cake, and decorate the clubhouse on her own. Each time her friends offer their help, Mags repeatedly insists on doing everything herself. Soon she begins to get tired and rushes to get everything done on time. When everything starts to come apart. Dash and GT tell her it's not too late for them to help her. But it's only when the cake explodes and she slips on the batter that she finally realizes she can't do it all herself. With her friends' help, Mags successfully puts on the party for Five, realizing it's okay to seek help.

[Educational Message: Nobody can do everything on their own. We all need a little help sometimes. So, when you're struggling with your chores, it's okay to ask for help from your friends.]

Hazel attempts to teach Thunder how to concentrate on the acorn so he can catch it, but it doesn't help. Rabbit and Mouse offer their help by suggesting that Thunder use verbal reminders to watch then catch the acorn. Focusing on the acorn and Hazel's instructions confuses Thunder more, which upsets Hazel. Realizing they have two problems, Rabbit and Mouse decide to help them individually. Rabbit teaches Thunder to think positively, focus on the acorn, and believe he can catch it. Mouse helps Hazel relax so she doesn't distract Thunder. With their friends' help, Hazel and Thunder are able to work together to collect all the acorns and find the missing ones from the stream.

[Educational Message: Doing two things at once can be confusing and distracting. Focusing on one task at a time and working together can help you accomplish more, especially when you have your friends' help.]

WINTER GEESE [MFR210]

Rabbit and Mouse encourage The Gobble-Goose Girls to experience winter. The Girls find that it's too cold, they can't walk in the snow, and their pond has disappeared. Even after Edweena blows the snow off the pond to uncover it, the Girls find they can't swim in it, because it's frozen. Mouse explains that water turns into ice when it's cold. The Girls try to glide on the frozen pond, but it makes them miss the water more. When the Girls decide to wait by the pond until winter's over, their friends realize they must help the Girls get used to winter. Through ice-skating, singing, riding on Thunder's back, and observing winter in the forest, the Girls realize that winter can be fun. Though hesitant at first, after joining them in winter activities, even Jade finally realizes that finding ways to enjoy winter is much better than fussing about it.

[Educational Message: You can find ways to have fun no matter what season it is, as long as you have a good attitude and try new things with your friends.]

Dark Truder tricks The Zula Patrollers into believing they've won a vacation to Earth, so he can steal the zoolanium from Mars while they're distracted. When he can't book a place on Earth, he places a cloud in front of Earth to hide it. Then, he lures The Zula Patrollers to Mars, which he disguises as Earth. The Zula Patrollers believe Mars is Earth, because it seems to be the third planet from the sun. While Dark Truder steals the zoolanium, Zeeter notices the fake plants and grass, and suspects they're not on Earth. During a nature hike, they encounter an icy dust storm of -70 degrees that nearly freezes them. Convinced they're on Mars after seeing two moons, Zeeter investigates and finds Earth hidden behind a cloud. Zeeter and Gorga expose Dark Truder's trick, but as he tries to escape he insults Mars who blows him far into the galaxy.

[Educational Message: Mars is the fourth planet from the sun. It has an orange surface, which is covered with sand and rocks. The only water on it is frozen and the air on Mars is too thin to breathe. Mars also has dust storms with a temperature of -70 degrees.]

THE OUTSIDER [ZUL115]

When Pluto tries to play cosmic volleyball with the other planets, they dismiss him. Convinced it's because of his size and makeup, Pluto decides not to orbit the sun. Charon calls on The Zula Patrol for help. Using the Multopedia, The Zula Patrollers discover that Pluto's made of ice and rock and is part of the Kuiper belt of icy objects. They also learn that scientists disagree whether Pluto is a planet because although it looks like a planet and orbits the sun, Pluto's size, orbit shape, distance from sun, and physical makeup don't qualify it as one. The Zula Patrollers give Pluto a pep talk and build an amusement park on it, but nothing works. It's only when Pluto warns the planets about a comet heading toward Mars that Pluto realizes the advantage of being different. Grateful, the other planets accept Pluto and it returns to orbiting the sun.

[Educational Message: Though Pluto orbits the sun and is shaped like a planet, not all scientists believe it's just a dwarf planet because it's too small, too far away from the sun, its orbit is shaped differently, and it is made up of ice and rock like the other icy objects in the Kuiper belt.]

[Educational Message: Laziness is never rewarded, but hard work has many rewards. So, when you want something, you must work for it diligently and with a strong effort.]

When Dash and Strut discover that Stinkbert has the missing racer card they want, they decide to compete for it by racing. To ensure his win, Strut tries to sabotage Dash's chances. But his plans keep going awry. He tricks Wrenchini into giving him Dash's new tire, but Dash catches Strut with the tire. When Strut gets a flat tire, Dash lends his own to him. At the garage, Dash finds Strut with Dash's wrench and believes Strut when he pretends to need it. On the racetrack later, Strut spins out of control on the very oil he spilled to ruin Dash's chances of winning. Dash ends up helping Strut by moving his car to the end of the racetrack.

Strut ends up winning, but he realizes he's won unfairly. As he returns the card to Dash, Strut confesses that he cheated and apologizes to Dash. They race again, fairly.

[Educational Message: Don't try to sabotage someone else's chances of winning a competition, because you want to win. Chances are you won't be successful, and even if you win unfairly, you won't feel good about it. Play by the rules and be a good sport if you don't win.]

Mouse's friends surprise him with a birthday party. Mouse appreciates his friends' efforts, but is disappointed when he finds that the "birthday mousey" Rabbit made for him is missing a tail. Mouse consults Jasper and Edweena, who advise Mouse to share his feelings with Rabbit. But Mouse decides against it after overhearing Rabbit tell the others how hard he has worked to make birthday mousey. Jasper and Edweena suggest that Mouse bring his own tail to Rabbit's notice, so Rabbit can realize that birthday mousey doesn't have a tail. Despite Mouse's efforts, Rabbit doesn't notice. Jasper suggests talking to Rabbit again, and Edweena reminds Mouse to be honest. It's only after Birthday Mousey falls on the ground that Rabbit notices the missing tail. Mouse finally admits seeing birthday mousey without a tail has bothered him. Rabbit explains that he forgot and tells Mouse to talk to Rabbit when something bothers Mouse.

[Educational Message: When something bothers you about a friend, the best thing to do is to talk to your friend and tell him/her honestly how you are feeling so it can be resolved.]

THE ZULA PATROL

THE INS AND OUTS OF PLANETS (ZUL116)

Bula divides The Zula Patrollers into two teams and sends them on a treasure hunt around the solar system to learn about teamwork. Their first clue takes them to the asteroid belt. Using the Multopedia, Multo's team learns that the asteroid belt divides the solar system into two sections, with four planets closest to the sun on the inner side and those farther from the sun on the outside. Zeeter's team beats them and lands on Mercury where their spaceship loses power. Multo's team finds Zeeter and they propose to work together to recover the clues. The next clue tells them to go from "inner" to "outer," which means they must work from the inner planets to the outer planets. They slowly work their way from Mercury to Pluto, receiving a caramel apple as their last clue. Upon returning home, Bula gives them their prizes--caramel apples and asteroid belts.

[Educational Message: An asteroid belt divides the solar system into two parts. The four planets closest to the sun are called inner planets. The rest are called the outer planets because they're on the outer section of the belt.]

YOUNG AT HEART (ZUL116)

Responding to their ship's alarm, Bula and Multo follow a speeding ship, which zaps them into toddlers. Zeeter discovers Dark Truder is behind it. Piecing together Multo's childish language, Zeeter searches for the formula to reverse the transformation. Through the Multopedia, Zeeter learns more about the known planets. She discovers that the Rocky Planets are made of metal and rock, the Gas Giants are made of liquid and gas and have many rings and moons, and Pluto is made of ice and rock. Using the list of ingredients for the formula, Zeeter picks up an element from each planet. She gets metal from Mercury, gas from Venus and Saturn, rock from Earth, Mars, Neptune, and Uranus, liquid from Jupiter, and ice from Pluto. Returning home, Zeeter uses the ingredients to make that formula that transforms Bula and Multo back to their adult selves.

[Educational Message: Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars are called the Rocky Planets, because they are made of metal and rocks. Jupiter, Saturn Uranus, and Neptune are the Gas Giants, made of liquid and gas. Pluto, the Dwarf Planet, is made of ice and rock.]

[Educational Message: Excess of any kind is unhealthy and might be dangerous, even if it's something that's good for you. You should do everything in moderation.]

He finally realizes he must play fairly, and apologizes to his friends for cheating.

[Educational Message: In order to win fairly, you must play fairly. Changing the rules to ensure your win is not just unfair, it also alienates the players in a game. Nobody will want to play with you if you cheat just to win.]

KING FOR A DAY [TDO112]

Noting the resemblance between Stinkbert and the king, the dogs consider the possibility of Stinkbert being the king's heir. They convince him to send in his paw print and playfully indulge him with a make-believe crown and throne. But Stinkbert begins to get carried away with his new possible role. He watches an instructional video and begins making outrageous demands based on a set of "royal rules." Upset with Stinkbert's behavior, his friends separate themselves from him. Stinkbert finally receives the letter with the results of the paw print match and believes he will not be able to be around his friends if he's better than them. The delivery dog advises him that being a king won't make Stinkbert better than anyone, and acting like it will hurt his friends. So, Stinkbert tears up the letter in his friends' presence, without seeing the results, and apologizes for getting carried away.

[Educational Message: If you act like you are better than everyone else, your friends' feelings will be hurt and they will not want to be around you. It's important to treat everyone the way you'd like to be treated.]

SING A SONG [MFR212]

Rabbit, Mouse and their friends find a new bird in their forest, who cannot understand them when they talk. So, they sing to the bird instead. Through a series of songs between them and Tommy, they learn that he crashed into the tree while migrating, tearing his wing, and now he can't continue flying. Rabbit and his friends decide to help Tommy and make him comfortable while they search for ways to mend his wing. While everyone looks, Rabbit and Mouse also remind Tommy that he's not alone and they are his friends. Everyone regroups with reeds, bark, moss, and vine to fix Tommy's wing, but it doesn't work. Then Thunder recalls finding Tommy's feathers and guides the others to them. He suggests using Tommy's own feathers to mend his wing, and it works. Tommy thanks them for helping him and continues flying south where it's warm.

[Educational Message: Friends help one another when one of them is in trouble. So, when you or your friend needs something, remember that you're not alone and if you reach out, your friends will help you.]

SNOWED UNDER [MFR212]

Hazel finds that the acorns she stored for the winter have fallen off the branch, which has broken under the weight of the snow. She also discovers that her acorns are buried under the snow and there's too much of it to move. She is able to recover all her acorns with the help of her friends by recalling the methods they used in different situations to solve a problem. They first have Mouse burrow into the snow to find the acorns, and mark their location with a twig. Then, they drop the recovered acorns down from the branch to figure out where the missing acorns could have landed. When they're out of ideas, they take a hop-stop during which they discover a pine cone stuck in Thunder's snowball, which gives them the idea of rolling the snowball along the ground so the remaining acorns get stuck in it.

[Educational Message: Sometimes, recalling similar situations and the methods you used to solve previous problems can help find a solution for a current problem. It also helps to have your friends' help.]

[Educational Message: It is better to leave wild animals in the wild because they are untamed and they can be very dangerous to people.]

Examining the mold through the microscope, Multo discovers a small city. Suddenly, they're transported into the city where they meet the head scientist and learn that cleaning the room is threatening his city's existence. Bula promises to protect the city, but another alarm warns them that the city is under attack. Through the microscope they see Wigg heading toward them with a vacuum. They direct Wizzy's attention to Multo's microscope. Wizzy discovers his friends in the city and stops Wigg. When the others return to Zula, they decide to safeguard the city under the microscope.

[Educational Message: Microscopes are used to observe and study microorganisms, their structures, and their behaviors.]

TELESCOOPED (ZUL117)

After dusting the professor's ship for fingerprints, The Zula Patrol discovers that Dark Truder's stealing all the telescopes. Multo explains that telescopes magnify and brighten objects in space, so they can be seen more clearly and closely. Professor Out-of-Focus shows The Zula Patrollers the museum with the oldest telescopes, including Sir Isaac Newton's 400-year-old telescope made with glass. Multo clarifies that the two kinds of telescopes are made with mirrors to reflect the light and with a special glass that bends the light. When The Zula Patrollers shrink themselves to enter the old telescope, Dark Truder steals it. Then they're scooped and trashed by Truder's cleaning-robot. While Gorga helps the others escape, Wizzy and Wigg distract Dark Truder and power Bula's devices by reflecting light onto them. They use mirrors to reprogram the robot that chases Truder away, so they can safely return to Zula after retrieving the telescopes.

[Educational Message: Telescopes are tools used to look into space. They magnify objects in space so they appear bigger when they're at a distance. They also collect light through glass or mirrors, so things look brighter and clearer.]

[Educational Message: Jokes are funny when everyone laughs. But when you go too far and play tricks on people, it can create serious problems and backfire on you.]

THE SURPRISE SURPRISE [TDO113]

Dash and Mags decide to surprise GT with the toolbox he wants to thank him for helping work on their cars. They try to work on it without GT finding out and make excuses for not hanging out with him. GT finds their behavior suspicious and thinks they don't want him around. Marlene notices GT's upset and advises him to talk it out instead of bottling up his feelings. GT returns to the clubhouse to show Mags and Dash his new boots, but they usher him out to stop him from seeing the toolbox. The other dogs convince GT to tell Mags and Dash what's bothering him. When he finally admits to them that they're making him feel left out by their sneaky behavior, they realize they've hurt GT, and show him the surprise. GT offers to finish the toolbox for them and apologizes for not talking to them sooner.

[Educational Message: When something bothers you about a friend, the best thing to do is tell them how you feel. Keeping your feelings inside will make you feel bad, and your friend will not know how to stop making you feel bad.]

JASPER'S FROZEN SMARTS [MFR213]

The Girls point out that the rest of the pond would also be unfrozen, so Jasper thinks perhaps the water moves too much for it to freeze. Before he can test his theory, Mouse and Rabbit return with a hat to warm up Jasper's brain so he can think clearly. Jasper explains he doesn't know everything and must figure out the answers to questions by watching, thinking, and testing his ideas. Rabbit realizes they're asking the wrong question. Jasper reminds them the only way to solve a problem is to stick with it. They finally discover that Thunder has been breaking the ice so The Gobble-Goose Girls can swim.

[Educational Message: Nobody knows everything. In order to solve problems, we must observe, think and test out our theories. Working together with friends and sticking with it is the best way to solve a problem.]

THUNDER'S IDEA MAKER [MFR213]

Thunder's head accidentally gets stuck in a log and when he breaks out of it, a piece of it gets stuck around his nose. As he runs into his friends who encounter different dilemmas, Thunder finds himself giving them creative ideas to solve their problems, and becomes convinced it's because of the horn-ring. To recover Hazel's acorns from a hole, Thunder suggests filling it up with water so the acorns float up. When ants take Jasper's berries, Thunder suggests sharing the food with them. He solves The Gobble-Goose Girls' diving problem, by having them dive off the pondie-floater one at a time so it doesn't sink. To help Thunder understand the ideas are his own, Rabbit suggests removing the horn-ring, but Thunder isn't convinced. It's only when Thunder's horn-ring is lost and he's forced to think on his own to find it, that he realizes the ideas are coming from himself.

[Educational Message: When you have a good idea, you should have the confidence to know it's coming from you. No object has the power to make you think of good ideas. If you think you great ideas, it is your own doing.]

Jack Hanna's Animal Adventures

Bite out of Crime (2269)

January 3, 2009

Jack discovers first-hand in southern California, "bad guys" are no match for the Orange County Sheriffs Department's skilled K-9 unit. In a training session, the skilled police dogs are put to the test in a building search, a felony car stop and finding "Jack-in-the-box."

Kangaroo or Koala Island? (2270)

January 10, 2009

In Australia, Jack learns of a dilemma on Kangaroo Island: it has too many koalas. The small island, south of the mainland, was so named because of its abundance of kangaroos, but Jack wonders if the island should be renamed. From the introduction of just 8 animals in the 1920's, the population of the loveable, tree dwelling marsupial has soared to more than 27,000.

Crocodylus, Kakadu and Hope (2271)

January 17, 2009

After the capture of a big saltwater crocodile in Australia's Northern Territory, Jack collects plaque samples for an important research project. At Kakadu National Park, Jack catches up with a colorful but sacred grasshopper. Jack also meets two kids with amazing childhoods that include growing up around animals from Africa to Australia.

Cruis'n with Crocs (2272)

Along the Island Coast (2274)

February 7, 2009

On Kangaroo Island, Jack explores the coastline for New Zealand fur seals and rare Australian sea lions. At Backstairs Passage, Jack snorkels into a powerful tidal surge to get a first-hand look at the agile swimming ability of pinnipeds. At night, Jack observes the Little penguin, the world's smallest penguin species.

Deadly Snakes in the Grass (2275)

February 14, 2009

In Australia's Northern Territory, Jack gets an up-close look at some of the world's most deadly snakes including the Inland Taipan, the Brown snake, the Coastal Taipan and the Tiger snake. At the Territory Wildlife Park, Jack is amazed by a host of birds, especially an owl that barks like a dog.

Thorny Devils, Camels and "Dinky" (2276)

February 21, 2009

Jack journeys to the Outback of Central Australia to learn about desert reptiles including Thorny Devils, a Shingleback lizard and a Perentie, a large monitor lizard. After a camel safari, Jack stops by a roadhouse at Stuarts Well where he's entertained by "Dinky," the singing dingo.

Where the Bears Are (2277)

February 28, 2009

Come along to some of Jack's favorite bear places. The Katmai Peninsula in Alaska is THE place for brown bears, and Brooks Falls is his favorite location to "bear watch". Then Jack heads to the isolated Knight Inlet to find grizzlies! Close by, in the Great Bear Rainforest, Jack sets off in search of the storied Spirit Bear, the rare, white, black bear.

In the Presence of Great Apes (2278)

March 7, 2009

When few people dared to attempt to film gorillas in the wild, Jack made a historic trip to Uganda to see these amazing primates. Tracking the great apes through the Bwindi Impenetrable Forest is a challenge, but Jack is rewarded with the encounter of a lifetime! Chimpanzees in a hidden gorge and a special sanctuary for orphaned and abused chimps rounds out this primate encounter.

Little Seen Africa (2253)

March 14, 2009

Jack takes a look at some of the African wildlife you don't commonly see such as the bush baby and the dik-dik, a tiny antelope. But most importantly, Jack learns about a conservation program to restore the Mountain Bongo population, now considered extinct on the forested slopes of Mt. Kenya. As Jack finds out at the Mt. Kenya Game Ranch, the Mountain Bongo, with its russet red fur, white stripes and ivory tipped horns, is one of the world's most beautiful antelope.

Howling Success (2254)

March 21, 2009

Jack journeys into the countryside west of Belize City to learn about the successful grass root efforts conserving two of Central America's signature animals: the black howler monkey and green iguana. After observing the inspiring work of "The Community Baboon Sanctuary" and the "Green Iguana Project," Jack is awed by thousands of Blue Morpho butterflies.

Caves and Birds (2255)

March 28, 2009

In Belize, Central America, Jack tubes his way into a cave where he encounters bats and spiders. He also travels by canoe to observe a nest of Jabiru Storks, one of the largest birds in the Americas. At Runaway Creek Reserve, Jack profiles the conservation research of a Wisconsin-based group, "Birds Without Borders."
