Programming: Ken Larking, Danville City Manager, said the transit system operates door-to-door, reservation-based service for seniors Monday through Saturday 4 AM to 1 AM, 21 hours a day. Services include medical trips, grocery and shopping trips and occasional recreation trips. Seniors can make reservations for service by calling 434-797-8994 or 434-799-5144 before 11:00 AM the day before the service is needed. Larking said to qualify, the senior must be at least 60, live within the Danville City limits, and complete a one time transportation
