A.	“Tulip Time Festival”	5/4/14	1:43	10pm	It’s Tulip Time in Holland. To celebrate, Dutch dancers kicked off the festival by dancing down the streets of Holland during the parade. Also, the annual arts and crafts fair was back along with plenty of Dutch food. People come from all over the United States to view the thousands of tulips around the town as well.
B.	“Michigan Youth Arts Festival”	5/7/14	0:45	7am	Artwork is on display in the Richmond Center on the campus of Western Michigan University. Students from all over the state of Michigan enter their artwork and only 100 pieces are picked to be displayed. The public can view the entries. The top 18 artists are invited to a special luncheon.
C.	“Wizard of Oz Festival”	5/9/14	2:20	5pm	Ionia is getting ready for next month’s Wizard of Oz festival. They’ll have a viewing of the film plus plenty of other crafts and activities going on.
D.	“Recycled Art in the Park”	5/19/14	0:40	6pm	17 entries were competing in the 2014 “Recycled Art in the Park” sculpture contest in Portage. The judges finally selected the winners who will now get to have their work displayed in the local library. The works were judged based on using 100% recycled material, creativity and originality.

A. **“Battle Creek Bus Driver Arrested”** **4/1/14** **1:49** **5pm**
Battle Creek Public Schools bus driver Kevin Frederick was arraigned for driving on a suspended license. The judge also addressed several other warrants. Monday morning, Battle Creek police say Frederick was in a minor accident when they discovered his driving status and outstanding warrants. That was after possibly dropping kids off at school.

- B. **“Suspect Sought In Multiple Burglaries” 4/16/14 0:45 5am**
Troopers from the Michigan State Police post in Coldwater are searching for a suspect following multiple break-ins at homes across two townships in Branch County. The homes were broken into and burglarized during the day on April 15th, but none of the residents were home at the time. Police say that large amounts of change were among the items stolen.
- C. **“Jodi Parrack: Person of Interest in Custody” 4/21/14 1:42 6pm**
It’s something that has haunted the small town of Constantine for years, since November 8, 2007 and after thousands of tips and countless interviews the question still remains, who killed Jodi Parrack? But now after nearly seven years, an arrest in connection to the case, Raymond McCann, who is charged with perjury
- D. **“Pharmacy Safety” 5/2/14 1:35 10pm**
The fatal shooting of a pharmacist at a Lansing store highlights the concerns West Michigan area ones have with the profession. Area pharmacist, Ken Fagerman, talks to FOX 17 about why the industry needs to be prepared for ‘worse case scenarios.’”

3. **DRUGS & ALCOHOL:**

- A. **“Above the Influence” 5/2/14 0:50 5 pm**
They’re vowing to live “Above the Influence” of things like bullying, drugs and alcohol. About 1,000 kids turned out in Allendale to share that message at the 3rd annual Kent County Youth Summit.
- B. **“Drug Arrest with Infant” 5/2/14 1:39 10 pm**
A father is caught hiding drugs in a container of baby formula after a traffic stop in Van Buren County with his 10 month old in the car. Police say he wasn’t just transporting the drugs when they stopped him, he was using, leading to his arrest.
- C. **“Sand Bar Raid” 5/15/14 2:31 6 pm**
Cameras were rolling as liquor and kegs were removed one by one from a northern Kent County bar, raided after a history of problems. The “Sand Bar” in Sand Lake is accused of violating Michigan law, three violations within a 24 month period.
- D. **“Hunting for Bail Jumpers” 5/19/14 2:54 6 pm**
There are kids in the house; there are drugs in the house and lots of emotions that can get out of hand. They’re in our community, armed and taking the bad guys off the streets. FOX 17 went out with local bounty hunters to see how they do their jobs.

4. **ECONOMY:**

- A. **“Students Used To Promote Bond Issue” 4/30/14 0:45 5 pm**
Districts in Kalamazoo County are looking ahead to Election Day as school funding hangs in the balance. Administrators at Vicksburg Community Schools

are taking a unique approach to raise awareness about a \$15 million bond proposal that will be on the ballot May 6. Students are featured in a YouTube video to show the buildings in various states of disrepair.

- B. **“New West Michigan Jobs”** **4/30/14** **0:35 5 pm**
Thanks to some money from the ‘Michigan Economic Development Corporation’ hundreds of new jobs are coming to West Michigan. Over the next few years as ‘In Glass’ expands in Byron Center, they are hoping to bring more than 450 jobs.
- C. **“Bid to host State Games of America”** **5/29/14** **0:35 5 pm**
The West Michigan Sports Commission is putting in a bid to host the 2017 State Games of America. Medal winners from all across the country can take part in the event. The local economy would also be winning. More than 5 million dollars would be expected to come in.
- D. **“Moving Back To Michigan”** **6/9/14** **2:13 10 pm**
For the first time in more than a decade, Michigan is seeing growth when it comes to people moving back into the state. Moving companies are seeing increased business and say the economy here is on the up an up.

5. **EDUCATION:**

- A. **“Kid Fitness Room”** **5/08/14** **1:40 5 am**
As childhood obesity continues to be a concern across the country, many realize the important of starting kids on a healthy lifestyle as soon as possible. And, one West Michigan Elementary school is among the first in the area to get kids moving in a way, specially made for them.
- B. **“West Michigan Aviation Academy”** **5/12/14** **2:59 5 pm**
In 2010, Businessman Dick DeVos announced he was starting a public charter school called the ‘West Michigan Aviation Academy’. It would be located in an old hangar at the Ford International Airport. It was a merger of his two passions, education and aviation. Now 4 years later, the school has its first graduating class.
- C. **“Kindergarten Age Shift”** **5/14/14** **2:27 5 pm**
If you are signing your child up for kindergarten, there are some enrollment changes that could affect your child if they have a fall birthday. Michigan is one of just a few states in the country that does not start kindergarten in September. Over the next few years, the state will work towards that. West Michigan teachers say the new start date could make a world of difference for your child.
- D. **“Michigan College at Forefront of UAV Education”** **5/20/14 3:30 5 pm**
It’s a controversial topic that raises a number of concerns about safety and privacy – the use of robotic flying vehicles commonly known as “drones.” But where some people see danger, others are seeing an opportunity – and one Michigan College is already training students in the developing technology.

6. **EMPLOYMENT:**

- A. **“Former Panhandler Gets Second Chance” 6/4/14 2:04 11 pm**
James Speet, a former panhandler grabbed media attention in 2012 following his arrest for begging on the streets of Kentwood. Today Speet is putting his old life behind him. He now has a job at Snug Harbor, where he washes dishes.
- B. **“Helping Teens Find Summer Jobs” 6/11/14 3:04 6 pm**
Now that school is out many high school and college students are looking for jobs. West Michigan career coaches say the best thing they can do is keep looking, network, search the job boards daily and get creative.
- C. **“Battle Creek Auto Jobs” 6/11/14 0:30 10 pm**
More than 180 jobs are on the way to Battle Creek. WKW Roof Rail Systems is looking to buy a building in the Fort Custer Industrial Park. The company is investing about \$23 million to start adding jobs.
- D. **“Best City to Find Jobs” 6/13/14 0:30 5 am**
Forbes Magazine named Grand Rapids the best place to find a summer job in 2014. According to research, Grand Rapids has a 28% net employment outlook. They say it’s the result of long term work to diversify the opportunities in the city.

7. **ENVIRONMENT:**

- A. **“Power Plant Emissions” 6/2/14 2:49 6 pm**
The federal government is making a major push to quell the toxins released into the atmosphere from power plants across the country. Whether you believe in climate change, there is no question West Michigan has been dealing with pollution problems for decades, but it’s not entirely to blame. It’s likely a case of ‘their problem’ becoming ‘our problem.’ Westerly winds carry toxins from factories and power plants in cities like Milwaukee, Chicago and Gary across the waters of Lake Michigan.
- B. **“Free Fishing Weekend” 6/3/14 0:30 5 pm**
During ‘Free Fishing Weekend’ you can check out all the Great Lakes and rivers that Michigan has to offer. During this weekend you can fish without a license. Also, there will be a kids’ fishing contest in Whitehall for the biggest catch.
- C. **“Nuclear Power Plant Concerns” 6/5/14 1:42 6 pm**
A group of concerned citizens and environmental groups met with the chairman of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to discuss two plants in West Michigan. The closed-door meeting was held with Chairman Allison MacFarlane. The conversation focused on the Donald C. Cook site in Bridgman and the Palisades Plant in Covert Township. Palisades has been in the spotlight since its 2007 purchase by Entergy because of several problems.

Deanna's Playhouse, a non-profit activity center for families and children in Holland, is facing foreclosure unless they can gather financial support from the community.

- C. **“Looking for a Soldier’s Family”** **6/6/14** **2:00** **6 pm**
A Kent County woman bought two antique boxes for her daughters, 30 years ago. Inside she found a soldier’s diary from World War I. Now she feels compelled to give the lost items a permanent home, with family members.
- D. **“Family Struggles After Motorcycle Crash”** **6/17/14** **1:37** **11 pm**
A family from Lake Odessa is dealing with pain and struggle after a motorcycle accident involving their 12 year old son. The accident happened in March and he is at Mary Free Bed. Doctors say he needs more time there but their insurance company is ready to send him home for outpatient therapy.

10. **GOVERNMENT RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- A. **“Michigan Road Funding”** **5/21/14** **1:05** **6 pm**
As roads and bridges in Michigan crumble, state lawmakers are looking to bulk up funding for repairs, more than a billion dollars’ worth perhaps.
- B. **“Minimum Wage Increase”** **5/27/14** **:45** **10 pm**
Governor Rick Snyder signed legislation raising Michigan’s minimum wage to \$9.25 an hour by 2018. Starting in 2019, it will be tied to the rate of inflation, but the increase would be no more than 3.5 percent annually.
- C. **“Ticket Scalping Bill”** **6/10/14** **:45** **6 pm**
Representatives from groups across the country spoke out during the Senate Government Operations Committee hearing on a bill that would legalize ticket scalping in Michigan, but lawmakers took no action. House Bill 5108, which was approved by a 66-42 bipartisan vote in the lower chamber, would allow a ticket holder to charge more than face value when re-selling a ticket. It targets Public Act 328, which was put on the books back in 1931.
- D. **“Regulating Firework Sales”** **6/19/14** **1:15** **6 pm**
Firework Tent sales are starting, but you can’t just set up a stand. It’s a process that begins in Lansing. The state is in charge of rulemaking for retailers and long before they set-up shop it starts with an application, site plan, proof of insurance along with a \$600 permit fee.

11. **HEALTH CARE:**

- A. **“Potato Chemical Investigation”** **5/31/14** **5:15** **5 am**
It was a YouTube video that had the Michigan potato industry up in arms. A little girl claiming that the chemical sprout nip was to blame for a sweet potato that wouldn’t grow. She used an organic potato to prove her point, ultimately raising health concerns.

- B. **“Nana’s 5K ALS Run”** **5/31/14** **:45** **10 pm**
More than 1,000 runners were at the starting line for the inaugural Nana’s Walk and Run. It’s a new event which takes runners through downtown Grand Rapids, raising money for ALS or Lou Gehrig’s disease.
- C. **“Secondary Drowning”** **6/4/14** **1:21** **5 pm**
As Michiganders dive into summer break and head to pools and lakes, doctors are issuing a warning about drowning, get this hours after you swim. ‘Secondary Drowning’ only takes a couple of inches of water and can happen anywhere, even in a bathtub. We have warning signs people need to be on the lookout for.
- D. **“Kalamazoo River Health Assessment”** **6/4/14** **1:10** **6 pm**
It was an oil spill that contaminated the Kalamazoo River for years but now they’re giving the all clear. The Michigan Department of Community Health finalized the public health assessment of the water. They concluded that no long term harm to people’s health is expected from contact with the chemicals in surface water and fish.

12. **HOUSING/ HUNGER:**

- A. **“Kent County Land Bank Success”** **06/03/14** **1:45** **5 pm**
The City of Grand Rapids took a step closer to selling 125 vacant properties to the Kent County Land Bank. The price tag is just over \$955,000. Under the Kent County Land Bank, he said each property is listed on the “multiple listing service” (MLS) which is a directory of homes for sale, and it’s accessible to the public online. So anybody has the opportunity to buy the properties.
- B. **“Kalamazoo Housing Grants”** **06/03/14** **0:30** **5 pm**
The City of Kalamazoo received almost \$2 million from the Federal Government to help clean up neighborhoods around the city. Some of that will be used to work on code enforcement and help prevent blight and another chunk will be used to fix up vacant structures on North Burdick Street.
- C. **“Homeless Camp Shut Down”** **06/07/14** **0:30** **10 pm**
Homeless camps that are set up along the railroad tracks in Walker are being torn down. Nearly a dozen people will be placed into temporary housing until the city can help them find a more permanent home. The property owner is leasing the area to another railroad that plans to expand.
- D. **“Feeding America Fundraiser”** **06/10/14** **0:30** **5 am**
Feeding America West Michigan hosted a fundraiser to provide some relief from hunger in Michigan. The event featured Judge Sara Smolenski as keynote speaker. In 2013, Feeding America West Michigan distributed more food than in any previous year.

C. **"Elderly Home Invasion" 06/20/14 0:30 7 am**

An 85-year-old woman was assaulted during a home invasion. Grandville Police were called to the scene where the woman told officers that a man tricked her into letting him inside and then attacked her before stealing money.

D. **"GVSU Youth Football Camp" 06/20/14 0:45 5 pm**

Hundreds of kids packed into the Kelly Sports Center for the Grand Valley State Alumni youth football camp. This year two NFL players joined the kids and talked about the importance of getting into a good fitness and health routine.
