¹ 47 C.F.R. ~ 73.6001(b) states that Class A television broadcast stations are required to:

- (1) Broadcast a minimum of 18 hours per day; and
- (2) Broadcast an average of at least three hours per week of locally produced programming each quarter.

"Locally produced programming" is defined in 47 C.F.R ~ 6000 as programming:

- (1) Produced within the predicted Grade B contour of the station or within the predicted Grade B contours of any of the station in a commonly owned group; or
- (2) Produced within the predicted DTV noise-limited contour of a digital Class A Station broadcasting the program or within the contiguous predicted DTV noise-limited contours of any of the digital Class A station in a commonly owned group; or
- (3) Programming produced at the station's main studio
